# Editor's Comment

## THEY say a week is a long time in politics – well now 24 hours is a long time in politics!

Shortly after Warrington South MP Andy Carter announced he was not seeking re-election, three of his colleagues, including former Prime Minister Boris Johnson announced they were quitting the Government with immediate effect, sparking byelections.

While I'm sure Mr Carter's decision not to seek re-election had nothing to do with the decision taken by his colleagues, it does reflect the state of Government at the moment which does little to steady the ship in such uncertain times.

Putting politics aside and having worked with many MPs representing both the Conservatives and Labour over the past four decades, I know Andy has been a hard working constituency MP, who is highly thought of by many in the community and while the next General Election is not expected until later next year, I would like to

take this opportunity to wish him well for the future – where ever and whatever that may involve.

The decision by the boundary commission to move Lymm out of Warrington South into Tatton clearly played a big part in Andy's decision making process – as it wiped out a huge chuck of his majority - and with the Government's current ratings, almost zero success of holding the seat at the next General Election – although like I said at the opening of this piece – 24 hours is a long time in politics – so the political landscape could be completely different this time next year- although I very much doubt it!

Meanwhile, the actual decision to place Lymm in Tatton, while retaining services from Warrington Borough Council, appears to be completely ludicrous. It means we will have an MP from Tatton, who has no working relationship with our elected Warrington Borough





### Councillors.

When people want to escalate local issues they will have to deal with local Borough councillors and an MP down the road in Tatton.

I see absolutely no logic in it whatsoever and would love to hear from anybody who can highlight the benefits to me?

Meanwhile deepest condolences to Cllr Graham Friend following the sad death of his wife Diana from cancer, during his term of office as deputy mayor. His decision to stand down from forthcoming Mayoral duties is totally understandable as Diana would have been his consort.

This means former Mayor, Cllr Steve Wright, will now take over from retiring Mayor Cllr, Jean Flaherty after Warrington Walking Day, from July 1st, being given the rare honour of a second stint as Mayor.

Having known Steve for many years, including his time as Mayor more than a decade ago back in 2012, I am sure the chain of office will be in a safe pair of hands.

Finally, congratulations to Jean on her term of office. She has been a great ambassador for our town and I am sure she will continue to remain busy as a hard working local councillor and as a volunteer at the Friends of St Elphin's Park.

# Former soldier to compete at Invictus Games

WHILE a freak training exercise brought his military career to a premature end, Liam Guatella, managed to transform his life overcoming mental and physical challenges and is now in training to represent Team UK at the Invictus Games from 9 -16 September 9-16.


Former Kingsman Liam, now aged 42, and a Head of Year at the Kings Leadership Academy in Woolston, joined the 1st Battalion The Kings Program at the academy The Kings Regiment at the age of 16 and served for three years before transferring to the Royal Military Police where he served around the world for the next eleven years. His overseas postings included Northern Ireland (x2), Hohne (Germany), Iraq x 2 (Telic 1 & Telic 7), Bosnia and Afghanistan.

After sustaining a freak injury during a training exercise he was left with a permanent disability in his left leg and forced to accept a medical discharge in 2012. After leaving service Liam struggled to find a suitable job and was diagnosed with chronic PTSD, which he still tackles on a daily basis. However, despite his, mental and physical challenges, coupled with a lack of academic qualifications, Liam found his calling in a youth engagement role, funded by the Royal British Legion, which then helped Liam to find work in mainstream education as a Learning Support Assistant. In a remarkable turnaround, Liam is now a Head of Year at the Kings Leadership Academy.

Having watched his closest friend Mark win medals at the last Invictus Games, Liam was determined to follow in his footsteps and applied for Team UK 2023, where he will compete in athletics (shot putt &

compete in athletics (shot putt & discus) and indoor rowing. The Royal British Legion helped to support Liam after Service, funding his work with 16–25-year-olds on a youth engagement programme, which helped him to secure employment in mainstream education. But Liam says he faces a daily battle with PTSD. He has already joined Warrington Athletics Club to prepare for the Games. He said: "I refuse to let my disability hold me back, I'll give it a right go. It'll hinder me, but it won't stop me. More than anything I want to be part of a team again!"

# New vision to make borough's libraries more attractive

# A NEW vision has been launched to make Warrington's libraries inclusive, creative, modern and attractive places for the whole community, now and in the future.

