Mixed emotions as family visit heritage centre display

THERE was pride mixed with sadness when Enid Edwards visited Lymm Heritage Centre recently with her daughter Diane and granddaughter Katie.

They were all coming to see the new window display, installed to mark Remembrance Day, which honours the all too brief life of Enid's great uncle Edward (Eddie) Johnson.

Every year, to mark Remembrance Day the Centre tell the story of one serviceman who lost his life in one of the two World Wars.

Edward (Eddie) Johnson was born in the Rushgreen area of Lymm in 1897. His early childhood was hit by a double tragedy. His father, a canal boatman drowned in Manchester 1899 and just three years later his mother also drowned in the Bridgewater Canal in Lymm in unexplained circumstances.

Eddie was brought up by his uncle, George Hazlehurst and his family who ran a small shop near Lymm Bridge. (A re-creation of their shop window is displayed in the Heritage Centre). He attended Pepper Street School and was a chorister at St Mary's Church. He had a brief working life at the Linotype Works in Altrincham before enlisting in June 1915.

He fought at Passchendaele and was reported missing on July 31 having been part of an attack which formed the beginning of the 3rd

Battle of Ypres. He died on August 2, 1917, aged just 20, probably in captivity after being wounded.

He is buried at Harlebeke New British Cemetery, West Vlaanderen, Belgium. There is also a half-size

memorial to Eddie in the cemetery at St Mary's.

"It is a wonderful tribute." said Diane. "Mum recalls her family talking about Uncle Eddie, especially around Remembrance Day. What a shame they can't all see him honoured in Lymm village this year!"

Enid and her family shared a collection of photographs and family memorabilia with the Heritage Centre some years ago and digital versions of these are now preserved for posterity and accessible online in thelymmarchive.co.uk

New Lymm book reveals hidden "House" history



FROM Monday to Friday, most weeks of the year, it is Lymm's busiest building.

But how many of its users realise that they are walking in the footsteps of history?

The building we are talking

about is, of course, Oughtrington Hall and now for the first time, that fascinating history has been explored in "House Through Time" style.

The result is a brand new publication "Oughtrington Hall – The House and Its People" by Lymm Heritage Centre researcher and author, Roger Hannam.

Today the Hall echoes to the sound of thousands of students and staff as it forms the original core of what is now Lymm High School.

But two hundred years ago it would have been the much more subdued sound of cooks, maids, grooms, governesses and butlers that would have resonated around the building as they went about their daily chores in the service of the owner of one of Lymm's great estates, Trafford Trafford.

With many newly published illustrations, the book traces over

two centuries of history from an early link to Peterloo through many wealthy owners and tenants to poignant stories of the building's role in two world wars, first as a haven for refugees and later as a temporary home for pupils of a revolutionary outdoor school. The book goes on to describe how the building became the fourth home of Lymm Grammar School followed, finally, by its transition into the school we know today.

Local CEO raises over £12.5k from gruelling charity trek across Cambodia

A Lymm mum has raised an incredible £12.5k after a five day 94km trek across Cambodia to Angkor Wat for the EY Foundation charity.

Clare Roberts, based in Lymm, was raising funds for the charity that works with young people from low-income backgrounds to support them into employment and education.

Clare, CEO of national nursery group Kids Planet Day Nurseries with its HQ in Lymm, said prior to setting off "I'm doing this because I know I'm in a privileged position and feel it's important to give back. I've done lots of things for children over the years with Kids Planet, but as my children are getting older, I'm recognising more that there's a real gap for young people in society."

In 2022, Clare took on the gruelling challenge of climbing Kilimanjaro for charity. This time, the charity Cambodia trek took place over nine days starting on 3rd November 2024 in Siem Reap and finishing at Angkor Wat.

Clare was part of a group that walked through varying terrains of valleys, hills and dense forests where temperatures were expected to reach 35 degrees during the day.

The trekkers were also camping in the jungle for a week during the hike in solo tents. Clare commented ahead of her trip: "This is the kind of trip where your out-of-office is on and you stick to it."

On her preparation, Clare said "I've been working on the premise that my running is my preparation. I haven't technically put on my walking boots in about four months, but I run at least 30 kilometres a week so I'm hoping I have a level of fitness from the running, and that if I can run it, I can walk it."

Kids Planet's leadership teams

Kids Planet's leadership teams and nurseries across the country have been raising money for Clare's trek. Kids Planet Prestwich held a crazy hair day where practitioners and children tried out new funky hair styles for the day; the head office team hiked to a waterfall in Lymm; Kids Planet Llandudno went for a long beach walk and hosted a danceathon; Macclesfield will be doing a sponsored stomp and Crewe have created an art gallery

of the children's creations to name a few.

