WOW - it has been an incredibly busy period following the return of the many community events after an absence of nearly three years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Our team has been kept busy out and about covering many of the events, none more so than Warrington Walking Day, which made a welcome return alongside the many other community events

right across the town.

While COVID-19 is still very much with us, we are now learning to live with it and although some people are still ending up in hospital, and some sadly still dying, the intensive care unit is nowhere near as busy as it was during the first and second waves.

Meanwhile the long-running

While a little less forthcoming on the a lime less torthcoming on the Together Energy investment, due to commercial sensitivity during the administration period, I am being told the loss to the town will not be as much as first feared – but the proof will be in the pudding.

Now the sparks are again flying about a proposed £63.5m investment in another solar energy company, which is now subject to a proposed "call-in" by concerned opposition councillors

As always we will continue to

report on this issues in a balanced way without taking sides, while holding the council to account on its investment decisions.

Finally finishing on a positive note – it was an absolute honour to be the Media Partner for the first ever TEDx event that took place at the Pyramid, organised by Kirsty James and her hardworking team. My thoughts have been well documented online and I haven't got the space here to truly articulate what I witnessed - but suffice to say, witnessing eleven outstanding public speakers, living in the moment and wearing their hearts on their sleeves, was truly breath taking and life changing and I am now well and truly a TEDx convert.

## Big boost for buses with 'Super Summer Service'

WARRINGTON'S buses will be pulling out all the stops this summer, with major improvements to evening timetables, cheaper fares and no limits for concessionary card holders.

Launched on Monday 25 July, Warrington's Super Summer Service is set to transform bus travel for nine weeks until 4 October. It aims to entice people of all ages back onto the bus for their evening journeys – whether they are heading into town to catch a film or grab a meal, meeting up with friends, or visiting the new Youth Zone.

There will be enhanced timetables, with more frequent buses every evening every day, making the bus a much better, easier and convenient choice for people looking to explore

Warrington.

Evening services, after 7pm every night, will also have super-cheap fares, with a single ticket to any destination within the Borough of Warrington – on any Warrington's Own Buses, Arriva or Go North West bus – costing a maximum of £2 for adults and £1 for children.

And there will be no restrictions on when concessionary pass holders can use their pass. People who catch the bus from a Warrington Borough bus stop will no longer have to wait until 9.30am for their pass to be valid, and can get on-board at any time of day, seven days a week.

The Super Summer Service will offer:

- an enhanced timetable for evening services from 7pm, seven days a
- Cheaper fares during the evening enhanced timetable, with children adults single fares at no more than

£1/£2 respectively on any bus across the entire network (Please note, there will be no change to those services which are already capped at £1.90 single)
The removal of the 9.30am weekday restrictions for

concessionary passes, with pass holders able to travel at any time of the day, 7 days per week. Funded by Local Transport Fund

money allocated to the council by the Department for Transport, the 'Super Summer Service' is the latest part of the council's work to invest in bus services in the borough, delivering an attractive, modern service which is affordable, reliable and responsive to local people's needs.

Everyone is being encouraged to use the service during the nine-week trial period, as the popularity of the project will help shape the development of long-term plans to drive up the attractiveness and reliability of buses in Warrington, whilst driving down forces.

Warrington Borough cabinet member for transportation, highways and public realm, Cllr Hans Mundry, said: "This is a really exciting project, which will transform our bus services throughout the summer months and, at the same time, hopefully transform people's thinking about the bus as a viable, attractive

way of exploring Warrington.

"People can look forward to a greatly improved evening offer,

better connectivity to key town centre locations, including Time Square, Golden Square, the Cultural Quarter and the Youth Zone plus the many wonderful places to visit in Warrington outside the town centre, where passengers can centre, where passengers can take advantage of cheaper fares and big benefits for concessionary passengers.

