Protest petition opposing Local Plan

A petition signed by nearly 450 people has been presented to Warrington Borough Council by concerned Cllrs. representing Culcheth, Croft and Glazebury, opposing the Local Plan.

Along with concerned residents, the Borough Councillors for the ward of Culcheth Glazebury and Croft delivered the petition to the Town Hall.

Cllr. Wendy Maisey said: "There's a strong feeling in our ward about the burden of up to 600 houses being built here, and we're not going to accept this disastrous local plan lying down.

"We all know we need more affordable local housing, but the sites chosen in Culcheth and Deacons Close Croft are

totally unsuitable. We'll continue to work collaboratively cross-party with residents to stop these developments.

"The Government inspectorate already has commented with concerns about with concerns about the overdevelopment of the Green Belt on sites in Warrington. Labour-run Warrington Borough Council had the opportunity to pause the local plan and review numbers following changes made in the levelling up out in elution to be union out or act in relation to housing numbers. They've chosen not to do this."

Cllr Valerie Allen MBE, added: "This disastrous plan would cause real problems for villagers who are already concerned with traffic on narrow roads and the safety of children walking to schools. The addition of this number of extra housing would not only see green belt being taken unnecessarily but would put a strain on what are already limited services in this area. We will stand up for residents and continue to work with them to stop this development". Cllr. Carol Benson concluded:

" I am so saddened to see WBC trying to continue with their plans to build on our precious Green Belt,

much of which is prime agricultural land. They appear to ignore the will of the vast majority of residents, who have given very good reasons against building on this land. The Government have been clear that Green Belt can only be used where there are exceptional circumstances. We say there are no such exceptional circumstances. WBC chose to use Green Belt in Culcheth and Croft when they did not need to. We will continue to encourage WBC to rethink these plans and thank all our residents for their continued support. Our villages matter to us all.

Public consultation starts on main modifications to 'unsound' Local Plan

AN online public consultation to try and ensure Warrington's Local Plan is 'sound' has been launched. Leader of Warrington Borough Council, Clir. Russ Bowden says

Council, Cllr. Russ Bowden says it "is an important chance for residents to continue shaping our Local Plan."

Independent Government inspectors have previously told Warrington Borough Council its proposed Local Plan is not sound and will require some significant modifications, including reducing the impact on Green Belt.

Inspectors, Andrea Mageean and Kevin Ward's findings last December, in relation to the employment land requirement, The South East Warrington Employment Area (Policy MD6) (SEWEA), Fiddlers Ferry and Warrington Waterfront will have significant implications. They have also sought the council's views on the need for a travellers' encampment within the Local Plan.

Following the examination in public of Warrington's Proposed Submissions Version Local Plan ("draft Local Plan") in late 2022, Planning Inspectors made their initial view that with some modifications, Warrington's Local Plan can be found sound.

These modifications will now be consulted on publically for six weeks, up to April 26.

The consultation only relates to the Main Modifications recommended by the Inspectors and not the wider Local Plan. The consultation's main questions relate to whether the Local Plan Main Modifications comply with legal requirements and meet the tests of 'soundness'. These are the key issues that the independent Inspectors will consider when assessing consultation responses. Comments should focus on whether the proposed Main Modifications comply with the legal requirements and can be considered 'sound'.

At the close of the consultation, the representations made will be passed to the independent Planning Inspectors for their consideration. Following a review of responses to the modifications, the Inspectors will then issue their final report before the Plan is then expected to proceed to Full Council for adoption.

adoption. The full schedule of main modifications can be found on the council website at warrington.gov. uk/main-modifications-2023

Clir. Bowden said: "We are hopeful that following this consultation, we will be able to satisfy the views of the Planning Inspectors and put forward a Local Plan for adoption.

"This consultation specifically relates to the Main Modifications recommended by the Independent



Planning Inspectors. It's important to note that it is not an opportunity to raise matters that either were, or could have been, part of the earlier representations or hearings on the submitted Plan, and any comments received will be passed directly to the Planning Inspectors for consideration once the consultation closes.

