

# Work underway to transform former bank building

WORK is underway to transform a former empty bank building in Lymm village centre.

The former Barclays Bank building in Lymm is undergoing remodelling, making it closer to the original building from the 1880s.

Welcoming the news, local Cllr.

Graham Gowland commented:

"It's great to see investment in the village. I understand the plans are to create three retail units and an upstairs unit that may be a Chinese restaurant. It's a really positive move for the village, and I'm pleased to see the new employment and visitor opportunities this will generate."

The building was sold last year to a local owner, who has worked hard to engage locally with how to develop the building.

says the nature of the proposal is internal and external alterations of this vacant former bank building at 4 Eagle Brow, Lymm. At the ground floor the existing open plan layout will be broken up to form three separate retail units whilst at the first floor an open plan bar/ restaurant space will be formed. A modest 1 st-floor extension has been proposed towards the rear of the property which will not be able to be viewed from either Eagle Brow or Bridgewater Street.

As the original building at 4 Eagle Brow was demolished in the mid-1970s and replaced with the existing building there is little to no historical interest in the building.



## Owners of missing Spaniel Ellie confirm devastating news

THE owners of Ellie, the five-yearold Spaniel that went missing from the Lymm Dam area in December

the Lymm Dam area in December last year, have confirmed they have received the saddest news their family has been dreading to hear for almost five months.

Ellie was discovered in a field by a local farmer, off Higher Lane, said grief-stricken Laura Drinkwater, of Fairfield Road in Lymm. It is believed she was found near a ditch in a secluded spot that is seldom worked on and added that she had been there 'for some time'. Ellie was identified by her time'. Ellie was identified by her black and white collar by Laura's husband Neil who was with family friend and local dog walker Ali

Their beloved pet was located not too far from the point she went missing on December 5th, in an area close to what is known locally as 'The Bongs' and ironically, less than five minutes from the family

nome.
Ellie's disappearance sparked off a village campaign, and it expanded further afield, to try to find the missing Red/Golden Cocker and the Drinkwaters, who vowed the content of the they would never give up searching for her, were overwhelmed by the response from residents, family and friends, with Laura confessing that she was heartened by offers of help that came from people who she had never met before.

Ellie's story was circulated far and wide, including social media, the national dog search and rescue network and tracking specialists. The Drinkwaters left no

specialists. The Drinkwaters left no stone unturned, even putting up a substantial reward for her safe return and turning to high-tech, eye-in-the-sky drones to try to detect their missing 'fur sibling'.

Holding back her tears Laura explained: "We received the message from a local farmer as I was just about to go out and circulate posters around the area of Frodsham following reports of a sighting of a dog titting Ellie's description. We are all devastated. At least we have closure, but this At least we have closure, but this isn't the outcome we had hoped for. It would have extended our living nightmare if we were never to find her. I am so grateful to the farmer who found her and for contacting us."

contacting us."
Laura said she had reached out to everyone and anything that could help her find her missing pet, even going down the road of spiritualism in the hope that pet psychics could provide the tiniest chink of detail that would bring her

chink of aeran me. faithful friend home. Laura said: "Since Ellie's disappearance we have struggled to function with everyday life. Ellie was our absolute world. From the day she went missing our household has been in limbo, but we brought her ashes home and we thank Eternal Paws in Lymm for being so supportive and kind." for being so supportive and kind." She also added that she was also grateful for the 'emotional support' currently being offered by some of

the specialist groups that had been involved in the search for Ellie.

This news has rocked us all. It's reliving that nightmare over again. I would have still been searching for our Ellie in ten years' time if she hadn't been found. I would like to thank all those who have helped in our search for darling Ellie – the Drinkwaters really appreciate it."

Laura said she was now going

to turn the focus on her fundraising effort, in Ellie's name, to buy a state-of-the-art, all-weather, thermal drone to help locate missing dogs and cats in Lymm and the surrounding area. Already halfway towards its £10,000 target, anyone wishing to help the Drinkwaters can do so via 'GoFundMe' and donate to 'Ellie's Lymm Thermal Drone Fund' page.

# Members past and present celebrate 50 years of Lymm Parish Council

THE 50th anniversary of Lymm Parish Council was celebrated recently by members past and present, with a drinks reception in Lymm's village hall.

Over 20 former and current Councillors attended, including the first Chairman of Lymm Parish Council, David Moon.

Formed on 1st April 1974, many councils in England and Wales were created in 1974 as part of

a significant restructuring of local government. This restructuring was primarily driven by the Local Government Act 1972, which aimed to modernise and streamline local governance across the country. The Act led to the creation

of new administrative regions, counties, and districts, replacing the outdated and often fragmented system of local authorities that existed prior to 1974.

