Editor's Comment

IF anyone had any doubts on the value of restoring Warrington's Historic Golden Gates – Warrington Walking Day showed they are worth every penny of the £500,000 spent on restoring them to their former glory.

While I can understand people questioning such expenditure in times of austerity it is extremely important to protect our town's history and heritage.

The council is often criticised when old historic buildings are bulldozed to make way for "progress" but very often when old buildings disappear, they are in

private ownership.

Our Golden Gates are iconic and had fallen into a poor state of repair – in fact they were becoming dangerous. Also the money used to restore them was from different funding pots and heritage grants and couldn't have been used to help the homeless or feed the hungry, which are different and important issues in their own right. Now the Golden Gates have been completely restored and what

better way to see them than on a sunny Warrington Walking Day -

and boy was it sunny.

Having covered Walking Day

Deadline for the September issue is August 6

for more than three decades, sunny ones have been few and far between - so it was wonderful to see the sunshine gleaming off the Golden Gates.

It was also good to see families of those related to the history of the gates attending the re-dication ceremony.

Meanwhile the Rector for Warrington Revd. Paul Wilson

re-dedicated the gates, as his Warrington Walking Day swansong as he moves on to pastures new in Lincolnshire after six short years.

While his time in Warrington has been relatively short compared to his predecessors, he has been a great ambassador for the town and we wish him well for the future.

A GROUP of Warrington women, who became known as the Burtonwood GI Brides are pictured at the White Hart pub, prior to embarking on a new life across the

Now Aldon Ferguson, founder and UK President of the Burtonwood

Association, is seeking help in identifying the women ahead of next year's UK Reunion.

Aldon said: "The photograph shows a group of GI Brides who married GIs from Burtonwood but had to weith weit and the control of the said." had to wait until after the war before they could travel across the Atlantic.

ⁱlt was taken in the White Hart Hotel in Warrington in late 1945. They travelled to the US in large groups, many on the Queen Elizabeth or Queen Mary, to New York where they were initially met by their husbands.

"The authorities then stopped that and told the husbands not to travel to New York to meet them. Instead they gave the brides, often with children, train tickets and sent them all over the US to their new homes. It must have been quite an ordeal as they had never left home before, never been to the US and many had never seen their husbands in civilian clothes as they were always in uniform.

"They had a new family to go to

and could only communicate with home by letter. Most marriages survived and we still have many GI brides as members of the Burtonwood Association. They do however, tell stories of how hard it was at first although they were generally welcomed into the family. The only problem would be when the GI told them he lived in a huge ranch in Texas and they found him in a poor district in Chicago or similar!"

"Of course added: Aldon many, many marriages continued after the Americans came back to Burtonwood in 1948 and still continued right into the 1980's to

the US Army personnel there.
"We are having our next Reunion in Warrington in May 2020 with the slogan '2020 – Looking Forward' and we will have several GI brides join us then.

"It would be wonderful if anyone can name any of the brides on this photo.

The photograph came from Edith Kratzer (front row, 4th from left) who married in 1951 but she entitled it 'War Brides 1945' so the date is questionable. She was nee Astle, married Mack Kratzer Jr (7540th Maintenance Group Depot, Feb 49 – Feb 52) at Warrington Registrar's Office on 4 October 1951. Edith



worked on the base as a telephone operator for four years 1948 – 1952. Mack died 3 Oct 1996. Edith was last known to be living at, Kokomo, IN.

The event got me thinking about the seismic problem that employers can face in ensuring that their business is appropriately considering the needs of disabled staff, potential staff and their users.

Disability discrimination became illegal in 1995 (crazy how late that happened isn't it!) and such laws have been incorporated into the highly-important, 2010 Equality Act. So what does the Equality Act say?

The Equality Act 2010 says that you must not be discriminated against because: you have a disability, someone thinks you have a disability, or you are connected to someone with a disability.

Discrimination against protected characteristics, such as a disability, can come in various forms and you need to be very careful in the manner which you and your employees approach certain situations.

Dismissal based on disability (someone spelling words incorrectly due to dyslexia for example) is entirely unacceptable and can lead to expensive tribunals and lawsuits - with one case resulting in a massive £242,000 award! Ellen Parkin

Providing for an Unmarried Partner after Death

In the UK, each year more of us are living together and starting families without marrying or being in a Civil Partnership. In 2017 there were over 3.3 million cohabiting couple families in the UK. Despite becoming more common, the rights of cohabiting couples are not always well understood.