Warrington's new three-year strategy, Transforming Warrington's Public Libraries 2023-26' aims to build on the ambitions of the town's library strategy of 2019-2022 – to ensure the borough's library service remains sustainable, relevant and valuable, by meeting the needs of all sections of the community. Delivered by the borough's Libraries Partnership Board, the strategy reflects on achievements of

the past three years, including the work to improve library buildings, work more inclusively with local communities and partners, and to deliver a more varied and inclusive libraries activity and outreach programme. It then looks at the next steps to help libraries thrive in the future and meet the challenges of

falling library users, exacerbated by the Covid pandemic. The strategy places a key emphasis on making Warrington libraries "valued community spaces that make a positive difference to the lives of the people that use them. They are welcoming spaces for all and offer the opportunity for reading, learning, enjoyment, reflection, calm, safety,

creativity, insight and inspiration." Included in the strategy are the stories of local people, who share their experiences of using their community library and the positive difference it has made to them and their families.

Warrington has set out six, key strategic aims for the months and years ahead:

- Encourage and promote enjoyment of reading, learning, creativity, culture, imagination and play.
- Provide children and young people with an engaging and relevant offer to help them fulfil their full potential. Provide
- Embrace technology and digital formats, supporting greater inclusivity in accessing new media
- Support positive physical and mental wellbeing.
- Enable access to up-to-date, accurate and trusted sources of information.

\*Provide attractive, welcoming, inclusive and environmentally sustainable community spaces – a safe and social space for all. The borough council's cabinet member for leisure and community,

Cllr Tony Higgins said: "We remain fully committed to investing in the future of our libraries. We've made great strides in recent years in transforming services by modernising our buildings, engaging with local people so we can better meet their needs and working hard to make our libraries a focal point for communities.

"The Covid-19 closure period had a huge impact on libraries across the country, and that impact is still being felt. That's why we need to work innovatively with LiveWire and other partners to protect and sustain them for the future and drive forward their growth.

"This strategy will help us achieve

these ambitions and will be a valuable tool in guiding our ongoing work to make our libraries places of learning, inspiration and inclusivity places which help people forge vital networks and help support the wider wellbeing of all our communities.

Warrington's Libraries Partnership Board - made up of representatives from the council, LiveWire, the third sector and Friends of Libraries groups – was established at the end of 2017 to help sustain and develop libraries as important community spaces.

# Multi-million pound bus transformation journey given green light

THE next phase of ambitious plans to transform bus services in Warrington, including a new bus priority scheme on the A49 Winwick Road, with cheaper fares, increased reliability and high quality, accessible vehicles - is under way.

Warrington Borough Council's Cabinet has approved the new plans – as part of Warrington's Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) – to move ahead with improvements to services across the board, working in partnership with local bus operators.

It means Warrington's Enhanced Partnership – set up between the council and all local bus operators can drive forward with its work to improve all aspects of bus services. This includes just under £10m investment in bus priority measures and over £6m investment to fund a local fare cap and introduce additional bus services until March 2025.

The council will now enter into operators with local bus service operators to put the BSIP funding into use over the next two years. This work will focus on the provision of additional, more frequent, punctual and reliable services, reduced fares and better ticketing, along with higher quality, more accessible vehicles – including 105 new electric buses.

All Warrington passengers will now benefit from plans to extend the duration of the maximum £2 single fare cap on all bus journeys. While the national scheme ends on 31 October 2023, Warrington will be keeping the cap at £2 for adult fares all the way through to March 2025.

In addition, a fare cap of £1 per single journey for all child fares is being introduced in Warrington – also running to March 2025 – with eligibility extended to all bus passengers aged under 19 years of age.

The local fare caps - which will be promoted by the council and bus operators - will launch local on Saturday 1 July, providing low travel costs for the school holidays

and for days out over the summer. Cabinet has also improved proposals for the development of a new bus priority scheme on the A49 Winwick Road southbound. This will speed up bus services through measures such as sections of new bus lane (which would be via an additional southbound lane, maintaining the existing two lanes for other traffic to use), bus gates and enhanced traffic signal

technology. This scheme will be funded with of capital funding awarded to the council by the Department for Transport to progress BSIP infrastructure.

Meanwhile, good progress continues to be made in delivering the ZEBRA project, which will see the replacement of Warrington's Own Buses' entire fleet of diesel buses with 105 new electric buses, Warrington one of giving largest all-electric bus fleets in the

country. With With work on Warrington's brand new bus depot – which will house the electric fleet – now complete, the next steps are for the council to place the orders for the electric buses and chargers.

