He says being at college has given him the necessary skills in food preparation essential to securing a job within this competitive industry. His experience at The French means he is able to share advice



Pandemic hits village church finances

THE COVID -19 pandemic has hit finances at Lymm's St Mary's Church – leaving the church about £10,000 down on its usual income.

The Church Hall has been forced to close and the church has also been unable to hold events such as teas and the annual Christmas Tree Festival which are normally a source of income. Income from the church hall alone was £18,847 last year but is down to

£8,982 this year.

But gas and electric bills, insurances and repairs still have to be paid for the hall and the church and major repairs costing nearly £4,000 are necessary on the church hall.

the church hall. The Rector, the Rev Beverley Jameson said: "Traditionally Christians remember the visit of the wise men bringing gifts to Jesus at Epiphany. It is also remembered as the 12 days of Christmas, from Christmas Day to Epiphany January 6. "Could you possibly just give 10 per cent of what you may spend on presents, turkeys, tinsel, food and chocolate etc. as an Epiphany gift to St Mary's Church to help fund both the church and the church hall which is a wonderful community metat. asset.

Residents fear truckwash expansion onto green belt will cause even more traffic chaos

CONCERNED residents and councillors are protesting against controversial plans by Lymm Truckwash to expand its business on to Green Belt land.

Planning permission is being

Planning permission is being sought to increase the area used, add a fuelling facility and to operate 24 hours a day, all week long. Residents of the Lane End community at the top of Cherry Lane in Lymm have complained about the noise, air pollution and blocked main roads from the current site and are convinced this will be made much worse by the planned expansion.


will be made much worse by me planned expansion. Parish councillor Tim Martland said: "The Truckwash started operating in 2018 following a controversial planning decision to approve development despite an identical facility operating at Poplar services. The new proposal is to build a truck waiting area on Green Belt land and a fuel bunker to allow greater use of the site. Lorries

allow greater use of the site. Lorries queuing to enter the site regularly extend back onto the A50 causing a dangerous traffic situation. "The neighbouring Fire Station has complained about HGVs doing three-point turns on its access road. Lymm Truckwash is currently open 7am to 5pm weekdays but the expansion would see it operating

24 hours all week. The nearest house separated only by a wooden fence, experiences the worst of the noise, fumes and light pollution and has had flooding in their garden on several occasions.

The Inland Border Facility on the "The Inland Border Facility on the Shearings coach site at Appleton Thorn has been approved with an extra 750 HGVs expected to use Junction 20 each day for Brexit custom checks. This will add to local traffic congestion and worsen conditions for Lane End residents especially if the vehicles use the Truckwash Truckwash.

"Cllr Anna Fradgley and I are supporting the residents' campaign. There are major problems with the current Truckwash which need addressing as they impact on the health and lives of families the health and lives of families nearby. The new plan to build on Green Belt make this dreadful situation significantly worse. We urge Warrington Borough Council to reject it. "But the truckwash operators claim their proposals have been put forward to alleviate the very problems the objectors are complaining about complaining about. They want to double the onsite

HGV queuing capacity and to introduce a 24-hour HGV fuelling

introduce a 24-nour rock tuening facility on the site. Truckwash spokesman Matt Marsden said: "We have experienced occasional queuing on to the A50, which is why we are proposing to double the onsite curving conacity. queuing capacity. "The plan is to use a small piece

of redundant wasteland which we own at the rear of the site which means queuing lorries will actually be further away from the nearest homes than they are at present. "This will help to ease congestion

on the A50. "The fuel facility will enable lorry drivers to wash and re-fuel in one go, reducing unnecessary road journeys. Only the fuel facility will be open 24 hours – there is no intention to extend the current operating hours of the truckwash. "As part of the current planning

application, we are proposing to

build a 4m high acoustic barrier within our site between us and the nearest house. There will also be a further 4m high acoustic barrier next to the fuel facility. There will no additional fumes or light pollution and any additional noise will go unnoticed because of the constant background noise from

constant background noise from the motorway. "There are no major problems with the current truckwash. The business is performing well and taking on new staff. We would simply like to double the onsite queuing capacity to alleviate the occasional problems when we are excessively busy. "Extending onsite queuing solves the problem – it doesn't make it

the problem – it doesn't make it worse.

