Editor's Comment

I'M still completely baffled at the Boundary Commission decision to move Lymm out of Warrington into the neighbouring constituency of Tatton for the forthcoming General Election whenever that might happen?

An election must take place by January next year - but so far, no date has been set and with the clock ticking down, the likelihood of a General Election in May, to coincide with the all-out elections in Warrington and the Police and Crime Commissioner seems increasingly less likely.

This would suggest an autumn election, with current Tory MP Andy Carter already declaring his intention not to seek re-election and the fact the Tories have still not announced a new candidate, a

May election seems highly unlikely.

Meanwhile the Lib Dems locally have announced Lymm resident and local Cllr Graham Gowland as their candidate, even though he will not be able to benefit from any local votes, while Labour announced borough Cllr Sarah Hall as their candidate last year.

Here at Lymm Life we are yet to hear any news via any candidates seeking election for the Tatton seat which would again suggest the

village is literally out on a limb.
While our MP will represent the village in parliament, services will still be provided by Warrington Borough Council, with locally elected Clirs. at parish and borough level.

This means the Tatton MP will have to build new relationships with Warrington Borough Council,

Lymm Parish Council, and local Cllrs, increasing their workload considerably.

We are told the reason for the changes is to make all parliamentary seats a similar size

to help decrease workloads on those with larger seats. In reality I believe MPS having to deal with two borough councils and many more local parish and borough Cllrs raising issues with them, will be a far greater workload than dealing with members of the


to members, whilst talking about plans to enhance the area as a community space.

Plan to increase capacity at Cheshire Day Nursery rejected by planners



A bid to increase the capacity of the Cheshire Day Nursery at Thelwall has been rejected by Warrington planners due to excessive noise pollution.

The Bright Stars Nursery Group was seeking permission to increase the existing cap on the number of children and to utilise the remainder of the building as nursery space at The Cheshire Day Nursery, Thelwall New Road Industrial Estate, Thelwall New Road, Warrington.
The proposal involved unutilised

space within the existing nursery being used to accommodate demand for more nursery spaces and to remove the existing capacity caps on previous planning applications when the property was smaller.

Planning permission was sought to replace the existing permissions on the site with one new permission which would cover the use of the entire building and application site as a children's nursery. It is requested that permission is granted for up to 130 children to attend at any one time.

There were three objections from

nearby residents, all occupiers of properties off Woodford Close and highlighted excessive noise from the existing operations of the nursery, which has an adverse impact on their amenity and the enjoyment of their properties and garden areas.

Concerns were also raised that

the increase in traffic will have a detrimental impact on the wider

environment.

Warrington . Borough Council planners said the proposed increase in the number of children said the to be accommodated on the site would result in excessive noise pollution arising from the increased use of the outdoor play areas associated with the nursery. This would have a harmful impact on the amenity and quality of life of existing neighbouring, residential occupiers. Insufficient information has been provided in relation to the operation of the outdoor play areas to demonstrate that the noise impacts can be mitigated or controlled.

They said the application also failed to demonstrate that the additional vehicle movements and parking requirements associated with the proposed increase in the number of children to be cared for on the site can be accommodated without detriment to the local highway network and the amenity of the surrounding local area and or the surrounding local area and community. The existing number of parking spaces available on the site would fail to meet the requirements set out in the adopted SPD, Standards for Parking in New Development (2015), for a children's nursery of the proposed

Lib Dems select Lymm-based Graham Gowland to contest Warrington South at General Election

WARRINGTON Liberal Democrats have selected Lymmbased Cllr Graham Gowland, as their candidate to stand in Warrington South for the forthcoming General Election, even though the village has been removed from the constituency by the Boundary Commission.

Graham commented: "It's a real honour to be chosen – I've been a long-term Lymm Parish councillor, and have served on Warrington Borough Council since 2021, but the chance to represent Warrington South in Parliament will give me the opportunity to raise the issues I've seen in local government, with underfunding of local services, and often a lack of consistency that sees different parts of the country facing

real problems.

