HOPEFULLY, ongoing flooding issues in the Culcheth area will be eased with news that $\pounds305,000$ Government funding is heading to the area for work on the Culcheth Culvert.

This should be of particular benefit to the Churchill Avenue area

according to local Cllrs. But like many areas up and down the country, I fear flooding is going to be an ongoing issue due to the changing weather patterns which are being attributed to global

warming. It is certainly more important than ever that the authorities ensure gullies are kept clear as heavy rains recently again saw many roads in the village flooded for the second time this year.

Nationally the Government is investing £5.2 billion in flood defences, with the money earmarked for Culcheth hopefully making a big difference.

While the flooding has been distressing for many it was good to see the community spirit as local residents and councillors rallied to tackle the problem.

Well done to all those who turned

Well done to all those who turned out to help those in need. During the recent monsoon conditions, many areas of Warrington were impacted by flooding, with thunder, lightning and hailstones in the middle of our summer.

If global warming continues at this pace I fear weather scenes like those recently witnessed will become more frequent, adding to flooding problems, especially as more and more homes are built, putting added pressure on our drainage systems.

Meanwhile, the schedule of work for Churchill Avenue has not been confirmed for the culvert yet but is expected to start later this year.

Major works get underway to replace ageing gas pipes

MAJOR engineering work has started to upgrade ageing underground gas pipes at Lowton that help sately deliver gas to thousands of homes.

Teams from Cadent, which manages the North West's 21,000mile gas distribution network, operating in Stone Cross Lane South, Lowton.

The worksite is near the junction with the A580 East Lancashire Road so, for the six-week duration, there will be no access to or from Stone Cross Lane South here.

Access to properties along Stone Cross Lane South will be via the Newton Road end only. Cadent has liaised with Wigan Council and informed the occupants.

This work has been deliberately scheduled to a window that minimises disruption – with schools

finished for summer. It's part of an £800m, five-year North West investment programme to ensure safety and reliability of gas distribution in the local area.

Modernising the network like

this also helps get it ready for the introduction of hydrogen, which is essential to local and national targets to achieve net zero carbon emissions [hydrogen emits zero carbon at point of use]. Phil Hendrick, Customer

Operations Area Manager, Cadent, said: "This is essential work in a challenging location, just off the busy East Lancashire Road.

"We do not foresee any impact to the 'East Lancs' but we want to give warning that you will not be able to turn off here to Stone Cross

Lane South. "Please follow the diversion route via the next roundabout and through to Newton Road."

There should be no interruption

to gas supply. If you smell gas during this work, nearby or anywhere, always ring the national gas emergency service immediately, day or night, on 0800 111 999*. Do not delay, or assume it's related to this work. It may not be and must be checked.

Campaigners turn out to voice opposition to HS2 and Western Leg

DESPITE concerns a HS2 consultation event taking place in Culcheth had not been well publicised, local campaigners and Cllrs. turned out to voice their opposition.

HS2 held a drop-in consultation and information event at Culcheth Sports Club to highlight the impact of its route on the local community prior to the presentation of a 'hybrid bill' before parliament early

in 2022. This bill is intended to approve the 'Western Leg' of HS2 connecting the high-speed line with the West Coast mainline south of Wigan. It will also take in the government's Integrated Rail Plan which will recommend the way

forward with a new east-west rail link – 'Northern Powerhouse Rail' and other proposed rail investments across the north.

Warrington Stop HS2 and Stop HS2 (North) were in evidence outside the club with their Stop HS2 table, keeping visitors informed about the opposition that they and many local residents have to the HS2 Western Link, which is also opposed by Warrington North MP, Charlotte Nichols.

Croft Parish Councillors Norman



Partington and Gary Farnsworth attended the event to check out the implications for Croft both of the route and its construction phase and are pictured left at the Warrington Stop HS2 and Stop HS2 (North) table.

Gary said "The construction of the spur would detrimentally impact our local communities and local environmentally sensitive areas.

It would provide no benefit to local people as there is no convenient station planned." Norman added: "The Golborne

Spur will cost billions, but delivers

All three Culcheth Glazebury & Croft Conservative Borough Councillors also attended the public consultation hosted by HS2 at Culcheth Sparts Club at Culcheth Sports Club.

Cllr Wendy Maisey OBE said "I've opposed the Golborne Spur from day one. In fact it was my opposition and campaigning against it that brought me into politics in part. It will have a devastating impact on our communities and rip through the villages. The wildlife and green villages. The wildlife and green belt up at Partridge lakes will be decimated, we really do owe it to future generations to ensure this

does not go ahead. "We will continue to lobby the Secretary of State and will push for it to be removed from the plan. I'm clear about HS2, whilst I would like

Labour Parish Councillors also attended the HS2 Phase 2b Crewe to Manchester route update at the Culcheth Sports Club to engage in information sharing and discussion with representatives of HS2. Parish Councillors and members of the public were able to view information boards and maps which could also be taken as hard

copies. Cllr Janet Seddon explained: "The issue of the Golborne Spur has blighted the area since it was proposed in 2013. The adverse effects of construction on the environment, business, and the local communities of Croft, Culcheth and Glazebury will not be mitigated by the carbon offsetting

plans in place. " Cllr Chris Smith said: "Traffic vehicles and road closures will have serious detrimental impacts on families, businesses and wildlife in the area. The recent gains made In the drea. Plans to upgrade and modernise explosives depot

PLANS to upgrade and modernise facilities at the Orica munitions factory at Glazebury have been submitted to Warrington Borough Council.

