Having been a near-daily visitor to Warrington Town Centre for business and recreational purposes for more than 40 years, I have to say the latest plans to make the temporary COVID-19 related traffic measures permanent, is possibly the most ill-conceived highways proposal I have ever witnessed since the creation of the Bridge Foot chaos, which has now become worse, making three lanes merge into two.

While I totally understand the need to make the town centre more residential friendly, the current temporary system actually creates more rat runs as bemused and confused motorists attempt to navigate their way through a confusing maze.

I know the town centre like the back of my hand and now struggle to find a way through. The proposed closure to through

traffic on Winwick Street near Central Station is an absolute nightmare for people dropping passengers outside the station. This was previously a quick route across town for those who know the area, providing easy access to the main town centre car park. Now this route has been cut off, it is going to have a damaging impact for town centre retailers, as around and go around the "system" to get back into town – particularly when it involves well-known bottle necks on Froghall Lane and the Cockhedge roundabout.

Travelling along Wilson Patten Street has never been easy and obviously, the ongoing roadworks have made the situation a lot worse. I

remain to be convinced that the new road coming out at Slutchers Lane will improve things but at the very least we should wait to see the impact BEFORE making any temporary changes permanent.

Recently I had the dubious "pleasure" of travelling into the town centre and almost lost the will to live trying to get back out, surrounded by númerous other motorists struggling to find a way through.

Before making any permanent decision those involved in planning this system should endeavour to make

the following journey.

Drive along Wilson Patten Street and turn into Winmarleigh Street towards the Golden Gates and then make a right turn into Museum Street to access a business or to visit the library. As you come to the end of Museum Street please now tell me how you get out of the town centre

without making a u-turn? I "enjoyed" this experience with many other frustrated and confused motorists recently. I work with many small businesses in the town centre and have yet to meet one owner who believes the new measures will improve things – all fearing they will

make things worse. I look forward to our highway planners hopefully adopting some common sense - and please don't just spend money because you have got to - spend it wisely.

College to educate and train healthcare professionals of the future

WARRINGTON'S University Technical College is now offering a new technical specialism to train the healthcare professionals of the future.

Now Warrington teenagers inspired by healthcare professionals working on the frontline in the global coronavirus pandemic are being offered a new career pathway, with UTC Warrington launching a new technical specialism in healthcare, backed by employers, to educate and train future health and social care workers.

Amanda Downing, Associate Principal, UTC Warrington, said: "Our new healthcare specialism is an important addition to our curriculum offer given the national surge of interest from young people in health and social care careers since the start of the pandemic, as well as the urgent need for new talent in the sector."

talent in the sector." She added: "As a UTC, we train young people in the scientific and technical skills which are increasingly in demand in these roles, alongside essential people skills such as empathy, communication and teamwork."

From September 2021, students in Year 10 and Year 11 will be able to study a BTEC in Health and Social Care alongside their GCSEs.

In sixth form, students will be able to choose from a vocational route with a BTEC Extended Diploma Level 3 in Health and Social Care, equivalent to three A levels. Or students can study a combined route completing a BTEC Diploma alongside A Levels.

Bridgewater Community Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust is one of the employers working with UTC Warrington on the new healthcare specialism.

Sarah Power, Talent for Care Programme Facilitator, Bridgewater Community Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust, said: "As an organisation, we are really keen to work with the UTC to offer students some insight into our services and how they operate and to hopefully inspire them to consider a career in the NHS. Our staff are passionate about the work that they do and keen to share that enthusiasm with local young people."

young people." She added: "We are continually expanding the work we do in our local community and hope to create a unique link with UTC Warrington that will ideally see some of the students undertaking these new health and social care pathways to form part of our future workforce."

Alongside their studies, students will work with local health and social care employers through site visits, work placements and practical masterclasses.

Hospital's life-saving Covid-19 'Black Box' scoops national innovation award

WARRINGTON Hospital's pioneering Covid-19 'Black Box' which provided potential life-saving therapy for seriously ill patients has scooped a prestigious national innovation award.

The team of clinicians that transformed a simple medical device to help some of the most seriously ill COVID-19 patients won the prestigious national innovation award in the annual London Business School (LBS) Innovation Awards.

Awards. The Warrington Hospital team were named as the inaugural winners of the new 'Innovating in Adversity' category at the LBS Awards ceremony which was held virtually.

