Editor's comment

AS the local parish councillor for the ward affected by plans for a huge distribution centre on Green Belt land at Appleton Thorn, I would like to place on record my outrage that the QC appointed by Eddie Stobart put on record at the recent public inquiry that democratically elected representatives of the area "have arrived at the conclusion" that this development is acceptable.

This is a complete distortion of the facts with not a single elected representative in the area affected being in support of it!

Yes members of the planning committee voted for it - but not one of them represents the area - in fact one of them didn't even know the site in question!

Meanwhile Eddie Stobart say they have no "plan B" if their controversial plans to build a £75m National Distribution Centre on Green Belt land at Appleton Thorn is rejected by the Secretary of State.

This certainly wasn't their attitude when the first planning application

was rejected as I heard members of their planning team saying they had other sites in mind.

In reality this is the most convenient site next to their existing HQ and it appears to matter little that not only will it involve destroying our Green Belt but also open up the way for the even bigger and more daunting Six 56 proposal by Langtree on nearby land.

I found it particularly disappointing

I found it particularly disappointing that Warrington Borough Council not only withdrew their objections but stated that the appeal should be allowed and planning permission be granted.

Whatever Planning Inspector David Wildsmith recommends after hearing all the arguments for and against, the final decision will rest with the Secretary of State due to the site being a "significant green belt development."

As this appeal was heard taking into account the slightly revised second planning application, which was approved by the planning committee, instead of the original application which was rejected, let



us hope that the secretary of state, on seeing all the submissions, will make the right decision for the local community - and ensure this area of Green Belt is protected for the benefit of future generations.

Warrington already suffers from far too much gridlock and pollution and transforming farmland into lorry parks and warehousing will not help the situation.

the situation.

Meanwhile we continue to all suffer from the ongoing nightmare of the outdated swing bridges breaking down on a regular basis creating traffic chaos right across Warrington.

Talks have been going on with Peel for years now in a bid to resolve the problems and update and paint the the bridges.

We now need actions not words!

New era for historic glasshouses at Walton Hall Pictures: Andy Gilbert

ONE of Warrington's best-loved historical assets – the Walton Hall conservatory range has officially re-opened following its £2m restoration.

A special opening ceremony brought together a range of people who have helped bring the magnificent conservatories back to life, from the labourers to the design specialists – all with their own passion for heritage.

Also celebrating the re-opening were a number of people who have supported the project during development and delivery, including Tiffany Hunt MBE, Chair of The National Lottery Heritage Fund in the North of England; the Friends of Walton Estate; and former conservatories staff from the past 50 years, who have given their time for the creation of a new audio social history of the estate.

It is the start of an exciting new

era for the conservatories, which had fallen into disrepair for almost 25 years after closing to the public in September 1993.

In 2016, Warrington Borough Council was successful in securing £2m in funding from The National Heritage Fund, the way to the restoration of the conservatories, working with a team of heritage specialists.

After three years of partnership working with Rosslee Construction, the conservatories are shining once more and ready to re-take their proud place part of a vibrant Walton Hall

The conservatories now have a bright future as an educational hub and a place of accessible learning, with a sustainable partnership formed with Myerscough College and Walton Lea Project to deliver apprenticeships, qualifications and opportunities for social enterprise.

This collaboration will also lead to the development of other areas of the estate, such as the historic formal gardens, conservatory planting and zoo, all of which will further increase public participation and learning.

Education will be at the heart the opening ceremony, entertainment provided by children from Stockton Heath Primary School and classical music quartet Flutiful, and certficates presented to learners and staff from Walton Lea Partnership who have gained a qualification with Myerscough College. The students will be conducting tours and talking about their plans for the future in the Conservatory Range and Shippon.

The restoration of the

conservatories is entirely in keeping the original, containing thousands of pieces of slender, elegant timber. During the renovation, each piece of this timber was removed and tagged before being assessed for rot.

This original timber was then used internally with new timber being used for the external heams.

The original ironwork has been repaired and reused throughout the conservatories, and with over 90% of the bricks dating back to 1899-1910 in excellent condition, this project has been true to its original construction; guaranteeing significant heritage history of the site for future generations.

Warrington Borough Council's Cabinet Member for Leisure and Community, Cllr Tony Higgins, said: "The journey of progress to reinstate the Walton Hall conservatories to their former glory has been a long

one.
"There have been many people involved in its transformation all playing a vital role in ensuring its rightful place on the Walton Estate.

'Supported by the National heritage lottery fund ,the council and armed by a strong friends group Walton Hall and it's glass conservatories is a

destination to be proud of .
"Walton Hall may have its roots set in the past but it's now looking towards the future with the partnership of Myerscough College and the Walton Lea Project all firmly positioned to deliver educational and supportive activities.

