

College construction centre granted Cabinet approval for £3.66m funding

WARRINGTON Borough Council's Cabinet has approved the business case to support the delivery of an Advanced Construction & Civil Engineering (ACCE) Centre as part of the Warrington Town Deal.

The business case, which will now be submitted to the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC), will unlock £3.66m funding for the development.

The ACCE centre, which will be developed by Warrington & Vale Royal (WVR) College, will help to drive collaboration between the college, employers and the council to develop, commercialise and promote digital technologies for the construction and civil engineering sectors. The ACCE centre will also support construction and engineering partners to build high-quality, smart, efficient homes and building infrastructure more quickly, cost-effectively and sustainably than ever The ACCE centre will help to raise awareness of, and access into, careers in the construction and civil engineering sectors, supporting unemployed residents to progress into employment in local construction


and civil engineering businesses.
Nichola Newton, Principal and
CEO at WVR college, said: "We are delighted that Cabinet approval has been secured for the ACCE centre, a ground-breaking project that will establish a centre of excellence for the construction and civil engineering sectors at our Warrington campus.

"The onward development of the ACCE Centre provides a fantastic opportunity for the college to work with employers and key stakeholders to co-create an education and skills training offer that will enhance the sectors use of digital technologies improved productivity

Cllr Tom Jennings, cabinet member for economic development and innovation, said: "Cabinet approval for the ACCE centre is the next vital step to bringing this game-changing scheme to Warrington. "It will support the next generation



Council provides clarity following complaints over non-collection of blue bins





AFTER numerous complaints about non-collection of blue bins in the Appleton and Stockton Heath areas of Warrington, the borough council has moved to provide clarity on what the bins can be used for.

Local residents and Lib Dem councillors called on the Council to be clearer about what cannot be recycled in a blue bin after dozens of bins were left uncollected in recent weeks.

Stickers placed on 'contaminated' bins say what can be recycled but are not explicit about what is forbidden.

Cllr Ian Marks (Lib Dem) said: "From talking to the blue bin man who emptied my bin, I understand that they are under strict instructions that they are under strict instructions to refuse to empty contaminated bins. They open the top and if they see material like crisp packets and polythene bags, they slap a sticker on the bin. I have had complaints from residents asking why their bins have not been emptied. I have been walking round looking inside bins with stickers and I can see what the problem is. I understand why this policy is being put into effect this policy is being put into effect because anything that improves the Council's recycling rate is welcome. "However, I strongly believe there needs to be much more clarity

about the policy otherwise there will be big problems. We need another sticker that explicitly states what common items that are not acceptable in blue bins. As well as crisp packets, confectionary wrappers, polythene bags, gloves worn by carers and polystyrene there will be other items which the bin-men will know about. There is also confusion about whether black plastic food containers should go in

a blue bin or not.

"I have written to the Council asking them to produce another sticker as a matter of urgency to give clarity to the public."

A Warrington Borough Council spokesperson said: "Blue bins that

contain items that we do not accept are left unemptied and stickered.

"Unfortunately, the amount of incorrect items in blue bins in Warrington has increased over the last 18 months. We are working with our contractor to make sure that we reduce contamination rates, which has resulted in some bins not being collected recently. We want to remind residents that items we can accept in blue bins are:


Glass bottles and jars Food and drinks cans Plastic bottles Plastic food tubs eg margarine tubs, yogurt pots Drink cartons Paper and cardboard

"Other items containing plastic and other materials may be recycled elsewhere. For example, plastic bags, wrappers and crisp packets can't go into blue bins, but they can be recycled in-store at most supermarkets.

Our crews only sticker blue bins that contain items that we do not accept, so if a blue bin has not been emptied and it has a red sticker on, please remove any items that are not listed on the sticker."

£21.5m zero emission funding secures all-electric bus fleet!



HOT on the heels of a new bus depot Warrington is now set to benefit from an all-electric bus fleet thanks to more than £20m in Government funding to transform travel in the borough.

