Editor's Comment



AS Culcheth Life was going to press strict new local lockdown restrictions were being announced in a bid to halt a rise in COVID-19 cases in the Warrington area.

There have been a significant number of cases recently in the Culcheth, Croft and Winwick areas, so the threat of this virus locally is very real.

If we want to have any chance of getting back to any kind of normality it is vitally important we all play our part and follow the guidance as best we can.

I say as best we can as I know from feedback, many are confused by the rules and regulations, so I will do my best to explain them as best I can.

The new restrictions, which came into force on Tuesday (Sept 22) are initially for two weeks.

The new measures include:

- Meeting people outside your household or support bubble in private homes and gardens is banned (exemptions include attending a birth, visiting someone who is dying, work, education, registered childcare, emergencies or care issues, moving house and child contact arrangements)
- People are advised not to socialise outside their household in public venues
- Residents should only use public transport for essential purposes, such as going to school or work
- Pubs, restaurants, cafes must be table service only and all leisure venues must shut at 22:00

- Holidays are permitted but only with members of your household or support bubble
- Travel outside the area is permitted but visiting another home or garden is not
- People should not spectate at any grassroots sport or play sport in the restricted areas
- Schools, colleges and universities remain open
- Care homes are closed to non-essential visitors except in end-of-life circumstances
- There are no local changes to funerals, weddings or religious ceremonies

The measures come after Warrington Borough Council attempted to halt the increase in

figures earlier by advising people not to visit other households, which is seen as the biggest cause of rising infection rates.

Like many other businesses, **Culcheth Life** has been badly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic as we rely on the advertising support of other businesses and local organisations, with many facing an uncertain future.

Hopefully these latest lockdown restrictions will be short-lived and we can be back again next month.

As always we will be continuing to provide our free local news service for the area online.

Fairy fundraiser bidding to raise £2,000 for Whizz Kidz charity

RETIRED Royal Air Force Engineer David Smithson donned a fairy costume and jogged around local villages to raise funds and awareness for disabled children's charity Whizz Kidz.

Culcheth resident David, 73, who is retired from the Royal Air Force but still works as an engineer, has been jogging around local villages to raise awareness and funds for the Whizz Kidz charity and to prepare for a marathon on October 4.

Whizz Kidz was established in 1990 and celebrates its anniversary in 2020.

The vision of Whizz Kidz is to provide children and young people with vital mobility equipment, life journey services and give them the

opportunity to build friendships, have fun, as well as training to help them gain skills and a brighter future.

After a car accident in 2008, fundraiser David was determined to get back to fitness and what better way to do that than running for charity.

"I was supposed to run the marathon on the 26th April and for the first time I was going to run in a costume outfit for the charity Whizz Kids.

"The charity is for kids and provides precision wheelchairs as well as looking after young children who have Cerebral Palsy."

Charlotte Ulett, Senior Events Fundraising Executive, said: "We can't thank David enough for taking on this challenge to support young wheelchair users."

"Despite the physical event being cancelled, David has shown his determination to make a difference by joining the virtual marathon challenge and we wish him all the best!

"Though we can't be there physically, we will be behind all our team, supporting them all the way."

Wheelchairs can cost a minimum

of £3000 and the fundraising efforts by David are hoping to raise £2000 towards those aids.

"I was in the Royal Air Force and the nickname for the trade was fairies, so my wife Linda thought that I should run as a fairy."

Thanks to the villagers of Culcheth and surrounding areas, David has helped to raise over £900 and will continue doing the runs to raise as much as possible for the charity.

The run will begin in the centre

of the village on October 4 and will start on Lodge Drive before continuing to Hob Hey Lane then towards the care home on Jackson Avenue.

David will complete the circuit three times to raise as much money as possible.

HS2 construction work will create around 22,000 new jobs

A FORMAL start of construction on the controversial HS2 rail project has been announced – highlighting the large number of jobs the project will be recruiting for in the coming months and years.

The project will have huge implications for the Warrington area if it goes ahead in its entirety – particularly in the Culcheth and Lymm areas.

But earlier this year, transport secretary Grant Shapps hinted that the Golborne Link – the section of the line that would affect Culcheth and Lymm – might be dropped and local campaigners are still hoping this will happen.

The symbolic announcement signals that the main contractors are moving from enabling works, scheme design and preparatory work, to full construction of the railway.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson said: "HS2 is at the heart of our plans to build back better – and with construction now formally underway, it's set to create around 22,000 new jobs."

"As the spine of our country's transport network, the project will be vital in boosting connectivity between our towns and cities. But HS2's transformational potential goes even further. By creating hundreds of apprenticeships and thousands of skilled jobs, HS2 will fire up economic growth and help to rebalance opportunity across this country for years to come."

