

## Challenges and opportunities for a Net Zero Warrington

Net Zero seems to be on everybody's lips at the moment. We have COP 26 coming up (Conference of Parties if you were wondering) with much talking to be done and hopefully, six years on from the 2015 Paris Agreement, an increase in the commitment "to reducing carbon emissions but also a ramp up of commitments alongside a clear plan of action for how climate action targets will be met in the short, medium, and long terms". Let's see.

long terms". Let's see.

Now I know that this is possibly an incendiary statement but it appears that we are only emitting as much CO2 as we were in the 1860's. Odd thing to say, but true as long as you are talking about emissions per capita. Unfortunately large reductions in all the UK's CO2 sources are still required to meet its 2050 target of an 80% reduction from 1970 levels.

But as always I wonder about the potential challenge and opportunity for Warrington. We are currently actively engaged in the Green Homes Grant project, where the worst energy performing homes are eligible for the free installation of solar panels and insulating works and we are also just about to start work on the new Bus Depot which will allow Warrington Own Buses to electrify the bus fleet if we are will allow Warrington Own Buses to electrify the bus fleet if we are successful with our bid. The Council

has also invested heavily in solar farms to provide truly green energy to Warrington, but I think the challenge goes much deeper than challenge goes much deeper than this. The major sources of emissions are heating & transport and agriculture. Agriculture is not one we can address directly, but if we are to make the proper transition to a low carbon or zero carbon Town, we will have to address transport and heating (mainly for homes) on a Borough wide basis. This will be a significant challenge and require significant investment. significant investment.

The transition however, can be seen in one of two ways, either something that we cannot afford to do or something that we cannot afford not to do. We are on the cusp of delivering significant regeneration and development in Warrington and have the opportunity to deliver a place that opportunity to deliver a place that

is both low carbon and attractive to is both low carbon and attractive to people and businesses who value a low carbon environment. Our challenge is to adapt and provide a place where the opportunities are grasped – quickly. There is an upcoming business conference in Time Square on 12th November and I expect this to be a topic for discussion.

discussion.

It seems that the 3 people whose bodies were found on the Youth Zone site this has provoked some interest and I wonder what would have made of all this. ### St Rocco's manager wins 'community hero' award

AN entrepreneur from Warrington has been crowned winner of the coveted Community Hero Award at this year's eBay for Business Awards.

Alongside the overall Grand Prize award, Daniel Taylor, e-commerce manager at St Rocco's Hospice, received a £5,000 cash prize and support to help grow St Rocco's business.

Mr Taylor was one of 10 eBay sellers to be recognised for their entrepreneurial success in the nationwide awards, which saw a record number of entries this year.

St Rocco's Hospice offers palliative care to all who need it in Warrington and is largely funded by its retail stores and online offering. Back in 2019, the charity spotted the opportunity of online shopping for the charity shop sector and employed an ecommerce manager – Mr Taylor – who set about maximising St Rocco's Hospice fundraising through ecommerce platforms like eBay.

During the pandemic, with stores closed up and down the country, this sales avenue became even more important for the charity, with St Rocco's Hospice relying solely on selling donations online to fund care.

The charity aims to build on its online success by recruiting more trainees and moving to a bigger warehouse soon.

Mr Taylor said: "We're thrilled to have won the Community Hero and Grand Prize awards. The pandemic has been an incredibly tough time for everyone, but especially for charities who have been hit hard by store closures, so to be recognised for our achievements this year is brilliant. eBay has played a huge role in helping to fund the vital work that St Rocco's does, over lockdown and in the months since. Now, we're focused on growing our eBay offering so we can support St Rocco's and the Warrington community for years to come."

eBay received over 2,000 entries for this year's awards across all categories, ranging from kitchen table start-ups and university 'side hustles', to established family businesses and those complementing offline stores with online avenues.

There were hundreds of applicants

from businesses that had started up during the COVID-19 pandemic, when eBay saw a 237 per cent boom in the number of small shops setting up on the marketplace – the equivalent to a new business registering online every two minutes.





## Green light for new "cutting-edge" bus depot



PLANS for a new "cutting-edge" bus depot capable of supporting an all-electric fleet are a step closer to reality after cabinet approval at Warrington Borough Council.

The existing depot, on Wilderspool
Causeway – home to Warrington's
Own Buses – is a key Warrington
Deal project and is set to be relocated
to a new site off Dallam Lane.
The relocation of the bus depot

The relocation of the bus depot will be an important step in unlocking key development opportunities in the Southern Gateway Regeneration Area and importantly, the proposed new bus depot would also have the capability of accommodating an allelectric bus fleet – functionality the existing bus depot does not have.

Once Warrington's Own Buses have relocated to the new depot, which is being delivered by Warrington&Co, the existing depot will be demolished to pave the way for new development.

Warrington's Town Deal –

Warrington's Town Deal — the £22m programme of seven pioneering projects — has a clear focus on improving public transport, through both the new depot and the complementary sustainable travel package of works. Approval to move the existing bus depot to a new, purpose-built and cutting-edge facility, is a huge step forward for Warrington's ambitious Town Deal

Polans.

Cabinet member for transportation, highways and public realm, Cllr Hans Mundry, said: "Approval for relocating the bus depot and construction of the new depot are important steps in realising our Town

Deal ambitions.

"It will be one of the first projects as part of our Town Deal programme to be rolled out, and it's exciting that the new facility will have the potential to accommodate an all-electric bus fleet – which is another key ambition for us on our transformational transport journey.

ourney.

