Finally, as displayed on the opposite page Warrington has now got its own special edition of MONOPOLY.


This has been one of my favourite


The Mayor of Warrington, Cllr Jean Flaherty, said: "It's exciting to see what has been included



The Warrington Business Conference is firmly established as the largest networking opportunity in the town and complements Warrington & Co's other flagship events – the Annual Property Review and Apprenticeships & Jobs

Time square continues to attract good quality operators and with the completion of leases for Revolutions and Yum Cha and the opening of Parlour Bar in October. These will complement the opening of the University of Chester for the new academic year which happened in September and will really start to bring the scheme to life.

Council becomes first in UK to produce all its own electricity

WARRINGTON Borough Council has become the first local authority in the UK to produce all its own electricity with the completion and hand-over of an advanced hybrid solar-battery farm.

The facility, built by GRIDSERVE, is on an 88-acre site at Cirencester equivalent to more than 50 football pitches and is the council's third solar farm.

It is the first DC-coupled solar farm of this size in the UK and the most advanced to be completed in the country since GRIDSERVE's York project in December 2019.

The project continues the nationwide expansion of subsidyfree renewable power, to meet the UK's net zero-carbon energy commitments.

Cirencester Hybrid Solar Farm uses battery storage and sophisticated technologies to maximise revenue and help balance the grid - both during the day with direct solar generation

and at night with energy stored in the 51 MWh battery. The 23 MWp solar farm includes more than 43,000 bifacial solar panels on trackers, co-located with 51 MWh of DC-coupled energy storage. This is one of the world's most technically advanced solar farms, which has achieved a significant design feat to avoid multiple conversion processes, increase efficiency, and help increase efficiency, and help balance the grid. The site will produce enough energy to drive over 88 million miles 1 every year in modern electric vehicles, or put another way, will produce enough energy to drive more than a hundred thousand electric cars

from Land's End to John o' Groats. It demonstrates how local demonstrates how authorities partner can

GRIDSERVE to deliver projects which cut carbon, supply zero-carbon clean electricity, and fund essential council services.


Electricity from Cirencester will be used to help provide net zero energy for Warrington's fleet of all-electric buses, coming next year, while the hybrid solar farm in York - handed over in December 2019 - is providing energy which can be sold into the grid.

A third site in Hull is supplying all the council's net zero energy needs, making Warrington Council the first local authority in the UK to produce all of its own electricity.

GRIDSERVE will operate and maintain all three solar farms during their lifetimes to maximise system performance and value for the council.

A LEADING video game developer has spoken about the importance of a partnership with Warrington's Priestley College that gives students a chance to break into the billion-dollar industry.

Arthur Parsons, Design Director at 10:10 Games in Warrington, said the internship programme linked to Priestley's Computer Game Design course was creating apportunities.

course was creating opportunities.

"I was blown away by the quality of work at Priestley and there really wasn't much difference between what was being produced there and third years leaving university," he said. That made me question why would the students that are really pushing the quality bar go to university. Surely there's got to be a way of getting those students into industry and the internships are a way of doing that."

Harry Foster, who studied Computer Game Design at Priestley, has been made a Junior Associate Designer. The 18-year-old has been working with the rest of the team at their offices on Centre Park Square on a game featuring Funko characters.

"I made my first game when I was eight. I was proud of it at the time, but it was just a cube that jumped from platform to platform," said Harry, a former Culcheth High pupil.

"My parents used to tell me to get off my computer because I was on it all the time, but now I am getting paid for it and I am doing something love."

Harry was introduced to Arthur by his college tutor during a WA Games

event. He successfully applied for an internship with the company – an opportunity made available to students taking the vocational course at Priestley College. "Harry is far more mature than his

"Harry is far more mature than his 18 years, which is important because he is working alongside people who have been in the industry over two decades." said Arthur.

Josh Campher and Ian Slonker,
who teach the course at Priestley,
said their goal was to continue giving
students the skills they needed to
make an impression on the industry.

The course covers everything from Al to level design and character modelling.

Hero Dads hit million pound target for suicide prevention charity

THREE dads who set out to achieve something positive following the deaths of their daughters have now raised more than $\mathfrak L1$ million for Warrington based national suicide prevention charity PAPYRUS.