"This is an important chance for residents to continue shaping our Local Plan so that ultimately we have a framework in place to guide and support the considered development of our town."

All representations must be received by the council no later than 5pm on Wednesday 26 April 2023. Late representations will not be accepted by the council, but they will be brought to the attention of the Inspectors.

Residents prepare for new Battle of Winwick

MORE than 70 concerned residents of Winwick attended a packed meeting at St Oswald's Church Hall to discuss a recent planning application by Bellway Homes to build 163 homes on land off Golborne Road.

The proposed development is close to the site of the famous Battle of Winwick – the last major battle of the English Civil War.

At the meeting, organised residents themselves, the discussion, led by Stuart Mann and Andy Griffiths, covered concerns about the impact on traffic, schools and the lack of infrastructure in Winwick.

Winwick. Stuart said: "The residents are rightly worried about the implications of this development on our small village. With over 1200 homes approved for Peel Hall, and another 50 across the Parish, together with this proposal our already over-used roads and services could become stretched to breaking point, and there is little mitigation in any of the proposals to address our worries." Andy added: "In our opinion,

the planning application contains a number of errors that make it seem like our village has the ability to support these homes. Residents' are already having issues registering with a GP or a dentist in the local area, with some having to travel as far as Manchester to get treatment'

Emma Lavender, who helped organise the meeting, commented:"A number of residents aren't on social media and may not even have Internet access. We wanted to make sure that everyone had the information they needed to understand the proposals and comment on them, as they will impact the whole of our village." The site is said to be well connected to the wider region by

excellent transport links, There is also shopping at the Gemini Retail Park, 4500m away, and at Newton-le-Willows, 3500m away.

Winwick Lesure Centre is only 800m from the site, offering sports facilities and social activities.

Bellway wants to build 163 houses on the site – including some affordable homes. They also plan to provide open space's and parking for the development.

Commissioner-funded barriers protecting Croft Youth Activity Centre

POLICE and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer visited Croft Youth Activity Centre (CYAC) to speak to representatives from Croft Parish Council about how his Community Action Fund has helped them to

prevent and tackle crime. In August 2021 an encampment on land I CYAC and subsequent illegal behind antisocial behaviour caused the local community in Croft a significant amount of distress. The site was left in a bad condition and residents were concerned that the same thing could easily happen again. This led Croft Parish Council to

apply to the Community Action Fund, so that kick rail barriers could be installed around the land to prevent further incidents. When

he visited, the Commissioner was greeted with the news that so far there have been no repeats. Mr Dwyer, said: "Preventing and tackling crime is a priority in my Police and Crime Plan, so it's great to be able to support residents in Croft with a simple crime prevention initiative through my Community Action Fund. "People expect and deserve

to feel safe in their communities. I was really pleased to hear from the Parish Council that the kick rail barriers are delivering peace of mind and a feeling of safety for local residents and I hope this continues to be the case."

The prevention of any further illegal encampments and related anti-social behaviour has meant policing and local council resources have been able to be dedicated where they are needed more in the community. Cllr Paul Campbell, Chair of Croft

Parish Council said: "The parish council and people of Croft would like to thank the Police & Crime Commissioner John Dwyer for the financial support we received in our work to put in the kick rails and security barrier at CYAC

The Raven gets ever closer to re-opening and returning to historic roots!

WITH new windows going in at the Raven, along with a lot of work inside, it is now very close to being handed over by the owners to the community. The renovations have also taken the historic pub back to its Tudor and

Georgian roots!

Spokesperson Peter Sturman said, 'It has taken longer than expected, however there were substantial structural problems that had to be addressed. During the course of solving those problems, the building had to be stripped of some fairly dodgy previous 'renovations'. "That work revealed conclusive evidence of the rich history of the Raven

"Having got to that point, the decision was made to renovate the building in a manner that took it back to its Tudor and Georgian roots. Whilst we are desperate to get the Raven open as soon as possible, we only get one chance to do this properly."

