

# People power wins the day – again!

IT would appear that our politicians are indeed listening to the people!

After reporting on last month's success at the decision by members of the planning committee to reject controversial plans by Eddie Stobart to build a new distribution centre and warehousing on Green Belt land at Appleton Thorn, members of the council's Executive Board have now put a halt on plans to close the Stockton Heath recycling centre.

Officers had been recommending it should be closed to make savings of around £300,000 despite more than 1,000 people responding to a public consultation opposing the closure, with a further 3,000 signing a petition.

But instead members of the Executive Board have granted a stay of execution until at least May and instructed officers to find an alternative site in the South of the Borough before closing the existing site.

Meanwhile they have also instructed officers to meet with the site operators and look at efficiency savings.

It is good to see that the council has listened to the people, otherwise it would beg the question "What is the point of consulting if you are not going to listen."

We now have two local success stories where the council has listened to the people – long may it continue.

Congratulations to all those involved in taking part in the consultation and to our elected representatives who campaigned against the closure.

Now we wait with baited breath to see the outcome of the Local Plan

consultations

Hopefully those in power will take on board all the information they have received and ensure whatever plans are in the pipeline, the right infrastructure is in place to deal with them.

Our highways, schools and GP surgeries are all at bursting point and with hundreds of new homes already being high there is no space canacity.

being built there is no spare capacity. Finally I would like to wish all our readers and advertisers a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year as we face uncertain times on various fronts!

The standard was so high that the work of runners up – Esmee Parker, Ruby Ella Boyd, Hannah Nestor, Marshall Anders, Eve Powell, Nanayaa Odro, Vlad Balutiu and Jaymie Howard - is also featured on the back of the calendar.

Joining Andrea on the judging panel were the Mayor of Warrington, Cllr Karen Mundry, Warrington Museum and Art Gallery education and learning officer Katy Melville and Culture Warrington chairman Maureen Banner.

Mrs Banner said the quality of the artwork, which totalled more than 1,300 pieces, was outstanding.

"The standard of work submitted was really wonderful, the talent our young people demonstrated was incredible.

"Holly was selected as the winner for the quality and standard of her drawing, she is clearly a very talented girl and she should be proud.

"The Golden Gates are one of Warrington's claims to fame and Holly has managed to capture the intricate

# MP calls for action on 'gateway' swing bridges

to the long-running campaign to get the local swing bridges repaired and restored.

The Warrington South MP has written to Mark Whitworth, chief executive of Peel Ports, raising concern about the condition of the bridges across Manchester Ship Canal in his constituency.

He points out that the bridges – at Latchford, Stockton Heath and Walton are in desperate need of painting and calls for assurances that the work will be carried out soon.

He asks for a schedule of the works.

Mr Rashid said: "My constituents are rightly fed-up by the lack of action on this issue. For too long the bridges, located on Chester Road, London Road and Knutsford Road, have been left in a poor state and in need of immediate

"I am disappointed that despite the

they intend to begin maintenance on the bridges, nothing has materialised. In the meantime, the bridges continue to deteriorate. Frankly, my constituents and our town deserve better.

"These bridges don't just connect our town, they are also gateways into our town, and as such they offer a first impression of Warrington to our visitors. The way they look matters.

"My constituents feel let-down by Peel Port's inaction to date.

"I believe that Peel Ports has a corporate responsibility to act on this issue and by doing so proving that they are indeed committed to our town and our communities.

'I hope that my letter will now spur Peel Ports on to do the right thing and carry out the maintenance on the bridges that is so desperately needed."

Thousands of people have signed petitions calling for the swing bridges to be renovated.



# Village doesn't want any more bars and restaurants

STOCKTON Heath village already has sufficient bars, restaurants and cafes - any

This is the view of Stockton Heath Parish Council in a response to a borough

council consultation on the night time economy.

Parish councilors also believe that it would be preferable if premises in the village closed before midnight on weekdays.

They claim the night time economy also creates a litter problem which is not always serviced by the borough council and that parking and traffic issues are caused by users of the night time economy.

Noise and disturbance levels also increase, particularly in the summer months and at time of celebration such as New Year.



# **Money Column**

# Money Purchase Annual Allowance

Some of you out there may be a bit long in the tooth, like myself, and withdrawn their 25% tax free lump sum from a pension scheme. If so, you should be aware of the Money Purchase Annual Allowance ("MPAA") which was introduced in April 2017 to counter a perceived tax avoidance, pension "recycling".