The Department for Transport has announced Warrington Borough Council has been successful in its application for £21.5m in Zero Emission Bus Regional Area (ZEBRA) funding, first announced by the Prime Minister in 2020, to support the introduction of up to 4,000 zeroemission buses across the country.

It paves the way to the replacement of Warrington's Own Buses' entire fleet of diesel buses with 120 new electric buses and has been welcomed by politicians across the town, including council leader Russ Bowden and Warrington South MP

Andy Carter.

Warrington's Own Buses – a municipal bus operator, wholly owned by the Council – covers 85% of the bus mileage in the borough, so the conversion of its fleet to allelectric will bring a huge boost to the council's ambitions to introduce

greener and cleaner transport options throughout the borough.
Independently of ZEBRA, the council is committed, as part of the Warrington Town Deal to delivering a new bus depot – relocating the Warrington's Own Buses depot from its current site to a purpose-built new depot on Dallam Lane. Work on the site will begin in December, and the successful ZEBRA bid means the council can forge ahead with plans to equip the new depot with electric vehicle charging infrastructure, charging ready to house the new fleet of zeroemission buses.

The council's commitment to green energy will also see the new buses charged by green electricity, including from the council's solar farm in Cirencester. Solar canopy/ panels will be installed at the new depot, funded by the council, to further enhance the green credentials of the scheme.

The ZEBRA scheme supports a wide range of council policies aimed at transforming travel, carbon emissions and carbon emissions and improving air quality, including the Climate Emergency declaration, the Local Transport Plan (LTP4), the draft Electric Vehicle Strategy, the Air Quality Action Plan, and the Central

Cllr Bowden, said: "Securing this funding is absolutely fantastic news for Warrington. It will enable us to make huge strides in decarbonising our transport system as we work towards a zero-carbon future.

The introduction of an all-electric bus fleet, charged by renewable energy, will bring massive benefits to our town. It will improve air quality, supporting our work to tackle the climate emergency. It will also provide more environmentally friendly, modern and attractive bus services, encouraging more local people to choose this mode of transport.

"At the same time, this project will put our town at the forefront of delivering sustainable, zero emissions public transport, further enhancing our reputation as forwardthinking location to live, work, and

Chair of Warrington's Own Buses, Cllr Cathy Mitchell, said: "We welcome this funding, which will bring transformational improvements

to bus services in Warrington.
"The investment in an all-electric bus fleet has the potential to be a real game-changer, improving air quality and reducing carbon emissions while and reducing carbon emissions while providing a modern bus service we can all be proud of. It will help transform perceptions of public transport in our town, supporting our work to drive growth in bus usage."

Mr Carter, said: "Local people have consistently told me that they want to see frequent reliable have

want to see frequent, reliable bus services across Warrington South. This is a fantastic announcement for the town. On the back of this commitment we'll see a big investment into modern, clean and efficient public transport in our town - which will allow the money saved from operating an older diesel fleet can go into providing better services where they are most needed."

This investment follows £5million secured from HM Government to create a new electric bus depot for the town last year, freeing up brownfield land for affordable homes

to be built.

Mr Carter added: "I've worked closely with Department of Transport Ministers, Warrington's Own Buses & Council Officers who submitted a plan which I was happy to endorse to secure around £25million investment

Campaigners left "devastated and stunned" as Peel Hall given green light

AFTER more than 30 years of campaigning Save Peel Hall campaigners have been left "devastated and stunned" after losing a public inquiry over a proposed 1,200 housing development in the area.

Following a lengthy public inquiry, the appeal inspector has ruled that Satnam Developments can have outline permission for the development, with her decision upheld by the secretary for state, Michael Gove.

Local residents Wendy Johnson-Taylor, a leading light in the Save Peel Hall Campaign Group said: "We are utterly devasted and stunned. There are no words in the Thesaurus that can adequately describe how we feel

right now. We are just numb.
"This decision will have devastating impact on North Warrington, and the rest of our town, North in a truly disastrous way. The stability of where we live will be shattered. Our lives will never be the same again and we lose an important, vital green space that has given us cleaner air, wonderful wildlife and peace for decades. We also lose another valued green amenity in Ballater playing fields – to make way for more houses and an access that

is woefully inadequate to serve this Frankenstein monster of a scheme.

