

The debate is now about how much affordable housing can be brought forward viably on a site rather than if and how those developments can bring forward sustainable communities rather than just houses. This is a reason to be optimistic about the future of Warrington's

We have more residential developments on site ready to deliver housing this year and I hope that we start to see the greater vibrancy in the town centre as a result of this. The Local Plan will also help this process and deliver certainty of housing delivery both within the Town Centre and more broadly across the Borough. It is a long process but essential.

broadly across the Borough. It is a long process but essential. Against this optimistic view I have to set the increased cost of living and the increased cost of bringing forward development. And here the dents get larger. I don't think we can continue with what are seen as traditional forms of home ownership, where the conflicting pressures on one person or a family prove too great to contemplate home ownership and so different ways to own your own home, if that is the desire, need to be considered on a far more flexible basis, perhaps supported



## **Royal appointment for fashion designer**

WHEN talented fashion designer Isabelle Pennington-Edmead embarked on her career she could hardly have believed it would lead to an audience with Royalty.

However, that's exactly what happened as the former Priestley College student from Stretton, met Prince Charles just weeks before he became King. Their two meetings took place

at Dumfries House to discuss a new womenswear collection she had been involved with that was designed in London and Milan, but manufactured in Scotland at The Prince's Foundation headquarters.

"He said he was very proud of what we were doing and seemed interested by the design process," said Isabellé

"I was really nervous to meet him and address him correctly, but as soon as I spoke to him I was put at ease because he's very warm and friendly. I also met the late Queen Elizabeth when I was a child so it was exciting I was going to be meeting the future king too."

The project brief was to create a womenswear collection celebrating circular design using innovative features like QR codes and carbon tracking. It also celebrates more traditional techniques of small batch production and craftsmanship.

The designers took inspiration The designers took inspiration from the gardens at Highgrove, something Isabelle had done before while at Priestley College only then it was the beauty of Arley Hall's gardens that were her muse. "We actually worked in a similar way when designing at Highgrove as we did on the Arley Hall project," said Isabelle, who studied Iextiles and Fine Art

Textiles and Fine Art. "We walked around the grounds

taking photographs for inspiration and doing observational drawings. It was also a similar time of year so all the gardens were similar autumnal colours."

Isabelle, a former pupil at Bridgewater High School, worked in London at the YOOX Neta-Porter Group offices with three other British artisans.

They partnered with four artists in Milan and during the collaboration she visited Italy to source fabrics and trims. Throughout the project they worked with Carbon Sink to ensure their impact was offset.

All the artisans relocated to Scotland to manufacture the collection and were mentored by the likes of Patrick Grant, Gabriela Hearst and Giuliva Heritage. "One of my favourite things

about the experience has been which has been great for industry contacts, but I have also made some friends for life.

"I am so pleased with the manufacture skills I have perfected from being on this programme and I now know I can produce clothing made at luxury standard."

The collection is available exclusively on Net-A-Porter and Yoox, 50% of the recommended retail price from sales will be donated to The Prince's Foundation

charity. Isabelle said her time at Priestley had helped her to reach where she is today.

"Priestley felt like it embraced students even if they aren't academics like myself and

academics like myselt and encouraged creativity and careers in the creative industry," she said. "Studying Art Foundation at Priestley helped me to build a strong, diverse portfolio. It also changed my perspectives on art and allowed me to look at it differently." differently.



## 550 homes and 160-bed hotel approved for town centre



# "Queen's Canopy" tree planted in Longbarn Park

## A TREE from the national "Tree of Trees" sculpture from the queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations has been planted at Warrington's Longbarn Park.

The Alder tree was presented to the park in a pot embossed with Her Majesty's cypher and was planted by Lady Redmond, Lord Lieutenant of Cheshire, at a ceremony also attended by Mayor of Warrington Jean Flaherty, volunteers from the Friends of Longbarn Park and local

councillors. The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) "Tree of Trees", which was designed by Thomas Heatherwick, stood outside Buckingham Palace as a centrepiece of the Platinum

Jubilee celebrations in June. The living sculpture sought to put the importance of trees at the heart of the historic milestone to celebrate Her Majesty, who planted more than 1,500 trees all over the world during her 70-year reign.

# Looking forward to a brand new year

2022 proved to be an interesting year for everybody, with numerous budgets and reversals, and ending with an immense hike in fuel bills despite a huge amount of support given by the government. Hopefully, the Xmas break has given you all a welcome break, and let us all raise a festive glass and wish each other a healthy and prosperous New Year.

As usual, January heralds the usual tax return season. So let us look at a couple of the most popular expenses that can be claimed by employees.

Firstly, there is the **Working** From Home expense claim. This is a deduction of £6 per week, or £312 per annum. This is worth a tax saving of £62 for a basic rate taxpayer, and £125 for people paying the higher rate of tax. The WFH deduction was widely prompted during the Covid-19 pandemic when many employees were required to work from home for all, or part, of their working time. HMRC did not require the employee to provide any evidence of the expenses incurred by the requirement to work from home, to support claims for the tax years 2022/21 and 2021/22. They were also quite relaxed about whether the employee was required to work at home for all of their working week or just part of it.

However, from April 2022 the conditions necessary to claim the WFH deduction reverted to almost the position that existed before the pandemic. This year an employee can only claim a deduction from their employment income for WFH if:

- substantial duties of the employee are performed at the employee's home, and
- 2. there are no facilities at the employer's premises for the employee to work, and
- the employee is required to work from home by their employer, and
- 4. the employee has no choice about whether they work at home or not.

If all of the above conditions are met, and the employer does not pay a working from home allowance, the employee can claim the deduction.

If the employee can show that their extra costs of working at home are higher than £6 per week, they can claim the actual costs if they keep the evidence. With electricity and gas bills at the current high levels, then this may be worth considering.

Secondly, employees who use their personal vehicles for work can claim a deduction for the costs involved. In order to be deductible the following conditions must apply.

- 1. the obligation to incur the expense must come from the employment, and
- 2. they must relate to the actual performance of the duties.

Consequently, a claim cannot be made for normal commuting as this does not meet the second condition but merely puts the employer in a position where he can perform them. However, travel to a temporary workplace could usually be claimed, as would travel to see a customer or supplier.

Claims by employees must be made using **HMRCs Approved Mileage Allowances.** Since 2011/12, for cars and vans the allowance has been 45p per mile for the first 10,000 business miles in the tax year, and 25p per mile for each mile above 10,000.

These rates purport to reflect the actual cost of using a vehicle. However, they were set at a time when the average cost of unleaded petrol was about £1.35p per litre and have remained unchanged since. However, unlike the Working From Home expense claim, the employee cannot claim the actual expense incurred if higher. Also, should the employer reimburse the employee at a higher rate then tax will be payable on the surplus. However, if the employer reimburses at a lower rate then a claim can be made for the difference.
