The advice is to go along to one of the walk in services at Halton or Warrington or ring 111.

I am aware that some people now

head straight to A&E to get checked out, putting undue pressures on our local hospital.

It is a far cry from the good old days when you could just pop along to your family doctor, build a relationship with the same person and just turn up for an appointment during times of ill health.

In an article on page 22 you will see that some pharmacies are now offering a video link to a GP to discuss your ailments.

I suppose for some people that may help but it is not exactly personal and doesn't create any GP-Patient

also know the GP experience can vary from practice to practice and some readers will be wondering what all the fuse is about.

But during these trying times for our health service surely there must be an easier way for everyone to get in to see their GP?

A re-assuring voice, a friendly smile and a quick examination can often be the perfect tonic, rather than the anxiety and stress of being left hanging on the telephone and unable to get in to see your family doctor.

May be the reason more than half Warrington's residents haven't taken up the free MOT is because they couldn't get through to make the appointment, with many more, I am

The old saying prevention is better than cure is certainly true - but only if you can get through to make an appointment and be seen in an orderly time.

Finishing on a positive note congratulations to everyone at Warrington Wolves on their Wembley success - it certainly helped provide a tonic for the town and it was great to see the town hall lawn transformed into a sea of primrose and blue.

Plan to convert historic Bank House into Boutique Hotel

WARRINGTON Borough Council is planning to sell off the historic Grade 2 Listed Bank House next to the town hall as part of plans to bring an important town centre site back into

The council is seeking a preferred developer of land and buildings at Garven Place, formerly the site of a former NHS clinic acquired by the Council as part of the land swap with the NHS in 2009, for the former public swimming baths on Bath Street

The council is proposing to dispose of the Grade 2 Listed buildings Bank House (88) and 86 Sankey Street – which have been empty for a number of years – paving the way to a major residential-led/mixed use scheme at

A proposed redevelopment scheme has been brought forward, seeking to convert the existing buildings into a boutique hotel, restaurant, spa and swimming pool, along with the development of residential apartments and public car park.

The plans aim to bring two landmark, town centre buildings back into use, and provide a high quality development on a strategic corner site, adjacent to the Town Hall and opposite the cultural quarter.

It will also provide a capital receipt for the council.

The residential element of the proposal is being supported due to the site's inclusion in the Council's Strategic Housing Availability Assessment (SHLAA)

Warrington Borough Council Leader, Cllr Russ Bowden, said: "We have strong aspirations for Warrington town centre, and these plans aim to support our ongoing economic regeneration

"Bringing forward the development of the Garven Place site has been a long held ambition, and the current market and wider town centre developments mean we now have a fantastic opportunity to do this.

"This is a strategically important, high profile site, and it would enable us to regenerate an area of unused vacant land and deliver an aspirational and quality scheme for the town centre." The Garven Place site comprises

the former clinic site and adjoining public car park together with the listed buildings, Bank House (no 88) and No

86 Sankey Street. The site comprises approximately 1.38 acres (0.56 ha).

Bank House (No 88) has been vacant since 2014 when it ceased to be used by Golden Gates Housing Trust as an operational office. 86 Sankey Street is partly leased. However, it is proposed the buildings will be offered with vacant possession, and with discussions now taking place with the current tenant. Land to the rear of Bank House

is currently an operational counciloperated public car park, and a condition of the sale is that this provision remains somewhere within the redevelopment scheme.

The site is cleared, levelled and fenced with direct access from Sankey

There will be a report back to Cabinet in 2020 for final terms for a disposal of the property, once details of the project and planning consent are confirmed.

With the start of the new school year you may have found that the number of applications for a change in working hours have increased.

From June 2014 any employee with over 26 weeks service can submit an application for flexible working - for any reason - so what can you do to ensure that shaking up work patterns doesn't have a detrimental impact on the office?

#1 - Treat everyone equally - Consider the reasoning behind everyone's desire to change hours - not just parents or carers.

Compromise can be found, but having a flexible working policy in place allows an open discussion between employee and employer.

#2 - Grant flexibility, with accountability - Allow people their flexible hours; health and well-being is important and can have a much more positive impact in the office. But if the amended hours are having a detrimental impact for whatever reason, these can be addressed with the individual

#3 - Don't be forced - You can reject a request to change employment hours, but you must reject it on fair and business grounds.

The legislation does not give employees the right to work flexibly. Instead it provides a right to request flexible

What if it is too late for a Lasting Power of Attorney?

Kristel Clarke, Solicitor in the Private Client team at FDR Law advises that Lasting Powers of Attorney or LPA's are very useful documents which you can make while you have capacity to appoint people to act for you if you lose capacity. Your chosen attorneys will act in your best interests if you can no longer make decisions for yourself. You can have more than one attorney and can appoint them in different ways. There are two types – one for Property and Finances and one for Health and Welfare Decisions.

There is generally no ongoing supervision or Court involvement.

