Where does your employer responsibilities lie when organising a christmas function whilst keeping in the christmas spirit?

The number one underlying problem, is that of drunk and disorderly behavior. If people go too far, equipment. furniture and ultimately, feelings, could get damaged.

Moreso, in the alcohol-fueled, setting of Christmas party, emotions can be thrown to the sky and unwanted violence and sexual advances can rear their ugly heads.

Staff have a right to feel safe in the workplace, and that includes Christmas parties - so outline expectations beforehand.

This can be done with a simple email to staff, but outlining appropriate behavior in a policy on work-related social events will help deal with any unruly activities.

'Sick days' can also be common after a Christmas party, when in reality, people are tired, hungover etc.

Outline beforehand the expectation for staff to be in work following a christmas function or advise them to book a days annual leave if they have doubts of making it into the office!

Should any employee fail to comply with the basic standards outlined by yourself, take HR action.

This could be as simple as calling someone in for an informal chat, or as tricky as taking disciplinary action depending on the circumstances.

Dream comes true as missing Da Vinci inspired "masterpiece" goes on display

A DREAM has come true for local artist Lee Trantum with his missing "masterpiece" inspired by Leonardo Da Vinci now on display in Warrington Museum & Art Gallery.

Gallery. Earlier this year warrington-worldwide reported on talented Lee's amazing work and following the publicity his dream of seeing the "masterpiece" on display in his home town museum and art gallery has come true.

Lee, who works as a process operator at Crosfields as his "day operator at Crostields as his "day job," spent seven months working on his version of Da Vinci's "Salvator Mundi". Self taught Lee, 47, has always had a natural ability to draw and through the years he has studied all mediums pareil watercolour

all mediums pencil, watercolour, acrylics and oils. In the early 90s he completed 2 BTEC courses at North Cheshire College achieving Distinctions, but made the decision not to progress to university. to university.

His artistic hero has always been Leonardo Da Vinci and his goal was to produce a renaissance

piece. In 2017 the painting "Salvator Mundi," attributed as the lost Da Vinci, sold for a record fee, \$400m at Christie's New York.

While the buyer is a mystery it is rumoured to be a Saudi Prince and the "missing" masterpiece is still not

on public display. Commenting on his work of art appearing in Warrington Museum and art gallery Lee said: "Firstly, a big thank you to Gary and Warrington Worldwide. Without their bala this menuated by without their

help this may not of happened. "I am grateful to the Warrington Museum & Art Gallery for the opportunity to exhibit my painting. "I see this as a huge moment in

my development as an artist, to have my artwork displayed in a public Gallery has always been my ambition.

"My version of Salvator Mundi is the first in a series of paintings inspired by Leonardo Da Vinci." Lee now hopes an exhibition of



'Secret Lowry' remembered with posthumous exhibition

A NEW exhibition is opening at Warrington Museum & Art Gallery in December to fulfil the final wish of an undiscovered local artist.

When former boxer and building labourer Eric Tucker died in 2018, he became the unlikely art 'Secret Lowry', who'd hidden his talent under a bushel for more than

60 years. Now Warrington Museum & Art Gallery are honouring the late artist with a tribute he hardly dared dream of – a full retrospective at the

dream of – a full retrospective at the 170-year-old gallery. Though he painted for more than 60 years, Tucker rarely spoke of his passion for art and made little effort to show his work. His nephew, Joe Tucker, said: "Amongst his piles of drawings we found a couple of old rejection letters from the Royal Academy, for their summer show.

"I think the rejection probably hurt him, he gave up trying to find recognition but he never stopped painting.

"Wherever he went he would take a stock of paper, often scraps, to record the people and the places.

"He drew surreptitiously in pubs and bars, often holding the paper below the table level, drawing whilst taking an occasional sip of bir drink "

A few months before his death, Tucker spoke to younger brother, Tony, of his dream of an exhibition. Although his close family knew he painted, they were staggered to



find more than 400 paintings, and thousands of drawings in his small, end-of-terrace house in Padgate, Warrington.

Hundreds of pieces were stacked up in every room; in cupboards, on top of wardrobes and even in the gården shed. Determined to honour his last

wish, the family opened his house as a gallery for a one-off, two-day exhibition.