So, what is recycling? This is when you take some or all of the tax-free element of your pension savings and reinvest it into a new pension plan. The new contribution qualifies for tax relief and

generates an entitlement to a new tax-free lump sum. In effect, you're using your original tax-free payment to create more tax-free income at no extra cost. How good is that? Well, apparently too good for the wicked taxman (BOO, HISS ...... Well it is pantomime season, after all)

So, what is the MPAA? This caps tax relief on future pension contributions to £4,000 per annum in most situations where you've arranged to draw money from your pension scheme after April 2015, and then made the withdrawal. The cap means that tax relief you receive for pension contributions in excess of £4,000 per year is clawed back through the annual allowance charge. Also, if the nasty man from HMRC considers that you've exceeded the limits for recycling pension contributions, then he may impose very stiff financial penalties (HE'S BEHIND YOU!!)

There are two more points to make. Firstly, both your own and your employer's contributions into an auto-enrolment pension scheme count towards the £4,000 per annum limit on contributions. Secondly, Mr Nasty Taxman cannot impose any penalties for exceeding the limits unless you've received more than £7,500 tax-free pension cash in the previous 12 months AND increased your pension contributions by more than 30%, ie penalties will only be applied in the most flagrant cases of breaches of the rules (PHEW!! HURRAH!!).

So, given the above is it worth even considering? Well, provided that you avoid paying contributions at a rate that triggers a penalty, reinvesting at the £4,000 per year maximum allowed by the MPAA can build a substantial extra tax-free lump sum. Assuming an annual growth rate for your fund of, say, 5% per year, annual recycling could generate an extra £13,000 tax-free cash over ten years. The bottom line is that just because you have or are taking money from your pension savings this doesn't prevent you from continuing to build another tax-free lump sum.

# Council halt plans to close recycling centre while alternative site found

CONTROVERSIAL plans to close the Stockton Heath Community Recycling Centre have been halted pending further investigative work to find an alternative site in the south of the town.

In a report to Warrington Borough Council's Executive Board, council officers were recommending that the Recycling Centre on Sandy Lane be closed, but have now been instructed "to allocate a suitable site for the provision of a CRC site within the South of the Borough as part of the Local Plan Process.

Warrington South MP Faisal Rashid, who called on the council to find an alternative site before any closure, has welcomed the news.

While welcoming the Council's commitment to providing a new, fit for purpose alternative site in the south of Warrington, Faisal expressed concerns about the proposal to close the recycling centre upon completion the improvement works at Woolston and Gatewarth, which would see residents in Stockton Heath, Appleton, Grappenhall, Thelwall, Walton, Stretton, Hatton and Lymm without access to a recycling centre

in the local area. He has been holding discussions with council chiefs to call for the Stockton Heath facility to be kept open until the alternative site in the south of the town is delivered.

Following these discussions,





recommendation to close the Stockton Heath site has been changed to "Request officers re visit the current operating model for the facility at Stockton Heath in partnership with the existing contractor, with a view to reducing the operational cost of the facility and report back with the outcome of their discussions to the May Executive Board at the latest.

Commenting on the news Faisal said: "I have been in talks with Councillor Russ Bowden, Professor Steven Broomhead and senior officers from Warrington Borough Council over the future of the Stockton Heath Community Recycling Centre. I had raised concerns with them regarding proposals that would see the recycling centre closed upon completion of improvement works at Woolston and Gatewarth.

"I am delighted to hear that following my work on this issue, the Council's Executive Board has now halted plans to close the Stockton Heath site and agreed to look again at ways to keep the site open until an alternative facility is delivered.

"Throughout our discussions, I made it clear that whilst I welcome the Council's commitment to deliver a new recycling centre in the south of the town, there should be no gap in provision for residents in Stockton Heath, Appleton, Grappenhall, Thelwall, Walton, Stretton, Hatton and Lymm. The Stockton Heath site

well-used and therefore I believe must remain in operation for as long as possible to ensure that communities in the south of the town do not experience any disruption to their recycling services.

"The Stockton Heath Community Recycling Centre will now remain open while usage of the site is monitored and re-evaluated. I hope that the findings from the investigative work will ensure that the Stockton Heath facility is kept open until a new site in the south of Warrington is delivered. I will continue to work closely with the Council on this important local issue.

A consultation by the borough council over the future of the facility saw more than 1,000 people oppose the closure, with another 3,000 signing a petition.

# "Leisure suite" plan turned down

PLANS for a "leisure suite" in the garden of a house at Appleton have been refused by borough council officers.

The scheme, in Lumb Brook Road, involved a detached outbuilding.

Another scheme at a house in Chester Road, Appleton, involving part two storey and part single storey extensions to the side and rear of the property has also been rejected.

But proposals for the demolition of an existing conservatory and construction of a single storey rear extension have been approved in Dudlow Green Road.




