## "Affordable" homes and land gifted to NHS for medical centre as part of new development

PLANS for more than 100 new homes on former green belt land at Lymm will include "affordable" properties and land gifted to the NHS for a new medical centre in the area.

Bellway has received planning consent for a new residential development in Lymm, comprising 108 properties, following on from the first phase of the Tanyard Farm site, which had been opposed by local residents. local residents.
Located off Rushgreen Road, the

housebuilder has now exchanged contracts on the land, which is 10 acres in size.

The new development will be known as Narrowboat View, providing an impressive range of two-bedroom apartments, two and three-bedroom mews, three-bedroom townhouses, semi-detached and detached houses plus four-bedroom townhouses and detached family homes.

Each property at Narrowboat View has been expertly designed to an exceptionally high standard, with attractive features and all housing M4 (2) compliant, which means they will be accessible and adaptable for disabled use.

With its desirable location in Lymm, purchasers at Narrowboat View will enjoy a short walk from the development into the village, and some properties will boast a

beautiful canal-side setting too. Grace Yarlett, Sales Director at Bellway, says: "We are thrilled to have exchanged contracts and are excited to be returning to Lymm. The first phase of this Tanyard Farm site was such a success so naturally we can't wait to be back, delivering more homes in the affluent and leafy village of Lymm."

Bellway hopes to start on-site by the Summer, with the first properties expected to be released for sale in

Autumn.

In addition to the new development, Bellway has made Section 106 contributions of circa £ 1 million, the housebuilder has also gifted land to the NHS to help bring forward a new medical centre in the locality, plus 30% of the properties will be affordable housing

housing.

Described as a "superb project",
Bellway worked with several North
West-based businesses on the
design, planning and purchase,
including APD Architects, TEP
Ecology, Shoosmiths and Gateley Solicitors, Eddisons Highways, E3P Ground and Lees Roxburgh Drainage.

Grace added: "We are hoping construction on site commences in the coming months and aim to start selling the homes later this year. We anticipate huge demand."

## Up to 20 weeks of work to refurbish historic village centre road

### UP to 20 weeks of work is set to start on Pepper Street in Lymm village centre.

It follows on from a public consultation when almost 250 people gave feedback on the best refurbishment options for the

The majority of respondents said they would like to see the road reconstructed with reclaimed setts.

Warrington Borough Council has made an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of which is as follows: -

Temporary Prohibition of Driving & Clearway: Pepper Street from its junction with Rectory Lane to its junction with The Peppers; Longbutt Lane from its junction with Orchard Avenue to its junction with Scholars Green Lane (East); Grove Rise from its junction with Pepper Street for 20 metres; Domville Close from its junction with Pepper Street for 20 metres.

Temporary Clearway: Rose Bank Turning Head at western end adjacent to Nos. 1 & 2; Scholars Green Lane from its junction with Limefield Avenue to its junction with Longbutt Lane.

Temporary Suspension of The Borough of Warrington (Longbutt Lane, Lymm) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1982 in its entirety.

The Order will be effective from 17th June 2024 for 20 weeks. The restrictions will be carried out in phases as follows: Phase 1 out in phases as follows: Phase I Longbutt Lane 8am to 5:30pm for 1 to 2 weeks; Phase 2 Pepper Street Works Closure 7pm to 1am up to School Summer Holidays; Phase 3 Pepper Street Closure 24/7 from start of School Summer Holidays until completion of sett paved area; Phase 4 Longbutt Lane 8am to 5:30pm for 1 to 2 weeks, however will be in place as detailed & when signed on site and dates/details will also be confirmed at: www. warrington.gov.uk/pepper-street-lymm. Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the duration of the works. The alternative route will be via Orchard Avenue, Longbutt Lane, Scholars Green Lane, Grammar School Road, Higher Lane, Rectory Lane and vice versa. The restrictions are required for highway maintenance

It is unlikely any full road closures will be put in place, but if required they will take place in the evening to minimise disruption.

## Ancient tradition of Lymm Rushbearing set to return

THE ancient tradition of Lymm Rushbearing is set to return to the village on Sunday, August 11.

The Lymm Rushbearing

The Lymm Rushbearing procession will leave the Lower Dam at 4pm and arrive at St Marys

church about 4.30.

The origins of Rushbearing dates from the Middle Ages and Lymm is one of the few remaining communities in the UK that continues the tradition. The Lymm event was revived in the 1970's by local resident Chris Limb.

Local Morris troupes Lymm Morris and Bollin Morris provide the entertainment while Lymm May

Queen and Rose Queen also join the procession.

The rushbearing celebration takes place each year on the Sunday closest to August 15th, which is St Mary's Day who is the patron of the village church.

The job of replacing rushes on the earthen floor of the church became a festival and in many places (including Lymm) had Morris dancers and music.