The site, in Wilton Lane, has been an explosives depot since the early part of the 20th century and Orica are believed to be the world's largest manufacturer of commercial explosives.

Occupying some 63 hectares, the site in the Green Belt and is surrounded by farmland. It is Orica's main site in the UK.

Because of the nature of the facility, it is essential it is in an isolated position, well away from other property.

The development will involve the demolition of an existing storage building, at the rear of the company's administration block and construction of a new manual mixing building within a secure compound.

Planning chiefs have been told the depot has been storing explosives for many years without incident and that the new facility will make it even safer.



The wait goes on for Help Save the Raven Inn campaigners

WHILST the Help Save the Raven group continues to wait for a decision on the latest planning application to demolish the Raven, the campaign group continues to plan for the future.

Campaign group spokesperson Peter Sturman said "There are so many positive possibilities for the Raven.

"In a survey of our local community, 98.1% backed the Raven becoming a community pub/hub and additional ideas were proposed, such as pop-up restaurants, a dog-friendly place, a hub for classes/lessons/groups

etc." "One of the consequences of the pandemic has been to bring people closer together. That certainly

applies to our community, and we believe that the Raven really can play a huge part in maintaining and building upon that community spirit. "The threat of demolition has already galvanised hundreds of

people to submit objections. There are so many reasons to keep the Raven. We have shown there is a will and determination to make it an inspiring facility. "If it were to be demolished it

The Help Save the Raven group has engaged a specialist, with 21 years experience, who has submitted a 39-page document that lists a number of substantive objections, any one of which, it is argued, should provide grounds for refusal of the current planning

application for a small housing development. have previously Campaigners been successful in having the pub

listed as a community asset and offered to buy it off the owners to run it as a community interest company.

Urgent roof repairs needed at Newchurch Old Rectory

Repairs are urgently needed – but before they can be carried out, Listed Building consent must be obtained. 

HS₂

HS2 Parish Councillors attended the HS2 Phase 2b Crewe to Manchester route update at the Culcheth Sports Club to engage in information sharing and discussion with representatives of HS2 on Friday 9th July 2021. Members of the public were able to view information boards and maps which could also be taken as hard copies. Parish Councillor's put forward their reasons for being strongly against the Golborne spur specifically, and the HS2 project generally. Copies of the most recent maps of route 2b (which includes the Golborne Link or Spur) can be found on the internet by searching for HS2b Western Leg Community area map book MA05: Risley to Bamfurlong or MA04 Broomedge to Glazebrook. The maps are also available in Culcheth library for local people to view. local people to view.

The Play Area on Culcheth Green

Ihe Play Area on Culcheth Green Funding has been allocated for the replacement of the play area on the village green and preliminary work started to identify the equipment available within the £100K budget and to take on board ideas given by local children. The play area has served the local children well for many years but is now reaching the end of its usable life. It is hoped the funding allocated will cover additional areas for use by older children and adults. A site visit with an officer of Warrington Borough Council is planned in early August August.

Law and Order There have been some criminal incidents recently, this could be due to more people venturing out and using the night time economy (Pubs and restaurants). TRUCAM continues to be used throughout the villages enforcing speed limits, this enforcement program will continue. Shaw Street Car Park has been identified as needing attention. Working with Warrington Borough Council and local Police it is intended that late night visitors are discouraged, many who come from outside of our villages, who cause noise and upset to residents. It is important that if you witness any antiocide of the tot you report them witness any antisocial or criminal incidents that you report them to the Police via the telephone number 101.

Christmas Lights switch on As the Christmas Market has been cancelled due to ongoing uncertainty about COVID restrictions in the Winter months it has been decided to return to making the Christmas lights switch on a simpler event. This could include Christmas carols round the Millennium Clock and light refreshments in the Parish Hall rottrictions allowing. restrictions allowing.

Traffic in our Villages The introduction of the HGV weight restriction on the roads in Culcheth and Glazebury came into force on Monday 3rd May and the signs are now installed on local roads. Residents of Glazebury have been logging and reporting back to those companies whose HGV vehicles have been ignoring the restrictions. Many of those reported have had legitimate reasons to be in the villages, most local companies are now aware of the restrictions and there has been a noticeable reduction in the volume of HGVs.

Home extensions approved

PLANS for two-storey side а extension and single-storey front and rear extensions at a semi-detached house in Wigshaw Lane, Culcheth have been approved by borough planners.

There were no objections from neighbours, although one indicated they would be opposed to the removal of greenery or foliage close to the house.

Officers decided the principle of development was acceptable and there would be no unacceptable impacts on the character of the area nor the amenity of neighbouring residents.

House extension plan withdrawn

PLANS for front, rear and side extensions at a house in Derwent Close, Culcheth, following the demolition of an existing conservatory and garage, have been withdrawn.

The application was not opposed by Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council but did attract an objection from a neighbour

School car park plan splits villagers

PLANS to improve car parking arrangements at Winwick CE Primary School have been given the green light – despite sharply divided opinion among villagers.

Twelve people lodged objections to the scheme put forward by the school governors – but 11 supported it. The scheme involves vehicle barriers, gates and fencing and resurfacing

and re-marking the car park. Part of the school dates from the mid-19th century and is listed as a


building of historic interest, but the development does not affect this section of the school.

Objectors say the development will block access to nearby shops and Winwick Leisure Centre, cause traffic to back up on Myddleton Lane.and involve the loss of "green" land and trees. Supporters argue it will improve road safety, particularly for children, ease congestion at a problematic location and stop anti-social behaviour.

Planning approval is subject to a condition that no trees are removed.
