

Olivia reaches final in national singing contest

FOURTEEN-year-old girl from Appleton Thorn has reached the finals of the national Open Mic UK singing competition.

Olivia Mae Booth has already won through the regional and area finals the North West and the Midlands and will now sing at the national finals at the O2 in London on February

About 10-12,000 singers enter the competition for unsigned artists every year and Olivia will have a chance in both the Under 16 age group and the open age category meaning she could

be the grand winner.

The former Bridgewater High School pupil's talent for singing first showed when, as a young child, she started singing along to pop songs.

Singing lessons confirmed she had a natural talent and, after two years at Bridgewater High she moved to a specialist performing arts school in

Here, she got a chance to sing to audiences of more than 300 but it was only when she entered the preliminary rounds of Open Mic UK that she found herself in front of really big audiences.

Proud Mum Gaynor said: "We don't know where she got it from - nobody

else in the family has been much of a singer. But right from the start her singing teachers have recognised she had a natural ability.

Now we are all excited about her appearing in the finals. We have been

told it is one of the toughest singing competitions in the country but Olivia is very determined and we are obviously hopeful."

Dream comes true as Adam meets his dream dinner guest

A DREAM came true for former Bridgewater High School pupil Adam White, the youngest ever Fellow and current President of the Landscape Institute, when he recently presented Sir David Attenborough lifetime achievement award.

As president of the professional body representing all landscape architects in the UK Adam got the chance to have dinner with Sir David and present him with his award.

It topped a busy year for Adam who has also co designed four RHS gardens with HRH the Duchess of Cambridge, met former US Vice President Al Gore and now considers Sir David a friend.

Adam is famous for designing and

nature play spaces with his business partner, fellow landscape architect, Andree Davies.

They have won two prestigious RHS Gold Medals, popular two BBC People's Choice Awards and an elusive RHS Best in Show for their work. During 2019 the design duo famously codesigned four nature inspired gardens with HRH the Duchess of Cambridge at RHS Chelsea, RHS Hampton, RHS Wisley and an NHS Trust in Devon. The gardens gained global attention and the duo appeared in the worldwide press including TV in the UK, Australia, America, South Africa and Canada.

Adam has always been really keen to promote landscape architecture as career choice and in July 2018 he launched a career campaign called #ChooseLandscape. The initiative has now gone global and has been adopted in 22 countries around the world. His message is simple 'you could be the next landscape superhero

of tomorrow'.

As President of the Landscape Institute, Adam was the first industry leader to announce a Climate Crisis and Biodiversity Emergency Declaration in June. This led to being invited to speak at the IFLA World Congress in Oslo, Norway and the World Urban Parks Summit in Kazan, Russia. The declaration and associated actions have now been adopted by 77 different countries who make up the International Federation of Landscape Architects.

Adam was then invited to meet former US Vice President and 2007 Nobel Peace prize winner Al Gore.



Al Gore got the world talking about climate change with his Academy Award-winning Film An Inconvenient Truth in 2006. He founded what would become The Climate Reality Project to move the conversation forward and turn awareness into action. Since their meeting Adam has been helping raise awareness of the project and encouraging more landscape architects to be adapt their working practice and projects to be more sustainable.

For five years Adam was host of the Landscape Institute's annual awards, however when he became President he stepped down from this role. This year they were hosted by Adam's friend, BBC Gardeners World presenter Arit Anderson.

They celebrated 90 years of the Landscape Institute, founded at RHS Chelsea in 1929. However, the real highlight for the guests and those tuning in online was the attendance of Sir David Attenborough.

Adam presented Sir David with the LI Medal for Lifetime Achievement at the Awards, he also made him an Honorary Fellow of the landscape Institute. Sir David spoke about the importance of reconnecting communities with nature, and the part this can play in ensuring the natural world's protection. You have a great responsibility to bring the realities of the natural world to the understanding and the love of human beings worldwide, Sir David told the 700 in attendance at the Troxy theatre

in east London and the thousands tuning in to watch online.

Following the awards Adam said "He silenced the room and reminded us all of our responsibility to make a difference no matter how small or large. It was a career highlight to spend the day with him."

"During the awards meal I asked him who his dream dinner guest would be, he couldn't think of any one that he hadn't already met, however he said he would have loved to have met Charles Darwin. He then asked me who my perfect dinner was? I replied 'I am sat having dinner with him!' he smiled and patted me on my wrist.

"Having written to each other several times since March the challenge for both of us was finding a suitable event and time to meet and make the announcement. We both agreed the 90th anniversary awards would be the perfect occasion.

