

LYMM High School continued its performances as one of the very top performing state schools in the North-West with another very impressive set of GCSE results.

Oliver, 23, saved the lives of four people through organ donation

A 23-year-old man from Lymm who saved the lives of four people through the gift of organ donation has been posthumously honoured at a moving award ceremony.

Oliver Wright was one of a number of people from across the North West who received the Order of St John for Organ Donation at a ceremony in Manchester. He was the eldest of four – he had a brother and two sisters – and had passed his Class 1 HGV at an early age. Oliver was working for a

Oliver was working for a Manchester based haulage firm, CSM (North West) Ltd – driving all over the UK.

He had signed up for organ donation and was able to donate to four people, giving his kidneys, pancreas and liver. Oliver also donated heart tissue.

donated heart tissue. His Dad Simon said: "Oliver's big passion in life was driving – cars and big trucks! Oliver was a beautiful, fun loving young man – the best friend you could wish for always, willing to help others even if things were not going well for himself. Oliver was the character that got everybody going at a party and was a larger-than-life personality in a room.

himself. Oliver was the character that got everybody going at a party and was a larger-than-life personality in a room. "Oliver passed his driving test as soon as he possibly could – going on to pass his Class 2 HGV and then as soon as he could he went in for his Class 1 HGV – all of which he passed first time. Everyone remarked on such a young man driving these huge articulated trucks wherever he went. "He was the first of his three

"He was the first of his three siblings to join the local primary school – always ready to support and make friends with anyone that wasn't too confident or needed a friend to help them. This kind and caring nature would stay with him throughout his life – looking after his brother and sisters but also friends whenever anybody needed help, Oliver was always offering to help wherever he could. "Oliver also went out of his way to

"Oliver also went out of his way to give time and spoke to neighbours young and old whenever he saw them. Oliver was always willing to give his time up for others and it came as no surprise that Oliver had chosen to help others if anything was to ever happen to himself. "Oliver's death came suddenly in the hospital and as a family we

"Oliver's death came suddenly in the hospital and as a family we were asked about organ donation. In the moment when the news of losing a loved one is at its most raw and painful – the very thought of thinking about anything else is extremely difficult to absorb and even more difficult to consider anything other than the most awful news that has just been given. "The organ donation team are extremely well versed in handling this point in time and use a very patient and considerate method,

"The organ donation team are extremely well versed in handling this point in time and use a very patient and considerate method, however they are tasked with delivering the question and finding out if it is a possibility in a very restricted time frame.

derivering ine question and manning out if it is a possibility in a very restricted time frame. "We as a family discussed the possibility of organ donation for Oliver and we arrived at the decision to say yes – we were then told that Oliver himself had previously given consent to organ donation. He had signed the register when he got his driving licence, off his own back and we didn't know. We found it massively comforting to know that both us and Oliver believed in the same value of organ donation and we knew we were doing the right thing.

of organ donation and we knew we were doing the right thing. "Organ donation is a decision that you hope to never have to make but it's a decision that can change lives – it was also to prove something that we as a family have found huge comfort in and has given us a legacy to hold onto which we would not have had without the organ donation.

"When we were contacted to inform us of the Order of St Johns awards we were 100 per cent sure that we wanted to attend in Oliver's name. The occasion is very poignant especially when you see other families who have lost someone – but the pride and love in the room from all those people is very moving.

very moving. "We are immensely proud of Oliver and the gift that he has been able to give others means we know somewhere a little part of him continues.

"For us the loss of Oliver has left us with a permanent hole in our lives where he used to be – the thought that out in the world other families have perhaps been saved that same loss gives us a great deal of comfort."

of comfort." Oliver's mum is Jill and his siblings are Henry, Scarlett and Harriett.

Harriett. Mick Messinger, Chancellor of the Priory of England and the Islands of the Order of St John, said: "It is a pleasure and privilege to work with NHS Blood and Transplant again on a 10th year of ceremonies to mark the wonderful gifts of life given by people who chose to donate organs and their families who supported them in this decision. These events are always very emotional and I pay tribute to all the families that attend and, most of all, to their loved ones who have selflessly helped others to live after their own passing."

"The impact of Covid on national results over the past three years means that we need to be a little careful making direct comparisons but, taking into account that we have returned to pre-Covid patterns across England, A' level results today are the best that Lymm High School has ever had. Given that outcomes in the Sixth Form have been consistently excellent for some years now, this really is quite an achievement, and everyone involved deserves huge congratulations. It is genuinely humbling to be able to work with such fantastic staff and students, and I am a very proud Headteacher this morning."

