Another record-breaking footfall weekend

MORE footfall records were broken during the school holidays as Warrington town centre came alive with the summer extravaganza proving a hit with visitors.

Following Warrington Market's record breaking week the week before, it smashed its own newly set record for the highest ever footfall, with 31,860 visitors coming through the doors, which is nearly 3,000 more than the record set the previous week.

Market footfall on the Saturday was 9,295, compared to 6,770 on the same Saturday last year, and on Sunday, 3,583 people came through the doors, compared to 1,993 on the same Sunday last

Across the weekend (Saturday 29 and Sunday 30 July), special summer events took place across Time Square and the town centre, as the heart of the town came alive with fun and activity with a packed schedule of live performances, art, music, activity and colour.

On Saturday, around 800 people took part in the events throughout the day. Visitors to Time Square enjoyed Street Games, with inclusive and accessible games from around the world, plus live music and dance with BSL performance and interpretation, and the Many Hands parade brought people together to explore the shared communicative power and expressive potential of hands

hands.

'Wake Me Up Before You Dodo', tied in with the environmentally themed events in the town centre, with a family friendly exhibition at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery about endangered wildlife. Also, back by popular demand, Out of the Deep Blue, everyone's favourite eco-friendly puppet Eko returned to Time Square to the delight of visitors for shows on Saturday and Sunday.

Even with the threat of rain on Sunday, around 700 people saw the Eko show in Time Square. Families took to Queens Gardens which hosted a giant whale – The Whale: Plastic Ocean invited bold explorers to encounter an 'aquabatic' diver, a shipwrecked pirate with a treasure tale to tell, a real life mermaid with a haunting siren's song, and an intriguing secret alongside a true-to-life 50ft inflatable sperm whale.

There was also a Sunflowers performance at Palmyra Square, with Culture Warrington presenting a new, eye-catching dance, aerial and hand balancing performance designed for children and families. A 'Be Kind to Our Planet' family workshop completed the day at the Parr Hall, with six local artists hosting a programme of free, dropin workshops themed around the environment.

Cllr Tom Jennings, cabinet member for economic development

and innovation, said: "These new footfall figures, smashing the previous week's numbers, demonstrate that our market, Time Square and the wider town centre continue to go from strength to strength as people visit Warrington for shopping, leisure and family fun, with the summer events programme bringing in the crowds — there truly is something for everyone, so make sure you don't miss out."

The 2023 A-Level results has brought positive news for many Warrington students.

The last three years have been challenging for students who have worked through the COVID pandemic, but it is important to celebrate the achievements of all of our young people.

Three colleges in Warrington supported pupils with A-Levels this year. The results released is initial data and could be subject to

Schools and colleges Warrington have seen an increase in the number of A-Level entries compared to last year.

 The percentage of A-Level entries achieving A* – E for 2023 is 98.1%, which is higher than pre-pandemic results reported in 2019

The percentage of A level entries A* - E pass rate is higher than both the North West (97.4%) and England (97.2%), averages

The percentage of students achieving A* – A, A*– C and A* – E grades is higher than pre-pandemic results reported in 2019

In line with national trends, the pass rate in Warrington has fallen slightly compared to 2022 results, although North West and England averages have fallen at a greater

for children's services, said: "Staff working in our schools and colleges have worked incredibly hard to ensure students were well prepared for exams this year. I would like to thank them for all their hard work and appreciate the support provided often goes above and beyond teaching.

Council received fewer complaints about potholes than almost anywhere else

IT may come as a surprise to Warrington road users, but the borough council received fewer complaints about potholes than almost anywhere else in the North West last year.

Warrington received 569 complaints – and only Blackpool, with 425 and Lancashire, with 536, received fewer.

Near neighbour Halton received 708, Cheshire East 945, St Helens 1482, Salford 2024, . Wigan 2568. Trafford 3419 and Chester West and Chester a whopping 8635.

The figures have been collected by the Federation of Small Businesses (FSB), who use Freedom of Information requests to local authorities to draw up a league table.

The FSB concentrate mainly on authorities in Greater Manchester where they also look at how many legal claims are received for damage caused to vehicles by potholes.

Their research showed that half of Greater Manchester's 10 councils fail to spend their allocated road repair budget.

Wigan had the largest underspend, spending only 75 per

cent of allocated funds on repairs it had budgeted for – despite its hefty 2,568 pothole complaints.

