Up to 12 weeks of road closures on main route between Croft and Culchet

UP to 12 weeks of road works are scheduled on the main route between Croft and Culcheth, starting at the end of January.

The works along Mustard Lane, from its junction with Lady Lane and along Wigshaw Lane, will be carried out in three phases while Electricity North West install a new electrical cable.

Warrington Borough Council has made a prohibition of driving temporary order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act
1984. The effect will be to introduce
a prohibition of driving as follows:
Mustard Lane from its junction
with Lady Lane to its junction with
Wigshaw Lane; Wigshaw Lane
from its junction with Mustard Lane to its junction with Common Lane.

The Order will be effective from

29th January 2024 for 12 weeks, as and when signed on site. The works will be carried out in phases, with only one phase being implemented at any one time: Phase 1: Mustard Lane from Lady Lane to Wigshaw Lane and Wigshaw Lane Wigshaw Lane and Wigshaw Lane from Mustard Lane to Glaziers Lane; Phase 2: Wigshaw Lane from Glaziers Lane to Pendle Gardens; Phase 3: Wigshaw Lane from Pendle Gardens to Common Lane. Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the direction of the visible. duration of the works.

The alternative route will be as follows: Phase 1 via Lady Lane, Cross Lane, Warrington Road,

Glaziers Lane and vice versa; Phase 2 via Glaziers Lane, Warrington Road, Common Lane and vice versa; Phase 3 via Glaziers Lane, Warrington Road, Common Lane required to allow Electricity North West to install a new electrical



Rail campaigners keep close watch on HS2 revival reports

COUNCILLORS campaigners in Culcheth keeping a close watch developments following reports that the controversial HS2 high speed railway line could be revived in the North.

Few details are currently available – but new plans for a privately-funded alternative to HS2's now-scrapped Birmingham to Manchester section are believed to be ready to be presented to the transport secretary Mark Harper.

It is believed that West Midlands Mayor Andy Street and Manchester Mayor Andy Burnham, are to put proposals for reviving the rail line between Birmingham and Manchester to Mr Harper.

The plan could involve a dedicated line between the two

But it is thought to be "highly unlikely" to be exactly the same as the HS2 scheme.

In October, the Prime Minister announced the parts of high speed

rail line linking the West Midlands to Manchester, and to the East Midlands, would be cancelled. HS2 trains are currently expected

to continue north to Manchester on existing conventional tracks.

Previously the proposed HS2 Golborne Spur would have cut through the Culcheth and with Lymm areas

environmental impacts.
Then the Golborne Spur was axed from the scheme, much to the relief of local campaigners.
HS2 north of Birmingham was later scrapped completely.

But now talk of reviving the

project, using private funding, has underlined the need for local councillors and campaigners to

can guard.

CADRAG chairman Frank Allen said: "We are keeping a close watch on the situation although it appears at the moment that any new line would be unlikely to be coming near us.

"Certainly it has been stated that any new proposal would be highly unlikely to be a carbon copy of

Cllr Keith Bland, chairman of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council, said: "This is a worrying development but we know very little about it at present. It is sométhing for us to keep an eye on.

West Midlands Mayor Street said options considered were "maybe a dedicated line, maybe upgrades to the existing line". The aim would be to relieve the "very very congested" West Coast Mainline, improving connectivity and reliability

But he said it would be unlikely to be exactly the same as HS2 as the project was so over budget.

The proposals were only their early stages, he added. But research into alternative rail improvements was being done with the prime minister's approval.



Self-build homes plan for "green" site



A PLAN for six self-build and custom-built houses on land at Culcheth has been submitted to Warrington Borough Council

The scheme – submitted by Mr and Mrs Paul Gafney – involves a one-acre site south of Holcroft Lane.

Story Homes have submitted an application for permission to build 186 homes on an adjoining wider area of land off Warrington Road.

A report to be considered by planning chiefs states that the land has been

in the applicants' ownership for more than 25 years.

The proposals are for four self-build houses for family members and two

The proposals are for four self-build houses for family members and two additional custom-built houses for people wishing to build their own houses. The report states the scheme has been designed to meet the specific housing requirements of family members as well as the borough council's requirement to provide sites for self-build houses.

Currently largely rough grassland, with a number of trees, the site has been allocated for release from the Green Belt as part of the borough Local

New exhibition celebrates legendary rock and pop designer Andie Airfix

LEGENDARY graphic designer Andie Airfix who grew up in Culcheth and worked with some of the biggest names in rock and pop is to have his incredible career highlights exhibited in his hometown.

The Andie Airfix Exhibition will launch at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery on Saturday, 3 February.

Andie Airfix grew up in Culcheth and collaborated with the likes of Paul McCartney, Metallica, Def Leppard, Rolling Stones and Led Zeppelin over four decades before his death in 2018.

He was revered in the music industry for his iconic album covers and other treasured memorabilia such as tour programmes and posters.

Andie's extraordinary Now but little known story and a retrospective of his work is coming to Warrington thanks to his brother, Tony McGuire, who is upholding

Andie's interest in music artwork began as a teenager when he used to create his own alternative front covers for his dad James's classical LPs when the family lived in Culcheth Hall Drive.