"The move to construction also

heralded a 'jobs boom' on the project, demonstrating the value HS2 is bringing to the economy many years before it is complete, particularly in the post-COVID economic environment.

HS2's main works contractor for the West Midlands, the Balfour Beatty VINCI Joint Venture (BBV JV), along with its supply chain partners, has said it expects to be one of the biggest recruiters in the West Midlands over the next two years, with up to 7,000 skilled jobs required to complete its section of the HS2 route. The EKFB Joint Venture (Eiffage, Kier, BAM Nuttall, Ferrovial) – building the section from the Long Itchington Wood site in Warwickshire south to the Chiltern tunnel portals, has said it will recruit over 4,000 roles in the next two years, many based in Milton Keynes, as work ramps up in the area.

HS2's Tier One construction partners based in Greater London: Skanska Costain STRABAG (SCS JV), Balfour Beatty VINCI SYSTRA (BBVS JV), Align JV and Mace Dragados JV, confirmed that they will collectively recruit over 10,000 new jobs as HS2 gears up for major construction. HS2 Ltd itself is already directly recruiting for 500 new roles over the next three months, with the majority based in



Birmingham, as the project moves into the construction phase. The forecast jobs boost is a clear sign of the key part that HS2 is already playing in supporting Britain's post-coronavirus economic recovery.

Transport secretary Grant Shapps said: "Today marks a major milestone in this government's ambitions to build back better from Covid-19."

"Shovels in the ground to deliver this new railway means thousands of jobs building the future of our country's infrastructure. This fantastic moment is what leaders across the North and Midlands have called for – action to level up our country by boosting capacity on our railways, improving connections between our regions, and spreading prosperity."

Mark Thurston, CEO of HS2 Ltd said: "This is a hugely exciting moment in the progress of HS2. After 10 years of development and preparatory work, today we can formally announce the start of full construction, unlocking thousands of jobs and supply chain opportunities across the project."

"We are already seeing the

benefits that building HS2 is bringing to the UK economy in the short term, but it's important to emphasise how transformative the railway will be for our country when operational. With the start of construction, the reality of high speed journeys joining up Britain's biggest cities in the North and Midlands and using that connectivity to help level up the country has just moved a step closer."

The HS2 railway is a significant investment both in the near and longer-term economic health of the country. At this crucial time HS2 is already driving investment right across our country. Jobs, including apprenticeships, are beginning to be released on HS2's construction partners' websites and will also be promoted through employment partnerships with local authorities and specialist employment support agencies. Promoting job vacancies in this way helps HS2 to ensure that local people benefit from the thousands of opportunities available. HS2 forecasts that the project will create at least 2,000 apprenticeships on Phase One.

Fire crew help rescue cat stuck in loft

A fire crew from Birchwood helped rescue a cat trapped in the loft of a house in Culcheth.

The Firefighters used a seven metre ladder to rescue the cat which was stuck in a loft at an address on Lodge Drive, Culcheth, on September 1.

The cat was safely rescued.

Meanwhile in another incident food left on a gas hob is believed to have started a fire which caused extensive damage at a house at Glazebury on August 24.

Four fire engines went to the scene in Warrington Road at around 4.20am, from Warrington, Birchwood, Penketh and Wigan.

No-one was hurt but the fire caused extensive damage to the semi-detached house and the adjoining property was also heavily smokelocked.

As well as the kitchen, the fire had damaged a bathroom directly above it on the first floor.

Residents urged to contact NHS 111 first if they need urgent – but not emergency - NHS care

RESIDENTS in Warrington who are in need of urgent – but not emergency care – are now being asked to contact NHS 111 first before travelling to hospital.

With this new initiative patients will be able to get expert health advice and clinical assessment and depending on the individual needs of patients, NHS 111 can book time slots for patients at GP surgeries, NHS Runcorn Urgent Care Centre, NHS Widnes Urgent Care Centre and the emergency department at Warrington Hospital.

This new way of working will support patients to stay as safe

as possible during the coronavirus pandemic by managing the number of patients attending services at any one time. It will also ensure patients get the right care, in the right place by signposting to other services and sources of advice and ensuring that patients get the most appropriate care.

Patients with a booked face-to-face time slot will benefit from reduced waiting times and NHS services can help maintain social distancing guidelines in waiting areas further reducing the risk of infection. Residents who are registered with a local GP practice

should continue to contact their surgery online or via phone as usual. Anyone with a life-threatening emergency should call 999 immediately.

In the coming months this enhancement to the NHS 111 service, which is a national project, will be extended to include the emergency department at Whiston Hospital and other local NHS services. Patients requiring services at their local GP practice should continue to contact their surgery online or via phone as usual and anyone with a life-threatening emergency should call 999 immediately.

