Editor's Comment



THERE will be a lot of disappointed, frustrated and angry people following the Government's decision not to call in the controversial Six56 logistics development on Green Belt land near Appleton Thorn.

The Secretary of State decided not to call in the planning application by Langtree, approved 7-5 by Labour members of the borough council's development management committee, on the grounds that it should be a local decision - a local decision that is being currently challenged by local campaigners, who claim due process was not followed correctly.

At the time of press, I was still awaiting a statement from the council regarding the complaints, which alleges two members of the planning committee were not suitably qualified, having not completed the necessary training to enable them to vote on such a complex and important planning application. A complaint has also been made that the leader of the council, Cllr. Russ Bowden did not declare an interest in the application, as a director of Wire Regeneration - a joint venture between the borough council and Langtree.

Whatever the outcome, the most disappointing element is when an important decision like this, which impacts our green belt, appears to be political.

When more than 1,000 people raise objections to something, our elected representatives should surely

listen, not just to them - but also those who have been democratically elected to represent them. Is it little wonder many people are losing faith in the democratic process?

Every single democratically elected person representing the area impacted, opposed this development, as well as local MP Andy Carter. Yet the decision to allow it was made by those on the opposite side of town. Is this a true democracy?

If the decision is ruled null and void and has to be reconsidered, it will be a first in my reporting career, so I am not holding my breath.

Meanwhile, on a more positive

note, I would like to congratulate all those involved in organising community events, especially the many Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations taking place across the town. After the past two years we certainly all need something to lift our spirits!

The latest organisations to benefit from a Warrington Worldwide Legacy Project grant of £500 include Lymm Festival - which makes a welcome return after being impacted by COVID. We are also delighted to be the main media partner for the TedX event taking place at the Pyramid which you can read all about elsewhere in this edition. As another beneficiary of a Legacy Project grant we have now donated a total of £4,500 to community organisations.

End of an era as Penny Ferryman hangs up his oar

IT will mark the end of an era when ferryman Kevin Wilkinson retires after almost 20 years of operating the historic Penny Ferry across the Manchester Ship Canal at Thelwall.

When Kevin hangs up his oar this month, it is understood the rowing boat will be replaced with a motorboat, although this is yet to be confirmed by operators Peel.

Meanwhile, grandad of six Kevin, who works 365 days a year, including Christmas Day, is looking forward to spending more time with his grandchildren while taking a well-earned rest from his duties.

Launched way back in 1894, to continue a public right of way across the newly constructed Manchester Ship Canal, inflation has seen the ferry charge increase from 1p to 11p or 20p return.

Describing it as "the best job


in the world" during the summer, Kevin says he couldn't do another winter, which can be tough going.

Meanwhile Kevin is a hugely popular character who will be sadly missed by his passengers, who are mainly walkers who number on average around 600 a year.



His most unusual clients were a group of boating enthusiasts, who after experiencing some of the largest ships in the world, wanted to sail on one of the smallest!



The ferry is an aluminum rowing boat that is operated with one rear oar from a neat little jetty when needed from 7am to 9am, 12 noon to 2pm and 4pm to 6pm.

I was very pleased to be invited to and have a guided tour around the new Youth Zone a couple of weeks ago. The problem is, I can't really do justice to this facility on paper.

Not only are the facilities fantastic but the ethos and purpose of the Youth Zone can only really be appreciated in context of what the building does. It offers probably every constructive activity that I could think of from boxing to cooking, hairdressing to art, which together with a hot food offer and most importantly someone to talk to if needed, should make this a great place for young people to go to. And that is the point to engage young people to get them off the streets and into something constructive, either literally as part of the development of the rest of their

life. The best way to appreciate this is to get involved either as a young person or if you really want to get some life satisfaction as a volunteer. I don't think the website does it justice either, but it is clear that a huge amount of thought has gone into the offer, style, approach and manner in which the WYZ approaches and engages young people. Truly humbling to see its potential.

Warrington & Co have had a long association with the project having created the site by relocating the Showmen from their long established

Creamfields organisers pledge to make some changes following concerns raised by residents

ORGANISERS of the annual Creamfields music festival have pledged to make some changes ahead of this year's event during a public meeting hosted by Warrington South MP Andy Carter.

Mr Carter hosted a second open meeting for residents in Hatton, Stretton and Walton with Creamfields Festival Organiser John Probyn, in preparation for the music festival later this year.

The meeting held at the parish rooms in Higher Walton follows a similar event after the 2021 festival highlighting concerns with dangerous parking, a lack of event marshals and difficulties with access for residents to their homes during the event.

As well as Borough and Parish Councillors from each village, the meeting was also attended by Cheshire Police who gave an update on Operation Servator to secure the site and prevent drugs from being available to festival-goers.

Commenting after the meeting Mr Carter said: "More than 80,000 music lovers converge on South

Warrington for this festival each year, it benefits our local economy with millions of pounds going to the hospitality sector but it also impacts people who live nearby.

"The festival organisers have made a number of changes after feedback received last year, in particular moving some of the car parks close to houses, increasing the number of security officers outside the perimeter and building a temporary footbridge over Daresbury Lane to allow the road to stay open to residents."

