New bid to save "haunted pub"

A NEW bid has been launched to safeguard the future of an 18th-century pub which, according to local legend, is haunted.

The Star Inn, in Star Lane, Lymm is the last remaining pub in the hamlet of Statham. The building itself dates from the 1840s when it was a fustian cutting house.

Lymm Parish Council is seeking to have the pub listed as an asset of community value. They say the pub, as the only one in Statham, contributes significantly to local community life.

It is used by many local organisations, including the local school's parent teacher association.

It is 'used by many local organisations, including the local school's parent-teacher association, the local Labour Party, the Star Gun Club, CAMRA and Warrington Angler's Association.

The pub holds regular quiz nights, its death and the pub holds regular quiz nights,

The pub holds regular quiz nights, its darts team competes in the local darts league and has large screen televisions which screen popular sporting events, bringing local people together.

It offers refreshments to walkers and cyclists using the nearby Trans-

Pennine Trail, many of who are fascinated by its history, including the legendary ghost from the 17th century.

Over the years, the top floor of the three-storey building has been subjected to poor quality partitioning. However, a lot of the original features still remain including the large beams that were used to support the heavy fustian cloth cutting bench.

The pub is believed to be one of the best examples in the village of Lymm's association with the fustian cutting industry which was once Lymm's main source of employment.

The Star has been listed as a community asset before, but the protection lasts for only five years.

If the listing is granted again, it means the local community would have the opportunity to put together a bid, in the event of the building being put up for sale.



Anger over retirement home plan for Green Belt land

ANGRY residents are opposed to plans by McCarthy and Stone to build 45 retirement apartments on Green Belt land at Watercress Farm next to the Dairy Farm estate in Lymm.

Local Councillor Ian Marks said: "This land is in the Green Belt and I don't believe there are any very special circumstances to justify release of this land now. It follows soon after a proposal by Bellway to build houses and a medical centre next door to this site.

"Both these proposals are premature because the Local Plan has yet to be examined in Public by an Inspector. This examination is an Inspector. This examination is expected later in the year and will determine if any Green Belt land in the area is to be released.

"In 2007 McCarthy and Stone applied for planning permission for 53 sheltered apartments for

the elderly on what was then the Rushgreen Filling Station but is now Sainsbury's. This was turned down on appeal. Although circumstances are different now, some of the reasons for dismissing the appeal still stand and set a precedent against development.

against development.
Cllr. Marks added: "We have campaigned for years to retain the gap between the settlements of Lymm and Oughtrington and this proposal would be a significant intrusion. The entrance would be at the end of Thirlmere Drive which is far from ideal Posidonts are is far from ideal. Residents are horrified at all the disruption that would result during the construction

McCarthy & Stone say the plans propose the construction of 45 Retirement Living apartments set amongst attractive, landscaped gardens with on-site parking provision. The proposed development is in a sustainable location near the centre of Lymm, with all the amenities that the village has to offer just a short distance away.

McCarthy Stone has carried out a

pre-application public consultation with the local community on its proposals, including a virtual exhibition from the 6th to the 20th of May 2022, which over 2,000 residents, businesses and stakeholders were invited to view.

Q: My rabbit has gone off his food. What should I do?

A: Lack of appetite in rabbits is A: Lack or appetite in rabbits is not good news and can often be a symptom of pain. The problem could also be linked to dental problems. Have your rabbit checked out by your vet to get to the course of the problem. the cause of the problem.

Q: Our Boxer has developed itchy, sore looking areas between her toes. She continually nibbles and licks them and the fur has gone an orangy colour. She is on antibiotics and antihistamine but it doesn't seem to have helped. What would you suggest?

A: It sounds like a classic case of Pododermatitis – an inflammation of the skin. Your vet has advised the right treatment. If the condition doesn't improve it may need a course of steroids or other antiinflamatories to get it under control.

Q: Our 7 year old cat is showing odd behaviour when we stroke her at the bottom of her back by her tail. She dips her back down and turns her head up and towards her tail and sometimes hisses. There isn't anything visible - what could

A: This could be a skin problem, possibly secondary to a flea allergy or overgrooming which could be stress related. Other causes of this behaviour could be a cat bite abscess or even arthritis. You need to have her checked over by a vet to find the cause of the behaviour.

Q: I have a 9 year old Labrador. She is healthy but suffers from a weak bladder. Is it just old age or can something be done to stop this?

A: This can be common in older bitches especially if they have been spayed. There are a couple of drugs available which we have found to be very effective in curing this in most cases.

Q: Is it safe for my cat to play with my knitting wool?

A: No. It is relatively common to see intestinal injuries as a result of cats ingesting wool or string. It would be much better to get her a good quality cat toy.