If someone who is married or is in a civil partnership dies without a Will, their assets are distributed in accordance with the intestacy rules. Depending on the value of the assets of the deceased partner, the surviving married/civil partner will inherit all or some of the estate.

Legally speaking, unmarried cohabiting partners don't enjoy the same rights as a married/civil partner. For cohabiting couples, if one dies then the surviving partner has no automatic rights to the deceased partner's property and no automatic entitlement to inherit their estate.

The exception to this is if the cohabiting couple owned any property jointly. Any joint property will automatically pass to the joint owner on death.

If the cohabiting partner who dies has not made a Will, then any assets that they owned in their own name will be distributed in accordance with the intestacy rules. If they have any children then their estate will pass outright to their children, bypassing their cohabiting partner. If they did not have any children, their estate will pass to their remoter family including grandchildren, parents, siblings, nieces and nephews and

Without a Will in place clearly indicating that the deceased partner's share is to pass to the survivor, it is very possible that the surviving partner may not see any of their partner's estate passing to them. If the cohabiting partners intend for the survivor to inherit their assets, it is advisable that they look to prepare Wills to that effect.

When preparing a Will care should be taken to make sure that it distributes your assets in the manner that you intended and that

it is properly executed.


It made for a wonderful spectacle

Dad embarks on fund-raising mission

AN Orford dad has embarked on a fund-raising mission as a thank you to hospital staff who helped save his baby daughter's life.

Personal trainer Nick Forrester aims to climb Ben Nevis, the highest mountain in the British isles standing at 1,345m, ride across the West Highland Way (96 miles off road) and kayak the length of Loch Lomond (22.60 miles), in just 24 hours.

Little Harper Forrester was born with a rare condition with cysts on her larynx which caused breathing problems and resulted in her undergoing two life saving operations during the first few weeks of her life.

Nick said: "When my beautiful wife Fran gave birth to our second little baby girl at Warrington Hospital, she weighed in at 8lb 10oz and was perfect in every way.

"Before we were discharged later that day we noticed an unusual noise when our little girl was breathing but

were reassured it was just a floppy Larynx, which can be quite common, and she would grow out of it.

"Little did we know that our baby girl had a cluster of cysts growing on her Larynx that was a potentially life threatening condition and the chain of events that unfolded over the next four weeks would see her rushed to Alder Hey Children's Hospital by ambulancé where she would undergo

emergency surgery to remove them.

"We initially thought she was having surgery to fix a floppy larynx, which the consultant thought was the reason why she was working so hard to breath, but unfortunately during surgery her oxygen levels decorped dramstically and she had dropped dramatically and she had to be incubated. It was only whilst in theatre that they discovered the cysts. Following the surgery she was

admitted to the ICU ward where she would remain on life support for the next 24 hours and in ICU for the next

'The consultant, Mr Donne, came up to the ward to explain exactly what had happened and how this was a very rare and potentially life threatening situation that he had only ever seen twice in his 23 year career, and that's when the shock hit us and

we couldn't help but cry.
"We had gone from being overwhelmed with joy at the arrival of our baby girl 4 weeks earlier, to complete and utter devastation at what was happening to her now. We were taken down to ICU to be with our baby girl and we just cried again at what we saw. She had tubes up her nose that were breathing for her, tubes up her nose to feed her, a cannula in her arm to administer drugs for pain and inflammation, she was monitored by machines with alarms that seemed to be constantly going off and a specialist nurse who

was working with her one-on-one."

The couple spent the next three days at her bedside watching over her, praying that she would stay strong and recover well and all wthey wanted to do was pick her up and

hold her close.

Nick added: "In the words of the consultant, she had amazed everyone with her resilience and strength and after three days was transferred back up to a normal ward where she would be monitored over the next week. My wife and I would take it in turns to stay over at the hospital with our baby while the other went home to try and keep things normal for our other daughter who was only 4 years old. She initially showed signs of improved breathing and was able to start putting weight on again as she was being ted through a tube



in her nose.

"Unfortunately as the week progressed and she was weaned off oxygen and air assisting her breathing, she started to deteriorate and she was having to work hard once again just to breathe,. The consultant used a camera up her nose again to assess what was going on and she was then scheduled for a second emergency surgery which would be to fix the floppy larynx and remove any remaining parts of the

cysts.
"My wife and I were devastated that our baby was going to have to go through another surgery in less than a week now at only five weeks old especially after what had happened last time, we were allowed to carry her down to theatre and after handing her over to the medical team we literally just cried in each others arms for what seemed like a life time. We were told our baby would be taken to the HDU ward after surgery, as more of a precaution after what had happened last time, to enable them to monitor her.