# Plans to rebuild collapsed wall at 192-year-old church

PLANS to rebuild a section of collapsed wall in the grounds of the 192-year-old Grade 2 Listed St Mary's Church, Lymm have been submitted to Warrington Borough Council.

The dangerous condition of the wall has made it necessary to seal off parts of the churchyard for some time, preventing access to many family graves and the War Memorial.

The planning application seeks permission to rebuild the collapsed section of the wall and build new, stone-clad structural supporting piers against the wall.

where possible, existing stones will be used to rebuild the wall. But some matching, new stones will be

Reports being studied by council

planners say the proposals include a new opening in the existing wall, adjacent to the church car park, to allow easy access into the graveyard. A new path will replace the existing path which has reached the end of its serviceable life.

The new entrance into the graveyard and the new and replaced paths will provide a safter, all-weather access into the churchyard.

St Mary's Church is believed to be the fourth church on the site. A Saxon church is mentioned in the 1086 Domesday Book. This was replaced by a Norman church while a third church was built, probably in the early 14th century.

The present church was built in sandstone in 1852.

Overall, the works proposed are believed to be necessary to enable safe and appropriate public use of the graveyard.

The design suitably reflects the setting and harm to the Listed areas

The design suitably reflects the setting and harm to the Listed areas is considered minimal, the reports state. Additional buttresses to the wall which differ from the original are considered necessary to ensure structural stability and integrity for the future.

Last year, a temporary bridge was provided by the borough council to allow access to the War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday.

An archaeologist with a watching brief will be present during all ground works. If any human remains are exposed, or are otherwise encountered during the works, all work in the vicinity must be stopped immediately and the remains lightly covered with soil. The Diocesan Registrar must be notified.

The directions of the Diocesan Registrar must then be followed. Maintenance of the churchyard

Maintenance of the churchyard at St Mary's is the responsibility of Warrington Borough Council.

Council planners are now studying the proposals.

A recent meeting to support local businesses will see the creation of 4 new schemes that will benefit businesses, residents and visitors to the village. A community toilet scheme, a water bottle refill scheme, dog friendly premises as well as used paper cup recycling will all soon be launched. Let us know if you want to be involved.

Following the arson attack, the final figures for the removal and refurbishment of the public toilet at Lymm Dam have now been received and sent to the insurers. This should trigger the removal and refurbishment of the unit and its reinstallation at the end of summer.

Outside the Parish Council, the much-anticipated work renewing the setts on Pepper Street will commence in June and is expected to last approximately 20 weeks. The work will cause some inconvenience, including access to Pepper Street car park.

We are pleased that the scaffolding outside Boots has been removed following the completion of the renovation work. The difference is remarkable, and it has greatly enhanced the appearance of the area.

Your continued support and engagement are vital to the success of our community initiatives.

# Lymm May Queen blessed with fine weather as new queens joined by former queen

AFTER losing the use of the Lymm May Queen field due to heavy rain earlier in the year the annual event was blessed with fine weather as it paraded through the village.

Organisers worked hard to ensure the event could continue, by making use and adapting the local car parks in the village centre.

The crownings took place of Lymm May Queen Eleanor Macdonald and Lymm Rose Queen Caitlin Ellison who were joined by Dorothy Greenhalgh, the esteemed May Queen of 1948, returning to grace the parade.

The Lymm May Queen tradition dates back to 1847 with the establishment of the Band of Hope by Jabez Tunnicliff, a venerable Baptist Minister in Leeds. In an era where alcohol held sway as a societal norm, the Band of Hope arose as a beacon of sobriety, staunchly advocating for complete abstinence. This noble movement, embraced by various denominations, offered children a sanctuary away from the temptations of alcohol, birthing alcohol-tree sanctuaries like the esteemed Temperance Hotel in

Lymm.
The inception of the Lymm & Oughtrington Band of Hope Festival in 1889 marked a union

of two venerable traditions: the religious processions commonplace in the North West and the May Queen Fair originating from Knutsford, immortalized in Lord Tennyson's timeless poem "The May Queen." While the May Queen Fair exuded a romanticized aura of a bygone "Merrie England," Lymm endeavoured to infuse its solemn procession with elements of joviality, revelry, and the crowning of a Lymm May Queen, all while remaining steadfast to its roots in church ethos and temperance principles.

Organisers said: "We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the dedicated volunteers at the Lymm Heritage Centre, custodians of the invaluable records that serve as the bedrock of Lymm's storied past. Without their tireless efforts, delving into history's annals would be a daunting task. As a committee, we are committed to preserving this rich legacy by donating all official photographs from our event to the Heritage Centre, ensuring that the tapestry of Lymm's history continues to unfurl for generations to come."