The mixed team of doctors, nurses and allied health professionals working across Intensive Care, high care Respiratory ward and the Cardiorespiratory team were recognised for the remarkable impact of their innovation. The simple modified CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure) device brought almost instant relief to patients with extreme breathing difficulties admitted with the debilitating effects of COVID-19

brought almost instant reliet to patients with extreme breathing difficulties admitted with the debilitating effects of COVID-19. CPAP is a well-established therapy for conditions causing significant breathing problems and low oxygen levels and is used widely in the community to increase airway pressure in patients with chronic sleep apnoea. Aware of the expected national shortage of the pandemic, the team wanted to find a way to assess the response to other forms of treatment before mechanical ventilation was considered. They decided to try to modify the community CPAP devices for high-flow oxygen use. They made a simple change to the mask and added a filter which also allowed oxygen to be supplied via the mask and then tested the devices on themselves, using anaesthetic gas analysis to confirm the levels of oxygen being delivered.

oxygen being delivered. Testing on patients in a controlled environment followed and the team were delighted when most patients found their breathing easing and oxygen levels rising. Patients that did not adequately oxygenate after a few hours on the CPAP 'Black Box' were escalated to intensive care for ventilation.

Particular mention should go

to Mithun Murthy, respiratory consultant; Saagar Patel, acute medicine and respiratory consultant and Mark Forrest (critical care consultant) and Jo Thomas, lead physiotherapist for respiratory and critical care who were key in completing this work stream within supportive multidisciplinary respiratory, cardiorespiratory and critical care teams.

This significant development was the focus of a Sky News documentary during the first wave of the pandemic and was also named winner of a London Business School People's Choice Award, following a public vote earlier this year.

Dr Alex Ćrowe, Medical Director for WHH said: "It is difficult to think of an occasion when an award was more well-deserved than this one. This team, when under intense and unprecedented pressures, were able to think creatively and worked together as respiratory and critical care teams to use their combined clinical expertise and the existing resources available to them.

"Receiving such a prestigious national award, in a field of some of the nation's most accomplished innovators, means that everyone can feel justifiably proud and it is a welcome boost many months into this pandemic.

this pandemic. "There is no doubt that whilst COVID-19 infection remains a serious threat for many – leading to serious and life-threatening complications for some – these devices continue to improve outcomes for many patients who would otherwise require much higher risk ventilation procedures."

London Busines's School Innovation Award Judge, Charlie Dawson added: "The teeth of the COVID-19 crisis in a regional hospital on its way to being overwhelmed... definitely adversity. The response was practical, smart, fast and described modestly as 'just doing our job'. The results were way beyond such understatement."



Head of the technology department at Daresbury, Ian Lazarus, said:"I am proud to be leading this team, in which we have brought together experts from medicine, science, engineering and knowledge transfer with a shared goal to make resilient high quality ventilators available in areas of the world which currently don't have enough of them. "We look forward to redeploying skills that normally underpin science research into this different and very necessary field, working with medical experts in both UK and Brazil. Together we hope to make a positive impact in the current fight against COVID-19 and afterwards in the treatment of other respiratory conditions in countries where ventilators are not as readily available as they are here in the UK " available as they are here in the UK

UK." As well as leadership from Daresbury Lab, teams across STFC will be working on this project. The £760,000 funding has been awarded by UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) through the Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF), which looks to support scientists to develop solutions to mitigate the short and long-term social, economic and health impacts of the pandemic.



funding awards to the Town is starting to be shaped into projects that can be delivered on the ground, bringing both a welcome stimulus to the Town and jobs alike. stimulus to the town and jobs anke. Despite not securing funding for a new electric bus fleet, the delivery of the new bus depot gathers pace and with some of the rationalised highways schemes and new residential development both in the Town and the surrounding areas will start to see the next chapter of development that will springboard from the schemes of the past year, such as the work to Slutchers Lane and Time Square.

College signs up to new mental health charter

WARRINGTON'S Priestley College has reaffirmed its commitment to protecting the mental health of its students and staff by signing up to a new national charter.

The college always prioritised its students' wellbeing, but signing the charter shows it remains a priority.

Assistant principal Mark Eccleston said: "The impact of the pandemic on people's mental health cannot be underestimated and at no point have we done so at Priestley.

at Priestley. "However, our commitment to the charter just gives us some fresh focus on this important part of college life."

The 11-point document, created by the Association of Colleges in conjunction with mental health experts, includes commitments to:

 Promoting equality of opportunity and challenging mental health stigma

• Providing appropriate mental health training for staff

 Providing targeted individual mental health support where appropriate One in 10 young people

One in 10 young people experience a mental health problem and one in five aged 16-24 experience a common mental illness such as anxiety or depression.

It is also thought that 75 per cent of adults with a diagnosable mental health problem experience their first symptoms before the age of 24, which means Priestley plays a vital role in supporting its 2,000 students and 300 staff.

For Mental Health Awareness Day all students and staff were asked to pledge one thing they were going to change to improve their mental health.

Support is available through a pastoral team of tutors, a counsellor and a wellbeing practitioner, Caroline Atkinson, who was appointed recently to support students and promote positive mental health amongst the college community.

community. Richard Caulfield, mental health lead at the Association of Colleges, said: "Every single day colleges like Priestley provide a world class education and transform the lives of millions of people.

"This includes providing support for both staff and student wellbeing at the right time, in the right place. "This charter gives colleges the chance to publicly state their commitment to the mental health agenda."