The 3 Dads Walking, who recently finished a second trek across the UK, passing through Warrington, where they met local campaigner Adrian Derbyshire, who look his own 14 campaigner. who lost his own 16-year-old daughter Julia, seven years ago, say they have been completely overwhelmed by public kindness and generosity.

Andy Airey from Cumbria, Mike Palmer from Sale, Cheshire and Tim Owen from Norfolk had originally set out to raise around

£3,000 each.

Their current total raised for PAPYRUS Prevention of Young Suicide stands at over £1,004,709.

The fathers dedicated two fundraising walks to their beloved daughters who were lost to suicide; 17-year-old Beth Palmer, 19-year-

old Emily Owen and Sophie Airey who was aged 29.
Ged Flynn, chief executive of PAPYRUS, said: "The 3 Dads Walking have captured the nation's hearts. In these days of financial transfer to the second of the said uncertainty, people have dug deep to support them in their efforts to raise much-needed funding for our charity.

"Together with the 3 Dads Walking, they have refused to

see young suicide as inevitable. Together they have shared real passion for our young people and given them new hope. Together they have helped to save young

Bereaved father Mike Palmer said: "We set out hoping to raise a few thousand pounds each. We then raised our target as the generous donations came in. All we can say is that we have been completely overwhelmed by public kindness and generosity.

"Thank you to every single person who has supported us and continues to support us."

In addition to raising money and awareness, the 3 Dads Walking want to see children and young people taught life-skills in the classroom.

Their online petition to have suicide prevention included on the school curriculum has collected more than 126,000 signatures, which should prompt a debate in the House of Commons.

Andy Airey said: "In 2021 we walked 300-miles between our homes and in 2022 we walked twice that distance, 600-miles between the parliaments of all four nations, from Northern Ireland

through Scotland, England and

Wales.
"It was a long journey but worth every single step. What could be more important than the wellbeing of our children and saving young

Tim Owen said: "We need to do something positive in their memory and hopefully that's what we're doing. I'm not saying we've done it because we're still doing it, and

we'll keep on going until it's done."
Hollywood actors Daniel Craig
and Nicole Kidman each donated
£10,000 to the 3 Dads during their walk last year, as did soccer legend Lou Macari who lost his son

Young biologists' inspirational African adventure

YOUNG biologists studying at Warrington's Priestley College have experienced an inspirational visit to some of the most ecologically diverse parts of the world.

Priestley took 20 students to Ecuador where they worked with conservationists and veterinarians to rehabilitate animals while a party of 13 travelled to Eswatini to learn about local culture, tracking animals and identifying species.
"It was the most incredible,

eye-opening experience I have ever been a part of," said former Penketh High pupil Sophie Weston, who spent her time in Ecuador.

Each trip was on location for nearly two weeks carrying out research, working with animals and absorbing local culture.

In Ecuador, the students spent a week at YanaCocha Animal Rescue Centre where they trained and fed animals and worked with

and fed animals and worked with conservationists.
Their second week was spent

at an ecological reserve in Tamandua where the focus was on conservation techniques and working with local tribes.

Among the highlights was a jungle hike to visit waterfalls and

seeing a collection of weird and wonderful animals along the way. In Eswatini students learned about local culture, how to track animals and identify species while in their second week at the Mbuluzi game reserve they found out how to set Sherman traps for rodents

that were later studied by scientists.

Among those collecting data on this trip was Reece Delamere, who also studies Environmental Science alongside Geography at Priestley College.

He said the experience had confirmed he would like to work in conservation after university.

"I always thought it was marine conservation that I was interested in, but now I am going to keep my options open," said the former Penketh High pupil.

The trips were organised by biology tutor Louise Naidu who said the experience had enriched the lives of those who took part and given them invaluable entries for their university applications and

CVs.

She has now secured funding which will allow the trip to go ahead again next year, creating more opportunities for another cohort of aspiring biologists.

"The feedback we've had is that

"The feedback we've had is that this was a life-changing moment for many of those who took part and that is what college is all about,"

she said.
"This is something they will never forget and I have no doubt that many of these students are the conservationists and ecologists of the future.







Council to implement changes to Westy Low Traffic scheme following public feedback

FOLLOWING public feedback Warrington Borough Council is making some changes to the experimental Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN) scheme in the Westy area of Latchford.

When the Westy Low Traffic Neighbourhood scheme went live in June 2022, introducing a series of temporary wooden planters as modal filters, which restrict vehicular traffic from accessing particular streets, it caused a storm of protest from local residents, many saying they hadn't been consulted.

