Editor's Comment



At time of writing assurances were still being sought over the re-opening of the Oughtrington Luncheon Club which controversially closed earlier this year following a fallout between Trustees and volunteer organisers.

My comments last month attracted a response from Chair of Trustees Paul Gibson and following an amicable conversation I received assurances that the luncheon club would re-open.

Further reassurances were also sought by local MP Andy Carter and local Councillor Ian Marks who again met with Mr Gibson, to seek assurances around the governance of the community facility, which is owned by local people and run for the benefit of the Oughtrington community by a board of volunteer Trustees.

This sorry state of affairs started in January and as we head towards May, the luncheon club had still not re-opened at time of writing, leaving

members upset and frustrated.
Since the closure, more than 130 local people came forward requesting membership of the Oughtrington Community Centre Trust and an EGM has been called with a view to re-establishing the twice weekly lunchtime event. Lymm Parish Council also recently exercised its right to appoint a Trustee. Mr Gibson also confirmed that he was planning for the Oughtrington Luncheon Club to resume on Tuesday 18th April and gave assurances that local residents would be given more details so that they can make arrangements to come along. At time of writing this did not look likely, although I do hope that by next month I can bring some good news about the luncheon club being back open!

Meanwhile volunteers Ridpath and his sister Phyllis decided the best way forward was to both step down from their volunteer positions as joint organisers of the Luncheon Club, after the trustees sent an email on February 19, stating they were re-branding the luncheon club with new management and team.

It is sad that two people who dedicated much time and effort to running the luncheon club felt the need to give up something they clearly love doing. They have been completely transparent and responsive to questions and emails
– unfortunately the same can not be said of Mr Gibson despite my very

best attempts.



Council sets out next steps for Conservation area refurbishment

THANKING nearly 250 residents for helping to shape plans for the refurbishment of the stone setts on Pepper Street Conservation area in Lymm, Warrington Borough Council has laid out the next steps.

Pepper Street, which sits within a conservation area in Lymm village centre, contains a sett paved area, which is in poor condition.

which is in poor condition.
In addition, the existing inspection chamber covers and gully gratings on the street are of an older style and unsuitable for modern traffic.

Almost 250 people took part in a consultation last autumn, aimed at getting local views on the best returnishment options for the stone setts.

The majority of respondents said they would like to see the road reconstructed with reclaimed setts.

The council is now moving forward to the detailed planning stage for the refurbishment project. This will take some months, as the reclaimed setts – of the right type and size – will need to be sourced.

As part of this planning stage, the council must also liaise with utilities

companies to ensure disruption is minimised as much as possible when the work is carried out, and utilities will need time to undertake any essential works before the returbishment project begins.

Other considerations for the

Other considerations for the council are maintaining access to the car park, ensuring important community on-street activities – such as Lymm Transport Day – can go ahead as usual, and planning for as much of the heavy work as possible to take place during school holidays. Cabinet member for transportation,

Cabiner member for fransportation, highways and public realm, Cllr Hans Mundry, said: "We'd like to thank everyone who shared their views on the refurbishment of the stone setts on Pepper Street.

"Residents made it clear that their residents made it clear that their

"Residents made it clear that their preferred option is for the look and teel of the surface to be retained with reclaimed setts, and it's this option we'll be moving forward with.

"We are keen to carry out the refurbishment works as soon as we can, to prevent further deterioration and ensure the longevity of the surface. However, this section of Pepper Street is an important part of lymm's conservation area, and it's vital we take the time to get it right.

"We thank everyone for their patience while we proceed to the detailed planning stage for the project which, once complete, will bring big long term benefits for the area, providing a high quality surface for many years to come."

Local Councillor Graham Gowland was pleased with the results. He commented: "There's a real mix of local views over which surface to go with. There have been quite a few people who wanted a smooth tarmac surface, but those preferring the heritage surface of setts were in the majority. I like the look of them, and am impressed at the degree of consultation we've had in Lymm for this project."

Objectors lose battle to block Green Belt development

OBJECTORS have lost a battle to block a development of 108 homes and a medical centre on Green Belt at Lymm.

Members of Warrington Borough Council's development management committee approved the scheme off Rushgreen Road despite objections from 90 nearby residents, Lymm Parish Council and local borough councillors Ian Marks and Graham

Gowland.

Planning officers recommended the scheme should be approved because including a medical centre - currently an outline proposal - represented a very special reason for the development in the Green Belt.

The proposal involves the demolition of a property in Rushgreen Road to make way for the medical

Objections from residents and others included road safety issues arising from increased traffic on Rushgreen Road.