Clinical Chief Officer of NHS Halton Clinical Commissioning Group and NHS Warrington Clinical Commissioning Group, Dr Andrew Davies said:

"We are pleased to announce that Warrington has been chosen alongside Blackpool as one of the first areas in the North West to introduce this new and convenient system with other areas across the country following later this year. It will see NHS 111 working closely with hospital departments, urgent care centres, GP practices and other NHS services to ensure that patients get the right care, in the right place at the right time."

Chief Executive of Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals, Professor Simon Constable said:



"This new way of working will allow us to more effectively manage the flow of patients through our emergency department which will help reduce waiting times for patients, ease pressures on staff and ensure we are fully prepared for the busy winter period. Social distancing guidelines also mean that we have reduced capacity in our waiting rooms so, by allocating patients a time slot, we can ensure that patients are able to social distance."

"We strongly encourage patients to contact NHS 111 first if they need urgent care. However, it is really important to note that, even if they have not done so, we will always ensure patients receive appropriate care and treatment in the most appropriate setting."

Green Belt homes scheme rejected by planners

PLANNING chiefs have rejected an application to demolish Holcroft House, in Warrington Road, Culcheth and replace it with two detached dwellings.

The scheme was considered by officers under delegated powers – and they decided the proposed development was in the Green Belt and represented inappropriate development harmful to the Green Belt.

Very special circumstances which would justify allowing the development had not been demonstrated, they decided.

The proposal involved demolition of the existing house and building a replacement four-bedroomed house forward of the site, with a second three-bedroomed house on land to the west of the site.

Both properties would have detached garages at the rear.

Two neighbours lodged objections.



BAS fit Protective Screens for Heathrow Airport

LAUNCHED just three months ago locally based BAS Protective Screens have had an overwhelming response including work at Heathrow airport.

Commenting on the work for

Heathrow, Bill said: "This is just one example of how these screens are enabling businesses to get back to work as safely as possible. The screens are giving confidence to both businesses and customers and we really hope we can get more businesses resuming their services, without feeling the need

to compromise on the number one priority, which of course is safety!"

"Fight changes to the planning system that could impact Warrington"

CHESHIRE Wildlife Trust has launched a campaign asking the public to challenge dramatic changes to the planning system – changes that could have implications for the Warrington area.

The move is a combined effort by Wildlife Trusts and a coalition of environmental charities to ensure that nature is not forgotten under the new proposals in the Government white paper.

Under the proposed plans, land will be sorted into three different categories of "growth", "renewal" and "protect". The first two will see plans automatically approved whereas the latter will remain under the current system. The Trust has argued that this amounts to nature being "discounted, overwhelmed and forgotten."

James Melling the Trust's Campaigns Officer said: "Restoration of our wild space is vital if we are to tackle the current ecological crisis. These spaces need to be bigger, bolder and better connected. We welcome the possibility of reform to the planning system but we need this to be done in a way that works for nature."

"Nature does not fit into three neat categories and the government's plan relies on data that doesn't yet exist. If the plans are to work, we will need to see significant levels of funding to help ensure that ecologically valuable land is correctly identified and that the whole system promotes nature's recovery. We want change

but this is not it."

Reforms will also see a change to the way local residents and third parties are consulted. Under the new system, the public will be able to suggest what land should fit into which category but will not be consulted on developments that fall into either "growth" or "renewal" areas.

Mr Melling added: "It is vital that local people and organisations have a say in the planning process. Last year, Cheshire Wildlife Trust responded to dozens of applications to ensure that wildlife was accounted for. If the reforms go ahead as they are, we could see that development-specific safeguard disappear entirely."

The consultation on the proposed planning reforms runs until October 29. Cheshire Wildlife Trust is calling on all members of the public to submit a response and voice any concerns to their councillors and local MP. More information can be found at <http://wtru.st/do-not-fail-wildlife>.

The new scheme will be operated by staff at the charity's Mobility and Independent Living Store located in Birchwood Shopping Centre.

PARISH NEWS

Throughout the Covid-19 crisis Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council has managed, and will continue to manage, to carry on working via Zoom meetings. This is in order to keep things running smoothly on a day to day basis, making sure that issues such as local planning applications, law and order and policing matters, future planning for the environment of our villages, and the welfare of all residents continue to be addressed and action taken.

We have also been running a poster campaign to help our local businesses as they emerge from lockdown encouraging residents to "Shop Local, Stay Safe". We have an impressive number and variety of local shops and businesses along Lodge Drive, Common Lane, Jackson Avenue, Church Lane and Warrington Road as it passes through our two villages.

Having created a new children's play area and facilities at Mee Brow our next aim was, and is, the improvement of the play area on Culcheth's Green, delayed because of the pandemic. Another casualty of these difficult times is the Christmas Market: the Christmas Lights will happen, with the arrangements being decided closer to the event.

