














# Alfie on the road to recovery as family overwhelmed by generosity

AN 11-year-old boy who would have almost certainly been killed in a freak accident at Lymm, if it hadn't been for his cycle helmet, is back home with his family and on the road to recovery.

Alfie Chadwick,who suffered serious head injuries after colliding with a vehicle on Rush Green Road, Lymm, is already asking when he can go back to school to see his mates.

His parents Stephen and Dawn have been "blown away" by the support and generosity from the local community and are proud of their son's resilience, although he still has a long road to recovery ahead of him.

He suffered a fractured skill and doctors who performed surgery said the cycle helmet almost certainly saved his life.

Dad Stephen, who is using the incident to campaign about the importance of cycle helmets, said: "So far we are taking it day by day. He is taking lots of painkillers so he is comfortable but we need to always be with him whilst going to the toilet or up and down the stairs which he is only allowed once a day

"He is in high spirits and we are all blown away by the level of generosity from people who have sent things to him such as sweets, Lego, balloons, flowers, a Sale Sharks kit, football cards and so much more including the massive go fund me page.

go fund me page.
"We are all amazed by the generosity of our community and want to thank them from the bottom of our hearts.

"Alfie is already asking to go back to school to see all of his friends but that maybe some time off."

His mum Dawn added: "Sincerest gratitude to everyone in Lymm for their tremendous support and outpouring of love and concern – it

was just overwhelming.
"We had no idea of the extent of support we were receiving whilst we were in the hospital. Alfie will be well enough soon to be able to say thank you in person. He's a resilient young man with a long recovery road ahead of him."

Dawn also praised the level of care he received at the Royal Manchester Children's Hospital which she says was nothing short of "amazina"

of "amazing".

A crowdfunding page set up by a neighbour has raised over £1,300 to help buy Alfie a new bike and safety helmet.

Dad Stephen added: "Alfie is doing well, he has had his first consultation with the surgeon after heing released from the hospital."

Dad Stephen added: "Alfie is doing well, he has had his first consultation with the surgeon after being released from the hospital and they are happy with his progress. He is still having dizzy spells and is extremely tired if he walks for longer than half an hour but that is due to the extreme concussion which the surgeons said he has. He has slowly moved away from the stronger painkillers which is a great sign and he continues to get stronger each day.

"He misses his friends from school who have been visiting him at home but he wants to get back to normal he said. We continue to be amazed at the out pouring of kindness from everyone in the

local community they have been amazing. A massive thank you from all of us.

"I will push on from here to make that section of road safe, there is obviously something wrong dating back years so we need to push forward with this and Alfie wants to be involved so that no one else is hurt. He has so far helped me put leaflets through doors in the local area, we can't wait for the next accident where maybe the end result is worse.

# Julia expands eco-friendly Refill Round business

AFTER successfully launching her eco-friendly Refill Round business in Lymm, founder Julia Stansfield has now expanded into nearby Culcheth.

The Refill Round's mission is to help residents of Lymm and Culcheth and the surrounding areas avoid single-use plastic with their "delivery with a difference" refill business.

So far as The Refill Round founder, Lymm based Julia, is concerned, recycling isn't the answer to our plastic use.

"Only a fraction of the single-

use plastic used is recycled and an even smaller fraction of that is done in the UK – and devastatingly vast amounts escape into our oceans. The Refill Round offers you an alternative to buying more you an alternative to buying more plastic bottles. I deliver household cleaning and laundry products, plus a range of toiletries, in refillable glass bottles. Once they are empty and you are ready to order again I pick up the empties and drop off filled bottles, in freshly sanitised bottles. It is very similar to a milk round! I also work with amazing eco-friendly suppliers who also operate brilliant closed-loop recycling systems".

Julia estimates since June 2020 over 2200 plastic bottles have been saved – "plus our products are eco-friendly and are cruelty-free. We also stock a range of plastic free household extras such plastic-free household extras, such as compostable kitchen sponges and reusable food wraps".

The Refill Round also wants to

make refills accessible to everyone.

Even as a keen refiller myself I often forgot to take my empty bottles out with me or struggled to carry them all home when full. This way you can simply order through my website, refillround.co.uk, and I deliver them to you. Zero fuss and zero waste.

# New heating approved for historic high school building

PLANNING chiefs have given the go-ahead for heating improvements in the historic heart of Lymm High School.

New installations fitted inside the Grade 2 Listed part of the school – the former Oughtrington Hall, which dates from around 1830 but which became part of the school – then a grammar school – in 1945.
Planners were told that without

the heating improvements, the Oughtrington Hall block would be unsuitable for teaching and would probably have to be closed.

The improvements involve replacing the existing heating installations on the ground, first and second floors, carrying out the work without damaging or affecting the heritage aspects of the building in any way.

New radiators will be placed in the carried best as the carried best and the second floor.

in the same locations as the

existing ones. Overhead heaters will be installed above all the doorways at all entrances to the building which will prevent heat loss and excessive cold air entering the building.

Warm air rising means there will be no need for additional heaters in corridors on the first and second floors.

The Listed portions of the building include an open stairwell and a library with a marble fireplace which has been ascribed to Adam and a Gothic glazed bookcase.