"Representing Warrington South means I can give residents a real voice in the decision-making process, that impacts us all." Recent Electoral Boundary changes means that Lymm and Latchford no longer sit in Warrington South, and Graham added: "The recent boundary changes were needed to help balance numbers, but it will cause some confusion where parts of Warrington will no longer be represented by a Warrington MP. As a Warrington resident impacted

by this personally, I'll be working to make sure that all residents remain

'Graham has lived in Warrington since 2009, moving to lymm in 2011 where he lives with his wife Tracy, two children who attend lymm High, and two cocker spaniels. As well as serving as a councillor, he has been a Warrington School Governor, and currently sits as a Director on Warrington's Own Buses. His usual occupation is a a 'Risk Manager', for a large hospitality company.

"I think my career has been the perfect training for the role of MP as it's given me considerable

"I think my career has been the perfect training for the role of MP, as it's given me considerable involvement in how government impacts upon businesses. Over COVID, my role was focussed on ensuring we followed the rules set by government, and that was a great example of how everyone needs sensible decisions to be made, then clearly communicated by policy-makers, and one think I am committed to do is to make sure

information for my constituents will always be clearly communicated, and challenged when needed."

Away from politics, Graham has been involved in many community projects, delivering regular community first-aid training sessions, acting as a volunteer ambulance responder, and has been a key member of many local initiatives, including the 'Leave No-One behind' group.

With Lymm now part of the Tatton Constituency for the General Election, which was opposed by the Lib Dems, Bowden based Jonathan Smith has been selected to be their

candidate for Tatton.

Jonathan said, "I fought the seat in 2019, and increased the Lib Dem vote by 74%. Since then I have been campaigning hard across the area.

"I have worked at a senior level in both social care as a Director of Social Services and in the NHS as a Chief Executive. My wife Alison and I have lived in Bowdon for thirty years and we have four children and five grand-children.

"My experience is exactly what's needed in Westminster. It is clear we are the main challengers to the Tories."



Shelter plan for Alpacas approved

PLANS for a shelter to allow grazing for up to 24 alpacas in a field at Lymm have been approved by Warrington planners.

Permission has been granted for the erection of a single agricultural field shelter to hold up to 24 alpaca units, provision of new vehicular access from B5158 (Cherry Lane) and closure of existing access on land to the east of 140 Cherry Lane, Lymm.

The works will also consist of a new paddock fence and gate which benefit from permitted development

The proposal by The Egerton Trust seeks consent for the erection of a 24-unit agricultural field shelter to support the use of the land for alpaca grazing. For clarity, the site will not be used for alpaca

trails or any commercial use but rather for agricultural grazing of alpacas. This will allow rotation of other grazing lands owned and controlled by The Egerton Trust and to allow the separation of the animals when required.

The proposal involves a modest timber-construction to the South East of the site.

The alpaca shelter will measure approximately 7.8 x 15.8m and will be a maximum height of 3.6m.

The British Alpaca Society


The British Alpaca Society recommends that sustainable acreage for alpaca farming is approximately one acre per five animals (however ten alpacas can be kept per acre if it is possible to supplement the grass with hay and clean up more often as well as rotate the pastures).

The paddock on site will be more than 3 acres, meaning the proposed number of animals are well within the recommended capacity. A new secure paddock fence line and gate will be erected

 these will be less than 2m in height and therefore benefit from permitted development rights.

Pizza takeaway approved despite opposition from villagers

PLANNING chiefs have given the go-ahead for a pizza takeaway in Lymm village – despite opposition from nearby residents and Lymm Parish Council.

Members Warrington's development management committee approved the application by Domino's Pizza. The scheme involves a change

of use of the existing Lymm Indian restaurant on Pepper Street into a pizza takeaway.

Seven residents opposed the application on the grounds of increased noise, litter, anti-social behaviour and loss of parking spaces currently used by residents. They alsó claimed

appearance of the shop would be out of character with the area, which is in a conservation area and is only 25 metres from the historic Grade 1 Listed Lymm Cross.

