Finally here's to a happy, healthy and prosperous new year to all our readers and advertisers. Thank you, as always for your ongoing



## Vintage Viola store opening rocks

A NEW charity shop in memory of Warrington band Viola Beach has opened in the town centre.

opened in the town centre.

Vintage Viola has opened its doors as part of the Changing Lives store, based in The Cockhedge Shopping Centre.

In its vibrant new setting Vintage Viola will serve as a pop-up charity shop/community space and was founded by the River Reeves Foundation, providing space for some of the River Reeves Foundation projects to take place. Foundation projects to take place.

The provisions include free guitar The provisions include free guitar lessons for young disadvantaged students, a new 'art gallery' providing the first permanent gallery space in town for young art students and local artists to showcase their work, plus Vintage Viola clothing which will provide pre-loved clothes and accessories in excellent condition, primarily aimed at 16-25 year olds.

Changing Lives provides donated refurbished furniture.

Changing Lives provides donated refurbished furniture, which is recycled and reused by selling back cheaply to low-income families to furnish their homes. The store also provides volunteering, training and work placement opportunities for those who are unemployed, those with physical or mental health issues, or maybe just looking for a way to give back to their community.

Vintage Viola has big ambitions

to grow into an 'Afflecks Palace' type hub for artists, musicians, design students and traders to create a community space; as well as being a one stop shop for vital youth provision within the town centre. The River Reeves Foundation want to create a multiuse building which meets the needs of the talented youngsters in the

It is hoped that the store will be part of an amazing legacy for Viola Beach and Craig Tarry.

The store has been designed and put together by Sharon Dunne and Lisa Leonard along with help from family and friends. Sharon and Lisa were inspired by Viola Beach's constant search for alternative fashion via charity shops. There



is also a designated music room which can be booked by the hour as a rehearsal space. Sharon and Lisa are both keen to support young performers looking for a space to practise as this is something Viola Beach didn't have.

Lisa remembers Viola Beach rehearsing for many an hour in her garage as they couldn't afford anywhere else. The music room at Vintage Viola is £10 an hour and can be booked by contacting Sharon or Lisa at the shop.

## New £200,000 Discharge Suite opens at hospital

A NEW £200,000 state-of-the-art Discharge Suite has been officially opened at Warrington Hospital

The suite has been designed to provide a comfortable, supported environment for patients to commence their onward journey home or to their next care setting.

Created adjacent to the new Frailty Assessment Unit and with easy access for vehicle pick-ups, the Discharge Suite has been created as a result of the Hospital Trust Board approving a £200K investment.

#### Enjoy

As soon as patients are identified as being able to be discharged they are booked into the suite and, if mobile, are able to enjoy the seated area with all the trimmings including Wifi, TV, hot and cold drinks, sandwiches; books magazines and games. There they can await transport collection by can await transport, collection by family/carers or friends and their take-home medications.

The Suite has a dedicated clinical team and is equipped with thirteen comfortable chairs, six recliners and seven high backs.

There are four bed/trolley bays for patients whose acute care is complete but may require further supported care in intermediate care or the community. The Suite is open 7-days per week from 8am-9pm weekdays and 10am-7pm at weekends.

Chris Evans, Chief Operating Officer said: "We are delighted to open this new facility at Warrington which has been designed around our patients, providing a more comfortable and supportive environment to begin their onward journey.

At the same time this will release much-needed beds earlier in the day enabling us to admit patients presenting through our emergency department in a more timely way and therefore ease pressure on our very busy emergency care team, particularly as we approach what promises to be another challenging

## New Year set to be another good year for Warrington economy

by Steve Park - Director of Growth & MD of Warrington & Co

DESPITE the ongoing uncertainty that Brexit presents I predict that it will still be another good year for the Warrington economy.

When we started site clearance works on the Time Square project in 2016, 2020 seemed a long way off.

works on the Time Square project in 2016, 2020 seemed a long way off. I was out on site at Time Square recently and it is exciting to see the progress. I stood in the structures that will become the new market hall and council offices which are rapidly taking shape. There are currently 260 permanent employees currently working for Vinci on the construction. By the end of March that figure will have risen to 400.

Progress is set to accelerate with roofs and wall panels being affixed to the structures. Come summer, externally the scheme will look complete albeit that the internal fit out of the buildings will be underway in earnest ready for an opening in spring of 2020.

Elsewhere, work is underway on Warrington Central Park Highways Link, with works starting on the key element.

Link, with works starting on the key element – the construction of a new bridge connecting Centre Park to Chester Road - to start in the coming

weeks.

Over at Omega three of the Mountpark units on Omega South were completed last month (of which Royal Mail are to occupy one) and work will complete on their fourth, and final unit in February. Demand for the housing units is high and both Redrow and Miller are reporting that it has exceed their sales expectations. Planting is also well underway on the Green Heart – a new 35 acre park – which will be opened in 2020 in order to give. In the coming months work will commence on the construction of the new Youth Zone at the Stadium

on & Co
Quarter.