Plan for Alpaca shelter

PLANNERS are being asked to approve proposals for an to approve proposals for an agricultural field shelter for Alpaca grazing off Cherry Lane in Lymm. A full planning application for the erection of a 24 unit agricultural

the erection or a 24 unit agricultural field shelter in association with the use of land adjacent of Cherry Lane for alpaca grazing has been submitted on behalf of the Egerton Trust, which also has an Alpca Farm at nearby Thelwall The works will also consist of a

The works will also consist of a new paddock fence and gate which benefit from permitted development

rights. The proposal seeks consent for the erection of a 24-unit agricultural field shelter to support the use of the land for alpaca grazing. For clarity, the site will not be used for clarity, the site will not be used for alpaca trails or any commercial use but rather for agricultural grazing of alpacas. This will allow rotation of other grazing lands owned and controlled by The Egerton Trust and to allow the separation of alpacas when required when required.

The proposal seeks a "modest" timber-construction alpaca shelter for up to 24 alpacas to the South East of the site.

The alpaca shelter will measure

approximately 7.8 x 15.8m and will be a maximum height of 3.6m. The British Alpaca Society

The British Alpaca Society recommends that sustainable acreage for alpaca farming is approximately one acre per five animals (however ten alpacas can be kept per acre if it is possible to supplement the grass with hay and clean up more often as well as

rotate the pastures). The paddock on site will be more than 3 acres, meaning the proposed number of alpacas are

proposed number of alpacas are well within the recommended capacity. A new secure paddock fence line and gate will be erected – these will be less than 2m in height and therefore benefit from permitted development rights. The site will be accessed directly via Cherry Lane. It is anticipated the site will only be accessed sporadically by small vehicles tending to the alpacas. No engineering improvements are proposed or required to access the field, though ground protection mats can be used where required. Warrington Borough Council

Warrington Borough Council planners will make a decision under delegated powers.

Your pet questions answered

By Dr Diane Wilshaw Lymm Veterinary Surgery

Q: My dog has torn his nail – what should I do?

A: Ideally, you will need to remove the part of the nail that has torn off with clippers and wash the area with warm water. Often this type of injury leaves exposed tissue that will be sore and sensitive so it's often best to contact us so we can help or advise you to come in, sometimes a local anaesthetic injection is given into the area prior to removal, this can be a quick procedure and the area may need to be bandaged and often medications are prescribed to keep the grace from becoming inflamed the area from becoming inflamed, infected and to keep your dog out of discomfort. It's essential to keep nail beds from becoming dirty as they can quickly develop into infections as a dog's paws are often quite dirty. We can help advise on how to avoid this

Q: My dog has a sticky eye with pus visible. I am bathing it with cool boiled water several times a day, but

A: This sounds like it could be bacterial conjunctivitis which will need to be treated by a vet with antibiotic eye drops. Your vet will also check that there are no ulcers or lacerations that have caused this. For any eye issues like this, it is better to use an eye-safe saline solution rather than boiled water. This needs to be bought over the counter. Don't be tempted to make salt water at home as it is difficult to get the quantities right which may cause irritation to your dog.

Q: My vet has told me that my young cat has a heart murmur. I have read all sorts of things on the internet and



now I am totally confused – please help. A: Vets grade heart murmurs from 1

A: Vets grade heart murmurs from 1 to 6. A grade one murmur is hardly detectable and may have no real impact whilst a grade 6 will most likely seriously affect a cat's activity levels and life expectancy. You need to speak to your vet to find out what grade it is and then they will work with you to manage the condition. with you to manage the condition. They may need to do blood tests to check on the heart's condition or ultrasound/X-Ray the chest to get the best idea of how it may affect your cat

Q: My cat keeps squatting as if to have a pee and just stares ahead, but nothing happens. Can you tell me what it might be please? A: The increase in frequency of urination or trying to urinate is most likely caused by a disease called FLUTD (feline lower urinary tract disease). Causes can include infections, bladder stones, inflammation and even stress! Your cat will need to be seen by a vet to check it out. It is particularly important if you have a male cat with these symptoms that you seek advice quickly as some male cats can develop a blockage in the urethra which means they cannot pass any urine at all and this can be fatal if left untreated.