FSB spokesman David Sudworth said: "While a well-maintained road network may be seen by some as a 'nice to have', they're actually rather important. Everybody relies on the road network in one way or another, whether that's getting to work by bus, car or bike, or for businesses to get their goods in and out on time. Our roads, paid for by our taxes, are our most important transport asset, and authorities must continue to invest in them."

When and if you need to complete a tax return

If you normally file a Self Assessment tax return then the deadline for submitting your 2022/23 return is approaching.

You must file your return, and pay any tax you owe, by 31st January 2024. Once you are registered for Self Assessment then you must file a return before this deadline even if you think that you have paid all f the tax due. Failure to do so will result in automatic penalties starting at £100 and reaching £1,800 after 12 months.

You may need to complete a Self Assessment tax return if, between 6th April 2022 and 5th April 2023:

- You worked for yourself as a sole trader or a business partner. This applies even if you had another job as well, or
- You worked as an "off-payroll worker", or contractor, through a personal service company or your own limited company, or
- You had total income in excess of £50,000 and either yourself or your partner claimed child benefit, or

- You had total income in excess of £100,000, or
- You received income in excess of £2,500, or £10,000 before expenses, from UK property or land, ie rental income, or
- You received more than £10,000 from dividends or savings, or
- You received income from a trust, or
- You received income from outside the UK, or
- You received more than £2,500 in commission or cash in hand payments, such as tips, or
- You have made a taxable Capital Gain from selling personal possessions worth more than £6,000 or any other asset such as shares or a holiday home. But be aware that Capital Gains Tax is not payable when you sell your Principal Private Residence, or
- You hold a position of:
- Religious minister
- Lloyds underwrite
- Examiner, moderator or invigilator
- Share fisherman

To help you determine whether you need to submit a Self Assessment tax return the tax office have issued a helpful tool to lead you through these and other questions and this can be found at https://www.gov.uk/check-if-you-need-tax-return.

If you are not already registered for Self Assessment but you meet any of the criteria for needing to submit a Self Assessment tax return then you must inform HMRC who will register you. This can be done on-line or by calling the HMRC helpline. You will then need to submit a tax return by the due date. Normally, you will be expected to submit your return electronically. This can be done through the Government Gateway or by using third party commercial software. If exceptionally you need to submit it manually then you will need to call HMRC and request form SA100. They will then send you a paper copy of the return. All other forms and supplementary pages can be downloaded.

If you needed to file a return in 2021/22 then, in all likelihood, you will have been issued with a Notice To

Complete a Tax Return by the tax office. If you feel that you no longer need to complete a return then you will need to tell HMRC. If you have ceased self employment then you can do this using the on-line form. Otherwise, you can either use HMRC's digital assistant or by post or by telephone call to the HMRC helpline. You will need to provide both your National Insurance number and your Unique Taxpayer Reference (UTR) number. If HMRC agrees that you no longer need to complete a Self Assessment tax return then they will send you a letter confirming that you do not need to do so.

In summary, it is your responsibility to register if you need to submit a return, to submit your tax return by the due date, and to inform HMRC when you no longer need to submit a return.

The clue is in the name – Self Assessment!

Warrington Town star joins Macclesfield



Warrington Town midfielder Luke Duffy has departed the club to join Macclesfield FC for an undisclosed fee.

Duffy, 24, joined the Yellows from Lower Breck in September 2020, and went on to make 92 appearances, scoring 17 goals, with ten of those coming last season, in which he played a pivotal role in Warrington Town's

promotion-winning campaign.

Most recently, the talented winger scored in the club's first-ever National League North fixture in a

4-0 away victory over Southport.
Warrington Town confirmed that they refused an initial offer from the Silkmen, but reluctantly agreed to allow Duffy to leave after indicating that he wanted to depart to join the revitalised Cheshire East outfit.

"The club was approached with an initial offer, which it turned down, and had no intention or reason to sell a key member of the

first team squad," Warrington Town said in a club statement.

"However, despite efforts to persuade him to stay, the player made it clear that he wished to leave the club to take up a more lucrative offer with the Northern Premier League club.

"With that in mind, the club felt it was in its best interests to negotiate the best deal possible rather than having a potentially unhappy player disrupting a pivotal season in the club's history.

Following their impressive start at Southport, it was back down to earth with a bump with their opening home league fixture as they went down 0-2 to Blyth Spartans, followed by two more wins
