Editor's Comment

CULCHETH & Glazebury Parish Council have sent an open letter to the Secretary of State for Transport, Grant Shapps, urging him to review the need for the HS2 Golborne Spur which would blight Culcheth and surrounding areas if it ever went ahead.

The council, also writing on behalf of Croft and Warburton Parish councils, welcome the news Parish councils, welcome the news it will be reviewed, together with his expectation that it might not be included in plans for the High Speed North rail system.

They say the cost of the entire Golborne Spur was estimated in 2015 at £1.9 bn; given the increase in HS2 costs since current

increase in HS2 costs since, current estimates are probably in the region of £2-3 bn.

In addition to its absurdly low financial benefit, the Golborne Spur will be driven through or close Spur will be arriven intrough or close to many communities, heritage locations, high grade agricultural land and ecologically important sites, causing a huge amount of

damage and permanent destruction with no discernible benefit.

This threat has been a blight on our local area for seven years and at one time threatened the destruction of Taylor Business Park before the route was moved slightly, but then impacting on other nearby businesses.

It can't be any fun for those living under the shadow of this threat so we need to know once and for all and sooner rather than later, that this unnecessary and costly spur

can be knocked on the head.
Those who have literally been living in fear of it deserve some peace of mind.

The parish council argue, and I agree, that the Golborne Spur represents huge costs both financial and environmental, but delivers appallingly low benefits.
Less disruptive and damaging

alternatives exist in relation to the conventional rail network, and cancelling the Golborne Spur

would significantly reduce overall cost of HS2 in its entirety.

Their letter concludes: behalf of our communities, blighted by HS2 proposals for the last seven years, we urge the Secretary of State to take speedy action to remove the Golborne Spur from the Phase 2b plans."

Village restaurant and bar wins planning approval

PLANS for a restaurant and wine bar in the centre of Culcheth village have been given the go-ahead despite opposition.

Objections were lodged to the scheme in Lodge Drive by Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council, seven neighbours and other nearby residents.

residents.

But Warrington's development management committee approved the application by Barry and Jane Tuffs, which will involve the change of use of an existing retail hi fi and electrical store.

They imposed a condition that the premises should close at 11pm

on weekdays and 10.30pm on

Objections related to fears of noise, disturbance, anti-social behaviour, parking problems and damage to residential amenity through longer opening hours. The committee was told the

premises would operate during the day, with evenings and weekends

focusing on operating as a bar with a small range of cold food.

No external alterations or extensions to the unit were proposed other than repainting the shop front and new signage, which would be subject to a separate would be subject to a separate

application.

Planning officers said proposal was an appropriate use in a sustainable location, accessible by public transport, walking and cycling and with adequate car parking immediately in front of the site and close by.

They did not believe the scheme would have a detrimental impact on the amenities of any adjoining occupiers.

Pupils get a chance to question the prime minister



PUPILS from Culcheth Primary School got a chance to question prime minister Boris Johnson during a visit to 10 Downing Street.

Three pupils from the school were part of a "children's lobby" who quizzed the prime minister on the topic "Looking to the Future"

He faced questions from the youngsters on topics like Brexit, climate change, technology and what he wanted to be when he was a child.

The Culcheth pupils – who were accompanied by teachers and were the party Warrington children to be invited to as on the visit – asked Mr. Johnson

They were invited to Downing Street because of the school's participation in the Primary Futures programme, which sees volunteers from the world of work talking with primary school children about their job and how they use different school subjects in their career.

The idea is to bring learning to life, raise aspirations and broaden horizons. Culcheth Primary have previously hosted volunteers from the world of work and will be hosting an event in Science week, March 6-15, when volunteers will attend a "What's My Line?" Assembly, when children will guess the jobs of the volunteers.

The three lucky pupils were inspired by the visit. They received a behind the scenes tour of Downing Street, including being able to sit around the cabinet table. They loved learning about the history of the building and about former prime ministers.

Speaker Eileen Pratt was in fact a "double act" with her husband, Steve and their subject was the long history of The Garrick Theatre, Stockport.