But after travelling around the world and a brief stint as a teacher, he actually fell into the music industry by accident after working at Country Cousins nightclub and coultry. gallery.

The owner, a well-connected and intuitive entrepreneur called Christopher Hunter, took an instant liking to Andie's paintings from his time in India and gave him a job as an exhibitor and then venue

After that, Andie was hired to revamp London's renowned Blitz Club and it was at these venues he started to meet influential people from the record industry.

His first big opportunity came when new wave band the Thompson Twins told him they weren't happy with the artwork for an upcoming record. Andie stepped in and gave the trio a new image for what would become their breakthrough record, Quick Step and Side Kick.

Word quickly spread about Andie's talents and by 1983 he'd created a fresh image for Def Leppard with a striking, incendiary, convention-breaking cover for

their diamond-certified album, Pyromania. He also worked with the band on their huge 1987 followup, Hysteria, which went on to sell more than 20 million copies. Tony, Andie's brother, said: "Andie had this unique ability where he could talk to a musician, they could tell them what their thoughts were for a record cover or tour programme and then he could match that in

"That's why he wanted to get really involved with the artists, as well as the management companies because he had this incredible ability to represent the ideas that were in their heads."

Andie's career then began to really pick up pace in the early 90s. Within the first half of the decade, he'd teamed up with Rolling Stones, Paul McCartney and Guns N' Roses on artwork for their tour programmes and began a long partnership with Metallica by designing their Binge and Purge live album box set.

Tony added: "We were constantly amazed at these things that kept turning up in Andie's life and Andie was as surprised as we were that he was getting a massive amount of work and respect from all these superstars. He always said: 'I'm really privileged to be able to do this'."

Other later highlights included Live Aid and Live 8 DVDs while Andie's projects on the likes of Concert for Diana and Disney Symphonic Fantasy showed he could turn his hand to other types of concert work.

Andie's favourite collaborations were with Led Zeppelin on the cover for their untitled live DVD and with Paul McCartney when he was entrusted with designing a boxset for a collection of music videos, live performances and rare footage from the icon's solo career and Wings days.

Paul sent Andie a personal note to thank him for his work and the Beatles legend even mentioned Andie by name when he was interviewed by Billboard Magazine



praising him for his innovative artwork and the effectiveness of the 'eye' motif on the striking cover of

The McCartney Years.

Tony said: "I thought what an accolade for a star like Paul McCartney to not only know the name of his graphic designer but to mention him in a magazine. Somehow there was this instant click of recognition and mutual respect between Paul and Andie. Andie had this ability of not being

starstruck by people.
"He'd talk to musicians as if he'd known them a long time. It was his personality and the way he was which opened doors for him as much as his talent for design."

Andie's long friendship with Metallica's Lars Ulrich was proof of this. On a professional level, Andie enjoyed creating album covers for the band such as Garage Inc and S&M but he would also hang out with them all over the world.

Highlights included following Metallica to Berlin for VIP treatment at their renowned S&M show with a full orchestra at Velodrom in 1999, and then in 2014 he was side of stage when the band headlined

Glastonbury. When Andie's mum, Mabel, died, Lars even paid for him to be flown to San Transcertake his mind off things. flown to San Francisco first class to

Tony added: "Lars often described Andie as family. He was not just someone who did the graphic design for the band. They really got to be good mates. They were almost like brothers and when they were together they were a

crazy pair."

Now Tony is looking forward to raising awareness of Andie's work in the area he grew up in.

Andie was pretty modest about his achievements and brushes with fame but Tony thinks the time is right to introduce his work to new audiences such as young designers who can look back at an era when album covers were meticulously hand-drawn.

said: "There Tony challenging times and it could be stressful because there were always deadlines. But he told me it was a pleasure to work for these people.

"He said: 'I would never have thought in my wildest dreams I'd be in the same room as people like Paul McCartney, Robert Plant and Jimmy Page but here I am working with them and going down to the pub with them'

'But Andie didn't want any of the accolades that were thrown at him. He just said: 'No, I'm the album cover designer. That's enough for

Student flying high after winning national challenge

A FORMER Birchwood High School pupil has won a national challenge by building an app that would make life easier for RAF pilots.

Freddie Robinson was encouraged to enter the competition by a tutor at Priestley College, Warrington, where he now studies Computer Science.

He received £1,000 for winning, but admits he is more excited about the second part of the prize - a private simulator flying lesson with Squadron Leader Pete Kennedy.

"It was a wonderful opportunity college has afforded me and I am really looking forward to the simulation," said Freddie, who hopes to one day become a pilot himself.

The challenge was set Inversity – a company started by two veterans to train tomorrow's technologists.

They choose real-world problems for learners to tackle, the most recent one 'From Computer to Cockpit - how can software change how Air Forces operate?' was set by San Ldr Kennedy, a decorated RAF pilot who was born in Warrington.

Freddie's entry saw him build a mobile app, which would help RAF pilots divert course if they needed a

new landing location.

He also had to film a pitch for the app in which he demonstrated the software with the help of a flight simulator, which can be viewed


