Campaign to save the Raven Inn reaching critical stage!

AFTER nearly four years, the fight to save the Raven Inn at Glazebury, will reach a critical stage towards the end of November.

After years of campaigning the Raven was purchased by two local families in March, in order to save it from demolition. Since then, volunteers have been hard at work clearing and stripping out the pub.

Work is close to being completed in repairing and strengthening the roof, along with structural work in the pub.

In addition, a Georgian fireplace has been recreated and the old chimney opened up, in order to house a double-sided wood burner.

The point has now been reached where full renovation can begin.

To that end, the management committee, which will be responsible for overseeing the Raven, launched a community shares offer in October, which has so far raised more than £120,000. That offer is due to conclude on the 28th November.

Spokesperson Peter Sturman commented: "This really is crunch time for the Raven. Our community has swept us along to the point where securing the long term future of the Raven is within our grasp. "We need to raise an optimum

amount of £243,000 in order to renovate and set up the Raven.

"We are doing this by a tried and trusted method of asking our community to buy 'community shares' in the enterprise.

"We have made a very good start, raising over £100,000 in the first four days. It is vitally important that we get it over the line. We cannot come so far to then fall at the last hurdle.

"Having achieved what we have, since January 2019, this is now about securing the long term future of the Raven.

"We ask everyone to seriously consider investing in the future of the Raven. To actually become part of the history of the Raven.

There are benefits too.

If you become a shareholder you stand to get at least 30% tax relief on your investment. You also become a member of the cooperative running the Raven – you can have your say in the Raven's future. If you invest £500 or more, you will receive 10% discount on drinks and food, at the Raven.

Peter added: "We have said before, "let's get the job done."

"Come on everybody. Just a small investment from a lot of people will play such a big part in our continuing history and heritage."

Where is the "secret vineyard" near Culcheth?

WHERE is the "secret vineyard" only three miles from Culcheth?

That's the question members of Culcheth Wine Circle were asking when they gathered to meet wine expert Jordan Kehoe – and taste a few wines.

The meeting was organised jointly by Culcheth Wine Circle and the Rotary Club. Although primarily a social occasion, more than £250 was raised to support local charities and deserving causes.

Jordan Kehoe gave an informative and interesting presentation, describing how to recognise the particular merits of five different wines and providing a generous glass of each to taste.

The wines he brought came from different parts of the world, Australia, Spain, France and he described how quality wines are now beginning to be produced in less well-known areas.

He illustrated this by presenting two wines from Romania which were well-liked.

The wine club – which dates from the 1950s and was originally called the Daten Wine Circle – has around 60 members.

In its early years they made their own wine to take to the club for others to try and offer an opinion. More recently it meets at Culcheth

Village Club and members present wines they have discovered on their travels.

Wine experts are on occasions invited to present their favourite wines.

Recently members have learned of a "secret vineyard" only three miles from Culcheth and this is something they would very much like to find the location of.



Chelsea is the jazz "breakthrough act of the year"



FORMER Culcheth High School pupil Chelsea Carmichael has won the title "Breakthrough Act of the Year" in the annual Jazz FM Awards.

Tenor saxophonist Chelsea Carmichael picked up the award at a star-studded presentation night in London.

Big name artists who also appeared in the awards list included Jools Holland (Impact Award) and singer Norma Winstone (Lifetime Achievement Award).

Chelsea was brought up in Culcheth and originally aspired to play the violin. But she eventually developed a taste for jazz and persuaded her dad, Winston, to buy her a saxophone. The rest is history.

After playing in the Culcheth High School Big Band and the Wigan Youth Jazz Orchestra, Chelsea moved to London where she is now well-known on the jazz circuit.

She currently plays in a number of groups, including the popular Outlooks Orchestra and her own Chelsea Carmichael Ensemble, which sold-out Ronnie Scott's Club with their tribute to John Coltrane's "Giant Steps" album on its 60th anniversary.

Steering group aims to restore the jewel in Culcheth's crown

A NEW steering group has taken over management of Culcheth Sports Club with the avowed intention of restoring to its former glory as "the jewel in Culcheth's crown."

In less than a month since a community meeting at the Charnock Road club on September 26, the team of enthusiastic volunteers has created a detailed project plan, based on community demand.

Chairman Gary Monaghan said: "We have received great support from the community. There was a huge attendance at our community meeting and everyone agreed that we had to do something to ensure the club keeps going, now and in the future.

"We are now optimistic that the club has a great future. Our bank balance is rising and people and organisations are coming back to the club."

The club – formerly known as The Daten Club – suffered badly as a result of having to close because of COVID. At one stage it was given no better than a 50-50 chance of surviving.

But now, thanks to the efforts of the steering committee and other volunteers, the future looks bright.

The car park has been re-marked and potholes have been filled, the club's main office has been moved to the front of the building, a health and safety inspection has been carried out to ensure compliance, exterior lighting has been repaired,

defibrillators have been installed, outside areas have been tidied up, a database of volunteers created and a financial plan drawn up.

