A husband and wife team embarked on a mission to clean up woodlands at Lymm which had been left littered with rubbish by young party goers using potentially lethal Nitrous Oxide gás canisters.

After being alerted about the litter by a dog walking friend, Paul and Stella Connor literally got on their bikes to clean up the mess left at Spud Wood and Helsdale Wood at Lymm.

Paul explained, "We were gob-smacked to see that there were indeed perhaps 200 to 300 silver 'laughing gas' canisters there, along with enough litter in that general vicinity to fill 4 large bin bags! Not to mention the large tent which had been fluctured there which had been fly-tipped there – which we reported to the council via their website. On our way home we spotted plenty more litter on the lower High School fields – a near-future job for us or another volunteer l'm sure.

The couple are part of a small but growing ad-hoc network of volunteers in the village who regularly grab their litter picking gear and help keep Lymm looking lovely. "We see looking after our local area as simply an extension of the natural inclination we all have to

natural inclination we all have to look after our homes and families. Many of us are so proud to live in Lymm and wider Warrington, and benefit so much from its wonderful outdoor spaces and sense of community, we feel it is only right that we do our bit to improve it further," added Paul. While the recent lockdown has shown what a tremendous

community-spirit exists across the in, an unfortunate increase littering and fly-tipping has town,



accompanied this. Paul added, "Needless to say, this has to stop. Whether kids setting out for an outdoor party, or adults going for takeaway - before we set out, we need to plan how we will dispose of our rubbish – taking

will alspose of our rubots – raking extra bags with us if needed." Stella adds, "Not to mention the health problems from inhaling that amount of nitrous oxide. It seems to be all too easy for even kids to get hold of. At least there is a growing national awareness of this problem, as well as several petitions asking for parliament to control access to it. I feel it is our duty as a caring community to support this effort in every way we can". Paul concluded: "Communities

Lymm Transport Day donates £7,000 to important causes

DESPITE having to cancel this year's Lymm Transport Day due to the coronavirus pandemic, Lymm Transport Day organisers were able to donate $\pounds7,000$ to important local causes, with plenty still in the kitty for next year's event.

Everything had been booked for Lymm Historic Transport Day 2020. "Entertainers, check. Vehicles

"Entertainers, check. Vehicles check. Volunteer groups, check. Traders, check": all this plus the hundred and one other things that make Lymm's biggest day of the year run smoothly.

But then, like for many thousands of events, Coronavirus stepped in and the hi-vis jackets and wristbands had to go back into the cupboard for another year.

"It was a huge disappointment of course" explained Event Director Alan Williams "but there was clearly no alternative and our thoughts turned quickly to how we could make some sort of response to what was happening around us."

Donated

Field Event Manager, John Parry added. "We had already donated nearly £5,000 in total to Lymm Heritage Centre, Maggie's Cancer Centre and the RAF Benevolent Fund before the virus surfaced.

"It quickly became clear that important charities operating locally were among the hardest hit. With all sponsorship events cancelled, their funds took a huge hit. So Transport Day stepped in to donate a total of £7,000 across three important local causes: St Roccos, Warrington Foodbank and Samaritans."

Organisers are confident that thanks to the huge success of the event there is still plenty in the kitty to enable them to put on another great show next year. In fact work has already started to ensure that Lymm's latest annual event can go ahead spectacularly and safely.

Lymm Village Centre Covid-19 Social Distancing Measures

When the social distancing measures were announced by the Government, Warrington Borough Council officers identified the need to try and assist the Borough's Town and Village Centres in relation to pedestrians' ability to social distance and provide better pedal cycle accessibility where possible.

InearlyJune 2020 a partnership of Ward Members, Parish Councillors and Warrington Council Officers Borough began rationalising the ability to provision wider footpaths through the village centre of Lymm. Due to the existing highway restrictions the best way of achieving wider footpaths and allow safe passage of pedestrians past shop queues the option of a one way system was proposed and circulated towards the end of that month. Responses identified issues with deliveries, the impact on the required diversion route roads, restrictions to the bus service in accessing the three busiest stops in Lymm, and also concerns about the aesthetics due to the type of barrier required to implement this option. It was noted that

the partnership would need to look for an alternate option.