We will continue to work with the Borough Council and Police to address speeding and traffic issues throughout the villages. Our Parish litter wardens and Warrington Borough Council pick up litter-please report any problems to your Councillors.

Culcheth Library is open but has limited opening times, check to see when and how things change.

Changes to National Planning Policy have been proposed and we will be commenting on them, as we always do, because Local policies HAVE to comply with National ones. The main document is called "Planning for the Future" with comments in by October 29th. When we comment our main concerns are protecting the Green Belt, brownfield before greenfield and minimising traffic through our villages. Also it is not just an issue of whether something happens or not, but how it happens.

Like numerous events around the country, this year's annual event at Walton Hall & Gardens had to be cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

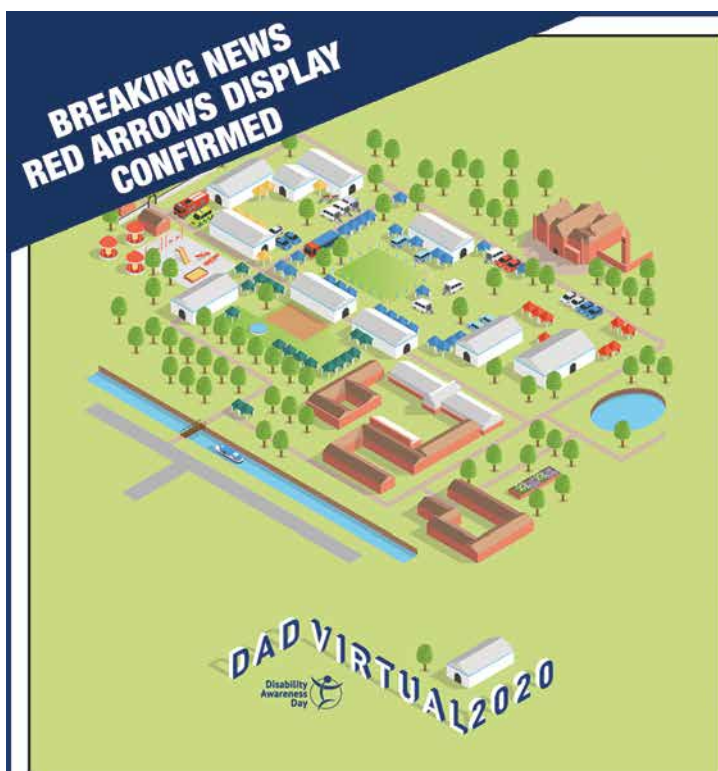
But now thanks to the latest technology the event can be staged online with a virtual event including "walk through" marquees, providing various organisations to promote their services.

Working alongside local online web developers Morgan Branding, the new business got off to a flying start as they sold out of 200 pairs of special compression socks in just 48 hours.

Philbin, aged 25 and with more than 100 first-team games under his belt for the Wolves, is already planning for his future after teaming up with Jack to launch Gripz, a fresh clothing brand. Having already enjoyed success in rugby league, representing Great Britain and Ireland, Philbin now wants to see Gripz thrive in the sporting world.

Commenting on the business venture Philbin said: "I've been thinking of this for years. I've always followed a few brands and I've always fancied giving something like this a go.

"Lockdown gave me the opportunity to act on it because previously I was always doing rugby. I got together with my good mate Jack Hodgkiss and we spent a good few months putting things in place.

"We have been friends for a long time. We've both had similar ideas with what we wanted to do. He's already got a successful construction company and I was looking to start this so we got talking to each other, shared ideas and we decided to use his expertise in the business world and my expertise in the sporting world, so we've put them ideas together and hopefully it is a good recipe for success."

The first item of clothing launched is a compression sock, which has been specifically designed to give

an extra boost to performance – and they are looking to launch an activewear range as well.

Philbin added: "Our first product, the Gripz sock, can be worn for playing any sport, or for walking or going to the gym.

"Boots are getting a lot lighter these days and your feet can move around your boot quite a bit so the compression sock will give that extra boost.

"They have got silicone grips on the bottom of the sock and it gives you that extra 1% in the change of your direction and extra power. The grips we have got go up the back of the sock so they help prevent blisters.

Philbin and Hodgkiss are determined to turn Gripz into a huge success – and they also want to give back to their local community in the process.

Philbin continued: "We want to build a solid brand. We want to do it properly and we want to make this a brand that people want to wear.

"We want to let the business grow organically and we've set a target that we want to be sponsoring the clubs that we both played for at amateur level within six to 12 months.

"Jack played for Culcheth Football Club and so did I. I played rugby for Culcheth Eagles and Latchford Giants so we want to be sponsoring those teams down the line and give back to the clubs that gave so much to us.

"One of our main goals is to give back to the community so hopefully it all works out well."
