Andy Carter MP not seeking re-election at next General Election



WARRINGTON South MP Andy Carter has announced that he does not intend to seek re-adoption as the Prospective Parliamentary Candidate for the Conservative Party in Warrington South at the next General Election.

He has also dismissed rumours that he will be seeking election for the Tory safe seat of Tatton, which is set to encompass Lymm, where he currently lives, stating that he plans

to "pursue new opportunities." Confirming his decision Mr Carter said:"I've thought long and hard about this decision, it is and hard about this decision, it is a tremendous honour to be able to represent all Warrington South residents in Parliament and I love being able to help constituents. However, having discussed with my family I plan to pursue new opportunities, so now is the right time to be open with constituents. time to be open with constituents and my local party.

In the meantime, Mr Carter says he will continue to serve in his current role until the time of the next General Election and remains fully committed to championing local priorities in Parliament such as prioritising the redevelopment of brownfield land at Fiddlers Ferry, improving public transport locally as a result of £42m Government funding to secure a new fleet of zero emission buses, and working with the Conservative Councillors on Warrington Borough Council holding the Labour administration to account.

New Zebra crossing due to safety concerns over infirm pedestrians

HIGHWAY planners have given notice of a new pedestrian crossing on a busy stretch of road at Lymm – due to concerns over the number of infirm pedestrians attempting to cross the road.

Rush Green Road near Sainsbury's has been highlighted as a location where the volume of vehicles and the pedestrians using the route are sufficient that pedestrians are experience difficulties with finding suitable gaps in the traffic flows to cross safely.

This is of particular concern due to the volume of pedestrians that are of infirm nature requiring additional time to cross the road. Warrington Borough Council highway planners say the implementation of a pedestrian crossing at this location will create a safe place for pedestrians to cross the road.

For this reason it is required to provide notice for the provision of the crossing to support the scheme: Schedule 1 – Zebra Crossing on Rush Green Road, located approximately 6m West of the junction with Reddish Crescent

The Council proposes to exercise its powers conferred by Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended and of all other enabling powers, by the installation of a Zebra Crossing facility on the road as specified in the schedule to this Notice.

Plan to convert Indian restaurant into Domino's Pizza takeaway

PLANNERS have been asked to approve proposals to convert an Indian restaurant in Lymm village centre into a Domino's Pizza takeaway.

The application by DPSK Ltd seeks planning permission for the change of use of the ground floor unit, together with facilitating works to provide extract and ventilation equipment and a replacement shopfront.

exiract and venifiation equipment and a replacement shopfront. A planning impact statement produced by The Pegasus Group says the proposal involves the existing ground floor unit being converted to a hot food takeaway, to be occupied by Domino's once all necessary consents are in place.

The proposed takeaway will operate between 11.00 and 23.00 daily and will generate a number of full-time and part-time employment opportunities. Employees will be sourced locally.

The conversion will provide 91.5 m2 takeaway floorspace with the customer service area and a kitchen/ service area at the front of the unit, storage and office area in a central position, and cold room, wash up and staff welfare facilities at the rear of the unit.

The ground floor residential access will remain unaffected by the proposals.

A space for refuse storage will be provided within the rear yard where there is existing refuse storage associated with the current use and easy access via the car park to Rectory Road where bins can be taken to the relevant kerbside for collection in accordance with a schedule to be arranged by the occupant.

In order to facilitate the operation of the unit as a hot food takeaway, it is proposed to install extract and ventilation equipment.

It is proposed to install exited with ventilation equipment. The extract will run from the hood above the oven to exit via the rear elevation using the existing extract duct. A new roof hood will be installed at the termination point above the flat roof. Fine filtration will be included within the cooker hood and an ozone odour neutralising system installed within the duct.

and an ozone odour neutralising system installed within the duct. An air handling unit will be installed internally, and the intake point will be via a louvred vent on the rear elevation.

Air conditioning and cold room plant will be within a covered storage area in the rear yard which is open at the sides to allow air flow. The units will be wall-mounted using antivibration mounts.

The application site is in an existing town centre use [Class E restaurant] and no additional floorspace is proposed that would introduce a new commercial use in an edge-ofcentre location. Furthermore, the site is currently operating as a restaurant with ancillary takeaway, so the change of use would not result in a significant change to the operations at the site, or to the level of trade that would be received at the unit.

