

# Care village operator strengthens dementia support

COMMUNITY care village operator Belong, based on Loushers Lane, Latchford, has enhanced its dementia care provision with the appointment of Bridget Lawler as Admiral Nurse to support residents and customers who have been medically diagnosed with any form of dementia.

The specialist mental health nursing role is provided for free across all Belong villages through the organisation's ongoing partnership with Dementia UK.

As well as customers, Bridget will provide tailored support for their family members and carers, and advise Belong colleagues on best

advise Belong colleagues on best practice in dementia care.

She assumes the role after eight years as Practice Development Facilitator (PDF) at Belong Atherton, where she was responsible for identifying opportunities for improvement and development to drive standards of care at the village. She also developed a unique insight into life for people living with dementia and how best to support them.

living with dementia and how best to support them.

Commenting on her appointment as Admiral Nurse, Bridget said: "Over the years I have gained so much knowledge about dementia that I truly feel I can make a difference to people's lives. I have learnt that often people will not remember what you said or did, but they will remember how you made them feel. That is to say that the human element of the role is just as important as the clinical is just as important as the clinical aspect. This is the essence of my

involvement with people living with dementia, their family and support

Originally from Zambia, Bridget moved to South Africa when she was eight years old and qualified as a registered nurse and midwife as a registered nurse and mlawite before working in various roles in hospitals and the community and managing a youth health centre providing health and family planning information and support. In 1991, she began teaching student nurses before completing a diploma in nursing education and primary healthcare in 1993

and primary healthcare in 1993 and going on to graduate from the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University with a degree in nursing sciences education and administration in 1996.

She took on the role of Registered

She took on the role of Registered Manager at a nursing home in Eccles after emigrating to the UK 12 years ago before becoming PDF at Belong Atherton four years later. On Bridget's suitability for the role, Stacey McCann, Chief Operating Officer at Belong, said: "Her distinguished career as a nurse combined with her significant care sector experience, including care sector experience, including promoting best practice in dementia care and track record of service for

Belong, make her an ideal Admiral Nurse. She is an invaluable asset

# Inspirational double amputee raises Santa Dash "bum shu

INSPIRATIONAL double amputee Jill Doran took part in Warrington Disability Partnership's "Santa Dash" raising over £1,200 for charity – and becoming the latest recipient of a Warrington Worldwide Legacy Project.

While many of the Santas ran or walked the 3k course at Walton Hall & Gardens, Jill, aged 59, a double amputee above the knee, who has survived more than 40 operations and a heart attack, did a'"bum shuffle.

As well as helping raise funds for WDP she also wanted to raise awareness and funds for Dog A.I.D (assistance in disability) which has been her savior not just physically

but mentally too.
Jill explained: "When I was 15 I was diagnosed with Charcot Marie Tooth disease which I was told affects the bottom half of your legs by the nerves dying off preventing the muscles from working. Many years later I realized it did far more

"Fast forward to 2007 and many surgeries, my legs had become so wasted and painful, I was given



two options, fusion of my right leg or above knee amputation. I went for option one and a full-length metal rod was inserted through the bones from my ankle to my pelvis, this was impossible to live with so I went with the second option of amputation above the knee in 2008 – best decision ever! I tried a prosthetic, aging to physio twice a

2008 – best decision ever! I tried a prosthetic, going to physio twice a week for 7 years but it wasn't to be. "During these years I got an Italian Spinone and took her to dog training classes where I met the trainer Peta Brandwood who helped me train 'Minnie' in the basics. Several months later I received a call from Peta saying she had become a volunteer trainer for the charity Dog AID and had I heard of it? I had years earlier tried to get on their scheme with my then chocolate Labrador, Murphy, but there were no trainers in the North West, so when Peta offered me this West, so when Peta offered me this

West, so when Peta offered me this opportunity I actually cried."
Dog AID, DA was established in 1992 to assist people with physical disabilities, improving their quality of life by helping them train their own pet dogs to provide assistance with day-to-day tasks and in some circumstances life-saving interventions. DA allocate a trainer interventions. DA allocate a trainer to clients to help them and give

them the tools to train their own pet dog, workshops happen twice a

year at Stoke Mandeville.

Jill added: "There are 3 levels you have to pass to become ADUK by an independent assessor which by an independent assessor which is tough, from your dog not being phased by a pigeon to the trickiest of tasks. My present Assistance dog – Paddy will take bank cards out of machines etc which is always a show stealer in shops! I've had Paddy from being 12 weeks old. These trainers are Volunteers as are many of the staff and DA rely on fundraising.

"In 2015 I had fusion surgery in my left ankle and a full hinged knee replacement once again this wasn't livable so in 2016 the left leg came off, I went from 5f1 to 3f5, can you imagine what my BMI would be?

am now losing the use of my hands and wrists now and started with vocal chord paralysis so Paddy is now learning hand signals as well as very gruff sounding commands at times. My disability has given me so many opportunities and I've met true, genuine people and my BFF Peta Brandwood, I wouldn't change a thing. 42 operations and a heart attack later I'm here telling

# Council cancel bus lane fines and issue new warning

AFTER receiving numerous complaints from motorists who were fined after unknowingly using a new bus lane, Warrington Borough Council has taken the decision to cancel all current fines.

In response to feedback, the council has taken the decision to cancel all penalty charge notices issued to date and to issue tull refunds to all who have already paid them, as soon as possible. The council will be writing to all those due a refund with further details.

is understood that several motorists have received numerous fines, some into double figures.

