# Warrington businesses vote YES for a 2nd term Town Centre **Business Improvement District**

Warrington businesses have voted in favour of having a 2nd term Business Improvement District (BID) for the town centre between 2023 and 2028.

Voting commenced on 19th April and closed on 18th May. More than 300 businesses had the opportunity to approve or reject the 5 year £1.5million private sector led investment for Warrington town centre, with a majority (80%) approving the 2nd term BID, an increase in support from 68% when the ballot was held for the town centre's first BID in 2018.

Re-approving the town centre BID will enable businesses to lead on a wide range of activities, additional projects and services that will make Warrington town centre more economically vibrant, increase footfall and support the creation of a safer, cleaner and greener town

Warrington's business community join over 300 city and town centres across the UK who have chosen to implement successful BIDs since

The 'Yes' vote empowers businesses and creates a more vibrant and diverse visitor experience for all. # Partnerships key to success as Property Review celebrates 25th anniversary

AS it celebrated its 25th anniversary the annual Warrington Property Review heard how despite challenging times, the town continued to attract £200m of investment a year over the past 10 years.

Business leaders from across the town and further afield gathered at the "sell-out" event at the Park Royal Hotel to hear how there had been £2 billion worth of public and private costs investment in Warriston over sector investment in Warrington over

the past decade.

Warrington Borough Council's
Director of Growth Steve Park said
partnerships had been one of three
key successes in delivering the council's visions

Speaking at the event he said: "It's been four years since I last spoke at a Property Review, and although today marks the 25th anniversary, unbelievably it marks 10 years since I first stood in front of you and described my thoughts on transforming Warrington and the renewed focus on economic growth and regeneration.

And what a decade it's been. I think we'd all agree it's not been without its economic challenges. We've had Brexit, a global pandemic, we've had Trump, 5 prime ministers, Trussonomics, debt crisis in Greece, and I know that many argue that we never actually recovered from the financial crisis in 2008. We've had a boom in logistics, and a bust in retail.


ongoing turbulence in the UK, but I'd argue that Warrington has managed to fly above most of it and it's not by chance either.

## Spotlight on Employment Development Team

Whilst I normally write about upcoming developments and projects in the town, this is only a part of what Warrington & Co get involved with and so I thought you might find it quite useful this month if I explained a bit of what the Employment Development Team (EDT) does at Warrington & Co.

As the name might suggest this team works with partners such as local voluntary and community bodies to deliver help connect people and businesses. So what does that mean? Well It's quite a broad range of functions but will include things like helping with recruitment drives, co-ordinating and if needs be hosting open days whereby people can come and meet with an employer during the

open day rather than having a more formal interview slot. We also help some residents specifically, where for instance they might need help to improve their employability skills and Improve their employability skills and ultimately gain employment. This also includes working with individuals at risk of redundancy, where we can help with things such as CV writing; application forms, skills around job searching and some, training

advice, job matching, interview skills and techniques – including mock interview sessions and help around confidence and self-esteem concerns. We also work with local businesses to demonstrate how to be part of the drive for growth for the Warrington area by offering a free recruitment service. This includes things like apprenticeships and links to skills and training opportunities and encouraging businesses to think local in terms of their staff, suppliers and partners and how this can strengthen and build upon the local economy in order to sustain can strengthen and build upon the local economy in order to sustain growth. In order to do this we work closely with the planners at WBC to understand the requirements of any new businesses relocating and investing in the area. This provides investing in the area. This provides opportunities to discuss vacancies, apprenticeships, work placement/ experience opportunities and support them throughout the recruitment process into job opportunities. We also offer support and guidance on creating skills development packages to suit the business needs.

We also deliver various externally funded programmes ground

funded programmes around employability & skills and can include things such as advice and support on apprenticeships and funding, including the apprenticeship levy or pre-recruitment training and skills development and in some cases Warrington

## Shock as Six56 public inquiry suddenly adjourned

THE Public Inquiry to consider plans for the massive Six56 logistics site has been adjourned due to pollution concerns on Manchester Mosses, which campaigners hope will be the "final nail in the coffin" for the development.