There were also objections to the siting of three-storey homes adjacent to the Bridgewater Canal which, it is claimed, will have a major impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

The proposals are for detached, semi-detached and terraced houses and a three-storey apartment block.

A total of 32 "affordable homes"

are proposed in the development.
Objectors said although inclusion of a medical centre in the

inclusion of a medical centre in the scheme is welcome, it will itself be an additional cause of increased traffic using the narrow Rushgreen Road.

They also argued that the main access route to the development, Woodyatt Way, is too narrow for the amount of traffic the development will attract.



Plan to modernise historic Methodist church

IMAGINATIVE proposals for modernising the historic Methodist Church, in Eagle Brow, Lymm have been submitted to Warrington planning chiefs.

The proposals involve a modern, glazed, structure linking the original church, which dates from 1850 with the Sunday School building which was built in 1865, but will respect the heritage of the two feature buildings.

will replace a number alterations and extensions, added over the years, resulting in a collection of difficult-to-access spaces over five levels.

The church, which also hosts the Life Church, is used by around 400 people every week, as well as visits by groups of around 180 pupils from local schools.

The proposals will also enable the development of the church's already strong community café facility, which is seen as a key part of the church's future outreach programme. Planning chiefs are now considering the proposals, which are said to have been widely welcomed by the local Methodist community

The youngsters were captured on CCTV following reports of anti-social behaviour at the Raven Court premises in the village run by Warrington Housing Association.

After the reports of anti-social behaviour, local PCSO Daren Dennis quickly gathered CCTV images and liaised with Lymm High School to identify those responsible.

Warrington Housing Association took to social media to thank PCSO Dennis for his proactive policing stating: "Recently some teens have been making a nuisance of themselves at night in one of our retirement schemes.
"A local PCSO found the youths,

"Everyone deserves a second chance. And thank you, PCSO Dennis!"

PCSO Dennis said: "A great example of Partnership working and taking positive action in relation to Anti-social Behaviour in Lymm.

"The youths involved were then visited at home with their parents present and formally spoken to about their behaviour. Letters of apology have been written and delivered to staff and residents at the Care Home and the youths were remorseful for their actions.

"Alongside this referrals have been made to the Community Safety Partnership Team and letters will be sent home to the parents of the youths involved."

Your pet questions answered

Q: My dog has a sticky eye with pus visible. I am bathing it with cool boiled water several times a day but it doesn't seem to be improving.

ti doesn't seem to be improving.

A: This sounds like it could be bacterial conjunctivitis which will need to be treated by a vet with antibiotic eye drops. Your vet will also check that there are no ulcers or lacerations which have caused this. For any eye issues like this, it is better to use an eye safe saline solution rather than boiled water. This needs to be bought over the counter. Don't be tempted to make salt water at home as it is difficult to get the quantities right which may cause further irritation to your dog.

Q: We are trying to stop our cat sleeping on our bed and have bought her a cat bed which we have put on the floor in our bedroom, but she still prefers our bed. How can we get her to use her own?

A: Oh, the joys of cat ownership! Sadly, if your cat doesn't want to use her new bed there isn't a lot you can do about it. Your bed will be comfy and familiar to her and have your familiar, comforting smells. You could try putting some clothing that you have worn in her bed or possibly some treats to tempt her in but at the end of the day she will make her own mind up about which bed she prefers.

Q: Our rabbit has fleas. I have two questions – can she have caught them from a cat and if so, can I use the same flea treatment I use for my cat for my rabbit?

A: Rabbits can catch fleas from both cats and dogs, and show the same symptoms. Flea treatments for cats and dogs can cause adverse reactions and even death in rabbits so talk to your vets about specific rabbit flea treatments.

Q: How long after vaccinations do I have to wait before I can take my puppy on a walk or he can mix with other dogs?

A: In general, we would advise that you wait until a week after the second vaccination but recommend that you ask your vet who will give you the specific manufacturers guidelines for the vaccine they have used. Your puppy's immunity will start to build up after the first vaccination and be boosted by the second and this will give your pup immunity for a year.

Q: My cat keeps squatting as if to have a pee and just stares ahead, but nothing happens. Can you tell me what it might be please?

A: The increase in frequency of

A: The increase in frequency of urination or trying to urinate is most likely caused by a disease called FLUTD (feline lower urinary tract disease). This can be caused by a variety of causes including infections, bladder stones, inflammation and even stress!

Your cat will need to be seen by a vet to check it out. It is particularly important if you have a male cat with these symptoms that you seek advice quickly as some male cats can develop a blockage in the urethra which means they cannot pass any urine at all and this can be fatal if left untreated.

Most cases do respond well to treatment once a specific cause had been identified.