As required, the council has referred its proposals to pass the buses and chargers to Warrington's Own Buses at nominal cost to the Subsidy Advice Unit (SAU) of the

Competition and Markets Authority. The SAU has now reviewed and published its formal report on the matter, which means the council can place the orders for the buses and chargers – with the new vehicles coming into service during 2024

The next phase of Warrington's bus improvements programme will build on a range of improvements carried out in recent months, including:

- the Better By Bus initiative with cheaper fares and more frequent evening services
- a borough-wide bus shelters replacement programme
- a new evening service for a key bus route the 329, which runs from Warrington to St Helens via Burtonwood and Winwick

Warrington Borough Council's Cabinet Member for transport, Cllr Hans Mundry, said: "I'm Cllr Hans Mundry, said: "I'm delighted that our ambitious plans for the future of bus services in Warrington have been approved. We are committed to delivering the highest quality bus services, as part of our work to increase bus usage and achieve a mode shift from the car. It's a vital part of our Local Transport Plan (LTP4) and climate emergency commitment.

'To make this vision a reality, we need to deliver a modern, attractive, reliable and affordable bus service – and the next phase of Warrington's bus improvement programme will enable us to make huge strides in achieving this. "Our Enhanced Partnership will

play a key role in this transformation, giving us a fantastic opportunity to work with all operators locally to make significant improvements that will benefit existing passengers and encourage more people to choose the bus for their journeys. "The improvements

improvements planned will ensure that our state-of-the-art, electric buses will be just one part of a much wider package of improvements – including cheaper fares, increased accessibility, faster journey times and improved punctuality, supported by effective bus priority measures.

"It's an exciting time for bus travel in Warrington, as we continue on our journey towards delivering a first class service which is truly fit for the future."

# Laboratories in Warrington to have major role in robotics research

## LABORATORIES in Warrington will play a major role in research into the future of robotics it has been revealed.

Global nuclear engineering giant Jacobs and the University of Manchester are to create a new international research centre to develop robotics and autonomous system's that will play a key role in climate response.

The Centre for Robotic Autonomy in Demanding and Long-lasting Environments (CRADLE) lasting Environments will research new technologies challenging and heavily for regulated industry sectors such as space, nuclear-decommissioning, energy generation and urban infrastructure.

The centre will be co-funded to a total value of £9 million over five years by Jacobs, the University and the U.K. Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council's (EPSRC) Prosperity Partnerships program, which fosters links program,

between academia and industry. "Securing this prestigious Prosperity Partnerships grant allows Jacobs and The University of Manchester to research the autonomous systems that industry needs to solve today's challenges and create a more connected and sustainable world," said Jacobs' energy, security and technology senior vice president Karen

Wiemelt. "Robotics is already a core strength of Jacobs' work in the energy and space sectors and this research collaboration will enable us to develop advanced technologies to help achieve net zero targets, such as autonomous inspection and repair systems to extend the life of water and energy networks, roads, bridges and railways

Jacobs, which is investing more than £3 million, will have investing the opportunity to commercialise technologies developed at CRADLE to bring a step-change impact to clients in urban infrastructure, generation, energy nuclea decommissioning power. and space exploration, where robust and reliable autonomous robotics are crucial for efficient asset management and operations.

"CRADLE will allow the university's recently established Manchester Centre for Robotics and Al to build a relationship with one of the leading organizations involved in applied robotics, helping us to progress our fundamental research in this area and to deliver impact from the robotic and AI systems that we are developing," said centre codirector Professor Barry Lennox.

CRADLE's research remit covers mechatronics, software and how communities and regulators will engage with future robotic systems. Jacobs staff will support 12 PhD students in conducting research and performing prototype demonstrations at The University of Manchester and at Jacobs' robotics laboratories in Warrington.

WARRINGTON has joined other Cheshire councils, the police, Environment Agency and the National Farmers Union to discuss a joint approach to tackle fly-tipping.

Police and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer has brought the various bodies together to discuss a joint approach to tackling waste crime – and believes the public can play their part too. He said: "It's not difficult to

find someone on social media conveniently offering to collect large amounts of waste or scrap, but did you know you could be inadvertently supporting criminal activity? And if illegally dumped waste can be traced back to you, then you could be fined up to £5,000."