It started 118 years ago in a former church when special trams were laid on to take people to performances and ladies in the audience were asked to remove their hals.

One of the earliest actors was an ancestor of the celebrity chef Antony Worrall Thompson.

The society toured parts of the country with various plays. They had support from George Bernard Shaw, who did not charge them fees at this time because their theatre was for "private members."

But this all changed when he found they had done a 'public' performance of his 'Candida', at Buxton, in 1920 a converted mill, became the new Garrick, performing 5-6 plays a year and with 350 members.

The actress Wendy Hillier came to a gala performance. Other recent celebrities, and patrons include Sir lan Mckellen.

They continue to flourish, and had refurbishments carried out in 1984, and festivals in 1994. A 'youth theatre' now also exists.

The future looks bright. A recent L.S. Lowry painting sold for a great amount ,showing Stockport Garrick in the background, which may help with needed publicity!

End of the line for HS2 Golborne Spur?

SECRETARY of State for Transport Grant Shapps has cast doubt on the future of the controversial HS2 Golborne Spur which would have a devastating impact on areas of Warrington including Culcheth and surrounding areas.

Warrington South MP Andy Carter and fellow Conservative MP for Leigh, James Grundy, have welcomed a statement by the Secretary of State for Transport that casts doubt on the future of the HS2 Golborne Spur.

In response to questions from both MPs, both of whose constituencies are heavily affected by the Golborne Spur of HS2, Mr Shapps stated: "The Golborne Spur is currently projected to cost between two and three billion, but delivers very little for that sum. The writing is on the wall as far as the future of the Golborne Spur is

concerned. We expect to make the final decision on it in months, not

years."
In response, James Grundy
MP stated, "I welcome the strong
indication by Mr Shapps that
the Golborne Spur of HS2 is
to be cancelled. I have been
campaigning against this poorly
conceived idea for over seven
years now, and it will come as a
great relief to thousands of my

constituents in both Golborne and Lowton, including members of my own family, that this saga is finally coming to a close, and people can again have certainty when it comes to investing in their homes and local businesses."

"It is now time for Labour-run Wigan Council to withdraw their support for the misconceived HS2 Golborne Spur, and end the uncertainty and blight they foolishly inflicted on local residents by supporting it in the first place."

"We need instead to concentrate on reopening local stations like

on re-opening local stations like Golborne and Kenyon Junction in order to reconnect Leigh back to the national rail network, and I fully

intend that to be my next task."

Andy Carter added: "I've been clear that we need investment into local transport infrastructure to help with journeys to and from work or between town and villages. The £5bn investment in buses cycling is excellent news and to hear that consultation on Northern Powerhouse Rail between Liverpool and Manchester will start soon is

very welcome.
"I'm also really pleased to hear from the Secretary of State for Transport, Grant Shapps that the HS2 Golborne Spur is being revisited. This section of HS2 track is

"I'll continue to push for better links on Northern Powerhouse Rail so that Warrington residents have easier journeys for their daily

commute.

Meanwhile Warrington North
Mp Charlotte Nichols said:
"Warrington North Labour have
long opposed the Golborne Spur
being part of the HS2 route, because of the profoundly negative because of the profoundly negative impact it would have on the constituency especially in Culcheth, Croft, Risley and Hollins Green- not least in cutting off Wigshaw Lane.

"While there stand to be a number of benefits to Warrington North from HS2 if delivered in the right way. Lam clear that this is not

right way, I am clear that this is not a compromise we can be expected to accept for the project to go ahead. I am glad to have gained assurances today from the Prime Minister himself that this is being looked into and I will continue to hold him and the Secretary of State for Transport to account to ensure that they deliver on these assurances.

