Bold plan continues to revive landmark building in town centre

A hive of activity is continuing to revitalise a landmark retail building in Warrington town centre, with a further planning application put to borough council planners.

The scheme, submitted by NMT Entertainment Ltd, involves another part of the former Co-op store in Sankey Street – more recently occupied by TJ Hughes.

Although not Listed, the building

Although not Listed, the building is considered important in the history of the town centre as it was formerly the flagship store of the former Warrington Co-operative Society.

The applicants say the proposal is part of an ambitious project to revive and regenerate the building in a prominent central location, with an adjoining part of the building already being transformed into The Hive shopping mall – with anchor store, Black Sheep Coffee due to open in the new year.

open in the new year.

It is anticipated that the ground floor of the building, most recently used as a supermarket, would be mostly occupied by retail shops in a vibrant "arcade style" format, with scope for food and drink outlets. Sport, recreational and fitness uses would be mainly at the lower, basement, level.

basement, level.

New shops are proposed along
Sankey Street but the building would
be serviced from the rear, off Egypt
Street.

The applicants state: "The proposal will enliven the frontages of the property, generate significant employment opportunities, add to

pedestrian foot fall and positively contribute to the attractiveness and vitality of the town centre.

"For the same reasons, the proposal would enhance the character and appearance of the Bridge Street Conservation Area, within which the site falls."

Conversion of the upper part of the building is not part of the application, but in the longer term, the aim is to bring forward the second floor with separate access from Cairo Street.

"The assembly hall on the second

"The assembly hall on the second floor will be retained as existing and its future will be considered as part of a future proposal."


The applicants point out that the property shows signs of deterioration, inside and outside, and its "run down" appearance is pronounced when viewed from Sankey Street.

"The main features of architectural interest are now largely confined to the second storey, which include Portland stone dressings, cupola type towers at each corner and large pedimented round arched windows. This ornate detailing and the elaborate fenestration give the upper part of the application building a distinguished presence in the local townscape."

Borough planning officers are now studying the proposals.

New version of the 12 Days of Christmas

Before putting pen to paper this month, I had a look back at the piece I wrote just before last Christmas. I am not sure if that was a good idea or a bad idea.

The changes in 12 months have been remarkable driven by both been remarkable driven by both international events and home grown ones and I can't help feeling that there is a new version of the 12 days of Christmas to be had here...... 4 new chancellors, 3 new deputies, 2 New Prime and Prince Charles, now as King. Hopefully you can do better so answers on a post card in the usual manner.

usual manner.

The focus this time last year was on COP 26 and the opportunities a low carbon economy could bring, which

are absolutely still valid, even more so, given that it is one year later, but the backdrop for COP 27 has changed – and then some. However, the optimist in me focuses on the potential accelerating effect that a drive for energy security may have on the carbon agenda of, be it windsolars, nuclear, or more importantly on the carbon agenda of, be it wind, solar, nuclear or more importantly efficiency in the use of energy either in the fabric of our buildings and our transport. The realist in me thinks that although this may be where we get to ultimately the path may be a little

less straightforward, as the drive for energy security also comes with the templation to return to fossil fuels, however a short term measure that

may be.

At the time of writing the Chancellor has just finished his Autumn Statement. As always the devil will be in the detail, but it is good to see from Warrington's perspective to see from Warrington's perspective that Northern Powerhouse Rail is still very much on the agenda as we have great potential to deliver long term economic growth and development to Warrington if we take good advantage of this major project. Likewise, I am hopeful that the promise to act on energy efficiency will be followed through to action on the ground. Whilst this is being touted as a new initiative, it is not

touted as a new initiative, it is not. The recently completed Green Homes The recently completed Green Homes Grant programme is a case in point. It was a government led programme to fit double glazing, insulation, solar panels and new boilers to the least energy efficient properties. Cheshire & Warrington was able to fit some of these energy efficiency measures to about 550 homes, making them warmer, more habitable and less expensive to run. Across the NW the total was closer to 5,000. This brought a double benefit to those least capable of dealing with significant household fuel bills.

What's 550 homes in Warrington,

against the near 100,000 households that we currently have? It's a start, on the worst performing end of the scale and a proof that centrally funded programmes can work.

Anyway, something to get our teeth into next year and we must not forget that it is Christmas and I am hoping that the newly minted bars and restaurants in Time Square will be able to tempt some of you out to celebrate. I was thinking of stating that we might get back to normal after Covid and the rest, but it seems that we are not quite there yet.

Care company placed in special measures now ranked "Good"

A Warrington-based care company rated inadequate and placed in special measures due to multiple

rated inadequate and placed in special measures due to multiple breaches of care, has now been rated "Good" by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

The transformation followed a rebrand from Krinvest Supported Living to Balance Care at the premises on Marsh House Lane and the appointment of a new operations director, Rav Sekhon.

