

Official opening for updated Culcheth Library

THE refurbished and updated Culcheth Library is to be officially opened on Friday, November 10.

Children's author and scriptwriter Frank Cottrell-Boyce will perform the opening ceremony together with Professor Steven Broomhead, chief executive of Warrington Borough Council.

Other council officers have also been invited to the event and also present will be members of the Friends of Culcheth Library, who campaigned for the library upgrade and raised money towards the cost of the scheme.

The project has involved infilling an existing courtyard to create an additional room, removing the existing entry porch, installation of a gantry canopy to service the

library entrance and an extension to the front entrance.

Children from local primary schools and Culcheth High School will give presentations at the opening, which will start at 2pm.

Frank Cottrell-Boyce is a screenwriter, novelist and actor known for his children's fiction and his collaborations with film director Michael Winterbottom.

He was the writer for the opening ceremony of the 2012 Summer Olympics and has won major awards for his children's books. He was at one time on the writing staff of Coronation Street.

Care home chef crowned champion in MasterChef-style competition

A CROFT care home chef has taken home the crown after cooking up a storm in a MasterChef-style competition run by not-for-profit care provider, Sanctuary Care.

Sarah Ashton, chef manager at High Peak Residential and Nursing Home in Main Lane, Kenyon, Croft emerged victorious amongst 13 finalists in the annual competition, which follows a similar format to

the popular BBC series.

The competition saw chefs from over 100 care homes in England and Scotland battle it out to produce a two-course menu in under 90 minutes.

A panel of judges assessed the dishes for taste, culinary flair, creativity, and presentation.

Inspired by her children's favourite cuisine, Sarah prepared a delectable chicken katsu curry with coconut rice as her main course. This was followed by one of the care home's most popular desserts, a rhubarb crumble cheesecake.

Sarah said: "The competition was fierce, so I am feeling very proud to have won! As a care home chef, it means a lot to have our culinary skills recognised."

"I've always loved cooking but working in a care home kitchen is a completely different experience, which brings with it unique challenges and a whole new level of satisfaction."

"Preparing menus which cater to our residents' wide range of preferences and dietary requirements requires a certain level of creativity, but knowing how much they look forward to mealtimes is incredibly fulfilling – particularly when they share positive feedback."

Weekend road closures confirmed at Croft

VARIOUS weekend road closures have been confirmed near the junction of the M6 at Croft to allow construction works associated with the Parkside Development at nearby Newton-le-Willows.

The closures scheduled in November, December and January, will come into force on a Friday evening from 9 pm to 6 am Monday, in a bid to minimise traffic disruption during the working week.

Warrington Borough Council has made an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of driving on Winwick Lane from its junction with M6 junction 22 to its junction with Stone Pit Lane.

The Order will be effective from 9 pm on Friday 3rd November 2023 to 6 am on Monday 6th November 2023, 9 pm on Friday 1st December 2023 to 6 am on Monday 4th December 2023, 9 pm on Friday 26th January 2024 to 6 am on Monday 29th January 2024, as and when signed on site.

Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the duration of the works. The alternative route will be via Winwick Link Road, Newton Road, Winwick Road, Mill Lane, Southworth Road, Newton Road and vice versa.

The closure is required to allow for the construction works associated with the Parkside Development.

Now the winter rains have arrived remember to ensure better drainage in your pots and containers.

Plant Area Specialist

- There are a surprising number of plants that perform well over the winter period, often they are well scented - examples include Sarcococca, Hamamelis and Mahonia
- Areas of the border, that are currently empty, can be dug over and enriched with blended manure for next year's planting
- Cut down any herbaceous plants that have finished flowering and that do not have a strong winter structure. Weed and fork gently between them



New bus services for Culcheth



NEW late bus services are now running into and out of Culcheth by Warrington's Own Buses.

The last 19 leaves Warrington at 23:15 and turns around at Culcheth Library and heads back at 23:45 - the 28a runs onto Leigh with the last service heading to Leigh at around 23:30 - every journey costs a maximum of £2 (£1 for under 19s) and a day pass for £5 is available if you make multiple journeys.

Welcoming the news local resident Nick Taylor said: "This is a massive boost to those wanting to

access both Culcheth and the town centre and beyond in terms of the night time and leisure economy. I'm trying to use the bus as much as possible as it's now much more economic than the car - the app has a live tracker on so you know where your bus is at anytime.

"Many services have WiFi and usb charging on board - so I may sound like a sales person for them but I'm not - I just think it's time to get out of the car and support public transport and save some money and if we don't use this we will lose it - please support!"