As a result, many new councils were established, merging existing authorities or creating entirely new ones to align with the new administrative boundaries.

his reshaping of local

government in 1974 represented a significant overhaul of the system and laid the groundwork for the modern structure of local governance in England and Wales.

The anniversary is also an opportunity to focus on the people – leaders, councillors and officers – who have served their local residents over the last half century.

## Lymm Sanctuary Hub expands projects and seeks community volunteers

LYMM Sanctuary Hub and Business Centre, fondly known as The Hub and based beside Lymm Library, is looking for more volunteers to support its community project expansion. The drive coincides with the

The drive coincides with the preparations in place to celebrate the 40th anniversary of 'Volunteers Week' which runs nationally 3-9 June.

The Sanctuary Hub is a Lymm

charity, established in 2019, comprising a community arm and a business centre. Chargeable services such as office and event room hire are delivered by the centre. Funds generated pay the Council to support the Library and also support several projects run by the community side of the charity.

Projects offer support to local people, particularly the vulnerable

and elderly, and span topics such as: memory loss, digital skills, SEND, counselling, companionship and environmental awareness (via its partner LEAF).

Many of the projects are now wellestablished and expanding rapidly. Memory loss groups such as Singing for the Brain and the Memory Café run on alternate Wednesday afternoons and attract upwards of 20 and 45 participants respectively.

and 45 participants respectively.
Feedback has been fantastic. For participants, sessions improve their quality of life by adding positivity, laughter, social time and fun activities in an environment that is safe and friendly. For carers, there is respite and support, with many saying that they get their loved one back again and that the support and empathy around the carers table is invaluable.

The impact of these projects, offered for free due to additional funding obtained from the National Lottery's Reaching Communities grant, is great news locally, and particularly timely with the advent of Dementia Action week 13-19

May. The Hub also signposts many enquiries to other fantastic projects in the area, including: https://www.facebook.com/DementiaFriendly. Warrington, https://www.warrington.gov.uk/living-well-hub, and www.warringtonva.org.uk/good-neighbours.

Meanwhile, many of the other community projects run by the Hub are also receiving wonderful feedback but, being newer, they are in need of more volunteers to increase the number of people that can be supported.

Volunteering can be hugely rewarding, flexible and doesn't have to take up much of your time. Opportunities to become a local volunteer in a friendly community group exist across several projects and for people of all ages and skillbases.



LYMM Festival is back again and this year from June 20-30, kicking off as always with the hugely popular Food Fest.

Last year Lymm Festival marked its 25th year with a programme of over 50 events, many of which were sold out long before they took place. This year's programme is sure to be just as successful!

One of last year's favourite acts is also making a return. Gerald Dickens – great, great grandson of the legendary Charles Dickens – will be back to deliver another of his brilliant one-man shows. Last year his "Great Expectations" show exceeded the expectations of the audience, and this year he'll be presenting "The Life and Adventures of Nicholas Nickleby".

As usual, the first event is the Foodfest which takes place on Thursday 20 June. The village comes alive with stalls from local restaurants and street traders, together with street entertainment,

And there's a special visitor this year too. A flypast from a Lancaster bomber – one of only two of these legendary planes in the world which still takes to the air!

Lymm Library will be running a programme of events for kids all through the Festival – this year.

all through the Festival – this year with a space theme. And there's more for younger residents – a Festival Family Fair on Saturday 29

June with a varied programme of activities and events (and free entry for all!) and a theatre performance for youngsters on Thursday 27 June – The Extraordinary Time-Travelling Adventures of Barón Munchausen, described as a cross between Jackanory and "Who's Line is it

Anyway"!

Music lovers will be pleased to know that the Festival Folk, Blues and Jazz nights are once again on the programme and the Festival Music Night features longestablished covers band Touch the

## Rain fails to stop play at Lymm May Queen

DESPITE the loss of the Lymm May Queen field due to poor drainage following heavy rain, organisers of the annual event are pressing ahead on Saturday May 18th.



Due to the unprecedented wet weather the May Queen field has experienced over the last six months, the grass field is not coping well with the raised water table.

Warrington Borough

decided before Council the weeks festival was due to take place that the May Queen field was not in a fit state to hold the event. The rain hasn't been the only concern; the drainage on the field has not operated effectively for quite some time, and last year's event had several large openings where the earth was washed away, with the largest opening measuring over 4 feet wide and several feet deep. The sinkholes pose a considerable risk to the safety of residents and visitors.