This was a result of a letter received from 'Natural England' which queried whether the correct legal process had been carried out with respect to the effect of traffic on the Manchester Mosses alongside the

Natural England is the government body whose purpose is to 'help conserve, enhance and manage the natural environment for the benefit of present and future generations, thereby contributing to sustainable

thereby contributing to sustainable development.'

The public inquiry is considering an appeal by Langtree over proposals for the giant Six/56 development next to Exit 20 on the M6 at Grappenhall.

Lymm Councillor lan Marks who was present at the Inquiry said, "We were all shocked by this turn of events and cannot understand why the problem only emerged at such a late stage in the process. The Inquiry started on a Monday but after about an hour and a half of preliminary proceedings, the Inspector suddenly announced to everyone's surprise, that the Inquiry would be adjourned

Tuesday because Planning Inspectors were on strike.

"The law requires there to be

a thirty-day consultation process to consider the issue to do with the Mosses, which delays the restart of proceedings. This had not been carried out. Due to diary commitments of participants, the first available date for a resumption is likely to be 10 October. It is all rather surreal and suggests that Mosses

available date for a resumption is likely to be 10 October. It is all rather surreal and suggests that Mosses located just outside the Warrington Borough have more influence than the people of South Warrington!

"The Local Plan Inspectors were admant that the land on which Six56 would be built should not be released from the Green Belt, contrary to the Council's proposal in the draft Plan. The Council has reluctantly accepted this modification to enable the Local Plan to be declared as 'sound'. Providing there is no change of mind from the Inspectors, it is likely that the Local Plan will be approved by the Council prior to the October restart. Surely it would then be very difficult for such a major component in an approved Plan to be overturned by the Inquiry Inspector with a recommendation that Six56 goes ahead. Together with residents of South Warrington, I really hope this surprise development is a nail in the coffin for Six/56."



# Sad pilgrimage in memory of local men who died in Isle of Man disaster

A WARRINGTON man will travel to the Isle of Man in August to pay tribute to the memory of 50 people who died in a disastrous fire 50-years ago.

Two young men from Warrington were among those who perished when the blaze swept through the five-storey Summerland leisure centre on the sea front at Douglas. They were Alan Barker, aged

20, from Woolston and Sean Kelly,

21, from Fearnhead. Now, 76-year-old Barry O'Neill is planning to travel to Douglas on August 2 – the 50th anniversary of the disaster – to visit the site and the memorial that was erected after the fire.

Mr O'Neill, of Ash Grove, Latchford has visited the site several times over the years and has kept in touch with a local woman, Tina



Brennan, who organises an annual memorial service.

She is still in touch with relatives

of Alan Barker and Sean Kelly who have visited the site on occasions.

Alan and Sean were working at Summerland at the time of the fire. It is believed Alan managed to get out of the building but went back in to try and rescue other people. He was due to take examinations to join the police on his return from the Isle of Man. He played football for the Church Street Labour Club team and was to have trials with Wigan

Athletic. In addition to the 50 deaths, 80 people were seriously injured in the crush that occurred as people tried to get out of the building.

Mr O'Neill said: "I want to make

sure Warrington people don't forget this tragedy. I realise there will be many who are too young to remember it, but I want to make sure local people know about it.

Hopefully we can get some over there on August 2."

After the disaster there was a major public inquiry. Although no-one was blamed, the use of flammable building materials and delays in evacuation procedures were condemned.

The skeletal remains of the building were demolished in 1975

and it was then re-built on a smaller scale the following year. It reopened in 1978.

In October 2002, torrential rain caused a landslide behind the building and it was decided the site could not be made safe. It closed in 2004 and in January 2006, demolition commenced. One wall remains intact as there are concerns that its removal could cause an adjacent cliff to collapse.

Forty years after the tragedy, a permanent memorial in the form of three granite columns was unveiled in nearby gardens. It bears the names of all those killed in the fire and is set into a circle of paving, alongside a stone laid earlier to mark the 25th anniversary.