Anyone who sees someone offering to collect waste or who is looking to approach someone to dispose of waste for them should ask the following simple questions that any legitimate company should be able to easily answer:

- What is your official company name?
- What is your waste permit number?
- Will you be able to provide a waste transfer note? Mr Dwyer added: "I talk about tackling waste crime in my Police


and Crime Plan, and it's really important that we bring all relevant bodies around the table to discuss a shared approach. Whether you're in an urban or rural area, illegally dumped waste is a blight on communities. We all share the same goal, so it makes sense that we work together and share data to enable us to tackle it.

"But we also know that prevention is better than the cure, and there are easy steps that people can take to stop their waste getting into the hands of fly tippers. Be vigilant and ask those three simple questions. That way you can protect our local environment from waste crime and save yourself from a potential £5,000 fine."

Data on waste crime is often collected by local authorities – who are responsible for clearing incidents of fly tipping – but it is not necessarily shared with the other authorities, the police or other agencies. By working together and sharing data, it will enable the police to build intelligence and target waste crime hotspots across the county.







# New £25.8m care facility approved on former school site

# A NEW intermediate care facility is to be developed on the former Bewsey Old School site in Warrington, following approval at a meeting of Warrington Borough Council's cabinet.

The proposals for the new £25.8million intermediate care facility on Lockton Lane will replace and extend the current provision across multiple sites in the town.

Intermediate care is a free shortterm service where patients receive intensive support from a range of professionals, either in a bed-based facility or via community services, to help them recover from illness or injury and regain their independence so that they can live safely at home for as long as possible, without the need for long-term care.

A report to members outlined the purpose, rationale, benefits and proposal for the provision of a new intermediate care facility for Warrington. The report put forward the preferred option for a new facility on the former school site, to seek approval for the new-build to seek approval for the new-build proposals, and to gain approval for progress to Royal Institute of British Architects 'stage three' design and development, which includes a pre-planning and formal planning application.

The proposal sets out plans to develop a modern and sufficient bed-based facility in the centre of the town that will meet current and future need for the borough.

Bed-based intermediate care means that people will receive care and support at the facility, with a place to rest and recover, on a temporary basis. Plans therefore include the provision for up to 80 beds, split into five wings over three floors, which would enable the closure of all other intermediate

care beds as delivery will be from this single, state-of-the-art site. The site will also feature office space and provision for community intermediate care services, parking for staff and vis and visitors. parking for staff and External facilities also include

ambulance parking, patient drop-off, delivery access and waste storage.

## Taxpayers will now have an extra two years to make additional payments to their National Insurance (NI) contributions to increase state pension entitlements

The cut-off point for voluntary NI contributions from April 2006 to April 2017 has been extended to 5 April 2025 to help people to plug gaps in their NI record - an extension of nearly two years.

HMRC's original plan had set the deadline to 5 April 2023, but in March this was extended to 31 July, following capacity problems on government helplines.

Extending the deadline until 2025 means that taxpayers will have more time to properly consider whether paying voluntary contributions, which could boost their state pension entitlement, is right for them. All relevant National Insurance contributions payments will be accepted at the rates applicable from 2022 to 2023 until 5 April 2025.

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) hopes the extension will grant staff more time to cope with the high level of interest - as

thousands of people are expected to take advantage.

This follows a number of reported problems back in March, as people struggled getting through to either the DWP or HMRC.

# HMRC has confirmed that from tax year 2023 to 2024 onwards, the self assessment threshold for taxpayers taxed through PAYE only, will change from £100,000 to £150,000

Affected taxpayers do not need to do anything now as the self assessment threshold for 2022 to 2023 tax returns remains at £100,000.

They will receive a self assessment exit letter if they submit a 2022-23 return showing income between £100,000 and £150,000 taxed through PAYE and they do not meet any of the other criteria for submitting a self assessment return.

For the 2023-24 tax year onward taxpayers will still

need to submit a tax return if their income taxed through PAYE is below £150,000 but they meet one of the other criteria for submitting a self assessment return, such as:

- receipt of any untaxed income;
- partner in a business partnership;
- liability to the High Income Child Benefit Charge;
- self-employed individual and with gross income of over £1,000.

## HMRC closes taxpayer Self-Assessment helpline until September 2023

Due to huge backlogs of correspondence that HMRC has not been able to deal with following the pandemic, they are directing staff away from handling telephone calls over the quieter summer months and as a result closing their self assessment helpline until

4th September 2023.

The agent helpline will remain open meaning that taxpayers with an authorised agent such as WatkinsonBlack will still be able to access HMRC call handlers to deal with any queries during this period
