Plans for 172 houses given the go-ahead

CONTROVERSIAL proposals for 172 new homes at Grappenhall Heys have been approved by planning chiefs at Warrington – despite opposition from nearly 150 people, two parish councils and the Woodland Trust.

The development will be made up of two phases – 58 houses to the south of Astor Drive and the east of Witherwin Avenue and 114 houses to the north of Lichfield Avenue and also east of Witherwin Avenue.

Both are close to the popular visitor attraction, Grappenhall Heys Walled Garden.

Walled Garden.
They will effectively fill-in much of the existing green space between the walled garden and Grappenhall Village.

But members of the borough's development management committee had little option but to approve the scheme as outline planning consent for both schemes – and a third one bringing the total number of houses

up to around 400, but not yet before planning chiefs – had already been granted.

Earlier versions of the two schemes were turned down last year but the principle of housing on the land dating from the days of the Warrington New Town Development Corporation in the late sixties was already established.

Most objections were based on grounds such as inadequate infrastructure, no provision for schools

or health facilities, poor design, overdevelopment, air pollution and the fact that the new properties would be car dependant.

Planning officers said the development would not have a harmful impact on adjacent properties and that ecological mitigation was in excess of the required level. They believed the local highway network would be adequate for the increased traffic the development would cause.





Residents and council team up to tackle litter blackspot

LOCAL residents teamed up with Warrington Borough Council to carry out a community litter pick around the Barleycastle Industrial Estate at Appleton Thorn.

An estimated 50 residents, many from the Appleton Thorn area, joined forces with the council's refuse collection team to tackle a litter blackspot which has become an eyesore.

In the space of just three hours they collected an estimated four tonnes of rubbish, much which has ended up in grass verges and hedges rows after being thrown from the windows of passing vehicles.

Warrington Borough Cllr Sharon Harris said: "Well this morning was inspirational.

"The community, local councillors and the Borough Council working together.

"Thank you to the 50 fabulous volunteers who gave up 3hrs of their Saturday morning and collected 2 tons of waste dumped mostly by lorry drivers as they enter the estate.

"The two day litter pick has cost thousands of pounds so we can't have repeat performances every year.

"We need businesses on the trading estate to change their future behaviour. I am hoping that we can now form a working group of business reps., WBC, Parish Council and residents to ensure that this happens.

"Appleton Thorn is a place to be proud of – such great community spirit. Well done one and all." $\,$

Warrington South MP Andy Carter, who also joined in with the litter picking added: "This morning I joined around 50 volunteer residents and Councillors in Appleton Thorn who were clearing the verges around the Barleycastle Lane Industrial Estate.

"When you drive past you see the litter on the verge but having walked and looked closely I'm quite shocked at the amount of rubbish being thrown from vehicles who use this route to and from the motorway.

"T've written to businesses on the Estate to ask them to play a bigger part in keeping this area clean.

"I'm really grateful for the community who've taken action to sort this problem. I'll also be asking WBC for bins to be placed in lay-bys in this area."

Farmer under pressure after bank closes account

FARMER Joe Fryer says his business has been put under a huge strain after the Nat West Bank closed his account on the back of a number of alleged banking errors.

Mr Fryer, who runs Apple Jacks and Spooky World at his Stretton Farm, claims the bank made a number of errors, including losing a cheque for £12,000 and cashing a supplier's cheque twice.

He also claims that on another occasion the bank agreed an additional £20,000 over draft facility but then forgot to implement it, meaning he was unable to pay his staff wages.

Last December the bank wrote to Mr Fryer stating they were closing his banking facility as a result of "threatening and abusive behaviour" during phone calls to the bank – something Mr Fryer disputes.

"Phone calls are recorded to banks and I have asked for evidence of threatening and abusive behaviour and they haven't provided any."

Mr Fryer admits there were some heated conversations

with his branch manager following the banking errors, but not "threatening and abusive behaviour."

He said he had since secured a substantial business loan from the Agricultural Mortgage Corporation but it was "crucial" to have a current account so the loan could be processed and funds released into the account.

He has raised the issue with his local MP Andy Carter who said he is keen to ensure that SME's are supported by the Government and that the banks act in such a way that small businesses are enabled and supported.

Mr Carter said: "Being an owner of a business myself I am only too acutely aware of how difficult it can be from time to time and will always work in Parliament to support small business."

A NatWest spokesman said: "Owing to confidentiality, we do not comment on circumstances related to individual customer cases, however we would not close an account without good reason."