Applications to construct and convert properties for town centre residential use continue to flood in with hundreds so far approved. It is encouraging to see the Private Sector responding to the public sector lead regeneration activity in the town.

In March Warrington Business Exchange will host its Annual Conference celebrating a year in business. At the time of writing membership stood at 175 and is growing day by day. It's a great torum in which to do business and collaborate with others. It is set to be an exciting event so hope to see you an exciting event so hope to see you

#### Have your say on schools admissions

PARENTS in Warrington are being encouraged to have a say on proposed changes to schools' admissions arrangements.

The borough council says the proposed changes, which would come into effect for the September 2020-21 academic year, focus on admissions of looked after children – that is children in the care of the local authority.

The Minister of State for School Standards has recently confirmed that the law relating to looked after children will soon be changing and there will be an additional requirement for all state funded schools to prioritise looked after children previously in state care outside of England.

Most schools in Warrington have decided to make this change for admissions to their school starting from September 2020.

In addition to the change to the looked after children criteria, some schools may be proposing other changes too, such as changing the admission

may be proposing other changes too, such as changing the admission numbers for reception classes or Year 7.

The council is now consulting on these changes, giving all parents the opportunity to share their views and provide feedback.

Cllr Jean Carter, lead member for children's services said: "We know how

important it is for parents and carers to secure a place at the right school for their child. That is why it is a really important for everyone to understand

"We are always listening to the views of parents so I would encourage as many people as possible to take part in the consultation and have their say. All views will be taken on board."



Their designs – featuring characters created by the college's in-house designer Carl Gleavey – now adorn the sides of buses that travel directly to the college from Widnes, Irlam / Cadishead and

Golborne.

Ben Wakerley, managing director at Warrington's Own Buses, said: "We like to wrap buses to give them an identity for the route they operate and to make it easier for customers to understand which bus to catch and where it goes.

"The final design was picked as we felt that it would work well on the bus and we liked the modern

They include cartoon-like student characters and interpretations of some of the buildings found on the college campus.

## RAM Properties complete on £3m sale of prime central site

RAM Properties has completed on the sale of a key development site in central Warrington for a sum in excess of £3million.

The 2.1 acre site on the A49 Winwick Road adjacent to Central Station has been sold to High Street Residential.

Developer Cording Development Group will be the ultimate owners who have planning permission to construct a  $\pounds50M$  plus residential development and Multi Storey Car Park on the site.

The sale of the land is the final component in the scheme enabling work to commence.

The land which sits opposite Warrington's Stadium Quarter site was acquired by RAM Properties in 2009.

High Street Residential intend to build a 9 storey mixed use complex which will include circa 6,400sq ft of retail and leisure space, a 796 parking space Multi Storey Car park and 362 contemporary apartments.

RAM Properties, based in Warrington, was founded by Robert A McLaughlin in 1991 and now has an extensive portfolio of land and quality office space in Warrington, Widnes and Ellesmere Port.

Bob McLaughlin, Managing Director, RAM Properties, said: "We've always been at the core of Warrington's ongoing regeneration and are proud to be facilitating in its renaissance with the sale of this site.

"Our business has been built upon seeing opportunity. We have always strongly believed and invested in the potential of Warrington Town Centre. Immediately opposite the Winwick Road site is The Boultings - a former derelict chapel that was in danger of demolition - which we saved and converted into prime office accommodation that we still own and manage. Just a little further up the road we also have Dallam Court, Ribban Court and Tannery Court. Our Portfolio of Office stock totals well over 120,000sq ft.

## My Warrington Remembers — The Waysiders

THE Waysiders began in 1944 when John Hales came out of the army and set up the business on 30 shillings a week, assisted by his mother, Mrs M. W Hales. Martin Hales tells me his father

was looking for a name for the store

was looking for a name for the store and his grandfather said, "Well, you're a bit by the wayside", so The Waysiders became the name.

John travelled down to The Potteries to purchase stock, which, in the early days, he displayed on orange boxes. As he sold the stock he went back to The Potteries to buy more and slowly built up the buy more and slowly built up the business.

At the end of World War II in 1945, the town, like the rest of the country, settled down to a new era of peace. There were still Gls stationed at Burtonwood

The company specialised in china and glassware, fancy goods, wall ornaments, figurines etc, all of which found a ready market among the gift buyers both locally and the

the gift buyers both locally and the Americans who wanted something to send home to "Maw".

By 1956 the business had become so successful that further developments were planned and younger brother, Anthony, entered the scene to take charge of another than the scene to take charge (seen in Market Place (seen in

the scene to take charge of another branch in Market Place (seen in the photo) specialising in wool, woollies and knitting patterns, etc.

In 1969 the original Waysiders took over the premises next door which had been occupied by a chicken barbecue and in July

1970, the wool shop added the Readicut Wool shop, opposite the Barley Mow at the entrance to the Market, to its list of assets.