Following further meetings the partnership identified the potential for a full weekend closure of both the main route through the Village and Bridgewater Street from 6pm on a Friday evening through to 11pm Sunday to allow social distancing at the Village's busiest times. This proposal would assist many food and drink retail outlets without restricting bus services and week day deliveries collections. A further invitation for comments was delivered to approximately 340 properties (as per the previous circulation for the one way provision) on Friday 24th July. Responses to this proposal identified access issues for residents, the need for weekend post office access for local business' parcels and **Environment Agency weekend** access to the weir in addition to the cleansing requirements after possible unsociable evening activity.

The partnership had identified several alterations to the proposed weekend closure to mitigate the concerns raised

although unfortunately, due to the safety of pedestrians through the Village Centre, none of these alterations were viable. The proposed weekend closure of Bridgewater Street did not identify the same concerns as those presented for the closure of Eagle Brow and The Cross. Access to the Henry Street car park was raised as a problem due to the present one way road connecting this to the Davies Way car park. With an alteration to a short section of the Boat Stage to provide a priority give way arrangement vehicles would be able to move in both directions to access Henry Street car park.


The outcome of the consultation on the various options explored to facilitate social distancing for road users is that they are too problematic to implement on Eagle Brow and The Cross without adversely affecting residents, businesses and pedestrian safety. Therefore; it is intended that as from the 6pm of the 31st July, only Bridgewater Street will be closed for the weekend, up to 11pm on Sunday 2nd August. will continue every This

weekend for six weeks up to and including 6th September.

Throughout this process there has always been an intention to widen the narrow footpath outside 'Eighteen' and 'The Wine Kitchen' on the North side of Pepper Street at its junction with The Cross. This is due to the existing narrow footpath that on occasions requires pedestrians to pass in the road increasing the risk of conflicts with passing vehicles. It is intended to also provide this proposal full time through the same six week period that the Bridgewater Street weekend closures will be in place and possibly beyond depending on necessity.

Both locations will be managed by a dedicated traffic management company and the partnership will monitor the situation closely. Any issues that arise from the traffic management measures being in place can be reported at the email address below:


successfully launched, sending books and jigsaws everywhere from Appleton to Australia and now that the Centre has reopened there are two exciting new additions to the range.

display. After such events, rocks are hidden around the village for others to find and brighten their day. Once found, finders are encouraged to


rehide rocks for others to find.

Lymm Rotary Club saved from closure!

LYMM Rotary Club has been saved from closure after "overwhelming support" from the local community, including former members, who have put forward a rescue package.

The support followed a report by warrington-worldwide highlighting the club was set to close due to lack of members after 84 years serving the local community.

Now members have been overwhelmed by messages of support and offers to join the Club, some from past members and some from people with no previous Rotary connections. At a special "zoom" meeting, the Club reversed the earlier decision and members will now go on to secure the future of the Club while awaiting the arrival of additional members. To sustain the club and its commitments to the Float and Senior Citizens' Party among others, it is vital that new members participate in Club campaigns and activities President Alan Edwards said: "This gives us a chance to renew the Club and as soon as we are allowed to gather together, we will organise a meeting for members and prospective members to set out ideas and plans for the future of the Club."

A club spokesperson added: "Members of Lymm Rotary never wanted to see the Club close but did not feel able to continue to meet expectations with so few members. We are grateful to Warrington Worldwide & Lymm Life for bringing a desperate situation to the notice of the public. One new member has signed up already, former Rotarians have stated that they will return and we are in touch with several people wanting to join. The additional complementary services aromatherapy, acupuncture and massage area will promote a feeling of calm and relaxation. The four new birthing rooms will be offering a home from home

The four new birthing rooms will be offering a home from home experience creating a welcoming and comfortable ambience. Focusing around state-of-theart birthing pools, the birthing suites will feature sofas, birthing cubes, cushions and wall art with mood lighting; music and candles creating a relaxed, peaceful and calm experience. This investment has allowed us to redevelop our offering for all mums to be including complex cases who will also experience their maternity care and labour in a more homely environment.

Midwife and antenatal appointments will also be held at the new Centre and women can choose this option instead of being seen at their nearest GP practice and Sure Start centre.

Following birth, a new postnatal suite will enable partners to stay overnight in comfortable surroundings with their new family in ensuite rooms. Contemporary cots, side tables, changing tables, soft lighting and luxurious bedding will make this room feel like a 'special home from home'.