The new May Queen Committee jumped into action with a full risk umped into action with a full risk assessment to move the entirety of the event to the Davies Way and Henry Street car parks, in the centre of Lymm Village from 10 am until 5 pm. The main entrances will be at Bridgewater Street (WA13 OAD) and the entrance to Davies Way (WA13 OLP). This wasn't the first time the festival was moved. irst time the festival was moved, in 2018 the crowning ceremony was held at Lymm Hall when the 2017 May Queen was rained out. The committee intends to have the festival back on the field next year, but for now, this was the only option as other outdoor locations were in the same waterlogged condition.

The new committee has also organised the return of the fun fair with the historical provider, Silcocks. The Silcocks family in lymm dates back to the 1980s, so organisers are excited to have them return with all-new rides to get the heart racing!

May Chair Queen Chair Jenna Brown said: "The procession will have a new starting point from Pepper Street at 12 pm and make its way through the village on Eagle Brow, where it will turn down Brookfield Road and finish at the entrance of Davies Way. changes that an These meant entirely new Management Plan was created to include additional provisions for free parking, complete with a shuttle

service to and from the event. The Lymm Rugby Club (WA13 OAS) has graciously provided FREE parking and opened its Clubhouse to the public to serve food and drinks to those waiting for the next shuttle to arrive. The shuttle is expected to operate continuously around the village between 9:30 am and 5:30

She added: "The May Queen Event will have all the expected food and drink concessions, artisan stalls and a great entertainment line-up in the Main Arena starting with the Crowning of the Queens at 1:30 pm, followed by music and the award-winning A Class Dance Academy. The Fun Fair will have larger rides, including the Twister, Miami, and the classic Side Kick. Organisers haven't forgotten the little ones! There will be smaller versions of the funfair rides just for them, such as an animal farm, a circus, and The Savage Skills Stunt Show.

The visit of the 'Connecting our Communities' scroll is the latest event in the RNLI programme to celebrate 200 years of the lifeboat service.

The scroll was signed by Lymm District RNLI Fundraising Branch Chair, Rosemary Irons, who was joined by long-serving committee member and volunteer Libby Whitle. Rosemary said signing the scroll was an "honour and a privilege" privilege"

The scroll is made from bamboo paper and inscribed with the RNLI's One Crew pledge, with all participating lifeboat stations promising to continue saving lives at sea for the next 200 years and

beyond. It began its journey on the RNLI's official 200 anniversary on March 4, at Westminster Abbey where it was signed by the RNLI's president, HRH The Duke of Kent, as well as the Archbishop of Canterbury and



THREE friends from Lymm – Jon Sheehy, Stuart James and Thanh Cawley – completed the London Marathon in aid of Muscular Dystrophy UK, raising over £8,000 in support of local twin boys with a rare form of the condition.

Their charitable campaign saw many months of training and several fundraising events. The trio of runners ran in support of local twin boys, Oscar and Seb Spink, who were diagnosed at the age of 8 in July 2019 with Facioscapulohumeral' muscular

dystrophy (FSHD).

Muscular Dystrophy UK is the charity for the 110,000 children and adults living with musclewasting conditions in the UK. There's currently no cure, and in many cases, it limits lives. MDUK do vital work in funding pioneering research into treatments and research into treatments and cures as well as providing vital information, advice, resources and support for individuals and families living with these conditions.

Many locals will know the Spink

Many locals will know the Spink family and have seen the boys navigating the streets of Lymm in their wheelchairs, often on their way to and from Lymm High School. They are also well known in the Powerchair football league in the Man City wheelchair football

For the boys and their family,

everyday life presents enormous challenge. Despite the courage, tenacity and good humour they all display, the reality of life with Muscular Dystrophy specialist equipment, tests and appointments with spinal disorder, appointments with spinal disorder, neuromuscular, orthopaedic, cardiovascular and audiology specialists. And then there is school SEND meetings, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, hydrotherapy and daily physiotherapy.

The boys miss a lot of school time and can't join in the majority of fun activities that their school

of fun activities that their school friends can. Despite that, they work hard and are currently on course to take the same number of GCSEs as everyone else. Seb is a keen scientist, hoping to do something with chemistry and the natural world. Oscar loves design tech and wants to help create a more and wants to help create a more accessible world for wheelchair

boys are kind empathetic young men, proud to be disabled and advocate for those

with muscle wasting conditions like

themselves who endure chronic fatigue and daily pain. There is currently no treatment available to halt the progression of their condition, which makes fundraising for research on FSHD so important. Mum to the boys, Kerry Spink, said of the recent marathon fundraising: "We're so incredibly grateful when our amazing friends and family tackle challenges to raise funds for MDUK. Stuart, Jon and Thanh, all smashed the London Marathon with amazing times and Marathon with amazing times and made their muscles matter. I know that when they hit that wall with tired muscles, they pushed through remembering that the boys legs feel

like that every day."

