RLWC Women in Rugby League exhibition

FOLLOWING on from the Lionesses' recent success, an exhibition celebrating the history of women in rugby league and encouraging other women to record their own memories of the sport is coming to Warrington this September.

The council and Warrington Wolves Foundation are working in partnership with Common Sense Initiative (CSI) and Rugby League Cares to bring a National Lottery Heritage funded touring exhibition to Warrington.

To celebrate Warrington's role as a host town for the Rugby League World Cup 2021 (RLWC2021), the touring exhibition will stop off in Golden Square to mark the occasion

and celebrate this history.
The National Lottery funded project looks at uncovering, documenting, and celebrating the history of the pioneering sportswomen who challenged traditional male dominance in rugby league, paving the way for thousands of girls and women to play the game young foday.

Thanks to the sportswomen in the exhibition and unprecedented growth in women's rugby league, this year's RLWC women's tournament is set to be bigger and better than ever. The tournament will see eight teams compete over three weeks, and it will be the first time that teams from four different continents will play in the

competition.

The exhibition will launch on Saturday 17 September, with an exciting programme of entertainment in The Old Market Place, Golden Square from 11am till 4pm, which will be hosted by Jenna Brooks, Sky Sports' Rugby League presenter and Sports' Rugby Léague presenter and

will also include some special visitors.

The programme will include interviews and talks from ex-Lionesses, dance and music. The day will be rounded off with an exclusive showing of the award-winning documentary, 'Power Meri' which follows Papua New Guinea's first national women's rugby league team, the PNG Orchids, on their way to competing in the 2017 World Cup in Australia.

The film documents the fascinating journey these inspirational women take from their home towns to the world stage. Power Meri explores how the women playing this male-dominated sport in the public eye for the first time could change mindsets in a country where the status of women is one of the most troubling in the world.

Prior to the exhibition, an intergenerational podcast workshop will take place with young people and former Lionesses to share memories and experiences of the

Cllr Tony Higgins, cabinet member for leisure and community, said: "Thanks to the pioneering sportswomen in this Women in Rugby League exhibition, women's rugby league has gone from strength to strength

to strength.
"Warrington is proud to have a strong rugby league heritage, so it is fitting that this exhibition, which showcases what women have done

for the sport, is coming to the town ahead of the RLWC in October.

Hearing stories and memories from pioneering sportswomen is a fantastic way to see how these people have made the sport what it is today, and contributed to the biggest and best women's RLWC tournament

The exhibition will be open most days from Saturday 17 September to Sunday 25 September from 9.30am - 4.30pm in the Golden Square mall,

Local Plan will bring certainty and investment

Despite the headwinds we all face at the moment, high inflation and the impact it will have on families and awaiting new leadership at Government level, locally we continue to progress those things that are important to the future prosperity of Warrington and its

investment and this is important and scarce in these rapidly changing

A good measure of certainty is the delivery of residential developments within the Town Centre. The apartments on John Street are once again moving towards completion and are proving to be very popular with prospective tenants and the development on the former Spectra site is likely to be accelerated in response to greater than expected demand. Our own housing company is also seeing demand outstrip supply. But these developments do

is also seeing demand outstrip supply. But these developments do not come at any cost and the delivery with a view to carbon reduction and the development of sustainable communities within the Town Centre will be central for new proposals such as the redevelopment of New Town House, which will come to planning next week.

We have the Rugby League World Cup coming soon and I hope you will keep an eye out not only for the games that are at the Halliwell Jones but also the events and parades that are planned for the Town Centre, bringing people to the Town Who wouldn't normally come. I hope it generates the sort of engagement that we have recently seen at Euro 2022, opening up the game to all.

We were obviously shocked to see the removal of equipment from Gravity, in the midst of the summer holidays, when children should be enjoying it the most, but take comfort from Gravity's stated commitment to Warrington and reopening operations of this critical offering within Time Square, which compliments the other food and drink offerings within the square.

Whilst retail within the Town continues to see tough trading conditions, online retail, which has conditions, online retail, which has a large impact on jobs and income within Warrington has surprisingly increased, albeit by a small amount over the Summer, underlining the changing requirements of a town centre. We have secured occupiers for the last remaining restaurant units under the cinema within Time Square and have enhanced our ability to hold enhanced public events here to further reinvigorate the town as it changes its nature. So as always the path to regeneration and inward investment is not always straight or investment is not always straight or fast but in general heading in the right direction.

MP backs Fiddler's Ferry Power Station development

WARRINGTON South MP Andy Carter has given his backing to Peel NRE's redevelopment plans for the former Fiddler's Ferry Power Station site near Penketh.

He described it as "a great brownfield development opportunity for Warrington" during a tour of the

site.

Last month it was announced that Peel NRE, part of regeneration business Peel L&P acquired Fiddler's Ferry Power Station from energy company SSE Thermal.

Since the acquisition, Peel NRE has been engaging with residents and key stakeholders about what this means for the future of the site and welcomed the opportunity to organise a site visit for the local Member of Parliament.

Mr Carter has been a supporter of the regeneration and reuse of the site since his election to parliament and lobbied for its inclusion in the 2021 version of the Warrington Local Plan as a key brownfield development opportunity.

The site is currently proposed for development of around 250-acres for employment use and approximately 1750 sustainable new homes.

developing its plans, but these will include the demolition of the former energy facility and restoration of ash lagoons to make way for the new developments for industrial use, creating high quality jobs and the creation of a new sustainable neighborhood to address local housing needs

neighborhood to address local housing needs.