In 2018 Krinvest Supported Living received the "Inadequate' rating with the CQC and was under 'Special Measures' due to multiple legal breaches of care and was in danger of being closed down. Link to CQC page here: www.cqc.org.uk/location/1-3234237488/reports

Commenting on the transformation, Rav said: "I joined in April 2018, just after the report had been shared, and began with addressing the issues raised. It took a huge team effort to do so, the CQC returned 6 months later in September and needed to see clear evidence of change to prevent the service from being shut down. Thankfully, we were able to evidence significant change to the service, and received an updated rating of 'Requires Improvement. Although this was the first Requires Improvement rating I had received in my career

(all other ratings were 'Good'), it is

the rating I am most proud of. "In March 2019, 6 months later, we rebranded as Balance Care. We wanted to create something new and

we rebranded as Balance Care. We wanted to create something new and move away from the old (negative) reputation. Days later, the pandemic then hit, and like all care providers, we battled through to keep people safe and well. There were some close calls, and at points, we did worry about losing people we cared for, but with god's grace we did not.

"In July 2022, the CQC finally came out to inspect Balance Care — I think they had been busy with managing the pandemic, as they paused all routine inspections for a 2 year period. This inspection went very well, we achieved a 'Good' rating and an absolutely flawless report. Link: https://www.cqc.org.uk/location/1-6953631142

"We did it! Four years later – from the risk of being shut down by the CQC to achieving a 'Good' rating with zero errors noted. It was a dedicated team effort and is evidence of what we can achieve when we

dealcated team error and is evidence of what we can achieve when we commit ourselves and truly care about the work being completed.

"From here, we will continue to build, and hopefully one day have the opportunity to become 'Outstanding,' added Rav.



'grow out of them'. Women also told us about speaking to doctors on multiple occasions over many months or years before receiving a diagnosis for conditions such as endometriosis.



In the Chancellor's own words, an "Eye-Watering" Autumn Statement

Hopefully, after the Autumn Statement, the government will now have settled down on what our future taxes and benefits will be. Much of what the Chancellor announced had already been briefed, so what are the main provisions:

Firstly, the main provisions in respect of **Income Tax** are as follows:

- The Personal Allowances remain frozen next year, and for future years until April 2028, at £12,570. By law, allowances increase in line with inflation unless the government takes action to stop them. Since April 2019 the allowance has only increased by a total of £70 from £12,500 in 2018/19. Had the government not taken the decision to freeze them in all but one year since, the allowance would be approximately £14,520 in the current year, increasing to approximately £15,970 next year. At the basic rate of 20% this means that a basic rate taxpayer will be paying over £13 per week more in tax next year than they would have been paying had allowances been allowed to increase by their default amount.
- The **Basic Rate Band** will remain at £37,700. The **Higher Rate Band**, however,

will be reduced by £25,000 resulting in the **Additional Rate** becoming payable next year at a total income of £125,000 rather than £150,000 at present. This reduction will result in someone earning £150,000 paying additional tax of £24 per week.

- Similarly, the **National Insurance Bands** will be frozen until 2028.
- However, the tax free **Dividend Allowance** will be reduced from the current level of £2,000 to £1,000 in April 2023 and £500 in April 2024.
- All Income Tax Rates and National Insurance Rates will be frozen at the current rates for next year.

Taking all of the above into account, the Chancellor said that someone fortunate enough to earn £150,000 per annum will be paying just over £1,000 per month more in tax and national insurance.

Secondly, the Capital Gains Tax Allowance, £12.300, will be halved to £6,000 from April 2023, and further reduced to £3,000 in April 2024. The Capital Gains Tax Rates remain frozen at current rates. These are 10% for basic rate taxpayers and 20% for higher

rate taxpayers for assets except residential property. The rates on gains from the transfer of residential properties are 18% and 28% respectively. Business Asset Disposal Relief remains unchanged.

Thirdly, the Inheritance Tax Allowance will be frozen at the current level of £325,000 until April 2028. The rate on Inheritance Tax charged on the value of estates above this level remains at 40%.

Fourthly, the turnover above which a business must register for **Value Added Tax** will be frozen at the current level of £85,000 per annum until April 2026. With inflation at 10.1% this is effectively a decrease in the registration threshold in excess of £8,000 meaning that many more SME's will be dragged into VAT.

There were a number of other announcements made including a reduction in tax relief on Research and Development expenditure. However, no announcement was made concerning the rate of **Corporation Tax**, meaning that the increase in April 2023 from 19% to 25% for businesses with taxable profits in excess of £250,000 will be implemented. Businesses with taxable profits below £50,000 will remain at 19%, with marginal relief being

applicable for profits between £50,000 and £250,000.

Finally, there were a number of non-tax announcements made, including:

- The pension triple-lock being maintained, resulting in the basic state retirement pension increasing by 10.1% to £10,600.
- Similarly, other state benefits will increase by 10.1%. However, additional resources will be made available to counter fraud, and to provide training and coaching to improve claimants earning capabilities.
- Continuing help to households to meet energy costs, additional cost of living payments for pensioners and people on benefits.
- An increase in the hourly minimum wage of 9.7% in April 2023 from £9.50 at present to £10.42 per hour.

The Chancellor himself said that his Autumn Statement would be "eye-watering". It has proven to be so!