# Student steps out to help raise over £6,000 for cousin battling brain cancer

A LYMM High School student stepped out to help raise over  $\pounds 6,000$  for her cousin who is battling the most aggressive stage four brain cancer.

With 32 people every single day diagnosed with a brain tumour, their lives are completely changed

Unfortunately, in 2018 Lanna Nuttall's cousin Laura was one of those 32 people to find out they had a brain tumour.

Starting on the 15th February, the Year 13 student walked 32 miles every day for 5 days with friends to raise funds for her cousin's charity

raise tunds for her cousin's charity 'Doing it for Laura'.

"In 2018 my amazing cousin Laura was diagnosed with Glioblastoma Multiforme, which is the most aggressive Stage 4 brain cancer", said Lanna.

"She had just started studying at Kings College London, when her life was completely turned upside down." Laura had at least six brain tumours and had to move back tumours and had to move back home for life-saving brain surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy and immunotherapy (for which she has to travel to Cologne in Germany on a regular basis to receive).

"The prognosis is so poor for this cancer and she was given a maximum of 18 months to live.

However, two years later she is still amazing us all every day."

Determined not to let this awful

disease beat her, Laura is now studying at the University of Manchester. She is also responding well to the immunotherapy treatment in Cologne.
This is great news although

it does mean that she needs to continue to make the trips out to Germany on a regular basis. On the most recent trip they had to spend £1600 on Covid tests alone.

This extra expense and the cost of the immunotherapy treatment is funded through Laura's charity, which is why Lanna walked all those miles.

"I am walking so Laura can travel for Laura's life-saving treatment", said\_Lanna before half term.

"The sore feet will be so worth it! I would really appreciate if you could share this to spread the awareness of brain tumours and even donate! Everything adds up

and it really is an amazing cause."
Lanna raised over £6000 during the 5 days of half-term.
"I genuinely couldn't have done

it without those that walked with me and supported me. Everyone has been so encouraging and lovely and that really helped!", said



# Twin boys robbed of their smiles raise over £17,000 for Muscular

Dystrophy research

LYMM twins Oscar and Sebastian, who suffer from a rare form of muscular dystrophy which means they can sadly no longer smile, have now raised an incredible £17,000 towards research during lockdown.

The boys, who suffer from Facioscapulohumeral dystrophy (FSHD), a genetic muscle-wasting condition that primarily affects the face, shoulders and upper arms, which can also cause weakness in the legs and rest of the body, sold over 400 tickets for a raffle for an afternoon "G &Tea" prize at the Church Green pub recently.

With their recent schools fundraising and everything else they've done this year, they've now raised over £17k.

Proud mum Kerry said: "The condition is very cruel and makes it physically impossible for them to smile anymore so it's difficult to get a sense of how happy they are!

In February Oscar and Seb got their school – Cherry Tree Primary in Lymm- to "Go Bright in February" raising funds for Muscular Dystrophy UK.

The whole school held a wacky hair and bright clothes day to take part in Zoom lessons and made donations for the charity. Even the teachers and the head joined in with the fun!

The boys were diagnosed in 2019 with fascioscapulohumeral dystrophy (FSHD) – There is currently no cure or treatment for the condition.

They've previously done a 26 lap sponsored walk in the garden and a virtual balloon race to raise funds for the charity.

Mum Kerry added: "Oscar and Sebastian are such gorgeous, bright boys it's utterly heartbreaking to see how much weaker they're becoming every day- even the simple act of moving around is becoming more and more difficult for them

# New family homes plan approved for former nursery site





PLANS have been approved for new family homes to be built in Warburton near Lymm on a former nursery site that has been vacant for more than two years.

Manchester-based P4 Planning has secured full planning permission on behalf of Edgefold Homes Ltd, who can now progress with the scheme, which is located on the former Panflora Nurseries Site.

The decision by Trafford Council follows the submission of plans to transform the 0.49ha site and paves the way for work to begin on an attractive new residential development comprising seven new homes.

The development will re-purpose a previously developed brownfield site, located within an area of Green Belt, into a high-quality, residential scheme. The Edgefold team not only demonstrated that the proposed scheme would have no greater impact on the openness of the Green Belt than the existing form, but that it would also make a positive but that it would also make a positive contribution to the area; something which was recognised by supporters of the scheme which included the local Parish Councils.

# Planners give go-ahead for changes to historic Lymm Hall

PLANNING chiefs have given the go-ahead for a number of alterations to The Shippon at historic Lymm Hall.

The proposed changes are said to have a beneficial impact on the setting of the Grade 2\* Listed Lymm Hall and a negligible impact on the Lymm Village Conservation Area.

They involve removing a conservatory built in 1995 and replacing it with a more appropriate orangery.

Although the hall and some other old buildings are Listed, the Shippon is unlisted. It was built sometime between 1837 and 1875, and is believed to have been built by the family of William Battersby, who owned the Hall around

It was originally intended for part residential and part service use.
In addition to replacing the existing conservatory, there are other alterations proposed, including an improved front porch and the removal of timber-clad

A number of internal improvements are also proposed.

Lymm Hall dates from the 11th century but the building has undergone many changes and alterations over the years.
