



IT is becoming more and more clear that the proposed HS2 rail network is going to have a major impact on the villages of Culcheth and Croft if the proposed route goes ahead.

The current plans for HS2 will apparently result in the closure of Wigshaw Lane, thereby cutting off the main route between the villages of Croft and Culcheth.

## Parish council's strongly worded protest over HS2

CULCHETH and Glazebury Parish Council has written a strongly-worded letter to Transport Secretary Chris Grayling asking him to take action to stop the closure of Wigshaw Lane to make way for the HS2 rail line Ž rail line.

They say the permanent closure of the road would seriously affect the lives of local people through effectively cutting off the communities of Culcheth and Croft

from each other.

Parish council chairman Margaret Webber (pictured) said: "The recent consultations about the impact of HS2 on the local area have revealed particularly strong concerns about the negative effects of the planned permanent closure of Wigshaw Lane and the re-routing of traffic between Culcheth, Croft and Winwick, onto the already overcrowded A574."

The council says Wigshaw Lane is the only established practical route between the villages of Culcheth and Croft, and its closure would mean the two communities would be effectively cut off from

each other. "The residents of Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft remain deeply opposed to the route of HS2 through the villages, which will seriously affect their lives. We understand this route is the current plan, and we believe that the changes to the

infrastructure resulting from HS2 should be designed to minimise additional damage to the area, not make things even worse.

"Recent consultations between the parish council and local people have brought out strong people have brought out strong concerns about the effect of cutting Wigshaw Lane on the quality of life and economy of the area. When Wigshaw Lane has been closed temporarily in the recent past, local businesses have noted a charactery of the control of the con sharp drop in income. Residents of Croft generally rely on Culcheth for shops, the medical centre, dentists, the high school, and other services. The closure of Wigshaw Lane would cause the loss of services and business for both villages.

"We call on the Minister for Transport to take action without delay to prevent the closure of Wigshaw Lane."

The parish council is also urging

local residents to make their own

individual objections.

Cllr Webber said: "Everyone who lives, works or has other connections in the villages will be deeply affected by the severing of Wigshaw Lane. It is now vitally important that, as well as individual residents, representatives and local individuál members businesses, schools, churches, health services, leisure organisations, sports clubs, etc.

## Village unveils its bl

A PARISH plan for the village of Croft, setting out a vision of how its community is to be protected and enhanced over the next few years, has been published.

The document, prepared by a voluntary steering group made of residents and some members of Croft Parish Council, identifies how residents feel about

where they live and how they wish to see the village improved. It has been produced over a period of seven months.

A questionnaire sent to all households gave residents an opportunity to provide feedback on their views on Croft's environment, planning impacts, recreation, leisure and other services and

utilities.

Steering group members also visited the two primary schools in the parish to seek the views of younger members of the community.

Group chairman Roger Lamming said: "The information gathered allowed us to identify the key issues and generate an action plan. It is a plan generated by and owned by the community. By undertaking this process, Croft is in a better position to consider and influence future planning proposals and decision making at both parish and borough council levels. The outcome reflects the collective voice of the community."

Another group member, Steve Grimshaw, added: "Residents demonstrated how they valued the rural nature, the countryside and in

particular the Green Belt, which protects the parish from being over developed. These were the main reasons for people choosing to live in the parish."


Parish councillor Norman Partington, also a member of the steering group, said: "The Parish Council has given full support to the plan and with the aid of an independent monitoring committee comprised of Croft residents, we aim to ensure that the parish of Croft is protected and enhanced in line with the needs and views of the community."

The plan will be presented to Warrington Borough Council

before it consults on the next stage of it's Local Plan, now expected to be in March next year, when sites for future housing development across the borough are likely to be proposed. It will also be distributed to all households in the parish.

The youngsters attended the Sellafield Awards showcase event at Hinton House, Risley where Dame Tanni was guest speaker – and they found her "truly inspirational."

In her presentation, Dame Tanni talked about growing up with spina bifida and her decision to become

an athlete.

She described the commitment and hard work needed to succeed in her field and the sheer joy of victory. Her message was simple: to succeed in anything you need planning, teamwork, determination and ambition.

Tanni Grey-Thompson's career began in the 100m at the Junior National Games for Wales in

Her international career started four years later at Seoul, where she

In her Paralympic career she won 16 medals, 11 gold, four silver and one bronze. Her fifth and last Paralymic Games was in

Athens in 2004.

In World Championships she won six gold, five silver and two bronze medals and she won the wheelchair section of the London



Marathon six times between 1992 and 2002.

She worked as a TV presenter and in many other fields and in 1992 was awarded the MBE and in 2005 a DBE.

In 2016 she was created a Life Peer, taking the title Baroness Tanni

Grey-Thompson of Eaglescliffe, Durham