Some objectors argued that the development should not be encouraged because of the obesity

crisis in the UK.
But, Warrington Borough Council
planning officers said the change
of use was considered acceptable and should not have any adverse impact on the character and

appearance of the conservation area or Lymm Cross.

Local Cllr. Graham Gowland commented "It's good to see what was a vacant unit is going to be brought back into use, providing jobs and an additional offering on the high street. There are concerns over traffic on a fairly narrow street, and the potential for litter issues with the bulky boxes, which I'm sure the takeaway will manage. But there's also been a lot of people looking forwards to a fresh Pepperoni Passion pizza when it opens."

Glimmer of hope from new sighting as heartbroken family offer substantial reward for return of missing Spaniel Ellie

A heartbroken family from Lymm, who have been searching for their missing Spaniel Ellie since December last year, have now put up a 'substantial reward' for the safe return of their beloved 'fur sibling' and have received news of a possible sighting.

Owners Laura and Neil Drinkwater, of Fairfield Road say recent publicity from Lymm Life and Warrington Worldwide, the social media network, and a slot on Lymm Radia, had 'aut popula talking and

media network, and a sior on Lymin Radio, had 'got people talking and sending in more information'.

They say the latest glimmer of hope in the search for Ellie comes from a possible sighting. Laura explained: "Someone contacted us last week with a possible sighting of Fllie in Holmes Chapel. With the help Ellie in Holmes Chapel. With the help of our supportive residents, we have widened our search to this area. Posters have been put up, leaflets distributed as well as knocking on doors and drones have flown over the sighting area. Holmes Chapel social media pages have also been made aware.

She added: "The support from Lymm residents in our new search in Holmes Chapel has been amazing, especially from two local men who have given their free time to fly drones, leaflet drop and generally spread the word about missing Spaniel Ellie."

Ellie, a Red Cocker Spaniel went missing from Lymm Dam on December 5th. She ran off towards farmers' fields known locally as 'The Bongs' and was last seen that same evening near a special feeding station set up by a specialist trapping team. Since then, the Drinkwaters have not stopped searching for their beloved pet who, they say has 'vanished from the face of the earth'. The whole community has rallied round to help the couple find their five-year-old pet, the couple find their five-year-old pet, and despite exhausting every avenue available to them, including specialist ground searches, drones and thermal scoping, the disappearance of Ellie

remains a mystery.

Now the Drinkwaters are hoping their offer of a 'substantial' undisclosed reward will either help bring their beloved pet home or generate new information that could assist their search in finding their faithful friend, who is described as



'nervous' in character. Laura said: "A substantial reward is being offered for the return of Ellie or information that will lead to the return of our gorgeous girl".

Laura added that Ellie needs regular medication and that she may already be feeling unwell. She said: "Ellie needs her daily medication for an autoimmune condition, this a huge an autoimmune condition, this a huge worry for us and our young children Josh and Saffy are desperately missing their best friend. We are all heartbroken and trying to function but not doing that very well."

"Even though we haven't found her yet, I'm forever hopeful." Added Laura. "Ellie could have been taken in by someone who doesn't realise

in by someone who doesn't realise she is missing. We are urging

everyone to keep a look out for Ellie". She appealed: "If you know someone who has recently acquired an adult Cocker Spaniel that looks like Ellie then please, please get in touch with us." Laura also pleaded for everyone

to continue to check outbuildings, garden hedges and sheds.

She added: "We are so grateful for the support we have received, and we remain forever hopeful that our fur baby will return very soon. Someone out there knows where she is. We will never give up looking for her. Ellie, please come home, we need you." need you.

Your pet questions answered

Q: Does my pet need more frequent grooming as the seasons change?

A: All dogs shed fur, even those with short coats, but you may find that this increases during the spring as the weather gets warmer and they begin to lose their winter coats. Regular brushing will help to remove loose fur and reduce matting as well as fur shed around your home. Brushing will also help you to spot any skin issues hidden under their fur. Regular grooming is still necessary during the winter months and it is a common misconception that a long common misconception that a long coat alone will protect pets during colder weather. Coats still need to be maintained, especially when using coats or jumpers as matting can occur from their fur being compressed. Paw care is also important. Keep them clean and wash off any irritants after walks such as mud, salt or grit.