## Council leader cleared of election fraud

THE leader of Warrington Borough Council, Cllr Russ Bowden, has been cleared of election fraud after trial by jury at Liverpool Crown

Court.' Cllr Bowden, 53, of Applecross Close, Birchwood, was alleged by the prosecution to have lied on his nomination forms for the May 2019 local election for re-election as a

Birchwood ward Labour councillor. He had been living in a rented flat in Lulworth Place for 21 months after marital problems but instead of putting that down on the form as his home he put the Applecross Close address, where his wife still lived

Cllr Bowden had always denied a charge of making a false statement on a nomination paper telling the court that the Bewsey ward address was only a temporary address and he considered that his home address was the one in Birchwood.
It was claimed by the prosecution

that he did so to gain a political advantage as being seen by voters as "a local man". Bowden denied this telling told the jury "I am Leader

of the council. It is absolutely crucial

or the council. It is absolutely crucial that I am above reproach."
Following the hearing Cllr Bowden issued a statement outside court saying the trial, which had taken nearly two years to come to court, had been "stressful and deeply upsetting for me and my family."

Stating he had always had a "clear conscience" he added: "Sadly there are those with political motivations that have led them to try and exploit this case in order to cast doubt on me as a person, attempting to undermine my leadership of the council and our Labour led council, regardless of the reputational damage to our

He went on to say; "This case should never have come to court. Lalways maintained my innocence. The unanimous verdict of the jury demonstrates the truth of what I was saying should never have been doubted.

He said he had been "blessed with unwayering support of family, friends and supporters.

It is part of a wider Warrington Pride party in the town centre promoting the dignity, equality and increased visibility of the LGBTQ+

community.
Culture Warrington's first Pride event will be the bold yet playful Barely Visible on Friday, June 23.

The physical theatre and contemporary dance solo performance at Pyramid's Studio Theatre in Palmyra Square will explore identity, objectification and what it is to be gay.

Then on Saturday, June 24,

Then on Saturday, June 24, between 10am and 4pm, creatives will lead free, drop-in workshops for children, young people and their families at Castlefield Gallery New Art Spaces in Sankey Street, Warrington

The sessions will enable children and their families to express themselves creatively in an open and relaxed setting and there is no need to book.

This event will also see Culture Warrington team up with Warrington Youth Zone to create an interactive exhibition exploring relationships, gender and identity, which can be

viewed until Sunday, June 25.

The programme concludes with a "Queer Scratch Night" at Pyramid on Thursday, June 29

A scratch night is a platform that gives artists and performers of all disciplines the opportunity to share and test out work in early stages for audience feedback, peer review and further development.

Building on the success of previous scratch nights at Pyramid, this adaptation of the usual platform will provide an opportunity exclusively for north west based LGBTQ+ creatives to tell their stories

"Our audiences can expect to see a lot more contemporary

Isabelle Rudge, from Warrington Youth Zone, added: "The young people at Warrington Youth Zone are very excited to have the opportunity for their artwork to be showcased in an exhibition in the town centre.

"We have several creative projects running, leading up to the exhibition, exploring the theme 'Express yourself through art'. The young people will be involved in every step of the way, from their initial ideas to installing the artwork and seeing their projects come to life."

The Pride events at Pyramid Arts Centre will also be the first Culture Warrington shows to feature a new 'pay what you decide' pricing policy.

The scheme aims to break down

barriers to the arts and works by allowing people to book tickets and attend shows without paying beforehand.

## Warrington again ranked as one of best places in the UK for a night out!

WARRINGTON has again been ranked the third best place in the UK for a night out following new research.

Situated between Manchester and Liverpool and and boasting lots of pubs, bars and restaurants Warrington scored 8.01 out of 10 in the ranking following new research.

The study by Get Licensed, analysed the number of venues per head, the cost of a pint and a range of safety issues to reveal the best nights out in Britain. By updating their original research data was refreshed for 2023.

