### Call for Council to do more to save leisure facilities

#### A CONCERNED councillor is calling on Warrington Borough Council to do more to save leisure facilities at Culcheth which are under threat of closure.

Culcheth & Glazebury Parish Councillor Val Allen MBE has called on the Borough Council to "do more" to safeguard leisure facilities in the facility based at Culcheth High School.

Cllr Allen's comments come after LiveWire announced that it had suffered a drop in commercial income of £3.2 Million since lockdown.

LiveWire operates leisure facilities on behalf of the Borough Council including the Culcheth Community Campus.

Campus. Clir Allen also sits on Croft Parish Council and has described that a loss of the facilities would be a "tremendous blow" to the local area. She said: "I am concerned at the

She said: "I am concerned at the announcement about the possible closure of the Culcheth Community Campus. The Council must do more to safeguard the future of the Community Campus."

more to sareguard the future of the Community Campus." "In the rural communities of Culcheth, Glazebury, Croft and surrounding areas, these leisure facilities are not only one of the only offerings for fitness, health and wellbeing but the Community Campus facilities are also a lifeline for local communities."

"If the Community Campus was to close, it would be a tremendous blow for the community and the sports teams who use the facilities, including the sports pitches."

including the sports pitches." LiveWire has launched a consultation about the future of Culcheth Community Campus. Cllr Allen added: "I have been

Cllr Allen added: "I have been contacted by a number of concerned residents and I would encourage everyone to engage with the consultation survey and have your voice heard. It is simply unacceptable to close our community facilities."

Warrington Borough Council's Cabinet Member for leisure and community, Cllr Tony Higgins, said: "We understand the concerns of the Culcheth community and we are committed to fully engaging them in the discussions over the future of leisure provision in the area

leisure provision in the area. "The impact of COVID-19 has resulted in a substantial loss of income for our leisure and library services, and we have not received a sufficient level of funding from the government to mitigate this. The last thing we want to do is change or reduce services, but the unprecedented challenges we are facing mean we have no choice but to consider costsaving proposals. This is essential if we are to protect the future of our wider leisure, libraries and lifestyles provision.

"Culcheth Community Campus faces specific challenges. The small size of the site means that to operate it under socially-distanced conditions would not be financially viable. At the same time, the site has operated at a loss for some time. While we have always sought to maintain the site in the community through the absorbing of this loss by our other sites, we are no longer in a position to do this. The huge financial pressures we are now facing mean that it is the right time to reassess the future direction of the site.



## Fifty-fifty chance "The Daten" will not survive the pandemic

### THERE is a 50-50 chance that Culcheth Sports Club – still known by many local people as "The Daten" – might not survive the pandemic.

That's the view of club secretary Stuart Nightingale as the Charnock Road club faces an uncertain future following the end of Warrington's

rollowing the end of Warrington's second lockdown. He said: "If Culcheth wants to keep what is a magnificent sports and social club, local people are going to have to use it. It could be a case of use it or loca it " a case of use it or lose it."

The club has been struggling for some time – even before Covid-19 struck. A number of sections have closed – some of them blaming what they have described as a hard-line taken by the club committee.

There was particular anger of the closure of the club's long established, 80-strong bowling section which led to the superb,

section which led to the superb, floodlit bowling green being taken over for five-a-side football. One bowler said: "The club was demanding a £4,500 fee upfront when, for years, we had been paying it off on a monthly basis. We could not raise this – but we offered to pay £2,500 up front and the balance monthly. But the club committee would not agree so we had no alternative but to leave " had no alternative but to leave.

He said he understood other sections were considering leaving because they could not agree terms with the committee.

"We have in effect been kicked out - the club seems to have been

our – the club seems to have been taken over by the football section." But Mr Nightingale said: "I don't know if the bowling section couldn't pay or wouldn't pay. But we could not reach an agreement. We offered the bowling green to the croquet section and the tennis action but acides worked to the it section but neither wanted to take it on. In the end we let the five-a-side football take it over. And it was a member of the former bowling section who kicked the first ball.