Vandals running amok on village playing fields

VANDALS have been running amok on village playing fields at Culcheth – uprooting trees and smashing equipment.

Nearby residents say a group of hooded youths riding pedal cycles have been visiting Shaw Street Recreation Ground of a night and repeatedly vandalising the area.

Volunteer litter pickers who regularly clean up the area were shocked when they discovered the damage.

Cllr Sue Bland has tabled a report for the next meeting of

Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council.

She said: "We have got to get something done about it. The matter has been reported to police, but nothing seems to have been done so far.

"Nearby residents say the offenders arrive almost every evening. Trees are smashed or uprooted and bushes torn down.

A shelter provided for users of a skatepark has been damaged.

"One parish councillor went down one evening with a video camera but, of course, the offenders didn't show up that night. They may

have seen him – I don't know."

Trees and bushes that have been growing for years have been smashed by the hooligans

Evidence of drug use has also been found in the area.



Magnificent seven raise over £10k for Steve Prescott Foundation with epic cycling challenge

CULCHETH based sandwich bar owner Ian Barker was part of a team of seven cyclists to conquer the Mont Ventoux cycling challenge, helping raise over £10,000 for the Steve Prescott Foundation.

Ian, owner of Brunch Sandwich Bar in the village, recently completed the epic charity challenge with six other cyclists for the Steve Prescott Foundation established to provide funds for both The Christie Hospital and the Rugby League Benevolent Fund, which offers help to those who have been seriously injured playing one of the world's toughest sports.

Mont Ventoux has been stirring things up in the Tour de France world since it was first introduced over 60 years ago. It became

infamous when it claimed the life of the British rider Tom Simpson in 1967 and has since become a Mecca for cyclists from all over the world wanting to battle this iconic moonscape of a climb.

Commenting on the experience Ian said: "From my own personal point it was one of the toughest challenges I've trained for. We got lucky with the weather as Mont Ventoux often has high winds but we got clear blue skies. The relentless climbing took its toll going into the last climb from the village

of Sault as this was the longest ascent. At this stage the weather was 28 degrees and no real shade on the mountain. Personally I broke the challenge down into stages and when I turned at Chalet Reynard I knew I had 6km to go and although it was an average of 9% gradient for those 6km I just grinded it out and then enjoyed the descent

back to Malaucene. It was a great achievement by all seven cyclists and a challenge that if Stephen was still with us today he would have hugely welcomed. The support team was fantastic and made sure we was well fuelled (with a few Brunch Flapjacks as well). I'd like to thank everyone that has donated its hugely appreciated."

Keep Taking the Tablets!

THE speaker for Croft WI October meeting was Stephen Freeborn, a retired pharmacist, who entertained members with some amusing, enlightening and sometimes alarming anecdotes from his long career.

Stephen graduated as a pharmacist in 1974 and when he first started work medicines were still being prepared by individual pharmacists using ingredients listed in books called formularies. Before World War II these books were all in Latin but in 1955 the government produced the National Formulary which thankfully was in English. Nowadays pharmacists use the British Pharmacopoeia and the initials B.P. can be found on some tablets. The pharmacist's role has changed from preparing medicines to becoming a vital source of information for doctors and patients on the uses and side effects of medicines. A serious and responsible job, but pharmacists also need a good sense of humour to cope with the queries they have to answer. Stephen recalled some of these:

"When I take this medicine for my right hand how does it know where to go?"

"My wife's on these tablets and it says don't drink, drive or operate machinery, can she put the washer on?"

"These tablets say take in water but I haven't got a bath"

"I won't be able to go home on the bus because it says keep away from children"

"The paste says apply to the trunk but I haven't got one"

"I've put these suppositories up my nose but they're not helping with my breathing".

Stephen's job involved visiting a few patients at home and he witnessed some alarming solutions to the sometimes tricky problem of how to open a child-proof bottle

cap - he has seen a hole made in the cap with a drill, the base sawn off with a hacksaw and one old lady had even made a hole in the bottle with a red hot poker! None of these ideas are recommended and Stephen advised that a pharmacy should be able to supply a normal bottle cap if requested.

Another useful piece of advice concerned the storage of medicines. All hospital wards have two cabinets to store internal and external medicines separately. It is wise to do this at home as well - you really don't want your piles cream to be touching your cough mixture!

Laughter is the best medicine and Anne Lamming gave the vote of thanks to Stephen for giving such an entertaining talk.
