Sadness and anger as Lymm Hotel closes

THE historic Lymm Hotel has now closed its doors for the final time and demolition work is expected to start soon.

At a meeting of Warrington Council's planning committee in December, permission was granted to remove all the existing buildings on the site to be replaced by a children's nursery, a residential care home and retirement-with-care grantmeets apartments.

apartments. Cllr Ian Marks said, "Lymm Councillors and local residents were extremely disappointed, angry and saddened with the decision to award planning permission for a large development on the site of the Lymm Hotel Lymm Hotel.

"It was a disgraceful decision by the planners to allow this. The concerns of over one hundred and eighty residents were ignored and the decision has been made by people who don't even live in Lymm

"The Lymm Hotel may not be an architectural gem but it has a distinct charm and character. It has a heritage with links to the old railway and to famous people who have been associated with it.

"We are losing a hotel and gaining a nursery but we have seen

no evidence of a need for more nursery provision. There are serious issues for neighbours with noise from the proposed nursery. The site will be over-developed and the surrounding area will not be able to cope. There are major highway safety issues on the nearby roads and parking will be a big problem. There has been no change to the public transport provision although when officers turned the previous proposal down, this was a concern. Both doctors' surgeries claimed they would not be able to cope with the extra numbers of

elderly people." Cllr Ryan Bate, the Liberal Democrat Parliamentary Candidate for Warrington South added, "When the demolition takes place and then when the new construction starts there will be chaos on the roads nearby. From my time at Lymm High School I am very familiar with the area. The road by the Golf Club is very dangerous and cars are forced to mount the pavement to pass each other. The far end of Statham Avenue is a private unmade section of road with a dangerous exit onto Barsbank Lane."

In 2016 the Hotel was packed at a special exhibition celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Brazil World Cup team, including soccer legend Pele, staying at the hotel.

LYMM resident Andrew Morris has just completed a cycling challenge of more than 600 miles to raise

of more than 600 miles to raise money for Claire House Childrens' Hospice on the Wirral. Andrew initially signed up for the four-day Global Adventure Challenges ride from London to Paris, but he set himself another challenge by starting underneath Blackpool Tower and cycling, alone, to the starting point of the official ride in London via the Tower of London - making his ride "The 3 Towers", finishing under the Eiffel Tower. Tower.

After weeks of training he set off from Blackpool and arrived in Paris after seven days. He cycled at least 70 miles each day, sometimes 90, overnighting in such tourist hotspots as Tamworth, Milton Keynes and Croydon in England, and Calais, Arras and Compiègne in France.

Andrew's careful planning could not foresee the heatwave, with temperatures in the high 30s at times, but some very early morning starts helped him cope, and the organised part of the challenge provided support for all the 100plus participants.

It's official – Lymm Historic Transport Day is another record breaker!

THE numbers are all in and organisers have now confirmed that this year's Lymm Transport Day broke all records – generating around £14K for local causes with at least a further £6K raised by other groups who took part in the day.

Nearly 6,500 people paid to visit the event during the day with a further 1,500 tickets going to exhibitors, traders, sponsors and volunteers, making it quite possibly Lymm's busiest day for nearly 50 years.

years. "It's a fantastic result" said Event Director Alan Williams. "Some of that money has already been allocated to causes like the Heritage Centre as well as the Scout and Air Cadet groups who provided great volunteer support on the day. The rest will be going to other community and transport based charities and groups in the coming months. As well as the financial gain it was wonderful again to see the job done by our outstanding volunteer team. "There are around fifteen people"

LOCAL dairy GP Broadsmith & Son is a real family affair spanning four generations of supplying milk to the Lymm community since 1932.

Based at Pool Farm in Statham, Lymm, the dairy was started in 1932 by 'R B Broadsmith' with a small herd of cows at Manor Farm, Lymm and delivered milk to departure in Statham on the bit bits doorsteps in Statham on his bicycle

and by horse and cart. His son 'G P Broadsmith' (known as 'Peter') then took over the business which is now run by his son Ray.

Most of their cows have been born and bred on the farm and you can read stories about some of their favourites which are printed on the side of their glass milk bottles.

Joe Broadsmith, who works as a barrister but helps out with social media and marketing, said: "We take good care of our free range dairy herd, the majority of which are British Friesian, Shorthorn and Ayrshire cattle. On our facebook

page @broadsmiths you can watch videos of the cows grazing and relaxing in the fields. "The cows are free to roam the

fields throughout spring, summer and autumn. In the winter when the fields are wet and muddy the cows are kept inside in open, spacious barns with deep bedded straw. They are milked twice daily in our milking parlour, producing fresh quality milk and cream which is then bottled in our own farm dairy.

"We deliver early in the morning to local doorsteps and

businesses and offer a wider range of associated products including bread, juices and locally sourced potatoes and eggs. We are also eager to be as environmentally friendly as we can. We have an electric vehicle for deliveries and electric vehicle for deliveries and are able to help people cut back on single use plastics by delivering milk to doorsteps in glass bottles -cutting down on food miles too! Joe's mum Angela takes care of all the accounts/office work for the ratail cide of the business while his

retail side of the business while his father Ray and brother, John, take care of looking after the cows, pasteurising the milk and then

bottling. Two local men Chris Harrop (who has worked for the business for 25 years) and Paul King are the

for 25 years) and Paul King are the roundsmen. Joe added: "Over the years things have changed very little on the whole. Technological advances mean that things can be done much more quickly - the cows are milked in an automated parlour nowadays whereas when the family business started in the 1930s they were milked by hand. Likewise, years ago the milk was raw, bottled straight from the cow, however today we have the processing equipment to pasteurise the milk and make skimmed, semi skimmed

and make skimmed, semi skimmed and full cream milk. "Our values and the way we look

after the cows haven't changed though. Our cows have grazed the same fields for the past 60 years. We're one of very few farms in the area now to milk the cows, process, bottle and deliver the milk.

"In an industry that has changed a lot, we are one of only a few that still do the whole process from cow to doorstep in the traditional way. to acorstep in the traditional way. It's funny how things have come full circle, for example the way in which people are coming to us to be able to use our traditional recyclable glass bottles and avoid single use plastics."