Q: How can I tell if my pet is at a healthy weight after the winter?
A: Regular weight checks are a good idea, especially if your pet has been less active over the winter period due to the cold and wet. A healthy pet should have a visible waist when viewed from above and an had missel their whom the winter the missel that with a price and a many contracts. abdominal tuck when viewed from the side. You should also be able to easily feel their ribs without excess fat coverage, but they shouldn't protrude. coverage, but they shouldn't protrude. Watch for changes in activity levels — a decrease in energy may be a sign of weight gain. Overweight pets might show reduced mobility or altered behaviour. If you suspect your pet is overweight, we recommend a check-up with your vet or nurse. We offer weight clinics where a tailored diet plan can be devised to ensure your pet is as healthy as possible.



Q: My pet seems more restless lately. Could this be due to the change in season?

A: Seasonal changes can indeed affect your pet's behaviour. As daylight hours increase, pets may become more energetic and restless. This restlessness can also be a response to environmental changes, like temperature fluctuations or increased outdoor activity. To help your pet adjust, provide extra exercise and mental stimulation. Sanctuary Café to be modernised and extended

PLANNING chiefs have given the go-ahead for the reconstruction, extension and modernisation of the popular Sanctuary Café attached to Lymm United Reformed Church.

The scheme will include a Juliet balcony overlooking the picturesque Bridgewater Canal. But it will also aim to make people more aware of the café's

existence.

Currently it is partially hidden between the church and Lymm Library – both of which are locally

listed buildings.
Lymm United Reform Church dates from 1863 but the building to be modernised, which also serves as a church hall and bookshop, was added in the 1960s.

The proposals will slightly increase the footprint of the building and reconfigure its layout described by planners as having some undesirable internal layouts, dark internal spaces and unusual proportioned rooms which make the functioning of the café and the church awkward.

"Kitchen space is small and storage space is not sufficient, as all the equipment essential for keeping the cafe running is allocated in almost every single room, which is very inconvenient and somewhat disorganised."

The modernised building will have a larger kitchen and also improve the current entrance to the church.

A number of poor quality trees will have to be removed from the site but the existing car park will remain unchanged.

Planning proposals officers rianning officers say the proposals will result in an improvement of the built form of the hall, enhance the appearance of the church and the library and bring benefits to users of both the church and the café.

Divorce Column

Q: My husband is refusing to provide his financial disclosure. What can I do to make him?

What can I do to make him?

A: Financial disclosure is crucial in divorce proceedings because (1) it promotes openness and transparency ensuring that both parties have a complete understanding of the financial picture; and (2) it enables both parties to make fully informed settlement decisions regarding the division of the assets. Disclosure is a duty, and therefore an obligation, and so if your husband is refusing and cannot be persuaded by your solicitor, or his for that matter, to comply with this duty then your remedy would be to issue an application with the court for a financial order because this will trigger a court managed process and within which the court will order him, at an early stage, to comply and provide his disclosure. If he still refuses stage, to comply and provide his disclosure. If he still refuses even when ordered by the court then he will run the risk of being penalised in costs and for contempt of court and in my experience most people, no matter how stubborn they are, are not so foolish as to put themselves in this position.

Q: My husband controls our finances, he always has. Now we're divorcing he is threatening that if I don't agree to settle on his terms he will spend all the money so that there is nothing left and he says that I cannot have what we haven't

got: What can I do?

A: Such conduct on his part could be considered to be financial misconduct and taken into account in the eventual division of the matrimonial pot but once the money has gone then its gone (unless it can be traced into another asset) and depending on the size of the disposal and the size of the pot then it may be that your best bet would be to apply for of the money in the first place. However, court orders don't come out of cereal packets so you will need to provide strong evidence in support so as to satisfy the court that a freezing injunction is necessary. In the first instance such applications are made 'without notice' so that your spouse doesn't have an opportunity to dispose of the money in the period between being notified of the application and the court hearing.