The scheme was aimed at reducing traffic, preventing drivers from using residential streets for 'rat running', improving air quality and creating a safer environment for pedestrians and cyclists.

As part of the trial, the council committed to listen to the views of local people, to understand levels of support, and whether residents have any comments about specific locations or aspects of the scheme.

locations or aspects of the scheme.

An interim survey was undertaken from 18 July – 11 September 2022 to gather public feedback on the scheme, receiving 986 responses.

A review of this feedback has now been completed, and has – along with monitoring information collected on traffic patterns and impacts – identified a number of issues, including:

Some increases in access traffic and increased speeds on

traffic and increased speeds on residential streets such as Lindley Avenue and Broadbent Avenue.

 Challenges accessing homes in the Griffiths Street and Reynolds Street areas.

 Difficulties operating the lockable bollard on Reynolds Street to provide access for school coach

trips.
• Planters appearing overgrown and untidy.

To address these concerns and issues, the council will be making a number of changes to the scheme. These are:

• The removal of the planters at the north end of Griffiths Street. This will allow greater access options to homes in this area.

• Removing the bollard on Reynolds Street, and extending the

eastbound one-way from Davies Avenue to the planters at Tinsley Street. This will improve access to Reynolds Street, relieve pressure on

Longdin Street and allow coaches to pick up from schools unhindered.

Restoring Broadbent Avenue to two-way traffic, between Griffiths Street and Davies Avenue.

In addition, there will be an increase in the maintenance of the planters that remain in place during the trial.

The changes will be made to the LTN in the first week of November.

A letter is being sent to all Westy residents, and details of the changes are also being published on the council's website and social media channels.

Monitoring of the impacts of the

revised scheme will continue, with a full monitoring and evaluation report publicly available at the completion of the trial.

A new public survey will go live in early 2023 to help the council understand how the revised scheme is working. The feedback received will inform any future decision as to whether the scheme is made permanent or not. This decision is expected to be made in six months'

A survey by Warrington South MP Andy Carter had also revealed the vast majority of residents were opposed to the low traffic schemes.

They were close friends with a common philosophy of "better together."

The project was discussed and approved by both congregations.

Final service at the church will be on Sunday, November 13 at 9.30am and all members of the congregation are welcome.

The church building is of modern design and was built to serve a growing population in the area as a result of the Warrington New Town, during the late 1960s. It is rectangular in plan, built of buff-coloured brick with a pitched and slated roof brought down onto metal columns.

Its future has yet to be decided.

This was reported as being due to a lack of recognition of symptoms from both women and healthcare professionals, with some written submissions noting that symptoms of the menopause can be confused with other conditions, such as women sometimes being prescribed antidepressants rather than menopause treatments.

Work starts on new "football hub" at high school

WORK has started on a new 3G pitch at Warrington's Cardinal Newman High School, to replace the existing artificial grass pitch which has been out of operation for a number of years.

The new pitch will help create a new football hub for students, local sports clubs and the wider community.

The plan to improve the site as a new Football Hub is a key project within Warrington's Central 6 Regeneration Masterplan delivery plan, which covers a wide range of project areas from parks, sport and leisure, to housing, air quality and employment

employment.

The Cardinal Newman project supports a key Central 6 Masterplan objective of giving young people and the wider community increased opportunities to participate in positive activities. It also responds to a priority raised by the community during the masterplan consultation, to improve access to high-quality sports pitches and facilities.

Contractors are now on-site at the school, to carry out the replacement of the existing artificial turf with a new, state-of-the-art 3G pitch. This follows refurbishment works to the sports hall flooring recently completed to enhance the Futsal facilities held at the site.

The new pitch will consist of an artificial grass (3G) surface with floodlights, security fencing, CCTV, controlled gates, and space for spectators. The pitch will be marked to cater for 11-a-side, 9-a-side, 7-a-side and 5-a-side football.

It will help create a strategic football hub at the school, with school students, the community and local clubs benefitting from the new pitch

as well as increased opportunities to enjoy Futsal in the school sports hall. Cardinal Newman headteacher,

Cardinal Newman headteacher, Jo Langstaff, joined council members, staff and contractors on site to celebrate the start of work

staff and contractors on site to celebrate the start of work.