"By enabling the potential electrification of our buses, this project supports the key priorities of our Local Transport Plan (LTP4), and our climate emergency declaration, which aim to promote cleaner, greener and more sustainable travel in and around Warrington."

Managing Director of Warrington's Own Buses, Ben Wakerley, said: "We have acknowledged for some time that the current depot is not in an ideal location for our buses to access."

ideal location for our buses to access.

"I'm therefore very pleased to see that not only will our new depot be in a much better location, but it will also be able to support an all-electric bus fleet. I am pleased to see continued investment in the town's bus service, which will play an increasingly important role in supporting our shared mission to improve air quality and sustainable transport in the borough."

### £4.3m Bewsey and Dallam hub set to open

THE new £4.3 million Bewsey and Dallam Community Hub is set to open in November – bringing vital leisure, library and community facilities to the area.

It will be operated by LiveWire, in line with the existing management agreement for the delivery of leisure, library and lifestyle services in Warrington. LiveWire will be working in partnership with Warrington Borough Council's Neighbourhoods team who will be managing the community rooms.

The Longshaw Street facility will provide residents with a range of community and wellbeing services, including community spaces, a state-of-the-art gym, multi-use studio, swimming pool and library provision.

Warrington Borough Council and other partners including Torus have provided the necessary capital investment along with a grant awarded by Sport England.

It will be open from 9am to 8pm Monday – Friday, and 9am to 4pm

on weekends.

### Green Belt school to be extended to cope with expected increase in pupils

PLANS to double the size of a Warrington primary school to cater for an expected increase in the number of school-aged children in the area have

been given the go-ahead.

Members of Warrington Borough Council's development management committee have approved extensions at Grappenhall Heys Primary School, together with an increase in car parking facilities to provide room for an additional 21 cars.

The scheme would normally have been considered inappropriate in the Green Belt, but there are "very special circumstances" to allow it to go ahead, the committee decided.

At present, the school has about 210 pupils, excluding nursery. But the extension will increase capacity by a further 210 giving a total of 420 pupils and about 26 nursery places


The number of classrooms would increase from nine to 16.
There were no objections from nearby residents.
Some 1050 new homes are due to be built in South Warrington by 2023, including 400 in the Grappenhall area. This would result in about 231 additional school-age children.

additional school-age children.

"There is a clear and convincing justification for the expansion of the school," a report to the committee states.

"The very small amount of encroachment into the Green Belt is considered to be outweighed by the overall benefits of the scheme.

Sport England has been consulted and has indicated that the proposed building affects only land that could not form part of a playing pitch nor reduce the existing playing pitch.

## **Linancially yours**

# In advance of the Autumn Budget, what do we already know about what is in store for us next year? You may be surprised at how much has already been announced.

As I write this we are awaiting the budget and autumn statement so I am unable to comment on any announcements that the Chancellor will be making. However, we do know a lot of the changes that are to be made, the main one being that the rates of Corporation Tax and National Insurance are set to increase, with the majority of bands and thresholds being frozen.

Currently, Corporation Tax is paid by all companies at a standard rate of 19%. It has already been announced that it will remain at this rate for the year commencing April 2022. However, from 1st April 2023 the rate of Corporation Tax will increase to 25% on profits above £250,000. The rate will remain at 19% for profits up to £50,000. Profits between £50,000 and £250,000 will be taxed at 25%, but will receive marginal relief of 3/200 of the difference between taxable profits and £250,000, resulting in a gradual increase in the overall rate of Corporation Tax.

Older readers may remember that we had a similar system of Small Companies Corporation Tax up to 2014. As applied then, the above limits will be divided between all 2Associated Companies", so if there are four companies under the same control then each company will pay the full rate on profits in excess of £62,500 and the small company rate will only be available on profits up to £12,500.

So what else do we know?

Well, we know that the Chancellor has already announced that all personal allowances and tax bands will be frozen at their current level up to and including 2025/26. This also applies thresholds for Capital Gains Tax, Inheritance Tax and Value

The income tax basic rate income tax will be payable on income between £12,571 and £50,270. Above this level, the higher rate of tax applies. The personal allowance will continue to be withdrawn progressively

once income exceeds £100,000, and all income above £150,000 will be taxed at the "additional rate". Whilst these may be subject to change, the current basic rate is 20%, the higher rate is 40%, and the additional rate is 45%.

National Insurance is set to increase from April 2022. The thresholds will be frozen at thresholds will be frozen at their current level. However, the rates at which it will be charged will all increase by 1.25%. Therefore, employees will pay 13.25% on income up to the upper earnings level, and 3.25% on income above this. Employers will see their contribution will see their contribution increase to 15.05%. If you are self-employed then your contribution will be 10.25% up to the upper earnings limit and 3.25% above that.

continue to be paid on all gains in excess of £12,300 in the year, or £6,150 in the case of most trusts. It is widely thought that the rate of Capital Gains Tax will be a prime target for the

current rate of Capital Gains Tax is 10%, increasing if total income and taxable capital gains exceed £50,270 to 20% for the excess. These rates increase to 18% and 28% respectively if the gain is made on residential property, with the exception of your own "principal private residence" which is currently

Inheritance Tax nil-rate band and residential nil-rate band remain at £325,000 and £175,000 respectively. And finally, the VAT registration and de-registration thresholds remain at £85,000 and £83,000 respectively.

All of the above is known before the Chancellor leaves No 11 clutching his little red box. We await with bated breath what further joys we have in store, but the general view is that it will not be a "give-away" budget. Perhaps this is to be expected following the trials and tribulations of the past couple of years. We will let you know what those further measures are once they are
