

LEGO® master creates sculpture of iconic Golden Gates as part of Time Machine Project

A 5,000 piece replica of the town's iconic Golden Gates is set to feature as part of a special Heritage Open

as part of a special Heritage Open Days Time Machine Project. The amazing two metre LEGO model of the historic Golden Gates has been created by local Champion LEGO master builder, Steve Guinness. The sculpture is going to be on display in the new Warrington Borough Council buildings, Time Square. The model which was created during lockdown in 2020 depicts every intricate detail of the impressive Warrington landmark which was built in 1862 including the four winged figures of Nike, the

goddess of victory and Warrington's coat or arms. Before moving to its goudess of victory and vicant victory and vice of the civic offices there's an opportunity to get a sneak preview of the model on display at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery during this year's Heritage Open Days festival from Saturday 12th September to Sunday 20th September during normal opening hours Wednesday to Friday 10am – 4pm and Sundays 11am – 3pm. The programme of culture and heritage events was launched in August with a pop up people's history space on Bridge Street

as part of a partnership project financially supported by Heritage Open Days, National Trust and coordinated by Warrington Business Improvement District and Culture Warrington. Meanwhile Steve, winner of Channel 4's LEGO® Masters 2017

and LEGO® Education trainer with Warrington's Creative Hut, has yet again proven himself to be a design champion.

With over 10,000 votes, Steve's pewriter creation was chosen by LÉGO® Ideas to be released as an official set.

An expansion upon part of his final build for LEGO® Masters, the 1254 piece replica typewriter, which he has dedicated to his wife Rachael, is built to scale and wite Rachael, is built to scale and even includes a working hand cranked mechanism. Describing the typewriter as having a 'fun, retro appeal,' the ex-Design and Technology teacher hopes to 'bring nostalgia to adult fans and wonder and curiosity to younger fans who might not have ever seen a typewriter' typewriter.

£1.5m Birth Centre nears delivery

A NEW £1.5m midwife-led birth centre at Warrington Hospital is nearing completion with plans for the first births there in the autumn.

the first births there in the autumn. The new Birth Centre will be an addition to the Trust's existing maternity services which currently include an alongside midwife-led unit, community midwife-supported home birthing and obstetric-led care for women who require additional support from a multidisciplinary team.

Every aspect of the design has been carefully planned in partnership with new and expectant mums and midwives. The additional complementary services aromatherapy, acupuncture and massage area will promote a feeling of calm and relaxation.

aromatherapy, acupuncture and massage area will promote a feeling of calm and relaxation. The four new birthing rooms will be offering a home from home experience creating a welcoming and comfortable ambience. Focusing around state-of-theart birthing pools, the birthing suites will feature sofas, birthing cubes, cushions and wall art with mood lighting; music and candles creating a relaxed, peaceful and calm experience. This investment has allowed us to redevelop our offering for all mums to be including complex cases who will also experience their maternity care and labour in a more homely environment.

Warrington & Halton Hospitals' Chavity Registered Charity 1051858 Midwife and antenatal appointments will also be held at the new Centre and women can choose this option instead of being seen at their nearest GP practice and Sure Start centre.

Following birth, a new postnatal suite will enable partners to stay overnight in comfortable surroundings with their new family in ensuite rooms. Contemporary cots, side tables, changing tables, soft lighting and luxurious bedding will make this room feel like a 'special home from home'.

£550,000 grant to help tackle crime

A £550,000 Government grant has been secured by Cheshire police and crime commissioner David Keane for a project to reduce burglaries in Warrington.

The money will be used by police to crack down on burglary and theft in the Bewsey and Whitecross areas of the town.

It will go towards measures proven to cut crime. These include an individual security assessment for every property and improving measures where required and will also involve the roll-out of Cheshire police's successful Operation Shield in the area – a DNA property marking exercise which has reduced burglary by up to 83 per cent in other areas of Cheshire.

There will also be simple changes to the design of streets such as increased street-lighting and the installation of CCTV alongside intensive work by local officers with the community to develop Neighbourhood Watch schemes for every street.

for every street. The funding will also be used to bring Warrington's problem solving team to the area with a sergeant, six constables and local authority representatives dedicated to working with the community to develop local problem solving approaches and community resilience.