How can I keep my dog cool during the hot summer months?

the hot summer months?

During the hot summer months, it's essential to ensure your dog stays cool to prevent heatstroke. Provide plenty of fresh water and make sure there are shaded areas in your garden or outdoor space. Avoid walking your dog during the peak heat of the day, when they are at most risk of heatstroke and burns, both from the sun and from hot payements. from the sun and from hot pavements, which can hurt their feet. Instead, try to take them out when temperatures are cooler in the morning or evening.
You can also use cooling mats or
damp towels for your dog to lie on, and ensure your home is well-ventilated. Never leave your dog in a parked car, as temperatures can rise dangerously high very quickly. It is also worth considering how you can amend your dog's grooming regime to help them cope with the warm weather, for example by brushing more often or taking them for a trim.

Is it safe to take my dog swimming in lakes or rivers during summer?

Swimming can be a great way for dogs to cool off and get exercise during the summer, but there are some precautions to take. You can search online for local reports of harmful algal blooms. Keeping up with their routine preventative parasite treatments will also help keep them safe when out and about. Avoid areas with strong currents, and always supervise your dog while swimming. Make sure your dog can always get out of the water easily, and rinse them well afterwards to remove any residual chemicals or contaminants. If your dog is not a strong swimmer, consider using a canine life jacket for added safety.



What are the signs of heatstroke in cats, and how can I prevent it?

Cats are also susceptible to heatstroke, though it can be harder to spot. Signs include excessive panting, drooling, lethargy and unsteady movements. In severe cases, cats may vomit or lose consciousness. To prevent heatstroke, keep your home cool and well ventilated, and ensure your cat always has access to fresh water Avoid letting them out during the hottest parts of the day, and provide shaded areas if they do go outside. If you suspect your cat is suffering from heatstroke, move them to a cool area and contact our team, or your usual vets, immediately.

l've heard that rabbits can get flystrike in summer. How can I prevent this? Flystrike can be a serious problem for

your rabbit, but is easily prevented with good hygiene and husbandry. If will be encouraged to lay eggs on it. When these hatch, the larvae will damage your rabbit's skin, taking advantage of even the tiniest wound to feed beneath it. A few simple tips to keep your rabbit happy and healthy in summer include daily removal of soiled or wet bedding, regular cleaning of their hutch, a healthy fibrous diet to avoid diarrhoea tibrous diet to avoid diarrhoea and frequent grooming of long haired breeds such as angora and lionhead. Flystrike requires urgent veterinary treatment, so contact our team immediately if you notice any fly eggs, maggots, hair loss or open wounds on your rabbit.

# Northern Lights light up Lymm!

THE skies over the UK, including Lymm, were turned various shades of pink and green as the Northern Lights (Aurora Borealis) produced incredible displays for skygazers on Friday May 10.

The incredible Aurora Borealis, usually only visible from northern parts of the British Isles, was clearly visible across large parts of the UK overnight, including Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland and, unusually, southern England.

Meteorologists say the display was caused after America's

Meteorologists say the display was caused after America's National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) issued its first severe solar storm warning since 2005 as a huge geomagnetic storm raced towards Earth. The NOAA said the G5 geomagnetic

storm, which is considered extreme and is the strongest level of a geomagnetic storm, hit Earth on Thursday and brought with it the risk of affecting communications, GPS and power grids.

Aurora Borealis displays occur when charged particles collide with gases in the Earth's atmosphere around the magnetic poles.

## **Cohabitation Breakdown**

Times have changed. People and families evolve and an increasing number of couples move in together and start a family without getting married, and whilst some might give some thought to what would happen with respect to their home and other assets in the event the relationship breaks down, I know from experience and from some of the common questions we are asked in cohabitation breakdown scenarios that many people do not, or perhaps they have given it some thought but they have mistakenly thought the legal position is different from how it really is.

The key thing to understand is that the law in relation to cohabitation breakdown is not the same as for marriage or civil partnership breakdown. There is a common misconception that unmarried couples who live together are 'common law' partners and have the same rights as married couples or civil partnership partners, but the fact is that they don't. It's not true; it is a myth! There is no such thing as 'common law' marriage and so it follows there is no such thing as common law husband and wife or common law partners.

Unmarried couples who live together are quite simply an unmarried couple living together and it comes as a surprise to some to discover on the breakdown of the relationship that they have no automatic right or entitlement to make financial claims against the other and that this is the case irrespective of how long they have lived together. That is, no right to any form of financial support for themselves (child support being a separate issue) and no right to a share of the other's pension. As regards the family home this on the face of it depends on how the property is owned but it can get complicated and in some cases the dispute can involve complex contractual, trust and land law principles. Each case turns on its own facts and sometimes the smallest of details can have a significant bearing on the eventual outcome.