The cooperative responsible for running the Raven have plans in place to enable them to crack on with their renovation of the pub and kitchen once it is handed over to them.

At that point the estimate is six to eight weeks until the Raven opens its doors. Peter added: "We have also had to go through a quite understandable process with the Department for Levelling Up, with regard to the Community Ownership Fund grant. We have just signed the final Grant Funding Agreement and returned it to the Department for Levelling Up. It looks like it will coincide nicely with the hadrographic the pub " nicely with the handover of the pub.'

The inspection found High Peak Residential and Nursing Home was an organised and well-run service that had an open and transparent culture. The registered manager was clear about how the service should be provided and they led by example

For members to enjoy. Entertainment was provided by Magaly Flores, a qualified art teacher in Mexico, specialising in contemporary dance and education and, after gaining a degree in Education at Edgehill University, became a Spanish and Dance teacher in the UK. She is also the creative director of Colibri Mexican Folkdance UK an established dance company of native Mexicans showcasing traditional Mexican dance throughout the north west of England and beyond.

throughout the north west of England and beyond. Being married to an English man, Magaly has lived in the UK for 30 years and her main aim as an artistic director is to educate Mexicans living in the UK to know and feel proud of their traditions and language and she was awarded by the the Mexican Government in 2021 for promoting Mexican culture overseas.

She gave an interesting talk about her home country and the many celebrations and rituals held throughout the year.

throughout the year. Mexico is the 13th largest country in the world and the 10th most populous. It was ruled by the Spanish for three centuries from 1500 to 1821 and the main religion is Catholicism. Mexican people are descended from many civilisations including Maya, Aztec, Toltec, Inca, African, French and Spanish.

Many traditions and celebrations have been passed down over the years, some date back to Aztec times long before Christianity came to that part of the world and things like blood and rain are considered sacred in many of these rituals. Christmas, New Year and Easter are all celebrated with lavish Christian festivals. One tradition which proved of particular interest was Dia Los Muertos, the Day of the Dead. On this occasion families get together to remember the beloved dead who have gone before and to celebrate the circle of life. Towns and villages are decorated with bunting and flowers, faces are painted to resemble skulls and people enjoy lots of dancing, singing and wonderful food. A wonderful demonstration of Mexican dancing in full costume was given by Magaly as a conclusion to the evening and members were invited to join in for the Happy Birthday dance, which proved very popular. A vote of thanks was given by Louise Geekie for a most enjoyable and extremely enlightening evening.

The competition as won by Jenny Forshaw, 2nd Janet Hughes, 3rd Sue Murcott people with kindness and respect. There was enough staff on duty to meet people's needs. The provider had systems in place to protect people from the risk of abuse and people told us they felt safe. Risk assessments were completed to help identify and minimise risks people faced. Infection control measures were safe. Steps were taken to learn lessons if things went wrong.

The registered manager provided good leadership and clear direction. Staff felt supported and were confident people received good care. Systems and processes for monitoring quality and safety were effective.

The inspection followed on from one in 2018 when the rating was also good.

"We always provide refreshments for Ukrainian guests on Sunday and on Wednesday. We provide sandwiches, cakes, drinks, teas, and coffees,."

Leanne sadded: "Obviously we need to pay for all of that. So, we decided to turn that into a working kitchen."

It took them only three months to completely reorganise space into stylish smart, functional kitchen with all necessary facilities, which was made thanks to donations and fund raising.

Now all the income from café goes straight back to the hub.

The hub also has a children's area, which is enjoyed by the younger visitors of the hub, yet Leanne and Kate have further plans, which include utilising the outdoor space. "What we'd like to do is use the

"What we'd like to do is use the outside space. In the summer we can open the patio doors, have some tables out there. But the idea is that we can get some money to have a playground out there or something like that," Leanne explained.

The cafe is now open to all and welcomes anyone who wants to come and spend some time in their little corner of Culcheth.
