# Editor's Comment

RESIDENTS at Risley have been left stunned after Warrington planners approved controversial proposals for a large HGV distribution centre near their homes.

This will have huge implications for the surrounding area, with thousands of extra HGV movements taking place - and no planning restrictions on hours or days of operation.

While some modifications have been made to the original plans these are minimal.

Members the planning followed committee committee followed officer advice, voting 7-2 to approve the application which will also include the demolition of the former Noggin pub, and historic World War II military buildings on the site. Leader of the council ClIr Russ Bowden, who is also a member of Birchwood Town Council who

of Birchwood Town Council, who as an organisation opposed the application in support of residents, has assured me the decision was not a political one, stating "planning is quasi-judicial and not whispand" whipped

He will have difficulty convincing many local residents of this, who left the meeting distraught and shouting that members of the committee who voted in favour of the application should be "ashamed of yourselves." I understand members of the

controlling Labour group may feel obliged to follow officer advice, because if they go against it and then the application is overturned on appeal - they can be accused of

costing the council money.
But officers aren't always right and local councillors are elected to

represent their constituents.

Local residents had invested in their own planning consultants to oppose the application by St. Modwen Developments which involves the demolition of existing dwellings at 689 and 689a Warrington Road and former Noggin public house and existing industrial premises and redevelopment of site to provide buildings for employment use, access and car parking, landscaping, and associated works on land at Trident Business Park.

A total of 3.33 letters of objection

A total of 333 letters of objection had been received in response to

4 consultation periods while there were 28 letters of support.

Judging by the resident's reaction and that of local conservative councillors, they don't feel their concerns were taken seriously.

It's not the first time the council has gone against public opinion on big planning applications in the borough and I'm sure it won't be the last.

With local elections looming next May, I suspect many distraught residents impacted by this planning application decision will not have short memories!

# Reading initiative connects students with "Silver Listeners"

A GROUP of Year 7 students at Culcheth High School are taking part in a reading initiative which connects them with older members of the local community.

They give up their time to contact senior citizens weekly by telephone and read to them.

Silver Stories is a charity-based project which aims to enrich the reading experience of young and old and helps the youngsters develop their reading accuracy and fluency. It also combats the loneliness and isolation that can be felt by some older people.

The students are the "Silver Readers" and the senior citizens the "Silver Listeners" and young and old both find the experience enjoyable. Readings are short extracts from books or poems and can range from Harry Potter to cake recipes!

Listeners provide feedback and encouragement to help the youngsters develop their reading skills.

They welcome the contact and thoroughly enjoy hearing from the students each week, often having a chat and finding out the youngsters' reading interest – which the students love to share.

Darcy, Brigid, Alice and Erin

have been taking part in the programme for a number of weeks, reading from a variety of texts and genres.

A school spokesperson said: "It is truly delightful to see the students building confidence and engaging with their listeners in such a positive manner. One listener commented on how eloquent and well-spoken the readers are – and this makes the school really proud. This is truly the positive power of reading making a difference."

### Work progressing well on library project

WORK is progressing well on the redevelopment of Culcheth Library – and it should be open soon.

The library has been closed since March while work goes on to modernise the building in Warrington Road. In addition to refurbishing the

library frontage, creating a new community space, and improving the interior decor and shelving, the refurbishment will also create a

new community event space.

Moreover, the revamp is aimed at providing greater flexibility for library and community activities using internal spaces. This will also help to promote pride in the library, which will encourage more people

The plans for the redevelopment have been produced by Warrington Borough Council and LiveWire, - which manages the library – in conjunction with the Friends of

Culcheth Library group.

During the closure period library users are being encouraged to use their nearest library services at Birchwood or via LiveWire's online resources which include free e-books and e-audio items as well as a wealth of online reference material available to use at home.



# Outline plan for 110 homes on land currently in the Green Belt

AN outline planning application has been submitted to Warrington Borough Council for 110 homes on Green Belt land at Rixton-with-Glazebrook.

The scheme submitted by Richborough Estates involves 4.27 hectares of open land south west of Hollins Green – land currently in the Green Belt but proposed for removal from the Green Belt in the draft Warrington Local Plan.

Applicants say the site is currently open land along Manchester Road. But they say it is close to the Hollins Green local centre, where there is a wide range of shops and services.

The proposal is for a development of a high-quality homes with provision of significant open space, including amenity green space and children's

Access to the development would be from Manchester Road.
Warrington Borough Council officers have indicated that while the site is proposed for removal from the Green Belt in the emerging draft local plan, any application made prior to adoption of the plan should be considered as development in the Green Belt, which would be considered inappropriate.

# House of "relatively unique appearance" approved

PLANNING chiefs at Warrington have given the go ahead for a house of "relatively unique appearance" – despite objections from a parish

Croft Parish Council opposed the scheme in Smithy Brow, close to the village centre, because of its impact on the Green Belt.

They also expressed concern that it would create a second row behind

the existing houses.

But Warrington Borough Council planning officers – who recommended the scheme be approved – said there was no established building line in Smithy Brow and that the development would have no impact on the Green Belt.

The scheme involves a single-storey H-shaped house consisting of two wings connected by a central porch. It would have four bedrooms and a detached car port for three

Officers said while the dwelling would have a relatively unique appearance in the area, Smithy Brow was not characterised by one type, scale or design of dwelling.

As the majority of the development would not be visible from the highway, the scheme would fit suitably into its surroundings.

### An introduction to the world of "Making Chutney!"

MEMBERS of the newly merged Culcheth and Newchurch (Sundial) WI were given an interesting talk on the world of "Making Chutney" at their June meeting.

Griffiths Eileen President welcomed Melanie Latham as "Jerusalem" speaker and after "Jerusalem" accompanied by Margaret Jones members settled down to enjoy introduction to the world of

'Making Chutney'

Melanie had already set out her ingredients and an electric ring with a very big preserving pan. She began with tales from her past life while she worked away at past life while she worked away at the mixture in the pan, beginning with cider vinegar and salt. Her grandmother taught her the first basics. Melanie carried on with paring red onions and pears while she talked and members were told to avoid cutting into onion roots to avoid watering eyes. Melanie also learned to make pickles with a low sugar content for her diabetic mother and she always uses plain white sugar. Two oranges (zest and juice) and beetroot for colour went into the pan and lastly fresh ginger root.
