Editor's Comment

UNFORTUNATELY an important occasion honouring our fallen heroes has been surrounded by anger and controversy due to changes in the "policing" of the annual Remembrance Day parade in Culcheth.

It is not just Culcheth affected, it is the whole of Cheshire as British Legion officers have been left confused and uncertain about

left confused and uncertain about Remembrance Day parades after being told they will have to find thousands of £s to pay for road closures to enable the processions to go ahead. While Warrington Borough Council and Cheshire Police appear to be blaming each other for the situation, the Royal British Legion (RBL) itself is unable to provide financial support as all their funds are committed to supporting veterans and their families.

veterans and their families. Culcheth RBL branch has indicated they will have to cancel this year's parade – which has been taking place for 70 years, if they have to stump up a £2,400 bill to Warrington Borough Council for road closures and profesional marshalls.

Now sadly honouring our dead has become somewhat of a political football - and not for the first time following last year's "unlawful" gathering at Warrington Cenotaph, which again caused a fall out between the borough council and Cheshire Police, who were asked to investigate their involvement. We are still awaiting to hear the

outcome of that investigation.

Personally I don't care who is to blame but everyone involved in this important occasion need to sit down and talk and agree on a way forward.

I find it remarkable that those in authority were aware of Cheshire Police's change in policing policy two years ago and then only raise it as an issue a matter of weeks before the event.

I am sure everyone involved wants to pay their respects in the right way and while this comes at a cost, council's always have contingency funds.

We have all seen increases in our council taxes and policing precepts so I am sure a solution can



be found to ensure these events can take place.

It is unthinkable that events should have to be postponed again for financial reasons, after many missed the opportunity to pay their respect last year due to the pandemic on health grounds.

Let us hope common sense prevails - or is that too much to ask? Honouring our dead should not become a political football.

Appeal for volunteers to help save Remembrance Day parade

LOCAL councillors have launched an appeal for help from the community to save the annual Remembrance Day parade at Culcheth, which is under threat following a demand for $\pounds2,400$ for local road closures.

The three Conservative Borough Councillors for Culcheth, Glazebury & Croft ClIrs Wendy Maisey, Valerie Allen and Carol Benson have called on the local community to save Remembrance Sunday and are looking for trained road marshalls, first aiders and volunteers to come forward to help out.

Their plea comes after Labourcontrolled Warrington Borough Council announced that it will charge back £2,400 to the Culcheth branch of the Royal British Legion for traffic management for Remembrance Sunday commemorations in the village.

The bill comes after Cheshire Police announced in 2019 that it would no longer coordinate Remembrance Sunday commemorations.

Sunday commemorations. The Warrington Tory Councillors have criticised the Labour-controlled Warrington Borough Council for their lack of planning. Cllr Maisey said."Labour-controlled Warrington Borough Council has

Cllr Maisey said."Labour-controlled Warrington Borough Council has had a number of years to plan with Parish Councils for this eventuality but they have not engaged and have instead sprung a large bill on the Royal British Legion

instead sprung a large bill on the Royal British Legion. "Had Warrington Borough Council engaged with Parish Councils such as Culcheth and Glazebury at the time the decision was made, we could have trained volunteers and been prepared for this."

Cheshire Police have said they will continue to attend Remembrance Sunday commemorations to pay their respects.

Labour leader Cllr Russ Bowden said: "The council is disappointed by the decision of Cheshire Constabulary not to provide support for traffic management duties – particularly given the significant rise in the Police Precept this year. In addition, unfortunately, the Royal British Legion has also indicated that it is unwilling to provide financial support. The council is holding regular discussions on these matters with the Police and Crime Commissioner, Parish Councils and the Royal British Legion and is helping to organise the events to ensure they are safe and secure. At this stage however, the council cannot commit financial support for traffic management arrangements and is asking other local partners to contribute, as we are unable to do so due to financial pressures."





from Winwick CE Primary Sch Twenty-seven year 6 VIP's, accompanied by their teacher Mrs Kelly Mather and teaching staff, were treated to their own "Winwickbury" festival as the school said thank you and waved goodbye to the youngsters who were about to move onto high school education. The event nearly didn't happen as festivities were cancelled after four class bubbles burst, including Y6, just days before the end of term, but the festival finally came to life following months of fundraising

life following months of fundraising and planning thanks to the determination of Headteacher Mrs Sue Dymond, teachers and careful Sue Dymona, teachers and careful masterminding led by Mrs Mather and the school's Parents, Teachers and Friends' Association chairman Sarah Browning who managed to keep the gig's highlights top secret until it was unveiled at the very last minute minute.

As music and laughter reached the far corners of the village, social media lit up as inquisitive residents tried to find out where the noise was coming from, and as word spread and rock band Highway 62 belted out the children's favourite anthems, it wasn't long before the rest of the village was singing along as the youngsters partied all day and into early evening.

"Mrs Mather chatted with the class about how they'd like to celebrate leaving Winwick CE Primary School and they came up with the idea of a festival. Year 6 (like so many students & pupils) have missed out on so much these past 12-18 months. They didn't get to go on their class residential, do Y6 Enterprise Initiatives, or be Buddies with new 2020 Reception class children, or get to go on the usual trips and visits – all the things that would usually help carve their that would usually help carve their last year in primary school and help prepare them for the next stages of their learning & life journey. 

