At parish level some elections have

At parish level some elections have been uncontested , most notably at Winwick where six independent candidates will be elected unopposed.

This is almost unprecedented and could become a worrying trend, with mainstream parties now struggling to find candidates willing to stand.

A lot of this is down to the fact many

people unwilling to put themselves forward and into the firing line of the toxic world of politics.

It's no coincidence that three senior Cllrs. who have decided to stand down, have all been victims of online abuse and trolling.
Locally the Lib Dems have been unable to field one single candidate, following a national policy of focusing on their heartlands.



Describing themselves as the "Super Six" the Independents the Independents tive as a 'catalyst' "Super Six" the independents see their initiative as a 'catalyst' for positive change for both the Peel Hall and Winwick wards of the parish and feel they now have a chance to forge a better deal in a host of issues ranging from improving poor community facilities to tightening control of unsympathetic planning issues and

over development of green spaces. Winwick resident Stuart Mann, who has recently announced that he will also be standing as an Independent for a seat as a borough councillor in the Burtonwood and Winwick ward, explained: "We are all really close friends who care so much about where we live. We have already done a great deal together to support our communities. We support the Peel Hall Campaign

journalist and Paul was a police officer who spent many years working in counter-terrorism so they both have plenty of background knowledge to add realism to their writing.


In more recent years Paul has served as a Warrington borough councillor and as a parish councillor in both Culcheth and Croft. But he has many memories of his years in the police which enable him to give

- Start applying summer lawn foods now remember to water them in well
- Help the environment by composting as much of your garden waste as possible
- Evergreen hedges can be given their first trim of the season - if the clippings are not too woody, they can be mixed in to the compost heap



#### New £24m fire resistance testing laboratory nearing completition

A NEW £24m fire resistance testing laboratory is nearing completion Warrington's Birchwood

Technology Park.
Four out of a planned seven state-of-the-art fire resistance testing furnaces are already installed.

In August last year, Warringtonfire, the UK's leading

testing and certification provider, announced it was building a brand new 101,000sqft facility.

This significant investment enables Warringtonfire, part of the global Element Materials Technology (Element) group, Technology (Element) group, to expand capacity and meet increasing demand for fire increasing demand for fire resistance testing of critical fire safety products and systems, such as fire doorsets, intumescent coatings for steel protection, and other passive fire protection solutions solutions.

Ten months into Warringtonfire's projected 17-month build programme, four furnaces have been fitted and are ready to enter the commissioning phase shortly. The furnaces will be supported by

a raft of technology to carefully manage air quality both during and after the testing process. This includes new air handling and high-performance ventilation systems, as well as cold smoke and hot smoke extraction systems, ensuring a better working environment for employees and compliance with strict environmental regulations. To support this, specialists from Element undertook extensive Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) involving acoustics and noise modelling, air quality dispersion modelling, and

emissions monitoring.

By the laboratory's open date, scheduled for January, two vertical furnaces, two horizontal furnaces, and one indicative furnace will be ready to accept test specimens. Another two furnaces, one horizontal and one vertical, will be installed by the end of 2026. In total, this will represent an 80 per cent increase in testing capacity over Warringtonfire's current site at Holmesfield Road, Warrington. Following the opening of the Birchwood Park laboratory, the existing facility will become a centre of excellence for reaction to fire testing, which are smaller scale tests including spread of flame and heat release. heat release.

Dafydd Llewelyn-Jones, project manager for Element Materials Technology, has been coordinating

the laboratory's construction. He said: "We are on track with our progress and are actually seven weeks ahead of schedule in terms of the furnaces themselves. We are of the furnaces memberses. We are now moving swiftly along to fitting out all the office areas and control rooms, commissioning the building services, and completing the test

"It is brilliant to see this project coming together. We have put a significant amount of money into making this new laboratory truly one of the best in Europe, if not the world."

Besides the investment furnaces, committed Warringtonfire committed to reducing the laboratory's carbon footprint and making the new site as sustainable as possible. Measures include energy-efficient fans, upgraded power supply transformers that

consume minimal electricity when idle, and electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure including a fleet of EV forklifts and charging points.

The site will also be well lit, through a combination of natural light from skylights and LED lighting that delivers a high lux level. In addition, the laboratory is set up to addition, the laboratory is set up to accept a blend of clean hydrogen and natural gas once local infrastructure offers this service.

IT was a case of rain stopped play for Glazebury Cricket Club - even before the cricket season had started.

In common with all other clubs across Cheshire, Glazebury had struggled to get their Hurst Lane ground ready for the scheduled first match on April 20 because of the extremely wet winter and spring.

But in the event, the Cheshire

#### Hedgehogs – and how we can help them

THOSE cute, illusive creatures Hedgehogs were the subject of a talk given to Croft WI by Kelly Leyland from Haydock Hedgehog Hélpers.

This is a charitable, non-profit organisation which has been open for five years that cares for injured hedgehogs and is totally reliant on public funding. Their team include one person to rehabilitate, 30 on-site volunteers and 10 foster carers. They have a dedicated "hog hospital" including heated boxes all labelled with information about each occupant. Ninety per cent of the hedgehogs they treat are eventually released, those that

are beyond help are painlessly euthanised.

Surprisingly i rehabilitate it costs and Costs release one hedgehog. Costs in medication, food, microchips include some need expert veterinary care.

need expert verefinary care. Hedgehogs have been around on this planet for around twelve million years. In the 1950s there were approximately 36 million, in 2017 their numbers were down to 600,000! More than 150,000 are killed on our roads every year, as well as numerous other injuries caused by man and other animals. These littlé creatures really need our help, due to the fact their natural

habitat, wildflower meadows and farmland that has not been contaminated with pesticides, has been rapidly declining over the

In fact they seem to be more prevalent in urban areas than tarmland these days, but modern gardens that include solid fences gardens that include solid fences and such items as astro-turf and the use of weed killers and slug pellets are not hedgehog friendly. "Hog Highways" (small holes in fencing) to allow them to wander and not using harsh chemicals can help. Planting insect friendly flowers like nasturtiums and open faced flowers such as single dahlias help with the hedgehog diet which consists of worms, beetles, earwigs and slugs. Bedding plants are usually not very insect friendly. Also the use of garden strimmers cause many dreadful injuries, as hedgehogs tend to hibernate in long grass and gardeners are unaware of their

Never feed hedgehogs bread, milk, yoghurt, fruit or veg, but they can be fed dry cat food and just water to drink.