The applicants say the statement has demonstrated that the proposed takeaway is appropriate at the site, replacing a similar operation and retaining the existing ratio of food and drink uses in Lymm. The use can be accommodated without causing harm to the vitality or viability of the centre, and there will be no impacts on amenity as a result of the change of use.

It has also been demonstrated that there will be no unacceptable impacts on highway safety arising from the takeaway use, and the external alterations will not have an unacceptable impact on the character and appearance of the Conservation Area

Conservation Area. Warrington Borough Council planners will make a decision on the application.

20's Plenty founder accuses "Loophole" lawyer of "talking rubbish" over calls to restrict 20 mph zones

LYMM-based 20's Plenty founder and campaigner Rod King has hit back at calls from high-profile lawyer Nick "Loophole" Freeman to restrict 20 mph zones to high-risk areas.

The prominent, lawyer known for getting high-profile clients off motoring offences, including speeding, has called for 20 mph zones to be restricted to high-risk areas such as roads outside schools areas such as roads outside schools. rather than becoming the norm in towns.

But his comments have come under fire from Mr King, who founded the 20's Plenty campaign to improve road safety and save lives, accusing Mr Freeman of "talking rubbish" with "no evidence" to support his comments. He hit back after Mr Freeman

spoke out against 20mph zones, telling GB News: "To me, it's counterintuitive, it's generally too slow, because what happens is you're so obsessed with trying to keep it to 20 miles an hour, that you're looking at the speedometer all the time.

"As drivers, what we need to be doing is concentrating on our speed but other things as well, what other cars are doing, who's around us, except there's a whole combination of things that we need to be looking at. "I

drove on Edgware Road

last night, having come off the motorway, and the car kept going up to 21 and 22 and I had to keep putting my foot on the brake to keep under 20, obviously cognizant of the fact that if you go more than 10% plus one you're going to be prosecuted. And that's what's happening."

In a discussion with Arlene Foster, he said: "I'm not suggesting we should never have 20-mile-an-hour speed limits, I think there's a time

speed limits, I think there's a time and a place for them. The time is obviously school run and school time and certain places. "But by and large, it's too slow. In London, they've got 50 miles at the moment which are subject to 20-mile-an-hour speed limits, they want in 2024 for that to be 137 miles. And you have to are yourself. miles. And you have to ask yourself, what is it achieving?

"The statistics actually show that it has very little impact on safety. And my view is when some proper research is done, obviously, you're not going to hurt someone as much as 20 miles an hour, but you're probably going to have more accidents because you're not concentrating on what you should

be concentrating on." He added: "I'd like to see it being targeted, be selective at the right times, but not just a blanket let everyone go 20 miles an hour, because it's counterintuitive and it causes anger for drivers, drivers who are sitting on empty roads in the early hours of the morning being restricted to 20 miles an hour.

"It's incredibly frustrating. The majority, over 40%, say we break it because we don't understand it. It doesn't make sense. So surely we need to collaborate.

"Most motorists, the majority are sensible, they are law-abiding, we just need to have something that works for all of us."

But in response, Mr King, who received the MBE in 2013 for his services to road safety, said: "He is talking rubbish. It takes no longer to check your speedo at 20mph than it does at 30mph. And for any comparate driver they would any competent driver they would acclimatise themselves as to what 20mph "feels like" so they don't have to continuously check their speedo.

"It is just driver exceptionalism. All a driver has to do to keep to 20mph is to occasionally check their speedo taking perhaps half a second. A pedestrian (including



children, disabled, and elderly) who wishes to cross the road needs to look right, check for cars, judge their distance, judge their speed, look left, check for cars, judge their distance, judge their speed, compute time to cross road, check right again and then cross the road if all is OK.

"The increase in drivers going to court for speeding is nothing to do with increassed 20mph limits. There is no evidence for this. In fact, police forces with the highest increase in court speeding appearances were Gloucestershire, Nottinghamshire Gloucestershire, Nottinghamshire and Leicestershire. None are known for regular 20mph enforcement and in none of these have they had increased 20mph roll-outs in the period chosen. So, no causation or even correlation.

"In short the article is just lazy journalism looking to push an "anti-motorist" scare story,"added Mr King.

Care Centre rated "Good" in all areas



THE recently opened Statham Manor Care Centre at Lymm, has been rated a "good" in all areas following an inspection by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

New Statham Manor

The newly built care home on the site of the former Lymm Hotel, provides residential and nursing care to people, some of whom lived with dementia. At the time of the interaction there was 20 people inspection there were 20 people living in the home.