Jo said: "We have a proud sporting tradition at Cardinal Newman, but we have been without a 3G pitch for a very long time. We are really grateful for the support of Warrington Borough Council and the Football Foundation in helping us to realise our ambition of having the excellent sporting facilities which our students and our local community deserve. The students can't wait for the pitch to open."

Designed with equality and diversity in mind, the new facility will enhance the provision of accessible sports space within the high school and provide new football opportunities for people of all ages and abilities.

and abilities.

School students will use the site for curriculum PE and after-school participation between 9am and 5pm. It will be available for community use from 5pm-10pm on weekdays and between 9am and 8pm on weekends. Livewire will manage the site during the hours of community use.

the hours of community use.

The project also forms part of the Council's Playing Pitch Strategy (PPS), refreshed in January 2020, which incorporates the Local Football Facilities Plan, produced by the Football Foundation and Football Association to support local

authorities in identifying current and future facility needs.

The £1.2m scheme is being supported through a successful grant application of £589,000 from the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation,

with the remainder of the funding coming through the Warrington Town Deal, Warrington Borough Council and Cardinal Newman High School.

Work is expected to be completed in February.

The largest mini-budget U-Turn for 50 years

They say that a week is a long time in politics. As I write this it is just over 3 weeks since Liz Truss and her then Chancellor delivered their mini budget, and the provisions contained therein were the subject of last months article. This month we will amend that article to reflect what has happened to the various measures included.

Firstly, the increase in **National** Insurance Rates from 12% to 13.25% which took effect on 6th July will be reversed from 6th November. Similarly, the increases in National Insurance paid by employers and by the self-employed will also be reversed. This will benefit anyone earning over about £1,000 per month from employment or self-employment but will self-employment, but will not benefit anyone whose income is primarily pension or investment income. This is one of the two major changes that, as we write, have been retained and will go ahead as from this month. However, the equivalent cancellation of the increase in dividend tax has been cancelled, meaning that this increase for the current tax year from the previous 7% to 8.25% will take effect.

Secondly, the reduction in the Standard Rate of Income Tax from 20% to 19%, originally planned for April 2024, was to be brought forward to 6th April 2023. Not only has this accelerated timeframe been cancelled, but the reduction in the basic rate has been cancelled for the foreseeable

Thirdly, whilst the Higher Rate of Income Tax remains at 40%, the Chancellor announced that the Additional Rate of Income Tax, which is currently 45% on taxable income over £150,000, would be scrapped from April 2023. This planned reduction has been scrapped, meaning that those high earners will not make the average £10,000 saving on income tax.

Fourthly, the previously announced increase in the Rate of Corporation Tax to 25% in 2023 has to have been scrapped, the rate remaining at its current level of 19%. **This** reversal of policy has now been reversed, and Corporation Tax will increase to 25% next April as originally planned.

Fifthly, the Chancellor announced a reduction in Stamp Duty on Property Purchases, the full details being included in last months article. This is the second of the major changes announced three weeks ago that has been

Sixthly, the planned increase

next February in duty rates on beer, wine, cider and spirits was to have been cancelled. This planned increase will now go ahead, resulting in the price of a pint of beer increasing by 7p a pint, and a bottle of spirits by £1.35.

The above are the main provisions affecting the average "man in the street". There are, however, a number of other announcements.

The most publicised change is that the current limit on **bankers bonuses** will be scrapped. Following the financial crash in 2008, bankers bonuses were limited to double their annual salary (lucky bankers). They are now even luckier, as their bonuses will once more be unlimited. This easing in regulation has been retained.

At the same time there was to be a **Crackdown on Working Benefit Claimants**, and this crackdown has been and this crackdown has been retained. Currently. If you are on Universal Credit then you need to "actively seek" work. However, a "light touch" is currently applied to this requirement once you work for 9 hours a week on the National Minimum Wage. This will increase to 12 hours a week immediately, and to 15 hours a week from next January, a week from next January, resulting in potentially more

benefits being sanctioned.

We understand that "Investment Zones", which will enjoy the substantial tax advantages spelled out last month, will continue, and in fact applications have now closed. However, many of the councils that have applied have since expressed doubts about whether they will see the light of day.

Finally, some lucky news, for us at least! Last month we failed to mention the planned changes to the IR35 legislation that were included and intended to ease the burden on contractors and those companies who make use of them. Lucky for us because, unsurprisingly, that easing in the legislative burden has now