"He is such a kind, gentle and patient man. We talked about our own childhoods and how we both enjoyed finding fossils and exploring nature, even talked about rugby league!"
Whilst Director of BBC2 Sir David,

was instrumental in the creation of the BBC2 Floodlit Trophy. A rugby league competition held between 1965 and 1980, designed specifically for television. When the competition was first mooted not many clubs were equipped with floodlights, but the tournament caused no fewer than twenty-one clubs to install them.

Adam awarded the What's Growing

on the Greenway, by the Paul Hogarth Company's Anthony McGuigan and Darren McKinstry, the prestigious LI President's Award. The Connswater Community Greenway brilliantly connects people to the green space and biodiversity around them through a 9km linear park in East Belfast. Following the course of the Connswater, Knock and Loop Rivers, the Greenway creates a vibrant, attractive, and accessible parkland for leisure, recreation, and community events.

Adam closed the awards with a message about the Climate Crisis telling the audience "Where there is action, there is hope, every single person in this room can make a difference both at home and at work. Landscape architects and landscape professionals are perfectly positioned to take the lead and make a difference. Time to act is now! He then introduced a pre-recorded message from Greta Thunberg who was travelling across the Atlantic Ocean in a boat to the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Spain.

Adam followed up the event with a key note talk in Lyon in France at the Paysalia Landscape Conference before returning back to the UK for a well-earned rest over the festive break with his patient partner Sarah and supportive Mum, Susan.



Cricket legend wins praise - 17 years after retiring from the game

GRAPPENHALL cricket legend Neil Fairbrother won praise at the BBC Sports Personality of the Year prize night - 17 years after he retired from

Fairbrother, the former Lancashire and England batsman, who started his career at Grappenhall Cricket Club and is still a regular visitor to the Broad Lane ground, was singled out for praise by the winner – superstar Ben Stokes.

Stokes, whose performances for England in the World Cup final and the third Ashes Test at Headingley, thanked all who had helped him through what he admitted had been a difficult two years.

But he singled out Fairbrother - his

agent - for special praise.

He said: "Two years ago was a tough time in my life. I've had so many people help me through that.

"My fantastic manager and friend,

Neil Fairbrother is here tonight. You are more than an agent, as you get called these days. You're an incredible human being and an incredible man.

"I literally don't know how you've put up with Andrew Flintoff to start with and then me!"

Neil Fairbrother was educated at Lymm Grammar School - now Lymm High School – and started his cricketing career at Grappenhall.

He was a long serving player at Lancashire, where he was captain in 1992-93 and played until 2002. He played in 10 Test matches and 75 One Day Internationals between 1987 and 1999. His top score was 366 for Lancashire against Surrey - scored in a single day.

Last summer, Ben Stokes showed an earlier sign of his regard for his manager when he took time off from the Old Trafford Test to visit Grappenhall, along with other England players, including captain Joe Root, to present a commemorative bench in memory of Fairbrother's father, Les, a stalwart of the Broad Lane club who had sadly died in July.





Money Column

January once again

Well here we are again in January. Everyone at WatkinsonBlack hope that you all had a really enjoyable Christmas with your friends and family, and that you are now looking forward to a successful 2020. Like all accountants we are buckling down to a busy month ensuring that, wherever possible, clients do not suffer any fines or penalties for not getting their tax return in on time. Because of this we are writing this column very early. In fact, we have still to vote in the General Election so as we write we do not know the result. Whoever wins, there must be a very early

budget to prepare the country for the next fiscal year which starts on 5th April. Therefore, whatever you read may have been overtaken by events, so watch out for any changes in the next few issues.

One major change that has been in the making for a considerable time is the change to the IR35 legislation. This was originally proposed in 1999 and introduced into law in April 2000. It was designed to counter perceived tax avoidance by people working through a Limited Company. However, it proved singularly unsuccessful and has been amended several time since. The last major amendment was in 2017 when the responsibility for determining the status of a "worker" in the public sector was moved from the "worker" to the "engager". The current proposal is to extend this to the majority of the private sector from April 2020.

As part of the IR35 introduction the tax office introduced a "Check Employment Status for Tax ("CEST"]" tool. Designed by HMRC to help taxpayers decide whether they were caught by the IR35 or not, this has proved completely unreliable due to it being biased in favour of HMRC. Because of this, HMRC has suffered a defeat in the majority of the cases taken before the Tax Tribunals, and many of those cases took years to conclude and caused a large amount of distress to the taxpayer. Whilst there have been some amendments to the CEST over the years it has never been successfully amended to take proper account of the recognised "badges of trade".