Mr Carter said: "The redevelopment of Fiddler's Ferry Power Station is something I've long pushed for. It's a great brownfield regeneration opportunity for Warrington and I was pleased to get a run down on plans from the new owners of the site.

These plans have the potential to

These plans have the potential to bring about high quality jobs, an economic boost for the region as well as homes to allow local people to get on the housing ladder. I look forward to seeing the proposals begin to materialise over the coming months."

AFTER a peaceful Teddy Bear's Picnic in Victoria Park opposing the controversial Central 6 low traffic schemes in Westy and Orford, campaigners are already gearing up for their next event at Warrington town hall.

Despite a relatively low turnout, the Teddy Bear's Picnic was hailed the leddy Bear's Picnic was hailed a success by organisers, who are now planning to stage their next protest outside Warrington Borough Council's Cabinet meeting on September 12, when they are hoping most people will be back from holidays – and the weather will certainly be cooler!

The Victoria Park event saw the campaign group introduce their new Super Ted, who took part in a short "skit" performance highlighting the opposition to the low traffic scheme planters!

One of the organisers Rachael Harper said: "It was truly a great

day for democracy. To see families come together to oppose the street plans and have fun while doing it was really something special. didn't have as many people as we'd like show up considering how many people we know oppose the plans, but there were many families there. We put the lower attendance down to numerous factors including quite a few people being on holiday, the traveller presence, the heat, and people not wanting to protest in this particular way.

"Our campaign group has always been about standing up and giving a voice to those who don't feel heard. The voices of families and children are just as important as anybody else's if we want to instil a sense of democracy into the next generation. Of course, a teddy bear's protest picnic isn't for everyone, but my kids and many others absolutely loved it.

"Many will question whether this event was successful if it didn't have a high turnout, but I don't view individual events as win or lose situations. We did what we were hoping to do; giving families a chance to come together and oppose these plans in a less aggressive way than some of our other events. That combined with the great feedback we received plus the children's reactions I think speaks for itself. To me, success would be getting these plans scrapped and the council engaging more people into creating something that actually works for the community. Each event that we organise, and hold is in service of that outcome."

The group would like to hear from anyone interested in the Viking way of life who would like to join the group which meets every Monday evening from 7 pm-9 pm.



Thames Barrier-style solution needed for Sankey Canal water supply crisis

A THAMES barrier-style barrage/weir on the Sankey Canal, above Bewsey Lock, would solve a water supply crisis.

The proposal has been put forward by canal campaigner Jeff Round, of the Sankey Canal Restoration Society (SCARS).

He says the move would ensure there was sufficient water in the canal at Halton and also crease significant flood protection for all towns on the canal – including Warrington and St Helens. Water

levels have water levels nave been maintained in the canal since 1985 by pumping at the Fiddler's Ferry Power Station. But with the plant being decommissioned in March, the pumping ceased causing reduced levels in Halton...

Boats have run aground, fish have had to be rescued and there have also been other impacts on wildlife.

The matter has been discussed in Parliament, with both Warrington South MP Andy Carter and Halton MP Derek Twigg criticising Halton Council.

Halton has allocated £500,000 over five years to deal with the issue.

Mr Round says a barrage/weir above Bewsey Lock would solve the problem. It would have to be similar to the Thames Barrier – having the ability to be lowered to allow flood water to pass through, then being raised towards the end of a flood event to capture water again.

A new sluice at Bewsey Lock would allow water into the lower reaches at times of low flow, as per the original design of the 200-year-old canal, although volunteers have cleared the original sluice and found it to be in good condition and requiring little repair work.

Mr Round said the canal should

be restored along it original length from Blackbrook to Sankey Lock and through to Spike Island using modern remote-controlled valve systems which could, at times of imminent flooding, could lower levels in preparation for the increased water flow.

This significant control of flooding and water supply would easily justify the work and investment required, he

Volunteers from SCARS and other organisations will be working again this weekend to clear the overflow for Bewsey Lock and Mr Round is offering to lead a walk of the area, to explain how the proposals would work.

He said: "We know they would work because they have worked for 200 years."

Warrington is in the top ten in the region for sports access



THE North West has been ranked England's second-best region for sports access – and Warrington is in the Top Ten in the

Sport and fitness experts Runner's Needs has carried out research comparing more than 100 English towns and cities, uncovering each one's sports accessibility score.

The study ranks each town and city by considering the number of local sports facilities and government sports expenditure data and compares this to local physical activity rates, well-being rates and sports expenditure from the past five years.

In total, the North West has 1,492 sports facilities per 100,000 people

more per capita than any other

Manchester has more sports

facilities per capita than any other town or city, with 460 facilities per 100,000 people. But overall, the top performing towns in the region were Burnley, which ranked 9th in England and Blackburn, which ranked 11.

When a stroke happens then speed is essential

We are all aware of Face Arms Speech Telephone 999, FAST, which indicates the urgency of receiving treatment fast.

What you may not be aware of, however, is that one crucial treatment is a **thrombectomy**, which can greatly reduce the chance of death or permanent disability by removing a blood clot from a vein or artery.

Unfortunately, this treatment is currently not available 24/7, treatment very much depending on being in the right place at the right time. In fact, in 2021 only 2.8% of people who suffered a stroke were lucky enough to receive a thrombectomy. A pledge by the NHS to increase this to 10% by 2022 has been missed due to lack of funds.

Margaret's husband, Phil Black, was one of those lucky ones. In gratitude, Margaret is raising funds to try and get that pledge achieved. WatkinsonBlack and Northwich Art Shop are pleased to support her in that mission.
