

Lymm woman launches new charity to support village in Uganda



A LYMM woman who has worked tirelessly to help build a school and church in a small village in Uganda, while providing housing for qualified teachers and paying them, is looking for support for her new charity.

Back in 2014, long-term Lymm resident, Helen Owen, visited the small village called Namataba a few miles outside Kampala in Uganda. She came across a village school which was little more than a chalkboard and a few wooden railings.

There were no teachers, just a few mothers trying to pass on what education they had to the few children that were able to attend. All around was starvation and abject poverty.

around was starvation and abject poverty. The struggles of the Namataba people stayed in Helen's thoughts after her return to the UK. The children needed her most, many had lost both parents and some had only one; she wanted them all to have a proper education in a proper school. She also wanted them to have at least one nutritious meal a day. It was this goal that lead to the beginnings of the Helen Margaret Owen Foundation (HMOE) as a registered charity.

one nutritious meal a day. It was this goal that lead to the beginnings of the Helen Margaret Owen Foundation (HMOF) as a registered charity. Through huge efforts, mainly by herself, she has funded the building of a school, a church, provided housing for qualified teachers and paid them. She has also bought tarmland to grow crops that provide food for the school and the wider community. Inadequate food, disease and death are still common occurrences in Namataba so Helen, in conjunction with the village Pastor, has developed a support system to look after the children that are left



without parents or a home.

Although a lot has been done to try to raise the community above the poverty line, there is still a lot to do and of course as with anything it needs money. The Foundation still needs to finish and furnish the school and build and staff a medical centre.

Helen has taken this project from a single funded mission to a registered charity. There are already a small number of generous people who donate money on a monthly basis, but it is not enough to meet the ongoing costs of running a school. The HMOF desperately needs more people or businesses to donate each month. If you are such a person or work for or own a company that has a charity donation scheme, please consider the amazing people of this tiny village and the goals of this small but significant charity.

LYMM PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER

The Parish Council has had a very full programme of decisions and actions over the last month

As members of the South Warrington Parishes group we campaigned strongly against granting outline planning permission for 5 very large warehouses next to the M6 M56 junction on Grappenhall Lane. Very sadly, the proposal went through on a 5 to 7 vote with all the councillors from the ruling group in Warrington voting in favour. The Secretary of State does have the right to call the application in for another look. We await that decision.

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Cheshire has announced a review of local policing and the role of PCSOs. Lymm Parish Council is unusual among Warrington parishes in that we fund an additional PCSO. We, and the PCSOs, welcome comments from residents on the priorities for policing in the village and the style of policing we would like to see given the limited resources available.

We are being asked for greater CCTV coverage in the village and have received quotes for additional cameras to cover Lymm Cross up to Lymm Bridge, and the Davies way access to the village including the recycling point.

We are very grateful to the very successful Lymm in Bloom group for helping to plan the decoration of the village for the Jubilee celebrations in June. They always welcome additional volunteers and meet In the Sunken Garden by the Lower Dam at 10.30 am on the last Sunday of the month.

Lymm has been short-listed for a pilot average speed monitoring system to cover Higher Lane and Church Road. We hope, if successful, that this will reduce the speeding here that concerns many residents. This would add to the recent purchase and installation of sensors around the village to record traffic and speeds in various areas.

Finally, plans for Lymm's Platinum Jubilee celebrations will soon be announced. We hope that you will take part and enjoy the events that the Parish Council and local organisations are planning.

If there are any further issues you would like the Parish Council to consider, please let our clerk know.

Enjoy the coming of spring in our beautiful village.

Q) I have a 9 week old kitten who has just had her first vaccination. I have noticed that she has some fresh bright red blood in her poo. Her poo is soft so I don't think she is constipated. What could be causing this..

A) The vaccinations given to animals are a small dose of the actual disease that the vaccine is designed to prevent. By injecting the pet with this vaccine it stimulates the immune system to produce antibodies which will help to ward off the disease in the future. Initially when an animal is vaccinated it can cause the animal is vaccinated if for a couple of days and exhibit the symptoms you describe. If the symptoms continues for more than a couple of days have your pet checked out as it could just be co-incidence that it has occurred following a vaccination.

Q)My cat has just given birth to kittens. How long should I wait before having her neutered?

A) A cat can get pregnant as soon as eight weeks after giving birth so we would recommend having her neutered as soon as she has stopped producing milk.

Q) I have a 6 month old spaniel who has broken a tooth when he was chewing a stone. At the time it bled a bit but doesn't seem to be causing him any problems now. Is it OK to leave it ?



A) I would certainly suggest that you have your dog examined by a vet. The dog could have just broken a tip but could have done more significant damage and left an exposed area of the gum. If this gets infected it could lead to an absess which is quite serious.

Q) I have a female Lhasa Apso who wees when she gets excited, for example when visitors come to the house and make a fuss of her. I have been told that she will grow out of this - is this right?

A)Many puppies will go through a stage of weeing and grow out of it but this sounds like it is behaviour related. Some dogs will wet when they are excited or anxious so the solution is to try to avoid these situations. Ask visitors to ignore her when they first enter the house as fussing her will just compound the problem. Do not chastise your dog problem. Do not chastise your dog when she wets as this could cause more anxiety.

Safer Streets campaign to tackle violence against women and girls

A Safer Streets campaign has been launched in Warrington by Police and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer, helping to tackle viol against women and girls. violence

against women and girls. The campaign has been launched on the basis that everybody has the right to go about their daily routine without fear or prejudice. Since the tragic murders of Sarah Everard and Sabina Nessa in London, the debate around how the police and other services should tackle crimes that disproportionately affect women and girls such affect women and girls such as stalking, harassment, sexual violence and domestic abuse has featured prominently in the national conversation.