The growth of the business, together with the cramped cramped conditions in this old part of town, made Waysiders' owners uneasy and, being progressive if nothing else, when the Timothy White shop at 34 Horsemarket Street came on the market, they quickly began







## Fire service helps rescue pensioner — from cancer!

A PENSIONER from Warrington has praised Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service for helping her find out that she had bowel cancer "before it was too late".

A member of staff from the

brigade's prevention team arranged for Gwen Pugh to receive a free home bowel cancer screening kit as part of a Safe and Well Visit in June last year. It arrived within a week, and

three days after using the kit and sending it off for analysis Gwen was informed that her samples showed cell abnormalities and given an appointment to see bowel cancer specialists at Aintree University Hospital,

University Hospital.

The mum-of-three was subsequently diagnosed with bowel cancer and underwent a major operation to remove a tumour at Warrington Hospital.

She has since been told the

operation was a complete success and that doctors are hopeful that

Gwen, now 79, said: "My husband Gareth and I can't thank the staff at Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service enough for enquiring about my health when they came to our home to sort out a problem we had

with our smoke alarms.

"They asked if I had ever received a bowel cancer screening kit from the NHS. I told them that my husband had but I hadn't and that I would like one.
"They arranged for me to be

sent one and although I received it

within a week I didn't use it for a

few months.

"It took me discovering some blood after going to the toilet to spark me to use the bowel cancer screening kit.

"Within three days of me using it and sending it off I was told that I had abnormalities and given an appointment at a hospital bowel cancer clinic.

"I was quickly diagnosed with bowel cancer and operated on and I have now been told by specialists that they believed it has all been taken out and been given a positive prognosis in regards to the bowel cancer.

"With everything being done through the bowel cancer screening people as opposed to my own GP, the whole process progressed very

quickly.

"Despite me having to have various tests and appointments with specialists to discuss my options, I had my operation less than three months after sending the bowel cancer screening kit off on 18 October 2017.

"The operation was on my husband's 80th birthday in January.

"I am looking forward to turning 80 myself in February but if it wasn for the staff at Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service enquiring about my health as part of a Safe and Well Visit and arranging for me to be sent a bowel cancer screening kit I may not be here now.

"They ensured that I was able to get my bowel cancer diagnosed

and treated before it was too late and I am eternally grateful to them

The Safe and Well Visits programme was launched in Cheshire in February last year in collaboration with the NHS and local authority directors of public

Since then the groundbreaking programme has scooped a host of

Nick Evans, head of prevention at Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service, said: "The latest figures

show that without a Safe and Well Visit almost 29,000 people in Cheshire may have suffered adversely through not knowing where to turn or not realising they have something needing medical attention."

People over the age of 65 can book a Safe and Well Visit via Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service's website – www.cheshirefire.gov. uk/home/safe-and-well-visits – where residents can carry out their own home safety check by completing a questionnaire.

#### Fun is over, back to work

We hope you have all had a very happy Christmas, but now it is time to look towards getting your tax returns in by the end of January. A late return incurs penalties even if it shows no tax payable. These rise from an immediate £100 to £1,600 after 12 months and are automatic. and are automatic.

Or so we all thought! A taxpayer recently went to tribunal over penalties that had been imposed. He claimed that

he had submitted his returns on time by first class post, but since he had not used recorded delivery he could not prove this. He had moved house several times and although he had informed HMRC by phone each time there was a delay of several months in recording these moves. He claimed that the first he knew of any alleged late filing was when he eventually received a letter from HMRC notifying him of the penalties, upon receipt of which he immediately resubmitted his returns.

The first tier tribunal (FTT) noted that with no proof of postage it could not accept that he had filed on time. They did, however, look at the level of the penalties. Without getting too technical, whilst the level of the first two penalties charged (amounting to a total of £1,000) were correctly calculated there was some argument about whether the final two penalties, charged after 6 months and 12 months and amounting to £600 in total, could exceed the tax due as there were two apparently conflicting provisions affecting them.

HMRC argued that "by creating two possibilities of a penalty" parliament clearly intended that there should be a minimum penalty under each of the two paragraphs regardless of the tax at stake, in order to encourage compliance, and they had calculated the penalties accordingly. The FTT disagreed, stating that the notion that it comes down to an alternative between issuing a penalty under one or another provision makes no sense. They said that part of the process of arriving at a  $\pounds 300$  penalty is the act of calculating whether 5% of the tax is greater or less than that amount. This being the case, it is clear that the penalty has been determined by reference to tax. "It is... not possible to impose a £300 penalty without first having referred to the liability to tax".

The initial £100 and three-month £900 penalties were upheld

since the taxpayer had shown no reasonable excuse for missing the deadlines. The six-month and twelve-month penalties were reduced to nil based on the fact that no tax was due for either year. Interestingly, and rather stupidly, this might not have applied if the returns had been submitted before they were 12 months late.