Free keep-fit and dance sessions have also started.

A pool team has been launched, a darts area created and a regular series of quiz nights started. Family events have re-started, including a Halloween event which sold-out in 36 hours. There are also regular dance classes.

But more is to come – hopefully within the next six months.

The steering group is to work with the Ukrainian Hub to make a café area which will be open and accessible daily. The car park will be enlarged, the main hall will be renovated for multi-sport use as well as an event space. A catering service is to be launched for in-house events. Funding will be secured to improve toilet accommodation.

A greater variety of sports will be encouraged, regular events for all age-groups started. Long-term strategic partnerships are planned with local businesses.

In the longer term, a children's play area, youth zone, affordable gym and a multi-sport barn are planned.



Steering committee member Alex Lee said: "We would like to say a huge thank you to the community for their feedback and support so far. The steering group, with the help of Culcheth Sports Club staff and some fantastic volunteers have been working hard to make changes and we hope people are

beginning to see them."

Mr Monaghan added: "I think we have achieved a great deal in a very short time. We know there is a lot more to do – but I am sure we can revive the club. Culcheth is very lucky to have such a facility – it really can be the jewel in the village's crown."

Now the winter rains have arrived remember to ensure better drainage in your pots and containers.

Plant Area Specialist

- There are a surprising number of plants that perform well over the winter period, often they are well scented - examples include Sarcococca, Hamamelis and Mahonia
- Areas of the border, that are currently empty, can be dug over and enriched with blended manure for next year's planting
- Cut down any herbaceous plants that have finished flowering and that do not have a strong winter structure. Weed and fork gently between them



Freedom Fibre's lightning-fast, full-fibre broadband network is now available in Culcheth, Croft, Winwick, and Glazebury!

In the borough of Warrington, Culcheth and the surrounding villages were the first locations to benefit from the rollout of Freedom Fibre's lightning-fast broadband network. Now, approximately 5,000 households have access to broadband speeds of up to 900Mb/s through Freedom Fibre's partnership with the UK's third largest internet service provider, TalkTalk.

Freedom Fibre has been working tirelessly to convert the existing copper network to full fibre, actively working towards the UK government's target of having Gigabit broadband available nationwide by 2030. Many providers in the sector tend to build networks in larger, more densely populated areas. However, Freedom Fibre believes wholeheartedly in its mission to make high-speed broadband available to everyone, no matter how rural the location. Speaking on the build progress in across the North West, Tony Moore, Chief Delivery Officer commented,

In comparison, full-fibre networks (FTTP) cut out copper and use fibreoptic technology that is delivered straight into your home or business, providing reliability and unrivalled speed. With many areas in the UK still using copper, even via standard fibre (FTTC) networks, it is important that these are replaced with full-fibre technology that will futureproof homes and businesses when copper is phased out in the near future.

Already, Freedom Fibre has had positive feedback from Culcheth locals, with one resident, Mrs. Thompson, saying, "I welcomed the news that Freedom Fibre was connecting

properties to fibre in Culcheth as I needed the security of a fast and reliable broadband connection to enable me to work effectively from home. The team from Freedom Fibre were very professional and helpful, even calling back after a few days to check if everything was working well".

Local Issues

There are several local issues being planned or carried out by the Parish Council some of which will be completed before this Magazine has been circulated.

1. Kick rails and an entrance gate will be installed around the Car Park at the CYAC building to prevent illegal parking/encampment.
2. The Play Equipment and Benches in the Play area will be painted.
3. A review will be taken of all other existing Benches throughout the Village to identify where repairs are needed to be repaired, repainted, and replaced if needed.
4. A Bench in Remembrance of Queen Elizabeth II will be installed on the path outside the Bowling Green.
5. The Borough Council will carry out a traffic and speed survey throughout the village and report back to the Parish Council. In the meantime the PC are looking to upgrade the Speed Display Signs on Heath Lane and outside Croft Primary School. We are also looking at the possibility of installing Display signs on Kenyon Lane.
6. We hope to plant seven trees possibly on the playing field border in remembrance of Queen Elizabeth II with special reference to her Platinum Jubilee.
7. Work will continue to complete the repairs on the Public Toilet Block.

A big thanks goes to everyone involved especially the Croft Carnival Committee for helping to bring back this annual event which we hope will continue for many years to come.

AFTER two years of postponements due to COVID the Culcheth Walking Football Group managed to resurrect its 2020 tournament, which was due on the 21st of March of that year, when the first lockdown started.

This year, some of the same teams plus new ones, gathered for a day of football and fun at Culcheth High School. In all, 19 teams participated, four of which were from Culcheth (the Walkers, the Strollers, the Amblers and the Wanderers), six others from the Warrington area and the rest from around the North West and North Wales.
