

# Brianna Ghey's mother tells vigil teenager was 'amazing, unique and joyful'

BRIANNA Ghey's mother has told a vigil marking the first anniversary of the murdered Birchwood teenager in Warrington that she was "amazing, unique and joyful".

People gathered at Golden quare Shopping Centre in Warrington to pay tribute

The vigil marked one year since the 16-year-old was murdered by teenagers Scarlett Jenkinson and Eddie Ratcliffe at Culcheth Linear

During their sentencing, the dge said the "exceptionally judge said the "exceptionally brutal" murder had elements of both sadism on the part of Jenkinson and transphobic hate on the part of Ratcliffe.

Addressing the crowd at the vigil, Brianna's mother Esther Ghey said: "Brianna was an amazing, unique and joyful teenager

'I will be forever thankful that I was lucky enough to spend 16

years with her.
"She taught me so much and gave me so much happiness and

"If there's one piece of advice that I can give to any parent, it would be to hold your children tight, and never stop telling them that that you love them.

"I want to thank you all for coming here today to pay respect to Brianna.

"I hope that wherever she is now that she can feel the love that we've created by joining together today." Brianna's headteacher Mills told those gathered at the vigil to honour her memory by being "true to yourself".

"Briańna knew who she was," she said.

"And she was determined to be

true to that.
"This determination spirit is something that I always admired about Brianna, and it's a deserving legacy for us to remember her by.

She said that the pressure to conform is "so intense" for teenaaers

"Societal pressure to conform is very real, for all of us," she said.

But the level of pressure as a teenager amongst your peers can

be so intense.
"Brianna knew who she was, and she didn't bow to the pressures around her. Please remember that about her.

"Be true to yourself, be yourself, and not a version of yourself that you think others want you to be.

It comes after Prime Minister Rishi Sunak refused to apologise to Brianna's father and said it is "sad and wrong" to link his transgender joke at Prime Minister's Questions to her case.

Brianna's father, Peter Spooner,

Sunak should sorry for the "degrading" and dehumanising" remark made in the Commons.

Mr Sunak had accused Sir Keir Starmer of having difficulty in "defining a woman" during an attack on Labour Party U-turns.

Esther Ghey was visiting Parliament when Mr Sunak aimed the jibe at Sir Keir.

His comment prompted fierce criticism from across the political spectrum, with Sir Keir telling Mr Sunak: "Of all the weeks to say that, when Brianna's mother is in this chamber Shame" this chamber. Shame.

But later on the Prime Minister aimed it was "the worst of claimed it was "the worst of politics" to link his comments to Brianna's case.



## Investigation underway following alleged breach of planning

AN investigation is underway following an alleged breach of planning control at the controversial Trident Business Park development at Risley, Warrington.

Work is underway on a large HGV distribution Centre at the Trident Business Park development off Warrington Road, which includes the demolition of residential dwellings and the former Noggin pub.

Local residents, who were left stunned after Warrington planners approved controversial proposals for the large HGV distribution centre near their homes are now alleging a breach of planning controls, put in place to try and help minimise disruption.

Members of Warrington Borough Council's Development Management Committee voted 7-2 to follow officers' advice and approve the controversial planning application on 22nd June 2023 with 35 conditions.

Construction began at the Trident usiness Park development on Business Park development on 29th January 2024. The residents received a letter from the prime contractor Caddick Construction advising that they were a member of the "considerate construction scheme" and advising residents that the site manager would be available throughout to address any of our

Condition 14 stated there shall be no direct pedestrian or vehicular access between the site and A574 Warrington Road. Reason: To limit the number of access points to the highway in the interests of road

Condition 16: The access spur off

A574 should be permanently closed and appropriately reinstated as a highway verge prior to occupation and shall not be used for construction traffic. Reason: To limit the number of access points to the highway in the

Residents say that during the Trident Business Park DMC meeting last June, the principal planning officer sold the above conditions to the committee members, repeating several times "This is a belt and braces" condition to ensure NO access to or from Warrington Road from the Noggin for the purposes of road safety.

They now say that on 31st January 2024 – Day 3 both conditions were broken. For the past 5 years, the Noggin pub has had temporary fencing in place, on 31st January this was partially removed to allow large construction vehicles onto the Noggin car park, 3 workers were holding up the traffic in both directions on Warrington Road (A574) whilst large construction vehicles entered the site via the access specifically prohibited in the conditions.

Then on 2nd February – Day 5 a very large forklift truck left the site from the Noggin onto Warrington Road (A574) carrying extra wide fence panels, the width of which crossed the central white The forklift was videoed leaving the Noggin and travelling along Warrington Road towards the Spar

roundabout where it turned left onto Daten Avenue to use the principal and approved access point for the site, once again breaching conditions 14 & 16. A number of oncoming vehicles had to move out of the way of this forklift, taking to the social media pages of the Culcheth and Birchwood community pages. Three residents left voicemails for the Caddick Construction site

for the Caddick Construction size manager who opted to return none of them. "So much for a considerate constructor," said one resident.

The resident added: "We lodged a breach notification with Planning

Enforcement, to date we have had no

response.
"We contacted the Considerate
Construction Scheme and Construction Scheme and reported their member Caddick Construction, residents received and acknowledgement but have had no further contact.

"The matter was reported to a member of Birchwood Town Council, who chose to immediately defend the Council by using a play on words, stating that the demolition is NOT construction and suggesting we log an enforcement breach.