Sarah added: "We promised the children they would not miss out and we managed to reschedule everything. The children had their church service and graduation ceremony at St Oswald's Church. They each received a rainbow bee badge, then Winwickbury Festival kicked off at the church hall followed by a prom party organised by their parents all on the same day!"

Changes to Breast Care Services across Warrington & Halton Where will I go for breast care?

Following our recent consultation there have been some changes to Breast Care Services. Here we look at where you will visit and why.

Routine Mammograms

If you need a routine mammogram our breast screening services remain the same and patients can choose to attend several locations. When you receive your appointment reminder the locations will be listed so that you can make the best choice for you.

Services following a referral

Our Assessment Clinics provide services after a routine screening mammogram has shown changes warranting further tests.

Patients who have found breast changes or lumps may be referred by their GP to our Symptomatic Service for more detailed tests including a mammogram, ultrasound scan or a biopsy.

Service for more defailed fests including a mammogram, ultrasound scan or a biopsy. These services, previously offered at Kendrick Wing Warrington Hospital, have now relocated to the new Breast Care Centre in the Captain Sir Tom Moore Building (CSTM) at Halton Hospital. The new centre has two new mammography rooms, two ultrasound clinic rooms, consultation and counselling rooms. This forms part of our work to create a Centre of Excellence which offers rapid access outpatient clinics and to ensure that patients receive the best specialist care in a dedicated, supportive setting.

The existing Burney Breast Unit at St Helen's Hospital will also continue to offer these clinics.

What happens if I am diagnosed with breast cancer?

Patients can choose where to have their treatment.

The new Breast Care Centre is co-located with the CanTreat Centre in the Nightingale building where chemotherapy services are operated by Clatterbridge Cancer Centres.

The Macmillan Delamere Centre is also adjacent to CanTreat and offers a range of support services including complementary therapies and information on financial and other support available to those diagnosed with cancer. Breast surgery is carried out at the Captain Sir Tom Moore building.

Travel - planning your journey

Patients required to attend assessment or symptomatic services will need to travel to either Halton Hospital, Runcorn or St Helens. A free shuttle bus operates between Halton and Warrington hospitals at regular times throughout the day. The timetable is available at www. whh.nhs.uk

Car parking is available at all sites, with a wide range of concessions and help to access the Hospital Appointment Scheme for those receiving benefits.

The Breast Care Centre at the Captain Sir Tom Moore building at Halton Hospital can be accessed by road from Warrington by using the toll-free roads with no need to cross the toll bridges. A new bypass at Slutchers Lane near Bank Quay station has considerably shortened travel time to Runcorn and is free to use.

To ensure that patients are receiving the best possible experience we will continue to listen to patient feedback and monitor suggestions throughout the year, allowing us to make any further reasonable adjustments.



New Breast Care Centre

Our recent consultation revealed support for the proposed changes to our breast care services that will continue to provide the best specialist care in a dedicated, supportive setting.

Patients accessing the service have doubled over the past 20 years and the opening of a new Breast Care Centre in the Captain Sir Tom Moore Building, Halton Hospital, will improve access for all patients and bring together specialist resources and equipment in a setting that offers a significantly enhanced patient experience.

The new Breast Care Centre, Captain Sir Tom Moore Building, Halton Hospital will ensure:

- The service can continue to expand to accommodate more patients.
- Improved access; the Kendrick Wing at Warrington Hospital has experienced significant issues associated with its century-old buildings and challenges which restrict access to the first-floor service for certain patients
- Scarce specialist resources and equipment are brought together into one site to enable expansion of the service
- We provide a more attractive employment offer to Breast Radiologists and Mammographers in the face of a national shortage of these vital roles



PARISH NEWS

The Play Area on Culcheth Green

A meeting was held between officers of Warrington Borough Council, Parish and Borough Councillors to discuss possible developments of the play area in Culcheth. The Borough Council is going to create plans which can be taken forward to a consultation with Culcheth and Glazebury residents.

Law and Order

Speed enforcement has continued this month in Culcheth, Glazebury and Mee Brow. Our PCSO has visited local community groups to engage with members of the community who would not normally meet the Police. CCTV cameras have recently been installed on Shaw Street car park in response to concerns from local residents regarding anti-social behaviour. The Police reported that burglary and vehicle crime in August was low in Culcheth and Glazebury.

Traffic in our Villages

A meeting of the Glazebury Traffic group was held with Parish and Borough Councillors, and road traffic officers from Warrington Borough Council in attendance. The possibility of creating a community speed watch group was discussed and will be further investigated. The installation of average speed cameras along Warrington Road was also discussed.

Litter Picking

Parish Councillors have been active in collecting litter across the community. Over the past two months over 50kg of litter have been picked on areas around Newchurch Lane, Common Lane, and Warrington Road. If anyone is interested in volunteering to litter pick contact Cllr Neil Johnson for further details.

Glazebury Play Area

Meetings have been held between Parish Councillors and the committee who oversee the community play area in Glazebury. Discussions are ongoing to replace worn out logs to renew this important green space. Over summer a group of young children and families used the area in a group organised by a local teacher.