Mr Carter added: "Organisers are keen to hear from local charities who may want to support the post-event clear-up operation, collecting tents and camping equipment left behind. There will be a further open meeting for residents in early July where the traffic management company will provide a briefing on temporary traffic orders which will be in place during the bank holiday weekend."

Warrington's newest railway station wins award

THE railway station at Warrington West, which opened in 2019, has won an award for best kept station in Warrington and Halton.

Warrington Borough Cllr Steve Parish (Lab, Chapelford and Old Hall) presented the award, in the shape of the old British Railways "totem", to staff at the station recently.

Cllr Parish, who worked for British Rail in the 1970s, has been involved with Council officers in trying to secure a better service at the railway station, after cuts during Covid left the station with just one stopping train an hour in each direction.

Timetable changes to address congestion in Manchester will see

express services return to the station next December in the morning and evening peak, along with an extra off-peak stopping train between Liverpool and Warrington Central with a fast connection to Manchester.

Cllr Parish said: "It's great to add this award to the award for the station's design, and passenger numbers are building up again despite the poor frequency. Warrington has lost out because of the cuts in Manchester, but we'll keep pressing for a better service".

Mental health campaigners lead 'Thank You Day' Parkrun Jubilee plans



LEADING mental health campaigners journalist and broadcaster Alastair Campbell and former professional footballer Clarke Carlisle visited Warrington Parkrun recently to help launch special 'Thank You day' events as part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend.

With former Burnley FC Footballer Clarke now living in Newcastle and Alastair, a passionate Burnley FC supporter, living in London – Warrington was the perfect location to launch the campaign to help raise mental health awareness.

Both men have suffered with mental health issues and are keen to help remove the stigma about talking about it.

Organisers are calling on everyone, young and old, runners, walkers, spectators and their friends and family to get involved and join their local parkrun or junior parkrun on the weekend of 4th and 5th June.

Up to 1,000 parkruns and junior parkruns take place across the country every weekend. They are an opportunity for communities to come together in the great outdoors, enjoy one another's company, see old friends and make new ones, and take part in the wider Thank You Day celebrations.

The campaign behind 'Thank You Day' is also suggesting that people bring along a picnic as a way of coming together with up to ten million people across the country and getting behind Britain's biggest ever street party.

"So whether you're a walker or a runner, a volunteer or spectator, it's time to get involved. Invite the neighbours, rope in your family and bring your friends. And if you'd like to join the biggest street party ever, pack your picnic and let's all get together to celebrate Thank You Day."

Clarke added: "Thank You Day is a brilliant initiative, and it's fantastic that Parkrun is getting involved. This is a day for us all to come together and take stock of what's important – and I can't think of any better way of doing that the joining your friends, families and neighbours at a parkrun."

Thank You Day will take place this year on Sunday, June 5. Organisers hope 10 million people will take part in events across the country.

£financially yours

Can you get any help to counter some of the current high inflation rate?

As I write this inflation has hit 9%, it's highest rate for 40 years. The last time was in 1982 when all shops were closed by law on a Sunday, there were only 3 television channels which broadcast from lunchtime each day, and there were only 4 national radio stations all of which were operated by the BBC.

All expectation is that, despite the efforts of government, inflation will take years to come back down again. Indeed, many commentators are predicting that it may even increase further. Additionally, whilst the headline rate is 9%, the actual rate is currently calculated at about 10.5% for poorer households due to the largest increases being in fuel and in basic foodstuffs.

The next budget is due in the Autumn, but the Chancellor is under increasing pressure from all sides to bring in mitigating measures sooner, such as a reduction in the rate of VAT charged, or

shortening the previously announced freezing of tax allowances and thresholds until April 2026. However, there are a small number of things that you may meanwhile be able to do yourself.

Firstly, if you are married or in a civil partnership, AND one partner is a non-taxpayer and the other pays tax at basic rate, then the non-taxpayer can transfer 10% of his or her personal allowance to the other partner. This will save £250 in tax each year at present. Additionally, if the same conditions applied in previous years then the claim can be backdated for up to 6 years, resulting in a one-off tax refund of up to approximately £1,250.

It is very easy to apply and details of how to do so are at Apply for Marriage Allowance - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).

Secondly, and as an extension to the above, if you earn above £50,270

then you will be paying tax at 40% on the excess rather than the basic rate of 20%. If you are above this income then you may be able to reduce your income to below this threshold by paying into a pension scheme. In the extreme, if you are earning £50,320 then you will not be a basic rate taxpayer and hence ineligible for the Marriage Allowance. However, provided only that your partner is a non-taxpayer then paying £51 into a pension will enable you to claim the £250 Marriage Allowance. Additionally, your contributions into the scheme will be grossed up by 25%!

Thirdly, if you have children and are receiving child benefit then a high-income charge, effectively clawing back the benefit, will be applied if your own or your partner's income is above £50,000. To avoid the clawback then you can similarly pay into a pension to reduce your income to

below this threshold and retain the child benefit. Again, any contributions will be grossed up by 25%.

Some people avoid the high-income charge by simply not claiming the child benefit. One very important thing to remember is that you will get Class 3 National Insurance Credits if you are registered for Child Benefit for a child under 12 even if you do not receive it, thus preserving your contribution record in respect of state pension. Therefore, do not avoid the high-income charge by just not claiming child benefit. If you are eligible, always register to receive it and then elect not to have it paid.