"This use of semantics left the residents no choice than to seek legal advice on the decision notice and in particular conditions 14 & 16. The legal advice given was clear the conditions apply to the application in its entirety unless it states otherwise, this would be a quick and very

straightforward challenge.
"Despite the positive legal advice, the residents were left out of pocket and doing WBC's job for them. It is an absolute disgrace that this council is so quick to absolve themselves of all accountability and responsibility. They are happy to discharge their responsibilities to anyone, even the very ratepayers they are supposed to represent and who pay their wages.

The advice received was as

follows:

Planning conditions are attached to specific planning applications and apply only to that planning application. In this instance, planning application 2021/40696 was approved for Demolition of existing dwellings at 4890 and existing dwellings at 689 and 689a Warrington Road and the obya Warrington Road and the former Noggin public house and existing industrial premises and redevelopment of site to provide buildings for employment use (use classes E(g)(iii) / B8), access and car parking, landscaping, and associated works.

"Therefore, all conditions apply the application in its entirety unless a condition specifically states

otherwise.
"Condition 14: There shall be no direct pedestrian or vehicular access between the site and A574 Warrington Road. Reason: To limit the number of access points to the highway in the interests of road

satety.

"If this condition was intended to apply only during construction and excluding demolition it should have been clearly included in the wording of the condition, which it is not. This would be an extremely straightforward legal challenge. The video (below) provided is damning and clearly shows an example of where road safety is put at risk,

the very incident that the condition is intended to prevent. In the first instance this is an enforcement issue not a police issue as risk to road safety is the 'symptom' and the breach of condition 'the cause'.

"Condition 16 The access spur off

A574 should be permanently closed and appropriately reinstated as a highway verge prior to occupation, permanent closure is a future event.

The condition adds and shall not be used for construction traffic. The wording does not exclude the demolition phase of the project which it should if that was the intention of the condition.

"In conclusion, neither condition stipulates the exclusion of the demolition phase of the project. The responsibility lies within Councils to ensure the wording of conditions are watertight and cannot be misinterpreted, where they are not, councils should expect appropriate legal challenges."

Warrington Borough Council esperson said: "Planning spokesperson

permission was granted in June 2023 for a development at Trident Business Park, including the demolition of residential dwellings and The Noggin public house on Warrington Road.

"We have received reports from nearby residents with concerns relating to construction vehicles relating to construction venturing warrington Road, and we are undertaking an investigation to determine if there has been a breach of planning control in relation to these new works."

A spokesperson for Caddick Construction Group commented: "Our impact on the local community is very important to us, and we take every precaution and due diligence to reduce the impact our neighbours may feel as we deliver the build of two industrial facilities at Trident Business Park. With work now progressing on-site, we appreciate that there may be a small level of disruption for our neighbours, but we are working hard to minimise this impact and mitigate any concerns surrounding access.

# Drink drive suspect arrested after car collides into restaurant

## A drink-drive suspect was arrested after a car collided with a restaurant building at Culcheth.

At 21:52 on Friday February 9, one crew from Birchwood was called out to reports of a vehicle colliding into a commercial building on Warrington Road, Culcheth.

Crews were called to a road traffic

collision involving one car impacting the Rokka Grill & Bar. Firefighters worked with other agencies to make the area safe and ensure everyone was accounted for.

They used a gas reader to monitor the area for any leaks following the impact – there were zero readings. A strict cordon was put in place by emergency services until a structural engineer could attend.

Police later confirmed that a drinkdrive suspect had failed a breath test

at the scene and had been arrested.

A Cheshire Police spokesperson said: "There were no reports of any injuries, but the driver of the car was taken to hospital as a precautionary

measure.
"The 31-year-old from Warrington was also arrested on suspicion of drink driving. He has since been released pending further enquiries." Meanwhile, the restaurant has re-

opened for business posting on social media: "Our restaurant was involved with a collision from a car driving

extremely fast around the bend on Warrington Rd. We are very, very lucky that no one within the restaurant


or outside was injured, all a bit shook up but thankfully unharmed.

and two young daughters, leaving behind her husband who remains in Ukraine fighting the war. She currently lives in Warrington with her sponsor.

Kateryna said: "The Ukrainian community is currently feeling a mixture of despair and hope. With the ongoing turmoil in our homeland and the constant distressing news, we feel as though any hope for a brighter future is dwindling. "However, being approached by representatives from various

communities, journalists and now Warrington Museum with offers of support and solidarity serves as a reminder that we are not alone in our struggles and that there are people and organisations willing to stand by us until our victory. This sense of unity and support gives us renewed hope and determination to continue our fight for justice and peace.

The 52 mile area had canals on 4 different levels with hundreds of shafts. Local landowners had to be won over or else avoided.

Women and girls pulled underground trucks until the 1840s and Alan showed early photos of female workers, including Mrs Betty Brooks who lived to be 101.

The barge crews had to move in very tight spaces, "walking the roofs" in many cases.

Some barges were given to schools after the NCB sealed the tunnels. Sadly some shafts have caused fumes and sink holes in some areas because they were badly sealed.

Doreen thanked Alan and he went on to judge the February competition. He chose Jean Riley and Chris Wilkinson as winners. The competition was "A Picture or Model of a Plane"- the choice made to suit Gordon Bartley's talk on Concorde.
