



New high-tech investment at Collegiate

WARRINGTON Collegiate Institute has invested £250,000 in 270 Compaq computers as part of a rolling programme of IT investment – to take the college into the 21st century.

An Area-wide Network, linking the Padgate and Winwick Road sites with Beamont High School, has also been updated to the latest high speed information highway.

Plans are also in the pipeline to link

Plans are also in the pipeline to link up with the Museum Street Campus in October, as well as bringing the Sankey Street Education Centre "on line"

The new multi-media set up will allow internet access to be delivered to more than 500 desktop computers.

The Collegiate and Compaq computers are also holding further talks on using the Institute as a 'case study' for IT in education and looking at further ways of enhancing IT provision at the college.

Principal and Chief Executive Hilary Tucker said: "We have made a firm commitment to ensure the Collegiate is at the cutting edge of new technology.

"We aim to deliver the best possible equipment for our students. The new equipment will add to our existing high-tech media suite and further improve our community links."





WARRINGTON'S flagship peace centre being built in memory of two young IRA bomb victims has received a double boost.

A group of friends, including cerebral palsy victim lan Judge, raised nearly $\pounds 3,000$ by walking coast to coast.

Meanwhile fundraisers helping to raise £2.5m for the international peace centre at Warrington, in memory of Tim Parry and Johnathan Ball, have been further boosted by the arrival of a new campaign director - thanks to backers United Utilities.

Nick Taylor, a Communications Manager with United Utilities, has been seconded to the charity for 12 months, to help co-ordinate fund-raising activities.

One of his first tasks was to receive a cheque for nearly £3,000 from 24-year-old lan and his friends Mark Gartside, Raymond Chan and John Broadbent, who walked from St Bedes to Robin Hood Bay, covering the 190 miles in 14 days.

lan took part in his wheelchair and the group received a message of good luck from Northern Ireland Secretary Mo Mowlam, who has been supporting the peace centre.

Work is well under way on the peace centre which will be officially opened on March 20th next year - the seventh anniversary of the bombing.

What price democracy?

AN opinion survey carried out in Warrington has revealed most people place democracy at the bottom of their list of priorities. They believe their own health and well-being is the most important issue the borough council should be tackling.

The survey, organised by the council, involved members of The Warrington 1,000 - a randomly chosen group of residents who have agreed to help the council by responding to periodic surveys.

They were asked to place in order of priority seven pledges the council has made as part of its community plan, Future Warrington, which covers the period up to 2002

Respondents placed the pledges in the following

order: 1, Health and well being; 2, Community safety; 3, Education and life long learning; 4, Environment; 5, Economic prosperity; 6, Value for money; 7, Democracy.

leader of the council John Gartside said: "I am disappointed democracy comes low in people's list of priorities but not surprised. At the moment public interest in local affairs is fairly minimal and I suppose the council must accept some responsibility for this.

"It is now our role to revitalise interest which is why it is one of our seven pledges. But all seven pledges are important."

THE earliest documented evidence for the holding of a market in Warrington is dated October 20, 1255, when the population of the town was no more than 700 people.

Today Warrington Market has more than 250 stalls serving a community of just under 200,000 people. Markets are a traditional part of British life and offer quality of service and a friendly atmosphere second to none.







"Should the Queen see fit to grant us the honour of City Status, the Year 2000, would without doubt, be the greatest year in Warrington's long and


dynamic history."

Old people's 'village'

AN old people's "village" with individual dwellings for up to 200 pensioners may be built in Warrington.

The £14.9 million centre would be run by a housing association and would have a wide range of facilities including a restaurant, village hall, general store, coffee shop, fitness gym, hairdressing salon, church, laundrette, etc.

It would require an area of 10 acres - and eight possible sites have been identified within the borough.

Research has shown that older people wish to be cared for in their own homes rather than move to residential or nursing home care. However, they want to be safe and many feel lonely and isolated especially if they are housebound.

If the village was built, each resident would have their own tenancy, their own front door with bathroom, bedroom, lounge and kitchen and a variety of communal facilities

Figures from at existing village at Stoke-on-Trent put the cost of a supported placement at £70 per week net to the council. In Warrington the existing net cost of residential care is £155 a week and for nursing care



Now taking each day as it comes, the thought of retirement is still only at the back of his mind - although he has started a successful sports business, based in Latchford village, with his wife Gaynor, as preparation for the day when he finally decides to hang up his boots for the last time.

During his career Mark has tasted all the highs and lows of the game the biggest high, scoring the winning try in the 1989-90 Challenge Cup semi-final over Oldham which took Warrington to Wembley; and the biggest low - never making it on to a Great Britain tour, despite winning two caps in the 1980's

Lancashire Cup Trophy/John Player winners and losers medals and of course a Wembley losers medal. Not getting a winners medal is obviously a disappointment. But with many great players never getting a chance to tread the hallowed turf it was still a memorable experience playing

The secret to his longevity could be coffee, as Mark freely admits to being a "caffeine addict." On match days he drinks at least six cups of coffee before kick off – he even bought an automatic car so he could

drink coffee while driving.

"If you tested positive for caffeine I would be in big trouble," said Mark, who first started playing rugby as a pupil of the former Pichard. pupil at the former Richard Fairclough School. His two favourite subjects were rugby and woodwork.

'I remember taking home a school report which said my two best subjects were rugby and woodworkbut I would never make a living from them. I went on to sign professional terms with Warrington at the age of 17 and started my own joinery business!'

He has played with some of the games greats including Bob Eccles, les Boyd, Kevin Tamati and Andy Gregory and was once crowned the fastest man in Rugby League.

He has a few superstitions which include eating beans and tuna on toast before games (not popular when away on camp!) and never putting his shirt on until he comes out of the changing room.

Over the years he has come close to leaving Warrington and was once even half way up the M6 to Workington to sign for the club at the start of Super League. But he got stuck in a traffic jam, changed his mind and worked out a new deal with Warrington.

Now with 20 years loyal service under his belt if anyone deserved a second testimonial, for loyalty alone, it should be Mark Forster.