"This initiative is one of many we will be delivering in the coming months and years as part of our Bus Service Improvement Plan to help address reduced bus patronage during the pandemic and encourage many more people to consider swapping the car for the bus. We all know the huge environmental benefits increased bus usage brings we now want to deliver a first-class bus service that people can count on.
"Initiatives like the Super Summer

Service are an important part of this work, and will help set the scene for some of the revolutionary changes coming to our bus services in the near future. By 2023 – thanks to our Bus Service Improvement Plan and ZEBRA project – we will be providing our residents with a cutting-edge, allreliable and cheaper for everyone.

you have never really used buses before - or have stopped using them, there's never been a better time to get on-board. We hope as many people as possible will take advantage of the benefits on offer over the summer, as the results of this pilot will help to inform decisions about the future of Warrington's bus network

Clir Cathy Mitchell, Deputy Leader of Warrington Borough Council and Chair of Warrington's Own Buses, said: "Our Super Summer Service initiative gives people a great incentive to leave the car at home and take the bus instead. At the same time, it will bring big benefits to existing bus users, which is great news. "We

She is also an elected parish councillor for Great Sankey North, where she is a resident.

Warrington BID was approved at ballot in 2018 after the majority of businesses voted in support. The current term of the BID will end in 2023, when businesses will again have the chance to vote for it to continue for another five years. Since the BID started in 2018, Warrington BID has supported more than £1m of

investment into the town centre.

excited to welcome Andrea as BID manager, her experience and energy will drive forward our plans to continue Warrington town centre's evolution into a thriving place where people can live, work, play and learn. ## Fiddler's Ferry site sold – and set for major new development

THE site of the iconic Fiddler's Ferry Power Station – a landmark in the Warrington area for 50 years – looks set to continue to play a key role in the town's economy.

It has been purchased by natural resources and energy company Peel NRE who now plan to produce a 10-15 year mixed-use master plan for the 820-acre site – one of the largest brownfield sites in the country.

New developments for industrial use and new homes in a sustainable community are planned to provide

use and new homes in a sustainable community are planned to provide jobs, skills and address housing shortages in the borough.

The plans will also create extensive new parkland and wildlife areas to enhance the environment.

Peel NRE is part of regeneration business Peel L&P. They have acquired the site from energy company SSE Thermal.

Fiddler's Ferry and its eight cooling towers were decommissioned in 2020 in line with Government policy to phase out coal-fired facilities by 2025.

With its parent company responsible for some of the country's most transformational projects across the North West including The Trafford Centre, MediaCity at Salford Quays and Liverpool Waters, Peel NRE will now help to mark a new era for Warrington by developing fresh plans to regenerate the former fossil-

fuel dependent power station.

The Fiddler's Ferry site, which also includes agricultural land, was identified in the 2021 version of the Warrington Local Plan for the development of around 250-acres for employment use and a minimum of 1,760 new homes.

Kieran Tames, development director for Peel NRE said: "Fiddler's Ferry power station has been a local landmark and part of the community for many years but as the UK moves

for many years but as the UK moves away from the use of fossil fuels for energy generation, the site was recently decommissioned by SSE.

"We now want to work with local people to develop exciting new plans and mark a new era for the site that best respects its history and meets the future economic social

site that best respects its history and meets the future economic, social and environmental ambitions of Warrington, the neighbouring district of Halton and their communities.

"As echoed in the draft local plan, employment, housing, parkland and wildlife areas are a key part of this and with decades of experience regenerating towns and cities across the UK, we are confident that we can the UK, we are confident that we car bring forward proposals that build on the strengths of both areas and

create new exciting communities with more jobs, better homes and facilities, and open space to help improve lives.

"We have a significant track record in regenerating redundant heavy industrial sites and we are keen to continue investing in more opportunities like this and work with partners to support local and with partners to support local and regional economies."

Peel NRE will also help to oversee the land remediation of the site and will be in touch with the community



for decades, but as we power past coal the decision was made to close the site in 2019. As custodians of the site for more than 15 years, we know how much it means to the local community and during the sale process we wanted to find a buyer who would ensure the site continued to play a vital role moving forward. "In Peel NRE, we are passing the baton to a developer with ambitious plans to regenerate Fiddler's

plans to regenerate Fiddler's Ferry, providing new economic opportunities for the local community, and we look forward to seeing those plans progress in the years ahead."