Major Furlough Changes

AUGUST 1 2020 saw the start of some of the most significant changes to the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme ("Scheme"). From August 1 2020, the level of

Retention Scheme ("Scheme"). From August 1 2020, the level of Government grant will reduce and the reduction will continue each month until the end of the Scheme on 31 October 2020. Although the level of Government grant will reduce, employees need not fear. The amount an employee receives will remain at the same 80% of their wages up to £2,5000 assuming they are furloughed full time). With the new flexibility to the Scheme, the £2,500 per month wage cap is proportional to the hours work and so if an employee is furloughed for 50% of their normal hours, they are only then entitled to 50% of the £2,500 cap. From August 1, the Government will still provide a grant of 80% of solary up to £2,500, however employers will now become responsible for paying Employer's National Insurance Contributions (ER NICS) and pension contributions for the hours in which the employees are on furlough. From O1 September employers will start to see even more significant changes. The Government will only

will start to see even more significant changes. The Government will only pay 70% of wages (down from 80%) up to a cap of £2,187.50 for the hours the employee is on

furlough (down from £2,500). Employers will still pay ER NICs and pension contributions as they were required from August 1, but in addition, they will now need to top up employees' wages to ensure they receive the original 80% salary up to a cap of £2,500, for time they are furloughed. From October, the Government contribution reduces further to 60% of wages up to a cap of £1,875

for the hours the employee is on furlough. Once again, an employer will then have to pay ER NICs and pension contributions and top up the employees' pay to 80% salary up to a cap of £2,500, for time they are furloughed. A table showing the changes for an employee on furlough for 100% of their hours has been produced on the Government website, as shown below.

As before, employers can continue to top up wages to 100% should they wish, although they are not legally required to do so. Any top ups offered by employers may reduce as the sliding scale of contributions will no doubt take its toll on businesses still struggling to recover. If businesses do manage to retain staff after the furlough scheme ends and keep them until January 2021, Chancellor Rishi Sunak will now also offer an incentive bonus of £1,000 per employee. Whether the £1,000 incentive will be enough for business to continue employing the employee after January 2021 is unknown.

Recovery & Restructure Grant. Up to £5,000 can be obtained for Covid-secure enhancements such as tablets/iPads, shielding screens and website updates. The Cheshire & Warrington Local Enterprise Partnership are behind this valuable assistance. You may recall me talking about the (Stronger) Towns Fund at the beginning of the year and we were fearful of this £25m funding being postponed indefinitely. Thankfully, it did return and we submitted our Investment Plan to central government at the end of July. We have 7 potentially transformative projects that address multiple areas including transport, culture, skills and health. Thank you if you contributed your thoughts on-line or at one of the shopping centre stands before the lockdown. Warrington has a reputation within government has a reputation within government for establishing strong partnerships with relevant stakeholders and this was again evident throughout this proces

However, customers of the Warrington prom superstore, The Dress Studio, have been proving that Covid19 will not rain on their parade. Holly Pirrie, the owner of the specialist boutique explained:"It has been heartbreaking to see the disappointment for so many of our customers but we have found that with restrictions easing, our prom girls have been taking matters into their own hands. They have still wanted their special prom moment and so, they have been arranging smaller togethers in their gardens and getting dressed up, as if it were the real thing. "We know it's not the same but

"We know it's not the same but 2020 has to be about making new memories and we can tell that our customers have loved these alternatives. The photos will be ones that they can look back at fondly and know they made the best of their situation."

Prom may be just a party to many but the industry has been massively affected by lockdown. It is crippling, not just for retailers of dresses & suits, but for all the sectors involved. Prom is a critical event for many, small and local businesses. Holly explained: "Physically, The Dress Studio is a large store with over 30 fitting rooms, but the reality is that we are a small business. March – June is typically one of busiest times due to the girls choosing their prom dresses, but this was completely cut short due to the pandemic, like most retailers, this is a difficult time for us. It is not just us that are feeling the affects of this – venues, transport companies (like limo hire), beauty salons, hairdressers, photographers, make-up artists, musicians, caterers... many are devastated by the cancellation or postponement of proms. "Many schools have postponed

"Many schools have postponed prom and we hope that all will consider this when restrictions ease. The students may be making the most of an unfortunate situation in their gardens now, but they definitely deserve that proper farewell. For now, we are super proud of customers for getting glam and making the most out of their dresses!"

after this year's event at Walton Gardens had to be called off due to the coronavirus pandemic.

On what should have been the 29th Warrington Disability Awareness Day, which has now become the largest event of its kind in the world, work started on launching Virtual DAD.

Due to the pandemic organisers had little choice but to call off the proposed event at Walton Gardens.

But undeterred work has now started on creating a virtual event on Sunday October 25, followed by a week of activities from Monday 26th to Friday 30th of October.

