Editor's Comment

SPRING is in the air, the roadmap out of lockdown is underway and the vaccine programme is being rolled out so hopefully, the light is shining brightly at the end of what has been a very long dark tunnel.

We will have all been impacted in some way during what has been a torrid year for many but some worse than others, especially those who have lost loved ones, are still suffering the ill-effects of long COVID and those who have lost their livelihoods.

Spending a lot of time on social media, which is a necessary "evil" of my job, it has become clear there are a lot of angry, anxious and frustrated people out there and with local elections in the air, there have been some very toxic comments in circulation.

It is easy to criticise from a keyboard and lash out at those in the community, who are very often just trying to do their best.

Most people involved in public life I have met, do it for the right reasons - to try and make a meaningful difference in their local communities.

Yes, I know there are career politicians, who are financially rewarded for their endeavours, but the vast majority, especially parish councillors and community volunteers, do it because they want to help people.

Healthy debate and being critical

of manifesto policies is one thing, but personal toxic and abusive but personal toxic and abusive insults are totally out of order.

Freedom of speech is essential but allowing people to be abusive and nasty and insulting is something we can do without.

So here at Lymm Life we have now decided to include a Zero Tolerance policy on our Facebook group, which has nearly 4,000 members, that anyone who is abusive to others with personal insults or foul and abusive language is blocked. We and the vast majority of likeminded people don't want these people spouting their poison in our community - no doubt I will be called a dictator by some - but the group is part of my business - and I believe if all media had similar principles the world would be a better place.
















Quality Counts award for Rosebank Naturegarten

Calls for urgent review of flooding defences along River Bollin

A concerned councillor is calling for an urgent review of flooding defences along the Rover Bollin following the recent flooding at Lymm which impacted local homes and farmer's

Lymm Councillor Kath Buckley has called for an urgent meeting with the Environment Agency following damage to the flo defences along the River Bollin.

Following a meeting with local farmers, Cllr Buckley saw the damage which has been caused close to the Old Mill at Heatley Weir first hand, as trees have been brought down blocking the river flow and storm gullies are blocked. Flooding in this area of Lymm has increased in recent years, with local residents reporting concerns all along the River Bollin which falls under the responsibility of the

Environment Agency.

A severe flood warning was issued to properties in Heatley Mere in January and around 150 homes were advised to leave the properties due to the risk of serious flooding. Whilst the water didn't reach the levels forecast some homes were severely damaged on Warrington Lane and Reddish Lane.

Cllr Buckley says if another storm occurs before the defences are repaired the consequences will be much worse.

"The awful flooding of Reddish Lane in 2019 was supposed to be

a once in a hundred-year event. However, as residents of Lymm are aware flooding again took place recently which has devastated again residents of Reddish Lane and this time the residents of Warrington Lane".

"A very large area of the bank has been washed away along Wetgate Lane and this means homes on Mill Lane and Birch Brook Road are also potentially at risk. Local farmers have also seen their fields flooded and crops destroyed as the Bollin burst its banks again and watercourses are clogged".

Cllr Buckley has been working with the Reddish Lane residents since 2019 to access flooding grant aid support and to address future flooding.

Lymm Parish council is supporting her attempts to help the residents and Cllr Buckley has been in discussion with Andy Carter MP and Warrington Borough Council to highlight the concerns of local residents.

green fingers", looks after the day to day production and is responsible for planting, potting, weeding and



Oscar and Sebastian, aged 10 from Lymm, got their school – Cherry Tree Primary in Lymm- to "Go Bright in February" to raise funds for Muscular Dystrophy UK.

The boys were diagnosed in 2019 with fascioscapulohumeral dystrophy (FSHD) – a rare, progressive muscle-wasting condition that slowly destroys muscle making aný physical

funds for the charity.

Proud mum Kerry said: "Muscular

Dystrophy UK has been a lifeline
to us since their diagnosis but is losing a huge amount of income from cancelled events during these lockdowns. We're trying to raise as much as we can to help them carry on with their vital support for us and other families affected by much wasting conditions."

Kerry added: "Oscar and Sebastian are such gorgeous, bright boys it's utterly heartbreaking to see how much weaker they're becoming the sample and at the sample and t every day- even the simple act of moving around is becoming more and more difficult for them. They never fail to amaze us with their resilience and determination to do as much as they can and are

spending lockdown trying to learn how to play instruments. They want to be the first rockstars that use wheelchairs!"

Facioscapulohumeral dystrophy (FSHD) is a genetic muscle-wasting condition that primarily affects the face, shoulders and upper arms but can also cause weakness in the legs and rest of the body. It affects around 1 in 20,000 people and there are only around 2,500 people in the UK living with this condition.