Road testing the Hybrid BMW 530e

HAVING driven Land Rovers for the past two decades, taking the BMW 530e out for a road test was certainly going to be a new experience for me!

Hybrid vehicles have certainly upped their game over the past five years and with an average electrical charge usage of around 20 miles, the BMW 530e is perfect for short distances around town.

It takes a while to get used to the silence, especially after all the years of driving diesel Land Rovers.



Major facelift for museum and library

WARRINGTON'S 152-year-old town centre museum and library building is to benefit from a major rejuvenation project this Autumn.

The facelift is aimed at re-energising the building as a creative hub for the town and increasing the links between

The facelift is aimed at re-energising the building as a creative hub for the town and increasing the links between the museum and library services.

Led jointly by LiveWire and Culture Warrington, the scheme will see a number of cosmetic changes made to the building as well as implementing a new combined ethos across the museum and library that will result in enhanced accessibility and increased colla boration in terms of opening hours, activities and exhibits.

The move will also see Sunday opening at the Museum and Library – a change it is hoped will enable more families to visit on weekends. Also under the proposals the library will benefit from redecoration throughout, including new carpets, the creation of immersive activity spaces, improved entry and access points; a new library counter, new branding, plus designated spaces for exhibitions and pop-up cafes. An accessible toilet is also planned .The two venues will also align and extend their public weekend opening hours for the first time as well as increasing private use opening hours. The changes will mean the building is used exclusively for private groups on Mondays and Tuesdays to cope with increasing demand from the town's schools and wider community groups.

The building will then be open to the public from 10am to 4.30pm on Wednesdays to Friday, 10am to 4pm on Saturdays, but also on Sundays between 11am and 3pm.The new plans will mean a temporary closure of the building for around two weeks in Autumn – expected to be after the school holidays in order to minimise disruption.

During July, LiveWire and Culture Warrington, who run library, leisure, arts and heritage services on behalf of the borough council, will undertake a series of stakeholder engagement sessions with the building's users including education, library and heritage groups, to outline the proposed improvements and to give people chance to feedback on the proposals.

VAT, Employee thefts and Bad Debts

HM Revenue & Customs HM Revenue & Customs do not always get things right, There have been a couple of tribunal decisions that have gone against them in the last few weeks, one of which concerned the IR35 legislation.

Introduced 19 years ago "counter" perceived tax avoidance through the use of ilimited companies one would expect HMRC to know these rules by now, but they are still trying to push the boundaries further. Their continued failure

to win at Tribunal does not do much to create faith in their "Employment Status Tool" which has been much criticised for ignoring certain very fundamental badges

been much criticised for ignoring certain very fundamental badges of self-employment.

However, that is for another day. Today I want to look at a case involving VAT, Employee thefts and Bad Debts. The facts of the case are very simple. The company, Total Catering Equipment Ltd, sold goods over the internet and, quite rightly, charged VAT on those sales and paid it to HMRC on their quarterly return. However, when taking the order and receiving payment by debit card one of their telephone operatives gave their own personal bank details to the customer rather than the company's.

The company, therefore, never received payment for the goods and, eventually, wrote the debt off and claimed VAT relief on the bad debts. However, HMRC claimed that this treatment was incorrect and that the loss was a result of theft. Whilst this distinction may seem trivial it is of vital importance when looking at the VAT treatment. If a business incurs a bad debt then it can deduct the VAT originally charged from the amount due to HMRC. However, there is no similar relief in respect of theft losses, increasing the cost of those losses to the business by 20%.

You would think that in this case HMRC had a reasonable point. How can the business suffer a bad debt when the customer has

How can the business suffer a bad debt when the customer has paid, even if it was innocently (on their part) to the wrong bank account. Surely this is theft of those monies by the employee from their employer. HMRC thought so, arguing that it was the same as the company receiving the money in cash which was then stolen by

the employee.

The Tribunal says "No" but I will leave it up to you to interpret this if a similar problem arises in your own case. The Tribunal found for the company on the grounds that the employee had made a "dishonest frolic on his own" and had not acted "within the scope of his employment". Therefore, the claim for relief was valid. All I can say at this point is that if you as an employer have a similar case then hope that you get the same judge!