Tony said: "We didn't know how nony people would come and have a look, we thought maybe one or two of the neighbours." In fact some 2,000 people

came from near and far, queuing round the block to see the artist's sensitive and evocative depictions

sensitive and evocative depictions of working-class life. The story of Tucker's paintings made national headlines, with critics feting the work as "serious stuff" (The Daily Mail) and "a remarkable, important find". (The i Navgraged)

Newspaper). Joe said: "The exhibition at Eric's home attracted a huge amount of attention; from the media, his friends and neighbours, and even

complete strangers. "It seemed as though Eric was finally beginning to find the

recognition that had eluded him in

life." The success of the pop-up exhibition paved the way for talks between the Tucker family and Warrington Museum & Art Gallery, who have been working together for over a year to curate Eric's first solo exhibition at a public gallery.

Eric Tucker: The Unseen Artist will feature a broad selection of Tucker's paintings and drawings, including favourites from the exhibition at his home and many never-before-seen images.

It will also feature a recreation of Eric's small front room, in which every single painting was created.

Roger Jeffery, producer at Culture Warrington – the charity that runs Warrington Museum & Art Gallery, Warrington Contemporary Arts Festival, Pyramid and Parr Hall – is delighted to be unveiling the exhibition next month.

He said: "Eric's story is so unique and his portrayal of our town is something that really resonates with the Warrington public, so it's a real honour to be finally presenting his work at Warrington Museum and Art Callony this winter

Work at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery this winter." Eric Tucker: The Unseen Artist runs from Saturday November 23 2019 to Sunday 23 February 2020 at Warrington Museum & Art Collery and is free to visit Gallery and is free to visit.



Warrington Remembers



GLORIOUS sunshine and clear blue skies greeted thousands of people who turned out for Warrington's annual Service of Remembrance at the town's newly refurbished cenotaph.

After days of heavy rain the clear skies and sunshine were a welcome addition to proceedings at the new look Bridge Foot War Memorial to commemorate the sacrifice and suffering of war and to pray for the peace of the world.

suffering of war and to pray for the peace of the world. A special re-dedication of the Warrington War memorial was read by The Revd. Stewart McTaggart, Acting Rector of Warrington.

A screen wall at the back of the cenotaph obelisk, designed by former Warrington Council borough surveyor Andrew Kerr and originally unveiled in November 1925, lists the names of 1,161 local servicemen who died during the First World War. A further dedication was added commemorating the 435 local servicemen and 22 civilians who died during the Second World War. Details of those who died in later conflicts have also been added over the years.

Warrington óbserved the two minutes national silence following the remembering read by Lt. Col. Les Taylor-Duff.

Rylands keeper climbs to top of world in aid of cancer centre

GOALKEEPER Graeme McCall's name was missing from the Rylands FC team sheet for a couple of weeks in October but he certainly was not just putting his feet up taking a rest.

The Rylands number one along with four friends – Liam Pilkington, John Bullen, Gregg Jaymes & Jonathon Keddie – was in Africa climbing the world's tallest free standing mountain.

standing mountain. Their goal in reaching the summit of the 19,341 ft high (above sea level) Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania was to raise money for "The Lilac Centre" based in Whiston and St Helens hospitals which cares for cancer patients and their families.

their families. Graeme explained his reasons behind the climb: "It is becoming all too frequent that you hear about so many people being affected by Cancer in some form or other however, it wasn't until my own sister was recently diagnosed with breast cancer that it hit home how tough the battle and journey really is not only for her but also for her family and friends". "Only by being thrown into this

"Only by being thrown into this life changing situation you come to realise how tirelessly hard NHS staff, individual groups and charities work to make this difficult time as comfortable as possible for the patients and families of those affected by this disease. The various heart-warming touches provided by the NHS staff at my sister's hospital have inspired me to want to give something back and to help other families affected in the same way."

tamilies attected in the same way." "Upon sharing my ambitions of fund raising with my work colleagues at Bolton Steel Structures they too were inspired by my sister's story and generously pledged to help raise funds and awareness. They began the fundraising by offering the chance of a lifetime for me and some fellow colleagues to fly to Africa to Trek to the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro. This act of kindness in its self deserves worthy recognition and I can't thank them enough for providing this fantastic opportunity to raise money for such an important cause".

an important cause". Before setting out Graeme said "It's going to be a tough battle to get to the top but nowhere near as tough as the battle thousands go through with their own battle with cancer". On his return he described the six days spent on the mountain as "horrendous."

as "horrendous." Having prepared for the trip by undertaking a weekend boot camp he continued; "It was the hardest thing I have ever done, I had altitude sickness from the second day and since returning have been receiving treatment for malaria".

receiving treatment for malaria". "I set my stall high as I wanted to raise £15,000". A total which has already been surpassed but further contributions are still being accepted because Graeme says "once the £15,000 has been donated to the Lilac Centre any extra funds will be donated to other local cancer charities".