Cllr Frank Allen, chairman of the Culcheth and District Rail Action Group, said: "We are as yet a little Group, said: Vve are as yet a time unclear about what is happening. But it seems that Phase 1 is going ahead but that anything north of Birmingham, or possibly Crewe, is

to be subject to further review.
"If the idea is to save money,
then getting rid of the Golborne Link would make sense.
"There is talk of a six month

review of the northern part of the scheme, taking into account the implications for Northern Powerhouse Rail (NPR). "NPR says it sees no point in the

Golborne Link so that seems to be

an obvious opportunity to cut costs.
"We think there is still a chance of the Golborne Link being dropped. Certainly a further review would give an opportunity for a more sensible and careful approach that would save money.
"But only time will tell."


















New technology opens up new guided tour of nature reserve

VISITORS to Risley Moss nature reserve can experience a unique guided tour – through the eyes of children- thanks to the introduction of new

Rangers have worked with children from three local primary schools, Gorse Covert, Locking Stumps and Birchwood CE, to digitally capture the children's thoughts about the wildlife they have been studying during

Now visitors can be accompanied on their walk by the thoughts of the children about a whole variety of wildlife such as woodpeckers, spiders and even lizards.

and even lizards.

It's simply a matter of tapping your phone on the tag at the start of the trail and letting the children lead the tour. Risley Moss has introduced new NFC (near field communication) technology to provide an exciting new way of exploring the reserve and discovering its hidden treasures. It means everyone setting off on the nature trail can access information, photographs and voice files created by children.

Driving made accessible for all – and right on your doorstep

IT is fair to say that most people want to learn to drive, they crave the freedom and independence that

driving gives you.

For a person without disabilities this is a fairly straightforward process; you find an instructor local to you (of which there will be many), you take your lessons, prepare for your tests and then, prepare for your tests and then, prepare to your tests and then. prepare for your tests and then, fingers crossed, pass. You are then on the road to freedom and independence. But what about those people with disabilities who can't drive a standard vehicle, is the process still as straightforward?

In the UK there are a limited In the UK there are a limited number of driving instructors who have vehicles which are adapted to meet the needs of disabled drivers and I truly believe this is due to a lack of knowledge surrounding vehicle adaptations and what would be required to teach a person to drive who has a disability. Based on last year's figures there is a 43% increase in the amount of people on the Motability scheme who are having adaptations fitted who are having adaptations fitted to their new vehicles and this is set to increase year upon year. So, where to start?

There are a wide range of adaptations available to meet the varying needs of disabled drivers.
One of the most popular adaptations available is the Push/Pull Brake/
Accelerator. This adaptation brings the control of the foot pedals to the hands and is a simple operation where you pull to accelerate and push to brake. These are available push to brake. These are available as column mounted and also floor mounted, the floor mounted option providing the benefit of being able to adjust the steering wheel height, an important feature for a driving instructor who is teaching lots of different people. different people.

In terms of hand controls there is also the Ring Accelerator which is placed under/over the steering wheel, a Twist Grip Accelerator which is used like a motorbike

handle and even a Thumb Touch Accelerator which is operated by either the left or right thumb.

A Left Foot Accelerator pedal is

an excellent adaptation for those drivers who struggle to use their right leg. Fitted to the left of the brake, it is operated by a dash mounted switch which enables you to choose between left and right accelerator. As with many adaptations, this can be easily removed if required.

Another excellent adaptation for disabled drivers is a Secondary Remote Control, which brings the secondary controls such as lights, wipers, horns, indicators to the driver's fingertips. The device will also act as a steering aid, providing greater control of the steering wheel.

As a driving instructor who currently doesn't teach disabled drivers, this process might seem

quite daunting and complicated, but this really doesn't have to be the case. There are specialist vehicle adaptation companies who will provide you with all the advice and guidance needed on choosing the right adaptations in order to be able to teach people with a range of disabilities. Most of





the adaptations are designed to be the adaptations are designed to be removable, meaning that you can still use the original controls of the vehicle. Some of these companies will also provide 'driving school packages', which will give you a discount when choosing a selection of adaptations. There are also companies out there selection of adaptations. There are also companies out there who will provide training on each adaptation, so you can feel completely confident when delivering your lessons.

Driving shouldn't just be a privilege for people without disabilities, it should be accessible for all and there's payer been an