Warrington has a total of 279 CAMRA pubs (169 per 100,000) and also had among the lowest scores for its resident safety concerns, with just 11% of locals worried about being assaulted due to hate crimes. Pubgoers in the area generally feel safer about walking home alone at night than in other towns, with 52% of residents feeling safe doing so.

In addition to having one of the highest rankings for the number of prestigious CAMRA pubs [211 per 100,000], the city has a wide variety of bars and nightclubs where you can dance the night away (66 per 100,000 people). The price of a beer in Newcastle averages at around £4.20 a pint, which is fairly cheap compared to

other big cities in the North.

In second place was York with a night out score of 8.14. The city has a choice of commercial chain bars and quirky independent pubs which pull in the punters. Considering York's small population of just over 153,000, the city hosts many traditional real ale and cider. or just over 133,000, the city hosts many traditional real ale and cider pubs (161 per 100,000) and is also known for its safe streets, with a safety index score of 73.09.

Warrington made the top 3 with a night out score of 8.01, making the North the best area for a night

London was crowned the worst

city for a night out with a score of 1.73. London fell to the bottom of the ranking for its average cost of a pint being £6.82 and for its number of real ale pubs (30 per 100,000).

The data used for the number of bars and clubs were taken from Tripadvisor, while the number of pubs close to each location was taken from CAMRA's whatpub. com. Comparing this data to the populations of each town and city using data from World Population Review. This data was correct as of 11/04/2023.

# SEND inspection report highlights areas for improvement while recognising good practice

A new report has highlighted areas where improvements are needed for young people with special education needs and/or disabilities (SEND) in Warrington, while also recognising good

Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission have published their Area SEND inspection report of Warrington Local Area Partnership,

February 2022.

Warrington Borough Council and NHS Cheshire and Merseyside Integrated Care Board (ICB) are jointly responsible for planning and commissioning services for children and young people with SEND. The inspection found the local

area partnership's arrangements lead to inconsistent experiences and outcomes for children and people with young educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) and says the local area partnership must work jointly to make improvements. The next full area SEND inspection will

be within approximately 3 years.

The report found that some children and young people wait too long to be assessed for wait too long to be assessed ror health services. This includes those waiting for assessments from the speech, language and communication therapy service, the child and adolescent mental health service (CAMHS) and the health service (CAMHS) and the neurodevelopmental pathway. While leaders have introduced support and guidance for children, young people and their families while they wait. However, some needs escalate as children and young people continue to wait for

young people continue to wait for specialist support and guidance. Parents, carers and professionals also report problems with communication. Too often, professionals signpost parents and carers to other services. While this is enough for some families, other families struggle while they wait.

A significant number of parents and carers who are waiting for their child to be assessed on the neurodevelopmental reported that they are not updated often enough on wait times. This causes increased stress and worry.

have been several changes to the senior leadership of Warrington's SEND services since the previous inspection. These include the appointment of a new director of children's services and cabinet member for children and young people. The commissioning of health services changed across England in 2022. On 1 July 2022, NHS Cheshire and Merseyside ICB became responsible for the commissioning of health services in

Warrington.
The local authority commissions The local authority commissions a single provider to provide education for children or young people, including those who cannot attend school due to social, emotional, mental health and medical needs, or for those who are at risk of or have been permanently excluded. The local authority does not commission any other alternative provision.

authority does not commission any other alternative provision.

The report highlighted that senior leaders across the Warrington Partnership are ambitious for children and young people with SEND. Inspectors also found a number of areas where Warrington Partnership is making a positive Partnership is making a positive difference to improve the lives of children and young people with

The report also praised the work of education, health and social care professionals to enable young people to take part in decision-making about their education, care

Most children and young people who responded to the online survey during the inspection reported having a trusted adult in their lives, who listens and acts on their views. The report also stated that the workforce benefits from training

opportunities, which help to improve staff's ability to quickly identify and meet the needs of

children and young people.