The cameras were introduced in October to assist with the removal of through traffic from Scotland Road. It forms part of the council's wider plans to reduce congestion, make the town centre a more attractive place for walking and cycling and to improve access for buses, by the removal of traffic rat-running through the town centre.

The implementation of the bus gate means there have been some gate hierars inere have been some changes to access routes to and from such places as the Prince Henry Square car park, Town Hill and the main Cockhedge Shopping Centre Car Park, located off the A49 Brick Street / A57 Midland Way.

Prince Henry Square car park should now be accessed to and from the north via Winwick Street passing Warrington Central Station and Town Hill should be accessed to and from the south via Dial Street and

Buttermarket Street.

In addition, the main Cockhedge Car Park now cannot be accessed via Scotland Road but instead via the A49 Brick Street / A57 Midland Way accesses, or via Dial Street and Orford Street.

Clear signage is in place, notifying people of the new bus gate and enforcement measures. However, a large number of motorists have been caught out by these changes in recent weeks, especially those travelling southbound as this was the previous access to Town Hill and many drivers have received Penalty Charge Notices.

Further to this, a leaflet showing the revised routes for motorists to follow will be sent to all those motorists who received a penalty charge notice, to avoid them receiving any more in the future. These leaflets will also be distributed to businesses in the vicinity of Prince Henry Square Car Park and Town Hill to raise awareness of the revised routes.

The council is now urging motorists who use this route in future to ensure they are familiar with the direction they need to travel in order to access Town Hill / Prince Henry Square car park / at the front of the Cockhedge Centre and the main Cockhedge Shopping Centre car park.

Only buses, permitted taxis, cycles and emergency services vehicles can use the bus gate. The new automatic number plate recognition cameras will capture the registration plate details of all vehicles driving illegally along the bus gate. Owners of these vehicles could receive a Penalty Charge Notice of £60 reduced to £30 if paid within the first 14 days.

The installation of the Scotland Road bus gate cameras is part of the council's ongoing work to support sustainable transport in Warrington. It aims to deter unauthorised vehicles, increase bus punctuality, reduce congestion and improve air quality. It is a vital part of the Council's wider

strategy set out in Local Transport Plan 4, Air Quality Action Plan and Health and Wellbeing Strategy to reduce the impact of pollution on busy roads in and around the town centre and for this to improve the health and wellbeing of those who live, work and visit Warrington town

Bus gates help provide a more reliable bus service and increase passenger numbers by enabling buses to have a more reliable journey along some of Warrington's most

congested roads.

# The dreaded Self Assessment Tax Return deadline is looming

As you read this you will be resting from the Xmas festivities and looking forward to a new year that will hopefully be both prosperous and healthy. However, anyone who has a tax liability to pay has one hurdle to face before they can fully relax – the dreaded 31st January deadline to both submit their tax return and to pay any resulting deadline.

The recent past has been very difficult for many people in business. The financial difficulties faced by many in the hospitality sector caused by the rapid spread of the new Omicron variant of Covid has been well publicised over the past few weeks. In view of the unusual circumstances HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) have taken a lenient view on "time to pay" requests. In fact, HMRC have reminded taxpayers of the option to set up a "self-serve time to pay" arrangement if they are unable to pay their self assessment bill by the due date.

This option has been open to people with smaller liabilities for some time. However, the limit for a self-serve time to pay arrangement was increased during the early part of the pandemic, and HMRC have now announced that the limit will remain at £30,000 tax due in respect of this January's liability.

If taxpayers can't pay their 2020/21 self assessment (SA) tax liability in full by the due date, which is generally 31 January 2022, then they can set up their own time to pay arrangement online if they:

- have filed their tax return for 2020/21;
- owe less than £30,000;
- are within 60 days of the payment deadline; and,
- plan to pay their debt off within the next 12 months or less.

To do so then the taxpayer should go to https://www.gov.uk/difficulties-paying-hmrc/pay-in-instalments

If the taxpayer owes more than £30,000, or need longer to pay, then they should phone the self-assessment payment helpline on 0300 200 3822 to make an arrangement.

As stated above, the service is available for 60 days from

the due date. However, if the liability is not paid within 30 days of the due date then a surcharge of 5% of the unpaid tax is generally payable. This is usually 1st March. To avoid this late payment surcharge, it is necessary for the taxpayer to set up the arrangement within the first 30 days following the due date.

The service has proved to be very popular to date. In fact, more than 20,000 taxpayers have used it since April 2021 to spread £46m of tax due for 2020/21. The previous year, over 123,000 taxpayers used it to spread the cost of £460m of liabilities in respect of the 2019/20 tax year.

Unfortunately, this self-serve time to pay facility is not available must be set up by the taxpayers themselves. Agents cannot do so on behalf of their clients as HMRC require a direct debit to be set up and they will only accept a direct debit mandates which has been set up by the taxpayers themselves.

All taxpayers should also consider any liability that may arise in respect of the

year 2021/22. A liability will arise on 31st January for a payment on account of this tax, and that payment on account will be based on 50% of the 2020/21 liability. A further liability of the same amount will arise on 31st July. Any taxpayer, whether or not they take advantage of a time to pay arrangement, should consider these payments on account. These payments on account will be reduced when the 2022 tax return is submitted to be based on 50% of the final liability. The payments on account will not be increased if the liability is higher. If they think that their liability in 2021/22 will be lower than their liability for 2020/21 then the taxpayer can reduce these payments on account based on those figures or estimates.

It is important to remember that any payment that is made after the due date will carry interest on a daily basis.