## New bid to open dog day-care centre

A NEW bid is being made to set up a day care centre for dogs on a Green Belt farm site at Lymm.
Planning chiefs threw out similar proposals by Bruce's Doggy Day Care last year on the grounds that the development would be inappropriate in the Green Belt. inappropriate in the Green Belt.

They also argued that the proposal would have a detrimental impact on the wider landscape character at Wet Gate Farm, Wet Gate Lane, Lymm and that the presence of dogs on the site would have the potential to cause a noise

The original scheme was for 70 dogs and the new application by Bruce's Doggy Day Care is for 50 dogs. The company says it operates like a children's nursery but for dogs.

It believes the centre - which would use existing buildings on the site – would have a catchment area including Lymm, Warrington, Altrincham and Wilmslow.

It would provide a safe, controlled and purpose-built environment for the enjoyment, exercising and care of dogs.

The majority of dogs would be taken to the centre by a "dog bus" and it was estimated that less than 20 per cent would be brought by owners by car.

The site would not be open on Saturdays and Sunday and would operate between 7.30am and 6pm on weekdays. There would be no overnight stay for dogs on the site.

Dog buses would be air-conditioned vehicles fitted with vetapproved carriers.

When operating at full capacity there would be about five members of staff on site.

## Child arrangements

There is no doubt that when a relationship breaks down it can be a very difficult and distressing experience for all those involved. There can be a lot to deal with and emotions tend to run high. Whilst this is not a piece about the psychological impact of divorce on children, it is important to understand that when parents separate it can have a profound impact on the children and they too will likely feel a whole range of companions. of emotions, perhaps shock, upset, anger, confusion, worry,

of emotions, perhaps shock, upset, anger, confusion, worry, rejection, insecurity and so on. Separating parents may have several questions concerning their children, such as: Who will they live with? How often will I see them? What happens if we don't agree? The list goes on. The broad answer is that parents are free to try to agree between themselves whatever they like regarding arrangements concerning their children and in my experience many parents do reach their own agreement. But in cases where for whatever reason the parents don't agree then the court can make orders to determine the arrangements. A Child Arrangements Order (CAO) is an order which may state whom a child shall live with and when they shall spend time with the other parent, or another person, and which may also address different types of contact such as phone calls and video calls for example. Child Arrangements Orders replace 'residence orders' and 'contact orders' but if you have one of these older types of order there is no need to reapply for a CAO as your existing order is still valid.

one of these older types of order there is no need to reapply for a CAO as your existing order is still valid. The court can also make other types of orders concerning children such as a 'specific issue order' and a 'prohibited steps order'. A specific issue order is an order which deals with a particular (specific) issue, such as for example, which school a child should attend, or an issue concerning religion or medical treatment. A prohibited steps order, as the name suggests, is an order which is used to prevent a parent from doing something such as relocating with a child or changing the child's surname.

# Success on the pitch poses revenue challenges for rugby club

SUCCESS on the pitch is causing revenue challenges for Lymm Rugby Club – and has resulted in another planning application for permission to store caravans at the club's Crouchley Lane ground.

The application – for permission to store up to 75 caravans for a temporary period of 18 months – has been submitted to Warrington Council's Borough planning department.

follows earlier applications in 2020 and 2022.

Documents submitted to Warrington Borough Council planners set out how the original application was granted in recognition of a threat posed to the future of the club through to lost revenues caused by the COVID-19

The club is now back in full operation but continues to face revenue problems due to inflation and increased costs following the successful 2022-23 season when the first team was promoted to Liven 4 National League 2 North – the highest level the club had ever played at.

Temporary caravan storage had generated an income stream that had proved to be critical in supporting and sustaining the rugby club and its future development.

The caravans were stored on existing hardstanding not required

for car parking.

Upon expiry of the temporary consent, the land would revert to its previous approved use - the future development of new rugby club

tacilities

The granting of the additional temporary consent would not change any of the sporting facilities or activities at the rugby club. Existing pitches and clubhouse facilities would remain unchanged.

Planning officers will consider the application.

Lymm Rugby Club was established in 1960 and has grown Clip to become a substantial community enterprise with more than 1,000 members. It promotes an active calendar of evens throughout the year in addition to its core sporting activities.