Warrington Disability Partnership will work in partnership to create a highly engaging virtual DAD event emulating the 'real event' with a high quality look and feel online experience, including mix of real and virtual reality (mixed reality). Capable of taking large volume of online traffic.

Work starts on Virtual

It will include a new dedicated Website/Portal-capable of hosting vebsite/Portal – capable of nosting live events, virtual models and high level of traffic up to 10,000 plus simultaneously. 



Trikes give twins new lease of life



WARRINGTON twins Mia and Lucy Moran, who have cerebral palsy and a rare genetic condition, have been given a new lease of life after taking delivery of two specially adapted trikes. The Terrier Hitch Combo Trikes cost £1,800 each and there was no way the girls' parents Michael and Emma, from Warrington, could afford to buy two.

and Emma, from varrington, could afford to buy two. Instead the Steve Morgan Foundation and The Boparan Charitable Trust stepped in and presented the trikes to the girls on

the day of their eighth birthday. Mum Emma said: "They've changed the girls' lives. It has given them a new lease of life. Their eyes lit up when they arrived on their birthday. We're so grateful to the Steve Morgan Foundation and The Boparan Charitable Trust."

Emma, who also has a 13-year-old son called Harry, had no idea there was anything wrong with the twins until they were diagnosed with cerebral palsy at the age of three three.

"Lucy is more severe than Mia," said their Mum. "She wasn't sitting up. Then they were given a blood test and diagnosed with a genetic condition called Rett syndrome."

Rett syndrome is a brain disorder that occurs almost exclusively in girls. After birth, girls with classic Rett syndrome have six to 18 months of apparently normal development before developing severe problems with language and communication. Emma said: "Lucy can't sit

unaided so needs to be supported.

Because of Rett syndrome they can't talk but they both have lovely personalities.

The girls attend Fox Wood School, in Warrington, and her parents became aware of the Terrier Hitch Combo Trikes. Emma explained: "Mia has a personalised physiotherapy programme in place at home and school and activities such as wimping and riding around on a swimming and riding around on a specially adapted bike have been recommended by the children's

"Mia was assessed for a Terrier Hitch Combo Trike but there's no way we could get one for Mia and not for Lucy so we approached The Boparan Charitable Trust and the Steve Morgan Foundation and they met the cost between them. We are so grateful. "The trikes mean that instead

of going in a specially adapted wheelchair they're able to ride around and be included. It means we can do normal things as a family and it makes such a difference.

"As soon as you put Mia on her trike she wants to get going. She gets so excited and wants to go straight away. It's lovely to hear them laughing and seeing them

enjoy themselves." Jane Harris, director of regional funding at the Steve Morgan Foundation, said: "Sometimes the smallest awards can make the biggest difference. This isn't a typical award for us but we were delighted to help and put a smile on Mia and Lucy's faces."





Making Tax Digital

The whole of the UK economy is facing the prospect of massive traumas over the next few months and years. Coronavirus has caused a massive upset. Not only has the economy suffered it's biggest recorded contraction in the last quarter, but as the much welcomed government support under the Job Retention Scheme comes to an end we are seeing huge redundancies, especially in the retail and service industries, being announced. And on top of that, Brexit is beginning to rear it's ugly head again, with all of the resulting uncertainty in international trading relationships faced by UK institutions and industry.

With all this coming rapidly down the road you would expect the government to try and avoid causing more upset. Do not believe it! The whole of British business, including micro and small businesses are facing even more upset with the proposed extension of Making Tax Diabolical ("MTD"). Oh apologies, I meant, of course, Making Tax Digital.

On 21 July the Treasury set out a first draft of the government's ten-year plan to modernise the tax administration system, including restarting MTD program which had ground been delayed by Brexit and the coronavirus pandemic.

Value Added Tax

Firstly, VAT. Currently the MTD regime is only compulsory for VAT registered traders who are required to be VAT registered as they have taxable turnover of over £85,000. An estimated one million VAT registered businesses with lower annual turnover are not required to enter the MTD regime. It has now been confirmed that all VAT registered traders will have to use MTD compatible software to file their VAT returns with effect for VAT periods starting on and after 1 April 2022. They will also be required to keep the VAT records in a digital format.

Around 30% of these small VATregistered businesses have already been using MTD software voluntarily. The strategy paper says "there have also been lessons learned, which will be used to inform and shape the introduction of the next phases of digital implementation". Those lessons are certainly required, and need to extend beyond the fairytales told by Quickbooks in their TV advertising.

Income Tax

And then we come to Income Tax. The MTD programme was originally planned to start with quarterly reporting for income tax, but the focus switched to VAT as it was perceived to be an easier transition for businesses that were used to making at least quarterly returns.