Dad being treated for rare cancer thanks "amazing" wife and community for fantastic support

A father of two being treated for a rare former of cancer has thanked his "amazing" wife and local community for their fantastic support during such difficult times.

Matthew Eborall, aged 38 from Lymm, was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer, Sarcoma and is currently undergoing chemotherapy at the Clatterbridge Cancer centre

at the Clatterbridge Cancer centre in Liverpool.

Despite being made redundant and having to start her own business working from home and caring for her husband, Sarah, 32, embarked on a fundraising campaign exceeding her initial target, with funds still coming in while also becoming the top fundraiser for the Sarcoma charity.

fundraiser for the Sarcoma charity. Matthew said: "This type of cancer is so rare there are currently only 15 people undergoing the treatment. I know a lot of charities are not getting any funding at this time but the Sarcoma charity didn't

get much anyway.
"With this in mind, Sarah has been amazing with her non-stop fundraising and has managed to raise to date over £3500 and

to raise to date over £3500 and counting.

"The Sarcoma team has been amazed how much she has raised so far and have said she is their top fundraiser for the charity.

"I truly appreciate her for all she has done and would also like to thank the local community who have not only sent money but have also contributed for raffles and helping us over this troubling time. helping us over this troubling time.

Matthew currently works for Guy Salmon Landrover in Knutsford who he says have been "brilliant and very supportive" with his Illness. Married to Sarah they have two

children Jaden, 9, and Summer who

children Jaden, 9, and Summer who is 5. Both go to the local school Oughtrington Community Primary. Sarah was a former Thomas Cook cabin crew until being made redundant. She currently works from home for The Bodyshop at Home and despite Matthew's illness and looking after him, she illness and looking after him, she has gone up the ranks in no time and now is an area manager with a team of 1.0 consultants.

Her fundraising started with a fundraising page with a target of £1000. She organised online sales nights for her Bodyshop at Home team with part of their commission

team with part of their commission added to the fundraising page.

She also organised a homemade cake sale with a yellow theme which she did on their driveway which was a "massive success" and was all covid compliant. There was also a wear yellow day. Sarah is also an avid runner and did a sponsored 10k run with her friend Tom and also 50 miles in January. She also has managed to do online raffles with personalised handbags that were donated by a local

Matthew added: "To help in the fundraising my work colleagues did a wear your own clothes to did a wear your own clothes to work day, despite most of the guys working from home. Jaden and Summer's school teachers did a sponsored Saturday morning walk around Lymm and the reception teachers also did a 10k sponsored run. In total, to date, Sarah has managed to raise £3339 smashing

the original £1000 target.
"Our close friends and local community have also been so compassionate not only did they raise £500 for us just before Christmas which has been used to landscape our garden while i'm shielding, I have also saved for a place to enjoy the sunshine with the family. We also have received food parcels from the local church group. group. "Ive

THE "Big Lymm Clean-up" campaign has been launched in the village to tackle increasing litter problems during the last year.
Residents who are annoyed at

seeing the car parks with entire take-aways dumped in them, or all the cans, crisp packets, and bottles thrown into the hedgerows and discarded facemasks in the streets

are urged to join the campaign.
A group of locals with the kind support of the Parish Council, have launched The Big Lymm-Clean-Up Campaign.

The campaign plans to get the whole of Lymm and visitors on board to tackle the problem, help restore the village, its woodland and trails to a litter-free state - and and trails to a keep it that way! Chrissie Chrissie

Knight Organiser Chrissie Knight said: "Lymm, has been severely affected during the pandemic due to increased footfall as it's a noted beauty spot. Unfortunately, budget cuts mean there are only three part-time personnel in Lymm to litterpick, and even with this resource and the wonderful efforts of 100 or so regular litter-picking volunteers, the battle against litter is being lost.

"The good news though is that people in Lymm have terrific community spirit and love for their environment. With this campaign, we hope to raise awareness of we hope to raise awareness of the seriousness and urgency of the

problem and ask for their help.'
The Big Lymm Clean Up has three aims. The first is to encourage residents to use picker sticks (some will be available to take away at local outlets), plastic bags, strong gloves, hand sanitiser and possibly hi-vis - and go out and have a pick.

This doesn't necessarily mean

an excursion with a big sack for two hours. Organiser Fiona Barnett explains. 'There are simpler, more 'bite sized' ways of tackling this, such as the 'Two Minute Pick' in such as the 'Two Minute Pick' in your own garden and surrounding pavement, the 'Five Minute Pick' of 200 metres around your house or flat and finally, the 'adding a bit more purpose to your walk' pick for, say 45 minutes. You will be astonished at how much you will find, even in just a couple of minutes and surprised at how satisfied you will feel at seeing the results!' will feel at seeing the results!