Conversation. A documentary filmed here in Cheshire, 'Stalkers', hosted by Stacey Dooley, highlighted the dangers faced by women and girls and the work ongoing in Cheshire Constabulary's Harm Reduction Unit (HRU) to protect them. The HRU helps victims to recover through practical support and Special Victims' Advocates.

Mr Dwyer heard first-hand about how the concerns raised across the country were no different here in Cheshire. In his Police and Crime Plan he outlined his commitment to tackling violence against women and girls through continuing to fund the HRU and providing more more community-based support for victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence through Independent Domestic Violence Advocates (IDVA) and Independent Sexual Violence Advocate (ISVA) schemes.

Since taking office, the Commissioner has applied to the Home Office for extra funding to help tackle violence and intimidation against women and girls in Cheshire. In November 2021 the

In November 2021, the Commissioner was successful in securing £550,000 for the Warrington Safer Streets project, which sees a number of initiatives being rolled out to help make residents and visitors to the borough feel safe.

Enhanced CCTV and street lighting will be added to the town CCTV centre, complementing neighbouring streets which have already been given the same enhancement. There will also be a 'safe taxi' scheme and an awareness and learning package for taxi drivers and other guardians to promote active bystander to promote active bystander intervention – encouraging people to challenge inappropriate behaviour

when they see it. Pupils across Warrington will also be educated on how to spot and challenge unacceptable behaviour additional training and support will be provided to police officers to enable them to identify perpetrators at an early stage.

Mr Dwyer said: "Tackling violence and intimidation against women and girls requires a collaborative approach and the Safer Streets funding supplied by the Home Office has helped the police, council and other partners tackle the issue on both sides of the coin.

It's vital that we work to protect women and girls from harmful behaviour, but that cannot happen without resolute action to prevent that behaviour from happening in the first place. We need to educate people that the perpetrator is always responsible for their own behaviour,

with no exceptions. "Using some of the initiatives mentioned above shows how well all the agencies involved have worked together to help tackle and prevent

violence against women and girls." The Safer Streets project in Warrington links in with work being undertaken elsewhere in the county. This includes the £300,000 investment the Commissioner secured as part of the Home Office's Safety of Women at Night (SWaN) fund.

This fund enabled Cheshire Constabulary to invest in technology providing a real time video call link between the call handlers in the Force Control Centre and victims of crime. This technology aims to reduce the fear of sexual offending, improve the confidence that women and girls have in the police and justice system and make Cheshire's night-time economy safer for everyone.

Mr Dwyer concluded: chnology demonstrates "This technology ' our commitment to making Cheshire as safe as possible. I want to see how it helps us protect women and girls and expand its use to other types of crime, if appropriate.

"It enables call handlers to send a secure link, direct to your phone, allowing them to view the incident instantly and give the caller quick reassurance.

'In the case of sexual assaults, if a victim calls the police immediately after an incident, the call handler can start recording a first account from the victim, enabling evidence collection at a very early stage, and may help to identify an offender it they are still in the area.

There needs to be a concerted effort from all agencies involved to help improve the feeling of safety for everyone on our streets. As you can see, work is being undertaken but we can't rest on our laurels. I am committed to doing all I can to help and support victims, hold perpetrators accountable for their actions and educate the next generation on acceptable behaviour."

Solar panels raise £3,800 for village community benefit projects

SOLAR panels on the roofs of Lymm's four primary schools have raised $\pounds 3,800$ for the village community this year – as well as cutting energy costs for the schools.

As a result, community benefit society Lymm Community Energy (LCE) is inviting grant applications from community groups for environment-friendly projects in the village.

The solar photovoltaic installations on the four schools continue to perform exceptionally well, reducing energy use and costs for the schools as well as enabling LCE to pay interest to members and build up a fund to benefit the wider community.

Over the past few years, LCE's Community Benefit Fund has helped fund projects that reduce energy demand and carbon

emissions in Lymm, such as efficient lighting, ventilation and insulation at Maple Lodge and the Youth and Community Centre.

This year's fund is widening the scope of projects eligible for funding to include projects that will support the community to deliver environmental benefits in the Lymm area. The fund is open to any organisation providing services to the community in Lymm, enabling delivery of projects to improve the environment in Lymm and the surrounding area

LCE chairman Cllr Bob Barr said: "Despite the pandemic, the four solar installations have continued to perform well and we are delighted that the community benefit fund this year totals £3,800. We hope to see applications from community groups that respond to the climate emergency in creative ways.

emergency in creative ways. "By widening the scope of the fund this year, we are keen to see projects that will deliver a really wide range of benefits." The fund is open for applications immediately –a guidance document and application form are available on the lumm Community Energy

on the Lymm Community Energy website –with applications being considered on a first-come, firstserved basis. The fund will remain open until all the available budget has been allocated.

LCE is working to bring forward further energy projects in Lymm, in particular developing a proposal for a ground-mounted solar farm

tor a ground-mounted solar tarm that would hugely increase the amount of locally generated renewable energy. Richard Catchpole, a director of LCE. who is leading the solar farm project development, said: "We are currently undertaking surveys and investigations as part of the next stage of the design for the solar farm. We've already carried out a wide-ranging community consultation programme and will be doing more over this year as we develop our plans. We've put all the information we have at present on our website and welcome questions or comments at any time."

LCE is entirely run by volunteer members of the community and is always keen to hear from people who would like to get involved or who have ideas for future activities.