"I'm immensely proud to be the cabinet member responsible, partnership working is vital for success and this is a fine example of

Clipper Ships are the nearest things to dreams that hands have ever made

A bold statement from Star Clipper, but as we sail away from Bali in the warm evening breeze, cocktail in hand and 'Conquest of Paradise' by Vangelis pounding from the speakers you just cannot help becoming part of this dream. Many of our fellow passengers were wiping away tears of joy and excitement



for the days ahead. The Tall Ship 'Star Clipper' has 82 cabins and carries a maximum of 170 passengers making a very intimate ambience and after a couple of days you are like one big family. My partner and I flew to Bali via Dubai and enjoyed an overnight stay in The Seminyak Beach Resort before embarking on our week long cruise. We sailed from and returned to Bali; visiting five islands in the Indonesian region of Lombok. The climate in June was idyllic hovering around 30c and not too humid with evenings only dropping a couple of degrees.

Accommodation on board is more than adequate for sleeping and changing. It was complete with porthole, TV and hair-dryer, but time should not be spent in your cabin as you risk missing out on all the action!

Council to monitor air quality in village

STOCKTON Heath Parish Council has taken delivery of an air quality monitor to enable it to measure air pollution in the village.

The £4,000 device will be installed in London Road near the swing bridge – thought to be the area which suffers most from pollution created by road traffic.

But for the time being it is being tested at Great Sankey – next to the official DEFRA air quality monitor for

Cllr Peter Walker explained: "By comparing the readings with the official DEFRA readings we will be able to check if it is giving accurate readings. Once we are assured about that we will be using the device in

Stockton Heath.

'It is a mobile device so we will be able to move it around the village to monitor the air in various places. But London Road is the obvious place

Road traffic causes various types of air pollution harmful to health, including carbon monoxides, hydrocarbons, nitrogen oxide and particulate matter. Once the machine is operational, residents will be able to check the level of pollution at any given time, either via the parish

council's website or via a direct link. Cllr Walker said: "We are particularly concerned about any increase in pollution that might arise following the construction of thousands of

new houses to the south of Stockton Heath. It could lead to up to 4,000 additional vehicles coming through "Even if they are electric cars they still cause pollution from tyres, brakes, etc., so we are keen to be able to check particulate matter.

Money Column

Don't ignore the taxman

It is never wise to ignore the taxman. If you do then they have substantial powers to determine the amount of tax that is owed and to pursue it. Those powers, however, are not unlimited and this was illustrated in a recent case that was appealed by the taxpayer to the First Tier Tribunal ("FTT").

It appears that HMRC received information It appears that HMRC received information from World Pay that the taxpayer, Cussons ("C") had received payments in respect of the buying and selling of used cars. They approached C about this but he failed to reply to HMRC both at the start of the enquiry and at every stage thereafter. Therefore, HMRC were compelled to use "best independent" to grain at the tax due from the limited information available to



judgements" to arrive at the tax due from the limited information available to them. They issued determinations for the years 2004/5 to 2015/16 which totalled a staggering £342,943.11 in tax and penalties. This was based on receipts for 2015/16 from which they deducted 50% in expenses. This "profit" was then worked back over the previous 11 years using the Retail Prices Index to allow for inflation.

Not surprisingly, this caused C to lift his head from out of the sand and to appeal the determinations to the FTT. At that appeal he stated that he was in receipt of enhanced employment and support allowance, which is paid to people unable to work due to physical or mental impairments, and had no income that took him above the personal allowance. At the hearing C was accompanied by his 81 year old father who stated both that the vehicles were actually traded through his company and that the average profit was

In cases such as this the FTT must follow a two-stage process. Firstly, did HMRC use their best judgement in making their assessments based on the information available. If not, the assessments fail. If (and only if) they did does the FTT then consider whether the assessments should be reduced on the basis of any additional evidence available. In doing so, the FTT must assume as its starting point that HMRC made an honest and genuine attempt to arrive at a fair assessment. Also, it is not sufficient for the FTT to disagree with HMRC's conclusions. They can only overturn the assessments if those conclusions are unreasonable

In this instance the taxpayer was lucky. The FTT agreed with the taxpayer that it was unreasonable for HMRC to use a 50% profit margin which seemed to be a figure "just plucked from the air" and seemed to be designed to frighten the taxpayer into providing the information requested. The assessments therefore tailed and were overturned. They added that it was not their duty to rework the assessment but said that HMRC could start again if they wished based on the additional information now available.

No doubt HMRC will learn their own lessons from this case. From the perspective of taxpayers the lesson to be learnt is simple. They should not bury heads in sand but should cooperate at all times with HMRC in arriving at a fair result.