EY Foundation's programmes tackle some of the major obstacles to social mobility in the UK. The charity works directly with young people facing barriers to employment, and with employers and social entrepreneurs in the UK, to create and support routes into education, employment and enterprise

Clare explains "I've been a judge for the EY Foundation for some of their projects and sponsorships that they were doing for young people, so I've seen firsthand what the foundation does to support young people and to raise their resilience, their work skills, and to give them a focus in life, post-school."

Lynne Peabody, CEO at EY Foundation commented, "Our fundraisers are such a critical part to achieving our charity's mission. I am so grateful to Clare and the Angkor Wat 24 trekkers, who are not only fundraising to support our charity and young people, but taking time out of busy schedules and challenging themselves to trek through the hills and heat in Cambodia. Thank you, to you and your donors for your support!"

Clare added, "Anything that can be done to support groups of people who are more disadvantaged and give them equal opportunities is vital. I am excited to get my walking boots on, and be a part of an amazing team raising money for what is a brilliant charity."

Divorce Column

Some common questions

- 1. How do I get a divorce? As of April 2022 'no fault' divorce laws were introduced meaning that married couples no longer need to allege blame and establish fault (such as adultery or unreasonable behaviour) to get a divorce. Instead, one or both spouses need only state that the marriage has instituted by the design of the product of irretrievably broken down and apply for a divorce on this basis.
- **2. How long does it take?** It can vary but typically at least 6-7 months. There's a mandatory holding period of 20 weeks after the divorce application is issued which provides time for the parties to reflect on the marriage breakdown and to make a start on trying to resolve any issues concerning finances and child arrangements. After the holding period the applicant can apply for a conditional order and 6 weeks after the conditional order they can apply for the final order.
- **3. How are the finances resolved?** There is a concept of fairness, which does not necessarily mean equality. If an agreed settlement can be reached there will be no need to go to court but if an agreement can't be reached either party may apply to court for a financial order. The court would first look at meeting the needs of any dependent children and then the needs of the parties, especially housing and income. The court would consider several factors such as the length of the marriage, contributions, needs, earnings & earning capacity. Although an equal split is not uncommon the goal is to achieve fairness, and which may be different from equality.
- **4. What about child arrangements?** Decisions will need to be made regarding who the children will live with and how much time they'll spend with each parent. If arrangements can be agreed there will be no need to go to court but if agreement can't be reached either party may apply to court for a child arrangements order, for the court to decide the arrangements.

Incredible start to the season as tabletopping Lymm tame Leeds Tykes

LYMM Rugby Club have had an incredible start to the season as the first proper autumnal day of the year saw an exhilarating top-of-the-table clash at Beechwood as the hosts made it nine from nine with a 30-26 victory over Leeds Tykes.

Just a point separated the two unbeaten teams at the start of the day, unbeaten teams at the start of the day, and for lymm followers the contest would answer the question that has been at the back of everyone's minds – is this lofty position a true reflection of the team's ability? This though is clearly not a doubt that has affected the players and coaching staff, as they put on a very confident and contained performance.

Lymm would be missing fly half maestro Tom Shard (second highest points scorer in the league) and powerhouse prop Ralph McEachran.
To manage the lack of Shard the

with two number 12's, with Sam Wadsworth donning the number 10 shirt. This was to prove very impactful

The subsequent maul sucked in the Lymm defence leaving the Leeds winger in acres of space on the right, and the fly half found him easily with a long kick pass to open the scoring. O v 5. The conversion was missed.

The restart saw Lymm finally get into the Leeds half, but a kick ricocheted off a Leeds player and they were able to kick long and again Leeds were deep in Lymm territory. A penalty to Lymm at the lineout allowed them some relief and they then began to find some

and they then began to find some possession, and go forward.

A couple of Lymm attacks were thwarted by knock-ons, but Leeds were now being penalised allowing Lymm to keep the pressure on. A high tackle on half way saw Leeds number 8 yellow carded. This time coming away with 5 points after some nice link play in midfield. The converted try made it 15 v 12. This was the tough match everyone had hoped for, and just before half time Leeds lost their number 11 to injury.

This eventually led to a rather controversial penalty try, and a yellow card for Steve Pilkington. 20 v 19.

The opening exchanges of the second half were again characterised by Leeds attack meeting Lymm's defence with neither team able to break the deadlock. The scrums were proving interesting with Leeds being physically dominant but Lymm emerging with penalties going their way. It was one of these scrum penalties that would give Lymm the next score with Wadsworth kicking for goal, 23 v 19.

As Leeds continued to threaten

Lymm saw another yellow card, this time for Paddy Jennings for a deliberate knock on, stopping a Leeds long pass to a winger in a dangerous position.