 \mbox{HMRC} has recently suffered a significant defeat in an important case concerning entertainers at the BBC. In view of these defeats, and the inevitable conclusion that even the people who designed the rules do not understand them, all of the main parties in the recent election promised to review the proposed extension of the legislation. Let us hope that this is one election promise that is kept.

Running group to take on the London Marathon



A RUNNING group made up of police officers, PCSOs and retired police officers is to run next year's London Marathon in aid of two charities.

Five-O Runners was set up in 2016 to help with people's physical fitness, well-being and mental fitness and has raised money for a number of charities over the last few years.

Now two members, Grappenhall and Thelwall PCSO Sharon Perrie and retired Now two members, Grappennall and Inelwall PCSO Sharon Perrie and retired PC Tony Davidson are to run the marathon to support Jessie May, a children's hospice-at-home service and two others, PC Chris Davis and PC Gary Geoghegan will run for the Lupus UK charity, which supports people suffering from an incurable illness affecting the immune system.

A spokesperson for Five-0 Runners said: "Our group was set up to encourage people to get out and enjoy running and the company of others.

"It is very easy to feel alone and isolated in the job that we do but with our running group it is a way to help make sure that does not happen. We are a free

group that welcomes everyone that wishes to be part of something.
"Over the last few year's we have raised money for different charities including stick n' step, children's cancer, Adam foundation (knife crime awareness charity) as well as many mental health awareness charities. Now on the April 26, 2020, four of our runners are doing the London Marathon together.

"We have decided to run for two charities. Jessie May provides vital end-of-life care, emotional support and bereavement support for terminally ill children and their families.

"Lupus is a charity for people suffering with an illness affecting the immune system which may then affect any part of the body. It can be triggered in various ways and 90 per cent of people who are affected are female, although men and young children can also be affected.

"We hope to attract support such as cash donations, vouchers or raffle prizes which we can offer to the running community.

"We will display sponsor details on our running tops and hope to be interviewed by the media to promote any companies that have donated. "Any support will be highly appreciated by us and our chosen charities."

Digital display plan rejected

AN application for planning permission to replace an existing advertising hoarding in London Road, Stockton Heath, with a digital display has been thrown out by the borough council on the grounds it would cause harm to heritage assets within the Stockton Heath Conservation Area, not balanced by public benefit.

Road where 93% of vehicles exceed speed limit

SPEEDWATCH volunteers monitoring traffic in Grappenhall and Thelwall say up to

93 per cent of vehicles exceed the speed limit on one road.

Broad Lane, Grappenhall is the blackspot for speeding traffic according to Speedwatch group member David Skelton in a report to Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council.

The percentage of vehicles speeding in the parish was: Knutsford Road, Grappenhall: 75 per cent; Weaste Lane, Thelwall: 28 per cent; Broad Lane, Grappenhall: 93 per cent; Hilltop Road: 39 per cent.

Mr Skelton said the group had spoken to the borough council highways department but unfortunately traffic calming could only be installed in areas

where there had been a fatality.

As a result, the group was looking into options for alternative funding.

They would continue to monitor areas with the speed gun, liaise with police

and continue to work with the borough council.

The council was told the clerk would also be seeking grant opportunities.

FDR Law advise pub chain on £17.9m sale

WARRINGTON based pub group Bravo Inns has been acquired by the Hawthorn Leisure arm of property investment firm NewRiver REIT plc in a deal worth £17.9m, with FDR Law's Corporate team advising on the sale.

Bravo Inns, which includes the local pubs Royal Oak Branch, Chapel House (Burtonwood) and Black Horse in its portfolio, has grown from just 5 pubs when formed in 2007 to 44 outlets across the North West. The group specialise in wet-led, operator managed, community pubs that will be merged into the Hawthorn Leisure brand.

Hawthorn Leisure operates over 650 leased, tenanted and managed pubs across community England, Scotland and Wales. Chief Executive of Hawthorn Leisure, Mark Davies commented: "The UK pub sector has experienced a recent revival in transaction activity and, as an early investor into community pubs, we have been tracking the success of Bravo Inns for some time. The transaction will increase our portfolio weighting in community pubs and demonstrates the value of our Hawthorn Leisure platform in identifying acquisitions that can deliver higher yielding sustainable cashflows with scale driven synergies.

On May 14, 'cellist Indira Grier, winner of a gold medal at this year's Vienna International Music Competition, will be performing. The Royal Northern College of Music