'Our residents' health will see protection from noise and air pollution that will be generated by this nightmare development. I fear more people will suffer from the effects of this and unfortunately, we know, that unacceptable levels add to unnecessary premature deaths, and as for the future highway network's stability, well that has well and truly been stamped on. The future will witness sheer chaos on our road's day in, day out".

"All I can say is we did our best. We've fought for over 30 years. It's been hard slog. I can only thank our key members and Rule 6 stolwarts.

key members and Rule 6 stalwarts Jim Sulivan, Margaret Steen, Jon Parr, Geoff Settle, Dave Sawyer, planning consultant Peter Black and campaigner Ste Dodd. They have all been selfless pillars of our community for years.'

Council Leader Cllr Russ Bowden, said: "At all stages, and for many years, the council has robustly rejected a series of planning applications at Peel Hall.

"In February 2017, an application for 1,200 homes was refused, leading to a public inquiry in mid-

leading to a public inquiry in mid-2018. The council again defended its position and we were very disappointed when Satnam legally challenged the decision to not build on the site.

"Regarding why Peel Hall had to be included in the latest draft Local Plan, this was done on legal advice, as not to include it would be a possible threat to a further legal challenge by Satnam. We are very concerned and angry that, despite our continued rebuttal, the decision to allow development has now been made by the Secretary of State, and we share the frustrations of our local campaign groups."

Are you VAT Registered? If so, then you WILL be affected by Making Tax Digital from next April

Every VAT registered business will be liable to report their VAT liability under the Making Tax Digital ("MTD") legislation for all VAT periods beginning on or after 1st April 2022.

The purpose of MTD according to HM Revenue and Customs is to "tackle the tax gap caused by errors and failures to take reasonable care", although they also claim that businesses will benefit from greater accuracy and improved productivity.

All businesses that newly register for VAT will be automatically signed up for MTD. Existing businesses must sign up for it, although your agent can do this on your behalf. With regard to the form that records can take, spreadsheets remain acceptable provided that bridging software is used to link the totals on the spreadsheet to those declared on the electronic VAT Return. There must be no typing or retyping of the figures. The electronic VAT Return prepared must be "API" enabled, meaning that it can communicate with HM Revenue and Customs using their digital interface. Of course, MTD enabled accounting software can

be used instead, and this will automatically be "API" enabled. WatkinsonBlack are experienced in dealing with MTD and will provide initial and continuing assistance as required to all existing and new clients.

Fortunately, the minimum record keeping requirements are not too stringent. In fact, they are no more than should be kept by all businesses.

As far as sales, or outputs, are concerned, retailers can continue to keep their manual till or cashbox, and individual sales do not need to be recorded. However, they must then digitally record their daily gross takings, and they can do this on a spreadsheet or in a suitable accounting software package. Non-retailers must digitally record their sales invoices and these must be sequentially numbered. Details to be recorded are the tax point for the sale, the net amount excluding VAT, and the rate of VAT charged.

Record keeping requirements for purchases, or inputs, are equally straightforward. Each invoice must be recorded and must, as a minimum, include the tax point of the invoice, the net value of the purchase

or expense, and the amount of VAT being claimed.

Whilst there are a very small number of exemptions, mainly on the basis of age, disability or remoteness of location, the time and cost of compliance are not relevant factors in obtaining exemption. Therefore, unless you are either old or decrepit you must expect to be caught by MTD. If you are registered voluntarily, and your turnover is below the VAT deregistration limit of £83,000 per annum, then you may wish to consider deregistration. However, the VAT registration limit is going to remain at the current level of £85,000 per annum until at least April 2024. Therefore, if you expect your turnover to exceed that limit in the near future then you may decide that deregistration is not an option.