"We realise the various sections have not been able to function during the lockdown so have not been receiving income from their members. But the main club has also lost its income. The bar has been closed and we have not been able to take bookings for weddings other functions. But our and and other functions. But out monthly outgoings have continued – and it costs a lot to keep the building going. The heating alone is expensive and we have all sorts of specialist equipment to maintain. "We cannot reserve parts of the

club for people who may not come back when things return to normal – particularly when there are other people prepared to move in now." The Daten Club, as it was originally known, dates from

Finally, to help get Warrington East Scouts in Culcheth meeting again they are looking to fund a set of resuscitation dolls as part of their First Aid Training. The training will be carried out by their trained Scout Leaders.

Members from 40 Rotary Clubs in the District collected over 6,000 pairs of shoes, making the footwear poverty campaign extremely successful. It is estimated that 200,000 homeless people in the UK lack proper footwear.

### Man ordered to pay £2,000 after fly tipping in country lane

A MAN who dumped rubbish in a country lane at Warrington has been ordered to pay more than  $\pounds 2,000$  for fly tipping at Winwick. He was convicted in his absence after failing to turn up at the court in Warrington

Warrington.

The court heard Matthew Howe, 47, of Halliwell Road, Prestwich, Manchester, advertised waste disposal services without a licence and then dumped waste at Waterworks Lane in Winwick.

Howe was unable to produce the relevant licence or documentation to carry the waste when contacted by the council, but at first pleaded not guilty to fly tipping offences at an earlier hearing after an arrest summons was issued to bring him to court.

issued to bring him to court. He then failed to attend Warrington Combined Court on and was found guilty in his absence after magistrates heard the council's evidence. He was fined  $\pounds1,760$  and ordered to pay a  $\pounds170$  victim surcharge and costs of  $\pounds500 - a$  total of  $\pounds2,430$ . After the hearing, Cllr Judith Guthrie, Warrington Borough Council's cabinet member for environment and public protection said: "This is another example of an unlicensed individual offering a waste collection service for money – then irresponsibly dumping it with total disregard for the local environment and community. environment and community.

"Residents should always ensure that anyone who takes their waste away is authorised and certified by their local council to do so. If not, residents are also at risk of receiving a fine for improper waste disposal. "It is important that people check that anyone who offers to take their waste away is authorised and certified by their local council to do so, as they are legally responsible for the disposal of their waste and we don't want them to fall victim to these unlicensed operators and to face the possibility of a fine". ot a fine

## Farm seeks permission to grow pick-your-own fruit business



A PLAN to increase the number of Spanish tunnels at Kenyon Hall Farm, Croft, has been submitted to borough planning chiefs – to meet a growing demand for pick-your-own soft fruit.

The farm – which has long been selling direct to the public – already has seven poly tunnels used for soft fruit and is struggling to meet demand.

The tunnels have extended the season for picking soft fruit to 5-6 months, compared to the traditional method of growing in the open which is still practised on the farm but has a season of only 6-7 weeks

 less if the weather is bad.
 Demand has grown to the extent where picking has to be rationed, resulting in many people having to

The family-run business has continued to invest, adding a farm shop, café, car parks and sales of ornamental plants.

As a result, it has become destination in itself - but is As challenged to meet demand.

The farm also produces arable crops, including potatoes and cereals, but the current uncertain future for agriculture means direct sales to the public provides better resilience.

It also enables visitors to enjoy the open air and the experience of

visiting a farm which encourages wildlife through hedges, trees and endangered species, including the grey partridge and the lapwing. The farm is also involved in the

community and runs several events that involve local youngsters, including being taught how to grow crops as an introduction to farming

And the farm has also helped in the development of other farms by hosting training events and sharing technology with others.

During the Covid19 lockdown the farm was able to continue to supply fresh fruit and vegetables safely for the local families to access.

The tunnels used are only clad with polythene from March to September, so are not a permanent fixture and they will allow the farm to take production forward into future years and continue to provide good fresh produce with a

day out on a farm for the visitor. Borough council highways and environmental protection chiefs have no objections to the scheme.