The second aim of the Clean-Up is to spotlight the existing Lymm community groups and resources that people can join. This includes Lymm Litter Network – a Facebook group which the community uses to communicate litter hotspots and

litter picking activities.

Organiser Paul Connor is a champion of litter picking throughout Warrington. He explains that, "Lymm Litter Network is proving very popular due to the sheer convenience and sense of community that stems from coordinated solo picking! You can choose to 'Adopt a Route' via our interactive map, or simply pick wherever takes your fancy! It is wherever takes your fancy! It is proving to be a great alternative to group picks during these times of social distancing, and I expect it to grow still further into the future!". Another key local group is Keep Lymm Kleen, which currently offers equipment for dedicated pickers and which intends to resume group picks as soon as lockdown eases. Finally, the most challenging

Finally, the most challenging objective, which is to educate people to stop throwing litter in the first place and put it in the bin.

The campaign will last for the whole of 2021 and the focus for the

first quarter will be on the benefit of a clean environment on our mental health and wellbeing.

Success for campaign to slow speeding traffic on Burford Lane

AFTER a campaign lasting many years to reduce the dangers from speeding vehicles on Burford Lane, residents have finally got the speed limit reduced.

Local Councillor Kath Buckley has thanked local people for their efforts, having relentlessly campaigned alongside many who were concerned about the number of speeding cars on the long open stretch of road.

In March 2020 Cllr. Buckley forwarded comprehensive document to the Borough Council and Warrington South MP Andy Carter, in which she argued for a speed limit review and a 30mph

limit along Burford lane.

Cllr. Buckley says the process of getting agreement has taken some time but after traffic surveys

Warrington Highways agreed that the speed limit would be reduced to 30mph for the majority of the road.

The current section at 50mph

would be reduced to 40Mph.
In addition, Cllr. Buckley held a site meeting with officers and residents to raise issues about verges, pavement, crossings and

Various proposals and remedial works were agreed upon, such as works were agreed upon, social as improvements to the exit of Spud Wood onto Burford Lane. It was also agreed that the pavement would be cleared which was completed at the start of March.

Clir. Buckley says she is continuing to follow this work through and would be pleased to

nnrough and would be pleased to hear any other comments which residents feel need to be addressed. Cllr. Buckley said: "I am also grateful for the help in this campaign by local PCSOs who provided speed detection training and they have been undertaking speed detection reviews down the lane on a regular basis.
"The PCSOs provide an update

monthly to the Parish Council so I will continue to monitor their activity regularly".

Meanwhile Andy Carter MP added, "I was pleased to be able to support Kath and local residents in this campaign, I use this road daily and the speeds some motorists drive at is way too fast for the road."

New signs will be erected in the coming weeks when the Speed Order is made official.

Planners reject Lymm Truckwash expansion plan

PLANNERS have rejected controversial proposals to expand Lymm Truckwash following objections from local residents and councillors.

Local residents, supported by local Councillors Anna Fradgley and Dr Tim Martland, objected to the proposals which have been refused by planners – although the Lymm Truckwash operators say they will be

appealing the decision.

Warrington Borough Council planners said there was no reason to istify building on green belt at the site on the A50 near Lymm Truckstop and noted the proposal would have had an adverse impact on those

living nearby.
The Truckwash opened in 2018 and at times has caused serious traffic problems with HGVs queuing

on the main road and performing three-point turns on the A50.

As a result, the owners submitted plans to expand the footprint of the site onto green belt, to install a fuel bunker and operate 24 hours a day, saying this would alleviate any backlogs of traffic.

Welcoming the refusal Cllr Tim Martland said, "The residents of the Lane End community at the top of Cherry Lane have been incredible in the amount of effort they have put into this campaign. Cllr Anna Fradgley has been helping them build their case against the development since last spring. Protecting our green belt against inappropriate development is one of the issues the Liberal Democrats are passionate about.

"When I heard of the potential effects on air quality and the light and noise pollution, I added my support to the campaign. Families with young children live close to the facility and would have been adversely affected by more HGV traffic. We have also drawn the attention of the Council to aspects of the 2018 development which are yet to be properly completed. We hope these can be swiftly resolved. I know from talking to Fire Service chiefs that they were worried about lorries turning round in

worried about lorries turning round in their station and obstructing access. "This demonstrates what local communities can do when energised and supported. The residents researched the issues thoroughly and campaigned passionately for what they believed was right. They are understandably delighted that the planning department found in their favour".