## Exciting investment enquiries continue

It's nice to feature in Warrington Worldwide again whilst the usual contributor, John Laverick, suns himself somewhere that naturally won't be as good as Warrington!

That said, most countries across the world are struggling with the lingering effects of Covid, Brexit and the war in Ukraine. Double digit inflation is not something that those of a certain vintage [met] ever wanted to see again, especially when it also brings stagnating growth. It's therefore a tough environment out there, although paradoxically,

we have plenty of companies in Warrington that are growing. Time Square and Golden Square are both very close to confirming some major new tenants, and when they do, you'll see further evidence of the shift from traditional retail towards leisure and hospitality. We continue to receive exciting inward investment enquiries from companies keen to establish

operations in Warrington, including a Chinese electronics company and French IT provider. The issue we have French IT provider. The issue we have is where to house them – work is due to start on 161,000 sq ft of new property at Birchwood Park and it's nearly been let before a spade has touched the ground!

Consultation continues on the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, the replacement for European Union grants. The process was held up briefly when the relevant Minister, Michael Gove was dismissed by the

Michael Gove, was dismissed by the Michael Gove, was dismissed by the outgoing Prime Minister, however Greg Clark has now taken over and we look forward to working closely with him. At £7 million it's about a third less than what we received from Brussels, however we do have more flexibility over how we can spend it. Similar to the £21m Town Deal that we secured in 2020, we need to present an investment plan to need to present an investment plan to government so Council colleagues are busy engaging with stakeholders to ensure that the most important issues and opportunities are addressed. Warrington is the 6th worst funded local authority in the country so we need to maximise the return for every pound spent through this scheme.

I had the pleasure of attending the church service for the new mayor of Warrington, Councillor Jean Flaherty. Jean was born in Fairfield & Howley and represents need to present an investment plan to

### First Carbon Neutral mortgage broker in town





## New ambulance station and training centre approved by planners

HEALTH and First Aid charity St John Ambulance has been granted planning consent for an ambulance station and training centre at Warrington. The facility is at the former

Cerberg Matec storage and distribution unit in Leacroft Road, Birchwood. Up to 11 ambulances will be based at the site, together with 35 staff.

Warrington Borough Council planners have approved the change of use of the site – which is already in use.

St John Ambulance will be delivering the transport services of the North West and North Wales Paediatric Transfer Service and the North West Neonatal Transport

Service and Connect North West from the site, as well as continuing to support NHS Ambulance services, including the North West Ambulance Service.

Planners were told the site was crucial to help St John Ambulance teams reach critical care units quickly to deliver critical care to patients.

An essential service, it would be operational 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

There were no objections to the proposals – and given the urgent need for the service, work on the conversion of the buildings started ahead of planning consent being given.

## MP helps secure £6m Government cash for Penketh High School re-build

WARRINGTON South MP Andy Carter has welcomed the Government's announcement that Penketh High School will receive almost £6 million in funding as part of the national Schools Rebuild Programme.

Penketh High School is one of sixty-one across the country which is set to receive state-of-the-art rebuilds or refurbishments that will transform education for their pupils.

Work to deliver the project will start immediately. It will include updating and modernising buildings, and creating state-of-the-art facilities. The new school buildings will be net-zero carbon in operation, helping meet the Government's net-zero target.

In operation, nelping meet the Government's net-zero target.
Mr Carter has prioritized Penketh High School for support by the Department for Education following a visit to the site when he was securing meetings for the Penketh High's leadership team with the Schools Minister, the MP managed to get a condition improvement survey brought forward because of his concerns over the safety of buildings. He has also raised the matter in Parliament recently when he asked the Education Secretary to support the school's application to fund a re-build programme.

to support the school's application to fund a re-build programme.

The funding, which is around £6 million, is in addition to a grant from Warrington Borough Council

recently agreed.