The inspection also found that many children and young people with SEND enjoy a wide range of inclusive leisure activities across Warrington, including dedicated sessions at Warrington Youth Zone.

Ofsted found that the local area

Ofsted found that the local area partnership supports young people to gain valuable work experience. These experiences help children and young people with SEND to be visible in the community and prepares them well for the future. Young people with SEND were found to benefit from good quality careers information, advice and guidance.

Warrington Borough Council's Cabinet Member for children's services, Cllr Sarah Hall, said: "I'm pleased with this report, which highlights some of the good work our local area partnership is doing

to make a difference to the lives of children and young people with SEND, so that they are listened to and given the best opportunities to reach their full potential.

"We will also fully take on board the areas of improvement highlighted in the report. By better sharing information partners and putting measures in place to deal with increased pressures on services, we can further strengthen our ability to meet the needs of all young people with SEND in Warrington. We'll be working hard to achieve this."

Carl Marsh, NHS Cheshire and Merseyside's Place Director for Warrington said: "This report demonstrates the work being done by partners in Warrington to improve the lives of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities.

"We also recognise there is still more to do and we're committed to working closely with partners through the Warrington Together health and care partnership to use the report's feedback and recommendations to improve the support available for children and young people with SEND.



## New £4 million housing development completed for older adults



# Should I opt out of my workplace pension?

One thing that has become clear over the past couple of years, and particularly in the last 12 months with the horrendous increase in the cost of basic needs such as power and fuel, is the inadequacy of the basic state pension in providing a comfortable standard of life. The full new state pension is £203.85 per week, and this can be reduced if you have a shortfall in your national insurance contributions record. This is substantially less than the National Living Wage for anyone over 22 years old who works for 19 hours a week or more. Despite this, the rumours that the "triple lock" protection of the state pension may be removed are getting louder. removed are getting louder, and if this happens then it will only have the effect of reducing the level of increase of future pensions.

The government have seen Workplace Pensions as being at least part of a solution to poverty in old age. With some minor exceptions, for the past few years all employers have had to provide a workplace pension for employees in the UK who are both aged between 22 and the state pension age and who also earn at least £10,000 per year. However, even if you fall into one of the exceptions an employer cannot refuse to enrol you if you so request, although they

do not need to make any employer contributions if you earn less than £6,240 per year. The choice of pension provider rests solely with the employer.

The amount that the employer and the employee pay into a workplace pension depends on the individual scheme. However, all schemes must meet the minimum requirements which are currently:

- The employer pays 3%, and the employee pays 5%,
- On all earnings between £6,240 and £50,270 per year, or £120 and £966 per week.

Any employee can "opt out" of a workplace pension. However, any decision to do so should be carefully considered. Obviously, opting out will stop you paying your 5% into the pension scheme. However, this may come at a considerable cost. WatkinsonBlack are not authorised to provide investment advice, and therefore the following points are for information and general guidance only. Firstly, and very importantly, opting out will directly lead to your income in retirement

being reduced.

Secondly, whilst your immediately net income will be increased, this will be at the cost of a substantial reduction in your gross pay. By opting out you will not only "save" your contributions of 5% but will also remove your employer's obligation to pay their 3%. There is no obligation on your employer to pay this to you instead.

Thirdly, as usual you will receive tax relief on your contributions. This can be given in a number of ways, but if by means of a salary sacrifice then you will also reduce your national insurance contributions. This means that the increase in your net pay by opting out may be significantly less you might think.

Fourthly, the reduction in your net pay of joining the workplace pension may:

- mean that you become entitled to tax credits, or to an increase in the amount of tax credits received; or
- mean that you become entitled to an income-related benefit, or to an increase in the amount of benefit received.

It might also remove or reduce your liability to make student loan repayments.

Finally, some people may

worry about losing any benefit from their pension if they die before they retire. This need not be a problem as you can usually nominate someone, such as your spouse or civil partner, to receive the benefit of your pension pot. Details of how to do this can be obtained from the pension provider chosen by your employer.