Lymm Truckwash opened on its present site last year. Previously it operated for some 25 years within the Moto Lymm truckstop on the opposite side of the A50.

Poppy Appeal team raised £11,500 - despite Covid

THE Lymm Poppy Appeal team raised more than £11,500 for this year's appeal – despite the local and national restrictions necessary because of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Team members could not go into supermarkets to collect and it was not possible to hold a concert to launch the appeal. They were not able to cover as many outlets as usual.

But they set out to acehieve the best results possible for the Royal British Legion to continue their work supporting forces veterans and their families. Neville Davies built a Covid safe kiosk which was used at Lymm Dam, the Lymm truck stop and a farmer's market at Abbev Levs Farm

market at Abbey Leys Farm. Because of a ban on street and face-to-face collections, the team were not able to be in the villager centre on the day before Remembrance Sunday. But they had 96 collecting tins out at 46 outlets and received huge support from schools, local shops, pubs and restaurants.

Special thanks were due to High Legh Garden Centre where more than £1,000 was raised and to Poppy Day veteran Albert Priestner and his family who were able to raise more than £1,000 through his online giving page.

The team are now hoping things will be back to normal for next year's Poppy Day so they can resume their many fund-raising activities.

Footballers help launch Lymm High School's new FIFA-standard 3G pitch

A FIFA-standard third-generation (3G) pitch has been officially opened at Lymm High School by ex-Everton and Scotland international David Weir and ex-student Ellie Fletcher who currently plays for Blackburn Rovers.

The professional footballers were joined at the socially-distanced event by local football team representatives: Gavin Laidlaw from Lymm Rovers and Julia Johnson from Lymm Piranhas. Other invited attendees that also contributed towards the project included Kate Harrison from The Lane End Group, Kirsty James from Lymm High PTA, and Liz Green, Chair of Governors.

The Premier League, the FA and the Government's Football Foundation awarded Lymm High a grant of over £500,000 to help it install the full-sized, floodlit pitch. The school and its supporters raised over £100,000. Thanking all the fundraisers

Thanking all the fundraisers and the overwhelming community support, Headteacher Gwyn Williams, said he was delighted to be finally opening the state-ofthe-art sports facility, which will be used by Lymm High students during the school day and the community of Lymm and its surrounding area during evenings and weekends. Lymm Rovers and Piranhas have already been using it for training and matches, and both organisations were thanked for their professionalism and kind donations towards reaching the £100,000 total.

However, the irony of opening the sporting facility the day before it is closed to the community because of the second Lockdown was not lost on Mr Williams.

"We are thrilled to be officially opening the pitch after what seems like years of planning", he said, "but it seems rather poignant to be closing it to the community from tomorrow as a result of the latest lockdown. On the other hand, perhaps this just serves to underline the fact that this is a facility that will serve the community for many years to come – long after any lockdown has passed."

The date was also significant as it marked three years to the day since Lymm High staff took part in a sponsored climb of Mount Snowdon to help raise funds for the school's 'Pitch In' initiative. Other activities included summer fairs, PTA events, school balls, whole-school Santa dashes and the annual Founders' Day activities. Students also held and organised a number of events in school, competing within their Halls to raise funds. There were also a number of dinners, raffles and prize draws, and Mr Williams thanked local businesses for all their support in donating items. Local contracting developers The Lane End Group were the initiative's major corporate sponsor

major corporate sponsor. "Today is all about thanking those organisations, businesses and individuals that helped us reach our goal. Obviously, we are very grateful to the Premier League, the FA and the Government's Football Foundation for the grant, without which this wouldn't have been possible, but we could not have achieved this without the generous and continued support of parents and the wider Lymm community either", said Mr Williams. "We always knew the bid was a very strong one, built as it was on the strong reputation of our own PE department but also that of Lymm Rovers and Lymm Piranhas junior football clubs – both very well-run clubs with large numbers of boys and girls taking part on a regular basis. Lots of people in school have done lots of work to make this happen but I particularly want to thank Patrick Hendrie and Helena Headon. It's still been a long, and sometimes difficult, process, but we are so pleased to be opening our 3G pitch at last and are incredibly grateful to everyone for their support."