Mr Carter said: "Our children deserve the best start in life and I

made a commitment when elected to work to secure better facilities for our local schools. During my first tour around the school with Head Teacher Mr Carlin I saw the problems for myself, some of the classroom blocks are in urgent need of replacement and some couldn't be used. I very quickly arranged a meeting with the Ministerial Team to make the case that Penketh be part of the Schools Rebuild Programme. TCAT submitted a strong bid and are also using some of the funds allocated to Academies to support this project. This is very welcome funding and I know the school are keen to get underway with the building project.

"I also pay tribute to Penketh High's improving educational achievements, this is really great school where renewed leadership and inspirational teaching is paying off for children in Penketh. The school recently received an improved rating from Ofsted and a sports gold award. It's fantastic news that they will now be getting the funding to replace the buildings that they so urgently need."

## Linancially yours

## The taxman is not always right as has recently been illustrated by two cases

The first concerns a couple of our own clients who were in partnership until 30 June 2017, after which they traded on their own. The 2018 partnership return, and the individual partners' tax returns, correctly showed this cessation date as well as the commencement date of the sole trader business. All of the individual tax returns for 2019, 2020 and 2021 were submitted on time, all of which only referred to the sole trader business.

Penalty notices for the late submission of a partnership return were issued by HM Revenue & Customs ("HMRC") in respect of the 2019 tax year. These were successfully appealed against and the penalties were cancelled. However, this did not stop HMRC issuing penalty notices in respect of 2020. Again, these were successfully appealed against and the penalties cancelled.

So did HMRC now accept that the partnership no longer existed? Not at all! Penalties were again issued in respect of the 2021 tax year in March 2022. These were immediately appealed against by letter stating that the penalties should be cancelled. In June 2022 a second demand was issued, stating that penalties were now increasing on a daily

basis. Again, a further letter was sent together with a copy of the original appeal. HMRC failed to act on either of these letters.

When a third demand was received in July we visited the client and contacted HMRC by telephone. After a 20 minute wait we spoke to someone who understood, and we are now hoping that the matter is resolved..

However, if the penalties are not cancelled than we will be following the route that had to be taken in the second case. This basically concerns the meaning of the word "late". You may think that you and everyone else knows that but HMRC does not agree. In fact, they seem to think that it means the same as "early".

Real Time Information ("RTI") has been with us for 10 years, so everyone involved in the preparing a payroll should by now be aware of the RTI deadlines for filing the Full Payment Submission ("FPS"). In fact, HMRC's own guidance "When to send your FPS" states that the FPS must be submitted "on or before your employees' payday", otherwise a Late Filing Penalty will be issued unless you have a "reasonable excuse".

Very straightforward, you might think, and so did

Quayviews Ltd until they ran foul of HMRC's interpretation of "late".

Quayviews had already been issued with late filing penalties so wanted to avoid any more. Therefore, on 4 September 2020 (Month 5), they decided to file submissions for the tax months ending 5 November 2020, 5 December 2020, 5 January 2021 and 5 April 2021 (months 7,8,9 and 12 respectively). They used HMRC's very own Basic PAYE Tools software which HMRC had altered to allow early filing, when previously returns could only be submitted within three weeks of the payday. They even received a message saying that the FPS had been successfully filed.

However, this did not stop HMRC from issuing late filing penalties. They agreed that the FPS had been received, but were unable to allocate them to a specific tax month. HMRC considered that no filing within a tax month indicated late filing. Even when they had been made aware of the early filing they maintained this view. Furthermore, they did not consider that Quayviews had a "reasonable excuse" for filing early, hence the reason for the late filing penalty notices and the rejection of the company's appeal.

Fortunately, the company's subsequent appeal to the First Tier Tribunal was successful. They stated that the company had a reasonable excuse, because:

- 1. HMRC's guidance did not state that filing early and not within the tax month could constitute late filing, stating only that the FPS must be filed "on or before",
- 2. Although Quayviews had been sent a previous "education letter" by HMRC, that again did not say the FPS could not be submitted early
- 3. HMRC's Basic PAYE Tools allows files to be submitted early without an indication that early could mean late if too early
- 4. The fact that the HMRC Basic PAYE software gave a success message.

So what is the moral of this story? When you receive a nasty letter from HMRC then do not automatically think that it is right. Speak to them or your tax adviser.