The ten-year plan sets a goal of April 2023 for micro self-employed businesses and unincorporated landlords to commence quarterly reporting through MTD software, and to keep digital records. Around four million unincorporated businesses and landlords with annual turnover exceeding $\pounds10,000$ per year will be drawn into MTD.

However, the roll-out may be different to that initially envisaged as HMRC says it will draw on everything that has been learned from the implementation of the VAT service to date, and responses to the MTD evaluation document, which was published in March.

Corporation Tax

Finally, Corporation Tax. We have been waiting nearly four years for a consultation document on MTD for corporation tax, and now we are promised such a paper will be published in the autumn.

There is no mention of MTD for complex bodies such as large partnerships. When MTD for income tax was first proposed it was quickly apparent that quarterly reporting would not be practical for very large partnerships and LLPs which operate more like companies, but are legally partnerships where the individual partners pay income tax.

The thorny problem of mixed partnerships - LLPs with corporate members - was not addressed at all in the original MTD proposals. It will be interesting to see if the consultation paper released in the autumn squares the circle of corporation tax and income tax reporting by the same body

Paying The Right Tax

Most people recognise their responsibility to pay the right amount of tax, and the government is also exploring the timing and frequency of tax payments, to make them more "real time" to align with the reporting of tax information. HMRC says it wants to make it as easy as possible for people to pay the right amount of tax and make it harder for taxpayers to avoid paying tax. The government argues that using digital technologies, which permit HMRC to make interventions earlier, will prevent tax loss and reduce the tax gap.

Administration

The final part of the introduction of MTD is to identify a range of changes to include updating:

- Obligations of taxpayers and HMRC
- Penalties and sanctions for failing to comply with obligations
- Taxpayers rights and safeguards
- How taxpayers are identified and register with HMRC
- How tax liabilities are identified amended and assessed.

The plan says "Taxpayers should be able to view their tax position and tell HMRC anything it needs to know through a single online account." This implies that the personal tax account and business tax account will be merged.

The plan calls for the changes to be introduced steadily. We certainly agree with this. Education is critical. People operating small businesses are not bookkeepers, and our experience is that there are frequently extensive errors in the records even of those businesses currently caught by MTD. In the past, HMRC have placed much more emphasis on penalties and sanctions than on education. Hopefully, this will change in the future. Unfortunately, we very much doubt it.

Rylands unveil ambitious plans to bring professional football to town

WITH ambitious plans to bring professional football to the town Rylands FC have renamed the club Warrington Rylands 1906 FC.

Currently playing at their highest ever level and former player and Triple S Sports & Entertainment Group MD Paul Stretford at the helm, the name change is the first phase of the that future plan. The club has a rich history in the

town.

In 1805 John Rylands and Sons were formed in Warrington to produce Iron and Steel Products and went on to become one of the towns biggest employers, and a leading manufacturer and exporter both in the UK and internationally.

Over the next 100 years, the business grew from strength to strength so much so that the Towns famous Rugby League Club became known as the "Wires".

The turn of the century saw the business grow from strength to strength and decided to invest in a facility that could be used to keep its employers fit and healthy both in a sporting and leisure perspective. Eventually they found a suitable site for their ambitions situated between Gorsey Lane and Orford Lane on the East side of Warrington and developed Rylands Recreation Club, providing opportunities for the workforce and their families to enjoy relaxation and sport. At the centre of this magnificent jewel was the Clubhouse building which provided facilities for indoor sports and a bar. The grounds were converted to create a Rugby Pitch, Cricket Field, Bowling Green, Tennis Courts and a Football Pitch situated Courts and a Football Pitch situated in the same enclosed grounds as the Rylands FC first team play today. In 1906, the Clubhouse and Grounds were officially opened and the Rylands Works Association Football Team played football on their new home ground for the very first time. The pitch and facilities were the envy of most other teams in the grea Including Everton FC. in the area Including Everton FC, whom Rylands hosted during this time.

Recently, another internationally renowned business based in Warrington has followed in the Rylands Bros footsteps to return the venue to former glories. Triple S Sports & Entertainment Group and its Managing Director Paul Stretford have slowly started to breathe life back in to this famous venue and facilities, with improvements to the Football Grounds and Clubhouse facilities, and further improvements scheduled to take place as development plans are approved. At the forefront of this plan is the commitment to establish the Rylands

Football 1st Team and enable it to compete at the highest level possible, with the ultimate ambition to bring Professional Football to the town

The decision to rename Rylands FC as Warrington Rylands 1906 FC is the first part of that future plan.