But what if you haven't made a Lasting Power of Attorney? What if the loss of capacity was sudden before you had the chance to make a Lasting Power of Attorney? Who can access your bank and investments and pay bills for you? Who can make decisions about your welfare?

your weltare?

If you lose capacity without appointing attorneys, the Court of Protection can appoint a Deputy to look after your property and financial affairs. The Court can appoint a family member or friend but in some instances a professional is required. is required.

Applying to the Court of Protection to appoint a Deputy can be complex. As part of the process interested people such



as close friends and family must be notified of the application so that they have a right to respond. Medical evidence is required to prove to the Court that the person has lost capacity. If the application is successful the Court will make an order outlining the Deputy's rights and responsibilities.

Once appointed, the Deputy must submit an annul report to the Court detailing all income and expenditure such as paying bills, investment decisions, purchases etc. The Deputy will be supervised the Office of the Public Guardian and may also be visited by a representative from the Court of Protection from time to time to ensure that they are carrying out their role and duties properly.

Applying to the Court Protection can be a complicated and daunting. We can support you through the process and make it as easy as possible. We can also make the application on your behalf and act as Deputy if required. 

Dancer Kate returns to her roots



PROFESSIONAL dancer Kate Jackson chose to return to her Warrington roots ahead of a series of performances at this year's Edinburgh Fringe Festival.

Contemporary dancer Kate has been commissioned by, and worked with Culture Warrington, before, so returning to Pyramid Arts Centre to rehearse

Airplane of Flowers was an easy decision.

Originally from Warrington, Kate returned to the town seven years ago after working in London and was delighted by the change she saw.

She said: "It's amazing that we've got somewhere like Pyramid and Parr Hall here; I've been coming to this building all my working life and it's great to be connected with Culture Warrington again."

Previous collaborations with the arts charity include Household, SOLO

and All-one with the support of Arts Council England and Warrington Borough Council.

Other credits include being artist in residence at Northern School of Contemporary Dance where she trained and she has taught extensively and is a newly qualified yoga teacher.

"The town has doubled in size since I moved back here from London," she added. "The art scene seems to be thriving and there's a great dance

programme developing here.

"That's why I've made most of my work here."

Her most recent residency at Pyramid has been in preparation for a series of performances of Airplane of Flowers which took place at Edinburgh Fringe's Forest theatre.

The piece was originally commissioned by Merseyside Dance Initiative for Liverpool's LEAP dance festival in 2018 and features a solo performed by LJMU Masters student Abbi Henderson.

Kate said: "I was looking for ideas at the point of time when Syria was being discussed a lot and terrorism was very much in people's consciousness; it was just before the Manchester Arena bombing to put it into context.

"I started to research the affects that war, terrorism and injustice can have on individuals and the community."

Kate also draw on her awareness of the IRA bombings which took place.

Kate also drew on her awareness of the IRA bombings which took place on Bridge Street on March 20, 1993, killing 12-year-old Tim Parry and three-year-old Johnathan Ball.

She spent a year and a half carrying out research with organisations like the Tim Parry and Johnathan Ball Peace Foundation and Survivor Alliance,

and volunteered with charities like Asylum Link Merseyside.

"I was interested in what happens to a community which has been affected by a bomb like that; what changes take place, how people's sensitivities

"The Irish people felt so passionately about what had happened in Warrington that they sent loads of flowers which came, of course, by plane; I thought it would be nice to highlight that with the title of the piece. That really resonated with me.

"I started asking lots of questions about what's in place to support people after something like this happens, what can prepare people for the

Speaking about Airplane of Flowers, Kate said: "Although it's not graphic, it is by its nature a small stand against the storm of violence against women and children in terrorism and the need now, in that light, to hold tighter to our understanding of community and one-ness.

"Airplane of Flowers celebrates the innocence of life, the great social

part of being human that makes us all connected and loved, and the ability

within us all to survive and recover."

Kate has once again been commissioned by Culture Warrington to create a new performance as part of this year's Warrington Contemporary Arts

Leah Biddle, cultural manager for Culture Warrington, revealed that Kate is working with students from Priestley College for a WCAF paving event to take place in the town centre during the Heritage Open Days weekend in September.

Leah said: "It's been fantastic having Kate as our artist in residence this summer, knowing that we are helping one of our local artists in the development of their work, especially when it is for such a renowned platform as Edinburgh Fringe.

"I have been lucky enough to work with Kate on several projects and it's a wonderful opportunity to now be able to connect an artist of her calibre with students from Priestley College in creating new work for this year's Warrington Contemporary Arts Festival."

Meanwhile Priestley College achieved its best ever set of A-Level results as the Class of 2019 secured an overall pass rate of 99.4%.

There was a 100% pass rate 34 subjects with impressive in 34 subjects with impressive results across subjects as diverse as Chemistry, Biology, Politics, Architecture, Performing Arts, Art and Design, Music and Computing. Principal Matthew Grant said both A* to B and A* to C grades were at record levels and praised the hard work of students and staff

"I always knew I didn't want to go to university and the careers advisers at college really helped me as I was looking for the right apprenticeship," he said.