During the inspection, inspectors found systems were in place to monitor the quality and safety of the service. A schedule of audits had been implemented but these could be further developed to improve the effectiveness of the checks. People and their relatives stated the home was well managed and they could raise any complaints or concerns they had with the knowledge they would be listened to, and action would be taken to address the issues

Systems were in place to manage medicines safely, but they could be improved further and inspectors made a recommendation about this. Staff had undertaken medication training and had their competency assessed and medicines were stored securely. However, records to guide staff when to administer medicines prescribed as and when

needed, required further detail. Most risks had been assessed and were reflected within people's plans of care. People said they felt safe living in the home. They were supported by trained staff who had been safely recruited and there were enough staff available to support people when they needed it.

Effective systems were in place to maintain the safety of the building and help minimise the spread of infections within the home. Staff were aware of their safeguarding responsibilities and how to raise

any concerns. People were supported to have

maximum choice and control of their lives and staff supported them in the least restrictive way possible and in their best interests; the policies and systems in the service supported this practice. However, inspectors made a recommendation regarding the use of mental capacity assessments as they could be completed more robustly. Records showed people's nutritional needs that and preferences were assessed, and people said they enjoyed the meals available.

Feedback regarding the care and support people received was positive. People said they were well cared for, and that staff were kind, caring and worked in ways that protected their privacy. Staff encouraged people's people's

Statt encouraged people's independence where possible and systems in place supported people to be involved in decisions regarding their care. Most care plans were detailed and reflected people's needs and preferences.

Staff were trained to support people at the end of their lives and support provided to people at those times was complimented by relatives. A range of activities were available for people to participate in, and people were supported to maintain relationships that were important to them.

The inspection was prompted in part due to concerns received about the care and support provided to people. A decision was made to inspect and examine those risks. Inspectors found no evidence during this inspection that people were at risk of harm from this concern.


Church members are excited about the new building and know that it will be a great asset to both

Your pet questions answered

Q: I think my dog needs to be referred to a specialist, can I self-refer him, or do I need to go through my vet? A: Sadly, you can't currently self-refer

A: Sadiy, you can reurrently self-reter your pet to a specialist, because the specialist will need to know all the case details from your current vet to properly diagnose your dog. However, you can find a veterinary specialist you'd like your dog to see and ack your your to profer your pot to and ask your vet to refer your pet to them on your behalf.

Q: I am planning on moving to Australia for a year or so, and plan on taking my cat with me. How do I go about organising everything? Can I take her on the plane with me? A: How exciting for you both! When moving a cat over to Australia, there are set steps that need to be followed, including eligibility requirements, microchipping, vaccinations, parasite treatments and clinical examinations. You will also need to apply for an import permit and get a Veterinary Health Certificate. Once your cat has arrived in Australia, she will also need to complete a 10-day quarantine in a special facility too. You can find out more about the steps involved online. All the best with your new adventure!

Q: I have just got my son a pet rabbit, and I was told by the person I got her from that I will need to get her vaccinated. Is this necessary even if she never leaves my property? A: The short answer is yes! Some of the diseases that rabbits are

vaccinated against aren't just spread from bunny to bunny, they can be carried by flies, fleas and mosquitos. We have a Pet Health Plan for rabbits that includes 2 check ups with



a vet each year, 25% off Flystrike preventative treatment, and their essential annual vaccines too. If you are interested, you can find out more on our website

Q: What is the best age to get the best possible hip score from my dog? A: The consensus among canine orthopaedic specialists is that the best possible score can be achieved after your dog reaches the age of 1. If a dog has got excellent hips, then the timing of this xray will won't make much difference. However, if their hips are average or worse than average then the care may be a few average then the score may be a few points higher months later.

Q: I have a young dwarf Dutch rabbit. He keeps moving his head from side to side, his eyes seem different, and he seems unable to balance. He is

he seems unable to balance. He is also very subdued and off his food. What is wrong with him? A: It sounds very much like your bunny has got an inner ear infection which has irritated the nerves that affect balance. He will need to be prescribed antimicrobial and anti- inflammatory medication and this should clear it up within 2 – 4 weeks. The infection could be caused weeks. The infection could be caused by either a parasite or bacterial infection. It is best to get this checked by a vet so you can begin treating it as soon as possible.