More than half of town's residents fail to take up free NHS health check

WARRINGTON has been labelled one of the least proactive when it comes to health following a report which shows less than half those eligible took up free NHS health

eligible took up free NHS health MOTs.
With the current NHS Health Check scheme set to be "scrapped" a report by Medicspot revealed only 46% of eligible people had participated in the scheme, although Warrington Council say they are ranked 58th best out of 152 areas – but admit they could do better. do better.

The report compares regional The report compares regional NHS data on the utilisation of Health Checks, a free service offered by the NHS to everyone aged 40–74 to prevent premature death from heart disease, stroke, kidney disease and type 2 diabetes. Warrington was named in the spect as a more the least properties.

report as among the least proactive places in England when it comes to health due to the low number of people who took part in the scheme over the last five years. The government announced it

plans to replace the scheme with a digital version that makes use of

a digital version that makes use of technology to save people needing to book face-to-face appointments with their GP.

Out of the 63,648 eligible people in Warrington, all were offered a free NHS Health Check between 2014 and 2019.



Despite this, only 46% of those eligible in the town received a Health Check. For comparison, as many as 88% of the eligible population in Bolton received a Health Check within the same period.

Dr Johnson D'souza, Medical Director and GP at Medicspot, advised: "People aged 40–74 who don't get a Health Check every five years are at an increased risk of undetected cardiovascular disease.

"By checking your blood pressure, lifestyle, family history, height and weight, we can get an idea of your risk of getting certain illnesses including heart disease, stroke and diabetes," explains D'souza.

"It is very worrying that only

46% of people who were eligible for a free NHS Health Check in Warrington took up the offer," he added.

In June, researchers revealed free NHS checks reduce the risk cardiovascular disease. study found that over a six-year period, participants of the Health Check programme had lost weight, lowered blood pressure and fewer were smokers. Officials are yet to provide precise details of what look like in Warrington, but they said they would harness 'the latest technology, techniques, and data' and would include factors 'that could include their age, where they live and their DNA' to personalise health checks.

Despite the planned overhaul, people in Warrington who are aged 40–70 can still get a Health Check from their GP or pharmacist. This would usually involve receiving a letter from your GP or local authority to invite you for a Health Check. However, you can also request one yourself by contacting Warrington Council for more information.

But a Warrington Borough Council spokesperson said: "NHS Health Checks are not being

scrapped either in Warrington or the rest of England. The Department of Health and Social Care will shortly be launching a national review into the programme, aimed at making it more effective.

at making it more effective.
"While this review is taking place, NHS Health Checks will continue in Warrington under the current model.
"Around 46% of Warrington's eligible population received a NHS Health Check between 2014 and 2019. As a result, the borough is ranked as the 58th best performing local Authority out of a total of 152 areas. We are certainly not among the 'least proactive places in the 'least proactive places in England when it comes to health'.
"We do however recognise that we can improve further and

we are looking at a number of ways to increase the uptake including further training for staff in GP Practices, community based provision of NHS Health Checks, and further awareness raising

campaigns.

"We would very much like to encourage local residents to take up the offer of the NHS Health Check and they can contact their GP directly to request one."

"There are a range of other

services available locally to support people to look after their own health and wellbeing. To find out more details please access My Life Warrington at mylifewarrington.

New rules for personal service company

Anyone engaging someone through a personal service company ("PSC") or operating through a PSC should be aware that from 6 April 2020 there will be two parallel systems for applying the IR35 rules depending on whether the engager (the end client) of the contract worker is worker is

a public sector body, or medium or large organisation in the private

sector; or a small private sector organisation.

In the first case the engager will

need to make the employment status determination to assess whether tax and NI deductions should be made as if the worker was an employee. In the second case the worker's PSC will make that decision as at present.

The engager will be in the second category if it meets two of the following three conditions for the financial period ending in the previous tax year:

- an annual turnover of less than £10.2m a balance sheet total of less than £5.1m no more than 50 employees

Whilst these criteria are based on the Companies Act definition of a small company they also apply for this purpose to all engagers. It is not clear how the contractor will know which category their customer (the engager) falls into, other than whether or not they receive an employment status determination.

- If the engager is in the first category they must: decide the employment status of a worker for every contract agreed with an agency or worker
- pass that determination and the reasons for the decision to the worker
- and to the agency it contracts with keep detailed records of all employment status determinations, including the reasons for the determination and the fees paid
- have processes in place to deal with any disputes that arise from the

determination
It is also clear that the engager must make the employment status determination on or before the date the contract is entered into. The contractor has a right of appeal against the determination.

The engager must take reasonable care when making the determination, but the HMRC guidance does not advise the engager what evidence it needs to take into account when making that determination. In practice, HMRC will expect the engager to use the check employment status for tax (CEST) tool to reach a decision on employment status. But the CEST has been criticised by the professional accounting and tax bodies and contractor groups for ignoring key elements of the employment status tests as established by case law. HMRC says it will be updating the CEST in time for implementation of the revised off-payroll rules.


